Starters (returning/lost) 4/1

## Starters Returning (4)

### Demarcus Holland

Returns for his fourth year in the backcourt rotation ... has played in all 103 games (74 starts) in his first three seasons ... team leader and "glue guy" ... second on the team in assists (82) and minutes (28.7 mpg) and sixth in scoring (7.1 ppg) last year ... shot a team-best 45.6 percent from 3-point range (26-of-57) ... named to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team as a sophomore ... team's Outstanding Defensive Player in each of his first three years ... two-time Academic All-Big 12 selection.

### Connor Lammert

Returns for his fourth season in the frontcourt rotation ... has played in all 103 career games (39 starts) during his first three years ... third on the team in rebounding (5.4 rpg) in 22.1 minutes per game last season ... two-time Academic All-Big 12 selection.

## Cameron Ridley

Returns for his fourth season in the frontcourt rotation ... has played in 102 career games (85 starts) in his first three years ... ranks fourth on the UT career blocked shots chart (183, just 81 shy of record) ... second on the team in blocks (60), fourth in rebounding (5.3 rpg) and fifth in scoring (8.0 ppg) while playing 21.4 minutes per game last season ... earned USBWA All-District VII Team, All-Big 12 Honorable Mention and Big 12 All-Defensive Team accolades as a sophomore.

## Isaiah Taylor

Returns for his third season as the starter at point guard ... named to the five-person Preseason All-Big 12 Team (by league's coaches) ... has played in 59 games (all starts) in his first two years (missed 10 games early in his sophomore year due to a fractured left wrist) ... All-Big 12 Third Team choice last year ... led the team in scoring (13.1 ppg), assists (4.6 apg), steals (23) and minutes (31.5) and reached double figures in scoring 17 times last season ... posted a 1.75-to-1 (110-to-63) assist-to-turnover ratio last year.

## Starters Lost (1)

### Jonathan Holmes

Four-year starter in the frontcourt ... played in 127 career games (108 starts) and averaged 9.2 ppg and 5.9 rpg in 23.1 minutes ... finished career ranked ninth at UT in rebounds (749), 11th in blocks (113) and 24th in scoring (1,166 points) ... All-Big 12 Honorable Mention as a senior ... second on team in scoring (10.3 ppg) and rebounding (6.1 rpg) in 26.1 minutes last year.

## Others Returning (7)

### Jordan Barnett

Played in 21 games and averaged 1.9 points and 1.3 rebounds in 8.5 minutes per contest as a freshman ... had a season-high 11 points (4-of-5 FG, 3-of-3 threes), four rebounds and two steals in a season-high 24 minutes against Lipscomb (Dec. 16).

### Javan Felix

Returns for his fourth year in the backcourt rotation ... has played in 99 career games (48 starts) ... reached double figures 43 times in his career, including seven 20-point efforts ... third on team in assists (61) and fourth in scoring (8.7 ppg) in 23.3 minutes per game last season ... All-Big 12 Honorable Mention (coaches) and Academic All-Big 12 selection as a sophomore.

### Prince Ibeh

Returns for his fourth season in the frontcourt rotation ... has played in all 103 career games (six starts) in his first three years ... ranks eighth on the UT career blocked shots chart (148) ... shared team's Outstanding Defensive Player honor with Demarcus Holland last year ... third on the team in blocks (47) in just 10.6 minutes per game last season ... two-time Academic All-Big 12 selection.

## Ryan McClurg

Returns for his second full season with the UT program ... enrolled at Texas in January 2014 after completing the Fall 2013 semester at UTSA ... saw action in four games and totaled nine minutes of playing time last season.

## Danny Newsome

Returns for his fourth season with the UT program ... joined the team as a preferred walk-on during Fall 2012 individual workouts ... redshirted in 2012-13 ... has played in 10 career games ... saw action in five contests and totaled 13 minutes of playing time last year.

## Joe Schwartz

Returns for his second season with the UT program ... played in one game (vs. Lipscomb, Dec. 16) and converted his lone 3-point field goal attempt in just two minutes of action.

## Kendal Yancy

Returns for his third season in the backcourt rotation ... played in 68 games (28 starts) during his first two years ... started the final 12 contests of last season ... named team's Most Improved Player last year ... fourth on the team in assists (59) and seventh in scoring (6.3 ppg) in 21.3 minutes per game last year ... Academic All-Big 12 Second Team selection as a sophomore.

## Others Lost (4)

### Brandon Allums

Two-year member of the program ... joined the team as a walk-on during Fall 2013 individual workouts ... played in eight career games ... saw action in five contests and totaled 11 minutes of playing time last season.

### Tarale Murry

Two-year member of the program ... joined the team as a walk-on during Fall 2013 individual workouts ... played in 10 career games ... saw action in five contests and totaled eight minutes of playing time last year.

### Myles Turner

One-year letterwinner ... declared for the NBA Draft following his freshman season ... selected as the No. 11 pick in the 2015 NBA Draft by the Indiana Pacers ... earned Big 12 Freshman of the Year, All-Big 12 Third Team and Big 12 All-Defensive Team honors last season ... played in all 34 games (seven starts) and led the team in blocks (89) and rebounding (6.5 rpg) and ranked third in scoring (10.1 ppg) while averaging 22.2 minutes per contest ... his 89 blocks ranked fourth on the UT single-season chart.

## Newcomers (4)

### Shaquille Cleare

Spent his first two seasons at the University of Maryland (2012-13 and 2013-14) ... elected to transfer and began taking classes at UT in the Fall 2014 semester ... per NCAA transfer rules, he was permitted to practice and work out with the team last year but was not able to participate in games or travel with the squad ... played in all 32 games (20 starts) for Maryland as a sophomore in 2013-14 and averaged 3.0 points and 2.5 rebounds in 13.8 minutes per contest ... high school teammate of Isaiah Taylor during Cleare's senior season (Taylor's junior year) at The Village School in Houston.

### Eric Davis, Jr.

Ranked as the No. 45 overall prospect in the nation by ESPN ... played in prestigious Jordan Brand Classic following his senior year ... finalist for Mr. Basketball in the state of Michigan as a senior ... led Saginaw Arthur Hill HS to a 24-4 mark and a trip to the Class A state championship game while averaging 25 points, seven assists and six rebounds per game in his senior season.

### Tevin Mack

Ranked as the No. 48 overall prospect in the nation by ESPN ... South Carolina 3A co-Player of the Year as a senior ... averaged nearly 30 points and nine rebounds per contest while leading Dreher HS to an 18-7 record and the third round of the state playoffs in his senior season.

### Kerwin Roach, Jr.

Ranked as the No. 34 overall prospect in the nation by Rivals.com and No. 47 by ESPN ... averaged 20.7 points, 4.8 assists and 3.0 steals per game while pacing North Shore HS to a 27-7 mark as a senior ... averaged a team-best 16.1 points per game as a junior in 2013-14 while leading North Shore to a 33-3 record and the Class 5A state title ... also competed in track and field and won back-to-back 5A state championships in the triple jump as a junior and senior ... set a Nike Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays meet record with a jump of 50-8.00 (15.44 meters) in April 2015 on the UT campus.



# Texas Basketball Program Notebook

- Texas tips off its 110th season of intercollegiate basketball when it plays Washington in Shanghai, China on Friday, Nov. 13 (Saturday, Nov. 14 in China). The Longhorns hold an all-time record of 1,718-1,022 (.627) in their previous 109 years of competition. UT played its first varsity basketball contest on March 10, 1906 and recorded a 27-17 win against Baylor in Austin. The Horns have fielded a varsity basketball team in every year since then with the exception of the 1907-08 season.
- UT has made a total of 32 all-time appearances in the NCAA Tournament. The Longhorns sport a 35-35 (.500) overall record in the NCAA Tournament games.
- Texas has advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 16 of the last 17 and 24 of the last 27 seasons.
- The Longhorns have advanced to the Final Four a total of three times in program history (1943, 1947, 2003).
- Texas has advanced to the "Elite Eight" of the NCAA Tournament a total of seven times in program history (1939, 1943, 1947, 1990, 2003, 2006, 2008).
- The Longhorns have advanced to the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA Tournament a total of 13 times in program history (1939, 1943, 1947, 1960, 1963, 1972, 1990, 1997, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2008).
- Texas has reached the NCAA "Sweet 16" five times in the last 14 years.
- Since the NCAA expanded its tournament field to 64 teams in 1985, UT is 17-7 in its opening game in the NCAA Tournament.
- The Longhorns have made four appearances in the Postseason NIT (1948, 1978, 1980, 1986) and registered a 6-3 all-time record in those four trips. Texas won the 1978 Postseason NIT Championship.
- Texas has claimed a total of 25 conference championships in program history. The Longhorns won 22 Southwest Conference regular-season titles between 1915-96 (1915, 1916, 1917, 1919, 1924, 1933, 1939, 1943, 1947, 1951, 1954, 1960, 1963, 1965, 1972, 1974, 1978, 1979, 1986, 1992, 1994 and 1995). UT has claimed three Big 12 Conference regular-season titles in the 19-year history of the league (1999, 2006 and 2008).
- The Longhorns have captured two conference postseason tournament titles in program history. UT won back-to-back Southwest Conference Tournament championships in 1994 and 1995.
- The University of Texas has retired three jerseys worn by men's basketball players in program history. T.J. Ford's No. 11 jersey was retired on Feb. 8, 2004. Slater Martin's No. 15 jersey was retired on Jan. 31, 2009. Kevin Durant's No. 35 jersey was retired on Feb. 25, 2009.
- UT is the only school in the country that can claim two different National Players of the Year in the last 13 years (T.J. Ford in 2003 and Kevin Durant in 2007).
- Texas has had four different players participate in a total of five Olympic competitions. Gilbert "Gib" Ford earned a gold medal with the United States at the 1956 Melbourne Games. Jay Arnette earned a gold medal with the United States at the 1960 Rome Olympics. Albert Almanza was a two-time member of the Mexican Olympic team (1960 Rome, 1964 Toyko). Kevin Durant earned a gold medal with the United States at the 2012 London Olympics.
- Texas has had 20 different players earn a total of 26 All-America honors in program history. Five different Longhorns have garnered consensus first-team All-America honors in program history (Jack Gray, 1935; Chris Mihm, 2000; T.J. Ford, 2003; Kevin Durant, 2007; D.J. Augustin, 2008).
- Texas has had three different consensus first-team All-Americans over the last 13 years (dating back to the 2002-03 season). T.J. Ford (2003), Kevin Durant (2007) and D.J. Augustin (2008) all earned the prestigious honor.
- UT has had four different individuals earn National Freshman of the Year honors in program history (Terrence Rencher in 1991-92, T.J. Ford in 2001-02, Daniel Gibson in 2004-05, Kevin Durant in 2006-07).
- Since the NBA Draft began in 1947, a total of 42 Longhorns have heard their name called on draft night. Texas has produced a total of 15 first-round selections and 11 second-round picks in program history.
- Texas has had 17 players drafted in the last 17 years (dating back to the 1999 Draft), including 12 players selected in the last 10 years. UT has had 11 first-round picks since 2000.
- Texas had a school-record three players selected in the first round of the 2011 NBA Draft (Tristan Thompson, Jordan Hamilton and Cory Joseph).
- The 2011 Draft marked the second straight year and third time in school history that the Longhorns had three players selected in the same draft. Avery Bradley, Damion James and Dexter Pittman were picked during the 2010 NBA Draft. LaMarcus Aldridge, P.J. Tucker and Daniel Gibson were taken during the 2006 NBA Draft.

- When the Charlotte Bobcats selected D.J. Augustin as the No. 9 pick in the 2008 NBA Draft, it completed an impressive three-year run for the Longhorns. Texas was the only school in the nation to have a Top 10 pick in the 2006, 2007 and 2008 NBA Drafts. UT also became just the fourth school since 1985 (when the current draft lottery system was implemented) to produce a lottery pick in three consecutive years (2006-08). Georgia Tech (1989-91), Duke (1992-95) and Connecticut (2004-06) previously accomplished the feat.
- Through the completion of the 2014-15 NBA season, a total of 29 former Longhorns have seen game action for an NBA franchise.
- UT has had six different individuals earn conference Player of the Year honors a total of seven times in program history. The Longhorns had four different players receive a total of five Southwest Conference Player of the Year accolades (Ron Baxter in 1979-80, John Brownlee in 1985-86, Travis Mays in 1988-89 and 1989-90, B.J. Tyler in 1993-94). Texas has had two Big 12 Conference Players of the Year (P.J. Tucker in 2005-06, Kevin Durant in 2006-07).
- The Longhorns have had eight different individuals earn conference Freshman of the Year honors in program history. Texas had three players receive Southwest Conference Freshman of the Year accolades (Travis Mays in 1986-87, Terrence Rencher in 1991-92 and Kris Clack in 1995-96). UT has had five individuals earn Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Year honors (T.J. Ford in 2001-02, Daniel Gibson in 2004-05, Kevin Durant in 2006-07, Tristan Thompson in 2010-11 and Myles Turner in 2014-15).
- UT climbed to the top of both major national polls (Associated Press, ESPN/USA Today Coaches) on January 11, 2010. It marked the first time in program history that the Horns had been the top-ranked team in the nation in either major poll. Texas held the top spot in both polls for a two-week stretch.
- Texas has reached the 20-win plateau a total of 30 times in its previous 109 seasons of basketball. UT had a streak of 13 consecutive 20-win seasons from 1999-2000 through 2011-12.
- The Longhorns have registered an all-time record of 463-109 (.809) in 38 seasons at the Frank Erwin Center. Texas went 13-5 at home in 2014-15 and is 148-23 (.865) at the Erwin Center in the last 10 seasons (dating to the start of the 2005-06 season).
- Men's Basketball has received public recognition awards for its multi-year NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) in each of the last six years (2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015). The awards are given each year to teams scoring in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sport. UT has earned a perfect 1,000 score in each of the last six multi-year APR reports. In addition, Men's Basketball has posted perfect 1,000 APR single-year scores in EVERY season dating back to 2005-06 (nine consecutive years).
- Six Texas players earned a spot on the 2015 Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team. UT's five first-team selections were the top mark in the conference. UT also led the Big 12 Conference in the number of Academic All-Big 12 selections in the sport of men's basketball in four consecutive years (2008-11).
- Texas has had 16 players in school history compete in the McDonald's All-American Game. The Horns also have had 12 players participate in the Jordan Brand Classic.

## MEDIA RELATIONS OFFICE

The University of Texas media relations office is located on the seventh floor of the Red McCombs Red Zone (North End Zone office space at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium).

## MEDIA GUIDELINES

- Interviews with any staff member or player should be scheduled through the UT Media Relations Office. To schedule interviews with coaches, staff members or players, please contact Scott McConnell ([sm@utexas.edu](mailto:sm@utexas.edu)).
- Phone numbers for players and coaches will not be provided, and players have been told not to accept calls or emails from anyone asking basketball-related questions without prior notice from the UT Media Relations Office. Please do not contact a player or coach without arranging the interview through the UT Media Relations Office.
- We ask that you do not arrive unannounced at the basketball office, Erwin Center or Cooley Pavilion to interview a player or coach without arranging it through the UT Media Relations Office. Media members must be escorted to interviews and to the basketball office by a member of the UT Media Relations Office.

## BIG 12 COACHES' TELECONFERENCE

The Big 12 Conference men's basketball coaches will participate in a weekly media-only teleconference during the 2015-16 season. There will be one call in December (Dec. 7) with a weekly call beginning on Jan. 4. There will also be a special postseason conference call on March 14 for all teams participating in postseason play. The teleconference begins at 10:00 a.m. Central. **UT coach Shaka Smart's slot begins at 11:12 a.m.** Check with the Big 12 office for this year's schedule of calls. The call can also be heard live and on replay via the Internet by visiting the Big 12 web site at [www.big12sports.com](http://www.big12sports.com).

## NON-GAMEDAY MEDIA AVAILABILITY

**PRACTICE:** All practices are closed to the media and the general public unless otherwise announced. No interviews are permitted during or after practice sessions. Camera persons are not allowed to shoot any portion of practice.

**BY TELEPHONE:** For a telephone interview with a Texas player or coach, contact Scott McConnell at least 24 hours in advance. A member of the media relations staff will schedule a phone interview around that person's schedule.

**COACH SMART:** During the season, Coach Smart usually will be available to the media prior to each game in Cooley Pavilion. Please check with Scott McConnell to verify time and location of Smart's availability.

**PLAYERS:** Texas players are usually available for a 20-minute period prior to practice one time before each game. For media availability and to verify locations and times, please check with Scott McConnell.

## ON-CAMPUS PARKING

Parking on The University of Texas campus can be difficult. When traveling to campus for an interview in the media relations office or the basketball office, we recommend that media members use the UT parking garage at the corner of Robert Dedman Drive and Clyde Littlefield Drive. For practice coverage at the Erwin Center and Cooley Pavilion, media can park in Lot 108, the large parking lot located to the south of the arena and the service drive (enter from IH-35 South access road).

## COVERING THE GAME

**CREDENTIALS:** To request working media credentials for a Texas Basketball home game, please submit a formal request via e-mail ([sm@utexas.edu](mailto:sm@utexas.edu)) to Scott McConnell in the media relations office at least one week prior to the game.

- Credentials are granted to authorized working press, NBA scouts, University of Texas approved officials and game management personnel only.
  - With the exception of beat reporters covering the team on a daily basis for daily reports, all credentials are approved and issued on a game-by-game basis.
  - Media organization identification and the name of the media member covering the game for that outlet are required for every credential.
  - Credentials are not transferable. Media members altering their original request should provide written notification to the media relations office of any changes at least 24 hours in advance of the particular game.
  - The University of Texas and the NCAA prohibits the issuance of press credentials to representatives of any organization that regularly publishes or otherwise promotes the advertising of "tout sheets" or "tip sheets," or other advertising designed to encourage gambling on collegiate sporting events.
  - Space in the media section and baseline space for photographers is limited. Working space and credentials will be allotted based on the following priority guidelines (for one credential ONLY):
1. Originating television and radio personnel involved in a live broadcast
  2. Daily newspapers covering for next-day publication (based on circulation)
    - Wire services and national publications
    - UT website partners and visiting university website partners
  3. National website reporters writing for postgame postings on network or historically printed publication websites

NOTE: Web reporters writing for regional and independent websites or with live updates do not qualify.

4. Officially recognized University of Texas student newspapers, publications and news outlets
5. University of Texas-approved publications covering the Longhorns on an exclusive basis
6. Non-originating radio and television personnel reporting on the game  
Only the following radio personnel receive consideration for credentials based on space:
  - a. Austin-area radio stations with a full-time sports director conducting a sports-based show on a daily basis
  - b. Beat radio sports directors or reporters covering a visiting team
  - c. Sports director or reporter for an affiliate station of the Longhorn IMG Radio Network
7. Non-daily newspapers or publications reporting on the game

**MEDIA ENTRANCE/WILL CALL:** Media members are to enter and leave the Erwin Center through the Red River entrance (main entrance on the west side of the arena). Local television stations that must move equipment in and out may use the south service entrance. Media will call opens 90 minutes prior to tipoff.

**PARKING:** Press parking is located in Trinity Garage (corner of Trinity and MLK). We suggest you approach the garage from the south and/or west and park on Level 4 of the garage. Parking passes are limited and available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

**PRESS ROOM:** From the bottom of the escalator/stairs at the Red River Entrance, the press room is located three doors down on your right. All working press are provided with game notes and statistics, game flipcards with rosters, fact books and complete statistics (box score, play-by-play, game notes). Statistics will be distributed individually and as a complete book following the game. Postgame quickie quotes are also available.

**MEDIA SEATING:** Please locate the seating chart in the press room to find your seat location. In general, the visiting team's radio network is seated at the scorer's table next to its team bench. Home radio and the originating television broadcast crew are located at mid-court on the side opposite from the benches. All other media are seated in the press section, located in the upper three rows of Section 28 in the arena. Media can access that section by either taking the stairs from court level or by taking the service elevator in the south tunnel.

**VISITING RADIO:** The University of Texas provides a courtesy hard-wired Ethernet line, one ISDN line and a POTS line for visiting radio. The visiting radio location is at the scorer's table next to the visiting team bench. Three can sit comfortably in the area provided. A stats monitor will be provided at the location. Please contact Scott McConnell for visiting phone line numbers at the location.

**MEDIA COVERING TEXAS ON THE ROAD:** Media members wishing to cover UT on the road must contact the host media relations office for credentials.

The Texas locker room is closed to the media. All postgame interviews will be conducted in the press room. No interviews with Texas players or coaches are permitted on the court following the game, except for the originating television broadcast or Longhorn Network. After a 10-minute cooling off period, the visiting coach and select players (if approved by the visiting SID) will be escorted to the press room first. Following a 10-minute interview window with the visiting team, requested Texas players and coach Shaka Smart will be available in the press room.

The leader of a Virginia Commonwealth University program that advanced to the 2011 Final Four and posted at least 26 wins in each of his six seasons at the school, Shaka Smart became the 24th head basketball coach at The University of Texas on April 3, 2015.

While at VCU (2009-15), the 38-year-old Smart posted an overall record of 163-56 (.744) and guided the Rams to five NCAA Tournament appearances. The 163 wins tied him for the second-highest number of total victories during the first six years of a head coaching career in NCAA history. VCU and Duke are the only two programs in the country to have posted at least 26 wins in each of the past six seasons.

VCU is one of only 11 schools in the nation to earn an NCAA Tournament bid in each of the past five years (Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Louisville, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, San Diego State and Wisconsin). During Smart's tenure, the Rams posted a 27-9 (.750) mark in postseason play and a 33-10 (.767) record in the month of March, including a 7-5 mark in five NCAA Tournament appearances. The Rams' NCAA appearance this past March marked the first time in school history VCU had advanced to the Big Dance five straight years, and the first time in the history of the Commonwealth of Virginia that a Division I basketball program had accomplished that feat.

Prior to Smart's arrival, the Rams were ranked a total of nine weeks in The Associated Press poll in program history. During his six years, VCU made 22 appearances in The AP Top 25, including three straight rankings in the final AP poll in 2012-13 (No. 25), 2013-14 (No. 24) and 2014-15 (No. 25), a program first.

"I'm looking forward to building on the past success of Texas Basketball," Smart said. "This is a proud program that goes back over 100 years, and I embrace that history. There is tremendous potential in this program, and my job is to work extremely hard to ensure that we realize that potential."

During Smart's time at VCU, the Rams led the country in steals per game for three consecutive seasons (2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14) and ranked fourth nationally in 2014-15 (9.5 spg). In 2012-13, VCU's 422 total steals shattered the Atlantic 10 single-season record of 352 set by Xavier in 1998-99. The 422 thefts marked the 18th-highest single-season total in NCAA Division I history. During the 2013-14 season, the Rams registered 391 steals, 21 more than any other squad.

VCU also ranked near the top of the national statistics in turnover margin and opponent turnover rate under Smart's guidance. The Rams led the nation in turnover margin in 2011-12 (+6.47) and 2012-13 (+8.03) and ranked third nationally (+5.4) during the 2014-15 season. VCU's +8.03 mark in 2012-13 was the sixth-best turnover margin by an NCAA Division I team since the 1992-93 season.

"Havoc" was a hit with the VCU fan base. The Rams concluded the 2014-15 season with a streak of 66 consecutive sellouts at the Verizon Wireless Arena at the Stuart C. Siegel Center. That is the fifth-longest active streak in the nation, trailing only Duke, Kansas, Michigan State and Gonzaga.

In the classroom, all 15 seniors during the first six seasons under Smart graduated with at least a bachelor's degree. Three of the 15 went on to earn a master's degree. All three seniors on the 2014-15 VCU roster (Treveon Graham, Jarred Guest and Briante Weber) earned their bachelor's degrees in May 2015.

Weber made Atlantic 10 Conference history when he was named the A10 Defensive Player of the Year for the third straight season in 2014-15. Despite suffering a season-ending injury in late January, he finished third all-time in NCAA history with 374 career steals and led the nation with 121 steals during the 2013-14 season (13th-best total in NCAA Division I history). Graham, a two-time All-Atlantic 10 First Team selection, completed his career ranked second on the VCU all-time scoring list with 1,882 points and fifth in school history with 803 career rebounds.

Smart led VCU to a 26-10 overall record in 2014-15, including a 12-6 mark in the Atlantic 10 Conference and a No. 25 ranking in the final Associated Press poll. The Rams captured the 2015 Atlantic 10 Tournament championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Second Round before falling to Ohio State (75-72) in overtime. This marked the program's first A10 title and ninth overall conference title for VCU. The Rams became the first team since Xavier in 2006 to win four games in four days at the A10 Tournament. VCU finished the year at No. 15 in the NCAA RPI with the nation's toughest non-conference schedule and the eighth-toughest overall schedule. The Rams posted 14 wins against the NCAA RPI Top 100, with nine of those victories coming away from home.

In 2013-14, the Rams registered a 26-9 mark, including a 12-4 record in the A10. VCU advanced to the NCAA Tournament Second Round and ranked No. 24 in the final AP poll. The Rams climbed as high as No. 10 in The AP poll on Nov. 19, 2013, the highest AP ranking in school history (previous best was No. 11 on March 11, 1985).

Smart helped VCU make the transition from the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) to the Atlantic 10 Conference in 2012-13, and the Rams registered a 27-9 mark, including a 12-4 record in the A10. VCU advanced to the NCAA Tournament Third Round before falling to eventual NCAA finalist Michigan. The Rams were ranked No. 25 in the final AP poll, the school's first appearance in the final poll since the 1984-85 season.



Despite the graduation of four of its five leading scorers from the 2011 Final Four team, Smart paced VCU to a 29-7 overall record in the 2011-12 season. The 29 wins set a school single-season record. The Rams posted a 15-3 mark in league play and won the CAA Tournament championship in their final year in the conference. VCU advanced to the NCAA Tournament Third Round, defeating Wichita State in the Round of 64 before falling to Indiana (63-61).

Smart's tenure in VCU will be forever linked to the magical 2010-11 season, which saw the Rams advance to the NCAA Final Four for the first time in school history. VCU posted a 28-12 overall record, including a 12-6 mark in CAA play, and earned a No. 11 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Forced to play in a First Four game in Dayton, the Rams registered five consecutive upsets in what many experts called the greatest run to the Final Four in tourney history. Along the way, VCU defeated "Power 5" schools USC (59-46), Georgetown (74-56), Purdue (94-76), Florida State (72-71 OT) and Kansas (71-61). The Rams' victory against Kansas, the No. 1 seed in the Southwest Region, was voted the "Best Upset" of 2011 at ESPN's annual ESPY Awards.

VCU, which fell to Butler in the NCAA semifinals, finished the season ranked No. 6 in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll, the highest in school and CAA history. Smart earned the Fritz Pollard and Clarence Gaines National Coach of the Year Awards.

In his first year with the Rams, Smart paced VCU to a 27-9 overall record, including an 11-7 mark in the CAA, and the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) championship. VCU's run to the CBI title included wins against George Washington (79-73), College of Charleston (93-86) and Boston University (88-75) before a two-game sweep of Saint Louis (68-56 and 71-65 wins) in the championship series. That team was led by Larry Sanders, who was selected as the No. 15 overall pick in the 2010 NBA Draft by the Milwaukee Bucks, marking the highest NBA draft pick in VCU program history.

## GETTING STARTED

Prior to his time at VCU, Smart worked as an assistant under notable coaches Billy Donovan (Florida), Oliver Purnell (Clemson and Dayton) and Keith Dambrot (Akron). During his one year with Donovan at Florida, he helped lead the Gators to a 25-11 mark and a trip to the Postseason NIT quarterfinals in 2008-09. The 25 victories marked the fifth-highest number of wins in a single season in program history.

He also worked for Purnell at Dayton as director of basketball operations for two seasons (2001-03). During that time, the Flyers registered a 45-17 mark and won the 2003 Atlantic 10 Championship. The 2002-03 squad posted a 24-6 record and earned a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Smart began his coaching career as an assistant at California University (Pa.) from 1999-2001. During his two seasons, the school recorded a 40-16 mark. While there, he also earned his master's degree in social science in 2001.

## THE PERSONAL SIDE

A four-year starter and three-year team captain at Kenyon College (Gambier, Ohio), Smart graduated magna cum laude in 1999 with a degree in history. He still holds the school single-season (184 in 1998-99) and career (542) records for most assists.

In his senior season, he earned All-North Coast Conference (NCAC) honors and was tabbed the league's Scholar Athlete of the Year. Smart was one of 20 students named to the 1999 USA Today All-USA Academic Team and earned a prestigious NCAA postgraduate scholarship.

A native of Madison, Wis., Smart was born on April 8, 1977. He and his wife, Maya, have one daughter, Zora Sanae (born Sept. 25, 2011).

A former assistant on Shaka Smart's staff at Virginia Commonwealth University who has 20 years of collegiate coaching experience, David Cason begins his first season as an assistant coach at The University of Texas.

The 43-year-old Cason served as an assistant coach at VCU during the 2014-15 season. The Rams posted a 26-10 overall record, including a 12-6 mark in the Atlantic 10 Conference and a No. 25 ranking in the final AP poll. VCU captured the 2015 Atlantic 10 Tournament championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Second Round before falling to Ohio State (75-72) in overtime. This marked the program's first A10 title and ninth overall conference title for VCU. The Rams became the first team since Xavier in 2006 to win four games in four days at the A10 Tournament.

VCU finished the year at No. 15 in the NCAA RPI with the nation's toughest non-conference schedule and the eighth-toughest overall schedule. The Rams posted 14 wins against the NCAA RPI Top 100, with nine of those victories coming away from home. VCU ranked third nationally (+5.4) in turnover margin and fourth in steals per game (9.5 spg).

Cason worked for three years (2011-14) as an assistant at Vanderbilt under Kevin Stallings and helped the Commodores post a 56-43 (.566) record. Vanderbilt registered a 25-11 mark in 2011-12, won the Southeastern Conference (SEC) Tournament championship for the first time in 60 years (1952) and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Third Round.

He helped develop a pair of 2012 All-SEC First Team selections in Jeffery Taylor and John Jenkins. Taylor, who finished his career as the school's second all-time leading scorer (1,897 points), was selected as the No. 31 overall pick in the 2012 NBA Draft by Charlotte and spent his first three seasons in the league with the Hornets. As a junior in 2011-12, Jenkins led the SEC in scoring (19.9 ppg) and topped the nation in three-pointers made per game (3.9) while earning third-team All-America honors by The Associated Press. He was selected as the No. 23 overall pick in the 2012 NBA Draft by Atlanta and is currently with the Dallas Mavericks after playing his first three seasons in the league with the Hawks.

Cason spent six seasons at the University of Tulsa on head coach Doug Wojcik's staff, including the last three in the role of associate head coach. The Golden Hurricane posted a 123-78 (.612) overall record in his six years, including four straight 20-win seasons (2007-10), made two Postseason NIT appearances (2009 and 2010) and won the 2008 College Basketball Invitational (CBI) championship. He helped recruit and coached Jordan Clarkson for one season (2010-11) at Tulsa, where Clarkson earned Conference USA All-Freshman team honors. Clarkson was selected as the No. 46 overall pick in the 2014 NBA Draft by the Washington Wizards (traded to the Los Angeles Lakers on draft night) and is currently in his second season in the league with the Lakers.

Prior to his time at Tulsa, Cason served as an assistant coach for two seasons (2003-05) at TCU. The Horned Frogs registered a 21-14 mark and advanced to the Postseason NIT quarterfinals in 2004-05.

He spent three years (2000-03) as the director of basketball operations at the University of North Carolina under head coach Matt Doherty. In his first season (2000-01), the Tar Heels won 26 games and earned a No. 1 national ranking late in the regular season. UNC won a share of the Atlantic Coast Conference's regular-season championship with a 13-3 league record, advanced to the ACC Tournament final and claimed the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament South Regional.

Cason served as director of basketball operations at Notre Dame for one season (1999-2000) under Doherty. The Irish posted a 22-15 record and advanced to the Postseason NIT championship game. He also worked for three seasons (1996-99) as an assistant coach at Eastern Illinois University under Rick Samuels.

He played his first two years (1991-93) of college basketball at the College of Southern Idaho (1991-93). Cason led the Scenic West Conference in assists during each of his two seasons and earned second-team all-region honors as a sophomore. He played his final two seasons at Illinois State (1993-95), when Stallings was the head coach for the Redbirds. Cason led the Missouri Valley Conference in assists in both years and remains the school's leader in career assists per game (6.0 apg). In his senior season (1994-95), he earned second-team All-Missouri Valley Conference honors, claimed the Doug Collins Award as the team's Most Valuable Player and was named the top athlete at Illinois State. Cason also set the school single-game record for assists with 16.

He began his coaching career the following year (1995-96) as a student assistant coach under Stallings. Cason earned his bachelor's degree in recreation management from Illinois State in 1996.

A native of Baltimore, Md., Cason (born Aug. 12, 1972) and his wife, Tamara, have three children, daughters Da-Via (born Feb. 15, 1992) and Taylor (born July 14, 2002), and son, DJ (born Nov. 30, 2004).

# Assistant Coach Darrin Horn

## 1st season at Texas

A former head coach at the University of South Carolina and Western Kentucky University, Darrin Horn begins his first season as an assistant coach at The University of Texas.

During his nine seasons as a head coach (2003-12), the 42-year-old Horn posted an overall record of 171-111 (.606) and guided his teams to one NCAA Tournament and three Postseason NIT appearances. Every player who completed his eligibility under Horn, both at South Carolina and Western Kentucky, earned his degree. Prior to his hire at Texas, Horn worked for the last three years as a college basketball analyst with ESPN and the SEC Network.

Horn spent four years as head coach at South Carolina (2008-12), recording a 60-63 (.488) overall mark and leading the Gamecocks to one Postseason NIT appearance. In his first season (2008-09), he led South Carolina to a 21-10 mark and a Southeastern Conference Eastern Division Co-Championship with a 10-6 league record. The Gamecocks recorded their first 20-win season and made their first postseason appearance (NIT First Round) since 2005-06.

He developed Devan Downey into an Associated Press honorable mention All-American and All-SEC First Team selection in 2008-09. Horn also was a finalist for the 2009 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award. His squad earned its highest GPA on record (3.007) in the spring of 2009.

His second season (2009-10) was highlighted by a home upset of then-No. 1 Kentucky. The win over the Wildcats was South Carolina's first in eight games against a top-ranked opponent in the school's 102 seasons of basketball. Horn also helped Downey become a finalist for the 2010 Bob Cousy Award, honoring the nation's top point guard. During the 2010-11 campaign, senior Sam Muldrow collected just the second triple-double in program history and went on to earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Horn served as head coach at Western Kentucky, his alma mater, for five years (2003-08). He guided the Hilltoppers to a 111-48 (.698) overall mark, highlighted by a 29-7 record, Sun Belt Conference regular season and tournament titles, and a trip to the NCAA "Sweet 16" in 2007-08. The 29 wins tied the school record for a single season. The No. 12 seed Hilltoppers posted victories against fifth-seeded Drake and 13th-seeded San Diego in the first two rounds before falling in the regional semifinals to top-seed and eventual semifinalist UCLA.

He developed Courtney Lee into the 2008 Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. Lee averaged 20.4 points per game in his senior season and finished his career tied with Jim McDaniels as the all-time leading scorer at WKU with 2,238 points. Lee, who was selected as the No. 22 overall pick in the 2008 NBA Draft by the Orlando Magic, is completing his seventh season in the NBA and currently plays for the Memphis Grizzlies.

Horn also recruited and coached Jeremy Evans for two seasons (2006-07 and 2007-08) at Western Kentucky. Evans went on to become the all-time leader in career blocked shots (224) at WKU and was selected as the No. 55 overall pick in the 2010 NBA Draft by the Utah Jazz. The 2012 Sprite NBA All-Star Weekend Slam Dunk Contest champion, he is completing his fifth season in the NBA, all with the Jazz.

Known for his up-tempo offense and pressure defense, Horn's 2006-07 team registered a 22-11 record, its third straight season of at least 20 wins. No Hilltopper head coach had led Western Kentucky to three consecutive years of at least 20 wins in his first four seasons until Horn accomplished the feat. WKU went 12-6 in the Sun Belt Conference, and all six defeats were by five points or less.

The Hilltoppers went 23-8 in 2005-06, winning the Sun Belt Conference East Division for the first time since 2002-03 (12-2 league record). Western Kentucky reached the championship game of the league's postseason tournament and played in the Postseason NIT First Round. The Hilltoppers posted a 22-9 mark in 2004-05 and advanced to the Postseason NIT Second Round. WKU recorded the program's first victory in a national postseason tournament game since Horn was a senior in 1994-95.

# TEXAS BASKETBALL



Prior to beginning his head coaching career, Horn served as an assistant under Tom Crean at Marquette for four seasons (1999-2003). He helped the Golden Eagles make appearances in two NCAA Tournaments and one Postseason NIT. In 2002-03, Marquette tallied a 27-6 mark, won the Conference USA regular-season title (14-2 league record) and advanced to the NCAA semifinals as a No. 3 seed with wins over second-seeded Pittsburgh and top-seeded Kentucky.

Horn was the staff's primary recruiter for Travis Diener and Steve Novak. Diener earned All-Conference USA honors in each of his four seasons at Marquette, claimed honorable mention All-America recognition by The Associated Press as a senior in 2004-05 and ranks sixth in school history in career scoring (1,691 points). He was the No. 38 overall pick in the 2005 NBA Draft by the Orlando Magic and played five seasons in the league with the Magic, Indiana Pacers and Portland Trail Blazers. Novak is Marquette's all-time career leader in three-pointers made (354) and free throw percentage (.931) and ranked 10th on the school's all-time scoring list (1,567 points) when he completed his eligibility. Novak, the No. 32 overall pick in the 2006 NBA Draft by the Houston Rockets, is currently in his 10th season in the league and currently plays for the Oklahoma City Thunder.

He worked as an assistant coach at Morehead State University for two years (1997-99) under Kyle Macy. Horn began his coaching career as an assistant at Western Kentucky for two seasons (1995-97) under Matt Kilcullen.

Horn was a four-time letterwinner and three-year starter at guard for Western Kentucky (1991-95). He helped lead the Hilltoppers to four consecutive 20-win seasons, two Sun Belt Conference championships and a pair of Sun Belt Tournament titles. Horn was one of three players to aid WKU in reaching national postseason play in four consecutive seasons, a first in school history, as the Hilltoppers played in the 1992 Postseason NIT and followed with three straight NCAA Tournament appearances.

While playing at Western Kentucky, Horn recorded career totals of 1,115 points and 139 steals, while connecting on 36.7 percent of his three-point field goal attempts. An All-Sun Belt selection during his senior year (1994-95), he helped the Hilltoppers to a 27-4 record (17-1 Sun Belt), Sun Belt Conference regular-season and tournament championships and a NCAA Tournament First Round win against Michigan. Horn also was tabbed WKU's "Athlete of the Year" and earned a spot on the GTE Academic All-America Third Team in 1994-95. The Hilltoppers posted a 26-6 record in Horn's sophomore season (1992-93) and advanced to the NCAA Tournament "Sweet 16."

A native of Glasgow, Ky., Horn was born on Dec. 24, 1972. He and his wife, Carla, have one daughter, Caroline (born Oct. 7, 2000), and one son, Walker (born May 19, 2003).





# Assistant Coach Mike Morrell

**Pronunciation: more-ELLE**  
**1st season at Texas**

A former assistant on Shaka Smart's staff at Virginia Commonwealth University, Mike Morrell begins his first season as an assistant coach at The University of Texas.

The 33-year-old Morrell served as an assistant coach at VCU under Smart for the past two seasons (2013-14 and 2014-15), when the Rams posted a 52-19 (.732) overall mark, won the 2015 Atlantic 10 Tournament championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in both years. He was the director of basketball operations at VCU in 2011-12 and 2012-13, when he handled the Rams' day-to-day operations and oversaw team travel, scheduling and practice schedules.

During Morrell's four seasons at VCU (2011-15), the Rams posted an overall record of 108-35 (.755) and made four NCAA Tournament appearances. VCU was ranked in the final Associated Press poll in 2012-13 (No. 25), 2013-14 (No. 24) and 2014-15 (No. 25), a program first.

The Rams led the country in steals per game for three consecutive seasons (2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14) and ranked fourth nationally this past year (9.5 spg). In 2012-13, VCU's 422 total steals shattered the Atlantic 10 single-season record of 352 set by Xavier in 1998-99. The 422 thefts marked the 18th-highest single-season total in NCAA Division I history. During the 2013-14 season, the Rams registered 391 steals, 21 more than any other squad.

VCU also ranked near the top of the national statistics in turnover margin and opponent turnover rate. The Rams led the nation in turnover margin in 2011-12 (+6.47) and 2012-13 (+8.03) and ranked third nationally (+5.4) during the recent 2014-15 season. VCU's +8.03 mark in 2012-13 was the sixth-best by a NCAA Division I team since 1992-93.

VCU posted a 26-10 overall record in 2014-15, including a 12-6 mark in the Atlantic 10 Conference and a No. 25 ranking in the final AP poll. The Rams captured the 2015 Atlantic 10 Tournament championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Second Round before falling to Ohio State (75-72) in overtime. This marked the program's first A10 title and ninth overall conference title for VCU. The Rams became the first team since Xavier in 2006 to win four games in four days at the A10 Tournament. VCU finished the year at No. 15 in the NCAA RPI with the nation's toughest non-conference schedule and the eighth-toughest overall schedule. The Rams posted 14 wins against the NCAA RPI Top 100, with nine of those victories coming away from home.

In 2013-14, the Rams registered a 26-9 mark, including a 12-4 record in the A10. VCU advanced to the NCAA Tournament Second Round and ranked No. 24 in the final AP poll. The Rams climbed as high as No. 10 in The AP poll on Nov. 19, 2013, the highest AP ranking in school history (previous best was No. 11 on March 11, 1985).

VCU made the transition from the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) to the Atlantic 10 Conference in 2012-13, and the Rams registered a 27-9 mark, including a 12-4 record in the A10. VCU advanced to the NCAA Tournament Third Round before falling to eventual NCAA finalist Michigan. The Rams were ranked No. 25 in the final AP poll, the school's first appearance in the final poll since 1984-85.

Despite the graduation of four of its five leading scorers from the 2011 Final Four team, VCU tallied a 29-7 overall record in 2011-12. The 29 wins set a school single-season record. The Rams posted a 15-3 mark in league play and won the CAA Tournament championship in their final year in the conference. VCU advanced to the NCAA Tournament Third Round, defeating Wichita State in the Round of 64 before falling to Indiana (63-61).

Prior to his arrival at VCU, Morrell was an assistant coach at Charleston Southern (North Charleston, S.C.) for one year in 2010-11. He spent three seasons (2007-10) on the staff at Clemson under head coach Oliver Purnell. As a graduate assistant in 2007-08, he handled film breakdown for opponent scouting, organizing recruiting mail-outs and assisting with the coordination of the Oliver Purnell Basketball Camp. Morrell first worked directly with Smart that year, when Smart was an assistant for the Tigers. He then served as director of basketball operations at Clemson for two years (2008-09 and 2009-10). The Tigers advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of his three seasons on the staff.

Morrell started his coaching career as an assistant coach at King College (Bristol, Tenn.) for two years (2005-06 and 2006-07). He helped the Tornados post a 23-11 overall mark in his second season, winning the 2007 Appalachian Athletic Conference Tournament and advancing to the NAIA National Tournament first round. While at King, Morrell also served as the school's golf coach.

Morrell (born Aug. 22, 1982) was a two-sport athlete at Milligan College in northeast Tennessee (Milligan College, Tenn.). He scored over 1,400 career points, a mark that ranks in the top 10 in school history. A three-year starter, Morrell helped the Buffaloes earn a berth in the NAIA National Tournament as a freshman in 2000-01. He also was a two-time all-conference golfer who led the team to a league championship in 2003. A native of Elizabethton, Tenn., Morrell earned his bachelor's degree in history in 2005.

A former player and special assistant at The University of Texas, Jai Lucas begins his first season as Men's Basketball Director of Operations and his third year in association with The University of Texas.

The 26-year-old Lucas spent the past two seasons (2013-14 and 2014-15) as a special assistant on the coaching staff at Texas. In that role, he assisted in all internal operations of the basketball program.

Prior to joining the Texas staff, Lucas played three seasons professionally. He played two years in the National Basketball Association Development League (NBA D-League), where he saw action with the Idaho Stampede (2012-13) and the Canton Charge (2013), and one year overseas in Latvia with BK Valmiera in the Baltic Basketball League (2011-12).

A guard who played in 58 career games (one start) during his two seasons at UT (2009-10 and 2010-11), Lucas scored a total of 169 points and recorded a 70-to-40 assist-to-turnover ratio in 662 minutes played while helping the Longhorns to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. He earned his bachelor's degree in corporate communication in 2011.

Lucas spent his freshman season (2007-08) and the Fall 2008 semester at The University of Florida and earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman team. Smart was an assistant coach at Florida during the 2008-09 season. Lucas started all 36 games as a freshman, helping Florida post a 24-12 record and advance to the Postseason NIT semifinals. He transferred from Florida and enrolled at Texas beginning in the Spring 2009 semester.

A 2007 graduate of Bellaire High School in Houston, Lucas was a McDonald's All-American, a Jordan Brand All-American and a Parade All-America Second Team selection as a senior. He was a three-year starter and three-time District 21-5A Player of the Year who led Bellaire to three consecutive district titles.

A sports communications consultant and author who has 30 years of coaching experience at both the collegiate and high school levels, Denny Kuiper begins his first season as Special Assistant to the Head Men's Basketball Coach at The University of Texas.

The 66-year-old Kuiper has spent the previous 14 years as a sports communication consultant, working with several college and high school sports teams and individual coaches to develop positive team chemistry, relationships, trust, open communication and a healthy environment. He assisted coaches and athletes on developing their mental and emotional capacity to become better teams and athletes.

Kuiper worked as consultant with VCU's 2011 Final Four and Marquette's 2003 Final Four teams. He also took a series of college all-star teams overseas during the summers from 2004-07 to Chile, Slovenia, Austria and Spain.

In 2008, he authored the book "Know Yourself as a Coach," which focuses on developing the mental side of coaching, assessing one's coaching style, analyzing where one's strengths and weaknesses lie, and honing one's people skills.

Prior to his time as a consultant and author, Kuiper worked for 30 years as a guidance counselor and coach. He got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant coach at his alma mater, Central Michigan University, in 1971-72. Kuiper served as head coach at Mount Pleasant (Mich.) Sacred Heart High School for three years (1973-76), leading his team to the Class D state championship in 1975.

He was an assistant coach at Northwood Institute (Midland, Mich.) in 1976-77 and the head coach at Midland Bullock Creek High School (Midland, Mich.) during the following season. Kuiper served two stints as head coach at Mount Pleasant High School (Mount Pleasant, Mich.) for a total of eight seasons (1978-83 and 1986-89). Kuiper also taught physical education at Mount Pleasant Sacred Heart School (1973-76) and was a guidance counselor at Midland Bullock Creek High School (1976-78), West Intermediate School (1978-87) and Mount Pleasant High

School (1987-2001). During his time at Mount Pleasant High School, his responsibilities included academic planning and scheduling, college and scholarship applications, coordinating the NCAA Clearinghouse program, personal counseling and developing a master schedule for teaching assignments.

Kuiper played basketball for four seasons at Central Michigan (1967-71) and helped the Chippewas advance to a pair of NCAA Division II Tournament appearances in 1970 and 1971. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education/sociology from Central Michigan in 1971. Kuiper went on to earn a master's degree in guidance & counseling from Central Michigan in 1976 and a second master's degree in physical education from Central Michigan in 1977.

A native of Hudsonville, Mich., Kuiper was born on March 29, 1949. He and his wife, Terree, have four children (Jeff Yardley, Melissa Mahoney, Jason Yardley and Amy Moore) and 10 grandchildren.

### Daniel Roose

#### STRENGTH & CONDITIONING COACH

1st season at Texas

The former Director of Sports Performance for Men's Basketball on Shaka Smart's staff at Virginia Commonwealth University, Daniel Roose begins his first season as Strength and Conditioning Coach for Men's Basketball at The University of Texas.

The 38-year-old Roose served as Director of Sports Performance for Men's Basketball during each of Smart's six seasons at VCU (2009-15). The Rams posted an overall record of 163-56 (.744) and made five NCAA Tournament appearances.

VCU and Duke are the only two programs in the country to have posted at least 26 wins in each of the past six seasons. In addition, VCU is one of only 11 schools in the nation to earn a NCAA Tournament bid in each of the past five years (Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Louisville, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, San Diego State and Wisconsin). The Rams' NCAA appearance this past March marked the first time in school history VCU had advanced to the Big Dance five straight years, and the first time in the history of the Commonwealth of Virginia that a Division I basketball program had accomplished that feat.

Smart's style of play during his time at VCU was termed "Havoc." Simply stated, it was a high-octane platform marked by full-court pressure and transition offense. Roose was the architect of the physical conditioning program needed to play that style of basketball.

The Rams led the country in steals per game for three consecutive seasons (2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14) and ranked fourth nationally this past year (9.5 spg). In 2012-13, VCU's 422 total steals shattered the Atlantic 10 single-season record of 352 set by Xavier in 1998-99. The 422 thefts marked the 18th-highest single-season total in NCAA Division I history. During the 2013-14 season, the Rams registered 391 steals, 21 more than any other squad.

VCU also ranked near the top of the national statistics in turnover margin and opponent turnover rate under Smart's guidance. The Rams led the nation in turnover margin in 2011-12 (+6.47) and 2012-13 (+8.03) and ranked third nationally (+5.4) during the recent 2014-15 season. VCU's +8.03 mark in 2012-13 was the sixth-best turnover margin by a NCAA Division I team since the 1992-93 season.

Roose and Smart's tenure in VCU will be forever linked to the magical 2010-11 season, which saw the Rams advance to the NCAA Final Four for the first time in school history. VCU posted a 28-12 overall record, including a 12-6 mark in CAA play, and earned a No. 11 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Forced to play in a First Four game in Dayton, the Rams registered five consecutive upsets in what many experts called the greatest run to the Final Four in tourney history. Along the way, VCU defeated "Power 5" schools USC (59-46), Georgetown (74-56), Purdue (94-76), Florida State (72-71 OT) and Kansas (71-61). VCU, which fell to Butler in the NCAA semi-finals, finished the season ranked No. 6 in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll, the highest in school and CAA history.

Prior to his arrival at VCU, Roose spent two years at The University of North Carolina at Pembroke (2007-09). He oversaw the strength and conditioning program of all 16 athletic teams for the Braves.

Roose served as a graduate assistant at Marshall University for one season (2004-05) and then transitioned into a role as director of strength and conditioning at Marshall for three years (2005-07). He worked directly with the basketball, volleyball, baseball and softball teams, but oversaw and designed training programs for all 15 varsity sports for the Thundering Herd. He also spent one year (2003-04) at Campbell University, serving as the head strength and conditioning coach for the Camels.

Roose earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Appalachian State in 2001. He later earned his master's degree in exercise physiology from Marshall in 2006. Certified by the National Strength and Conditioning Association, Roose also has been tabbed as a Level 1 coach by the United States Weightlifting Association.

A native of Troy, N.C., Roose was born on Oct. 10, 1977. He and his wife, Laura, have one son, Devin (born Feb. 20, 2007), and one daughter, Anna (born Jan. 23, 2012).

### Cody Hatt

#### SPECIAL ASSISTANT

1st season at Texas

A former graduate assistant on Shaka Smart's staff at Virginia Commonwealth University last year, Cody Hatt begins his first season as special assistant for Men's Basketball at The University of Texas.

The 29-year-old Hatt served as a graduate assistant at VCU during the 2014-15 season. The Rams posted a 26-10 overall record, including a 12-6 mark in the Atlantic 10 Conference and a No. 25 ranking in the final AP poll. VCU captured the 2015 Atlantic 10 Tournament championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Second Round before falling to Ohio State (75-72) in overtime. This marked the program's first A10 title and ninth overall conference title for VCU. The Rams became the first team since Xavier in 2006 to win four games in four days at the A10 Tournament.

VCU finished the year at No. 15 in the NCAA RPI with the nation's toughest non-conference schedule and the eighth-toughest overall schedule. The Rams posted 14 wins against the NCAA RPI Top 100, with nine of those victories coming away from home. VCU ranked third nationally (+5.4) in turnover margin and fourth in steals per game (9.5 spg).

Prior to joining Smart's staff at VCU, Hatt served as head boys' basketball coach, assistant dean of students, academic advisor and dorm parent for one year (2013-14) at Vermont Academy in Saxtons River, Vt.. He also spent one season (2012-13) as the assistant boys' basketball coach at Vermont Academy.

He began his undergraduate career with a one-year stay at Springfield College (Springfield, Mass.) in 2004-05, when he was a member of the 2005 Great Northeast Athletic Championship (GNAC) team and claimed All-Academic GNAC honors. Hatt transferred to Norwich University (Northfield, Vt.) for his final three years (2005-08). A three-year varsity player under coach Paul Booth, Hatt was named the Norwich Male Scholar Athlete of the Year as a senior in 2007-08. He earned his bachelor's degree magna cum laude in communications with a concentration in digital media technology from Norwich University in 2008.

Following graduation, Hatt served two years (2008-10) as a content editor at ESPN in Bristol, Conn., where he worked on shows such as "SportsCenter" and a variety of other specialty shows across various network platforms. He then spent one year (2010-11) as a content contributor for "New England Recruiting Report" and an event manager for Hoop Mountain, a national leader in basketball tournaments, camps and showcases. Hatt assisted NERR founding editor Adam Finkelstein in prospect evaluation, event coverage and features and supplied relevant content for Finkelstein's web site and national scouting service.

A native of Springfield, Vt., he was born on December 6, 1985. A four-year varsity starter at Springfield High School, Hatt was a two-time all-state selection and two-time team captain who scored over 1,000 career points. He and his wife, Lisa, reside in Austin.

# Frank Erwin Center Records

## HOME OF THE TEXAS LONGHORNS

Johnny Moore's jumper from the top of the key christened the Frank Erwin Center as Texas' home on Nov. 29, 1977. The 16,540-seat arena was an instant hit, as the 1977-78 Longhorns defeated Oklahoma 83-76 on opening day and went on to finish the season as NIT Champions. The Horns made themselves right at home at the Erwin Center – reeling off 25 straight wins before falling to Arkansas in February of 1979.

Thirty-nine years later, the FEC looks as good as it did on opening day, and the wins are still flowing, as evidenced by Texas' .809 home winning percentage at the Erwin Center.

## Retired Jersey Numbers

### Kevin Durant (#35) • At Texas: 2007 • 2007 Consensus National Player of the Year

Kevin Durant spent just one season in Austin, but it was a season for the ages. Durant (born Sept. 29, 1988) led one of the youngest teams in school history (started one sophomore and four freshmen for the majority of the year) to a 25-10 mark and the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament. Durant was the consensus National Player of the Year, becoming the first freshman in NCAA history to win any of the major National Player of the Year awards. A consensus first-team All-American, Durant was just the third freshman in NCAA history to earn that accolade (joining Wayman Tisdale of Oklahoma in 1983 and Chris Jackson of LSU in 1989).

He earned Big 12 Conference Player of the Year honors, becoming the first freshman to receive that award. Durant was the only player during the 2006-07 season to rank in the Top 10 nationally in both scoring (fourth) and rebounding (fourth). He led the Big 12 in scoring (25.8 ppg), rebounding (11.1 rpg) and blocked shots (67), and his 20 double-doubles ranked second nationally. Durant reached the 30-point mark 11 times, the 20-point plateau in 30 games and posted double digits in points in all 35 contests.

Durant turned professional following his freshman season and was selected by the Seattle Sonics (Oklahoma City Thunder) as the second overall pick in the 2007 NBA Draft. His No. 35 jersey was retired by The University of Texas on Feb. 25, 2009.

### T.J. Ford (#11) • At Texas: 2002-03 • 2003 National Player of the Year

T.J. Ford was a two-year starter at point guard for the Longhorns in 2001-02 and 2002-03. He led Texas to an appearance in the "Sweet 16" as a freshman, earning National Freshman of the Year honors by the United States Basketball Writers Association. Ford (born March 24, 1983) became the first freshman in NCAA history to lead the nation in assists (8.27 apg) and was the consensus Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Year.

He returned to lead the Longhorns to their first Final Four appearance since 1947 during his sophomore campaign and won the Naismith and Wooden Awards as the top player in college basketball. Ford also was named National Player of the Year by Chevrolet, CBS SportsLine.com, ESPN.com, The Sporting News and Sports Illustrated. A consensus first-team All-American, he led the team in scoring (15.0 ppg), assists (7.7 apg), steals (2.0 spg), free throw percentage (.820) and minutes played (33.6 mpg). Ford finished his career in second place on UT's all-time career assists list (527) and held the top two single-season assists marks in school history (273 in 2001-02; 254 in 2002-03).

Ford turned professional after his sophomore season and was selected by the Milwaukee Bucks as the eighth overall pick in the 2003 NBA Draft. His No. 11 jersey was retired by The University of Texas on Feb. 8, 2004. Ford became the first UT basketball player and just the fourth athlete in University of Texas history to have his jersey number retired, joining Earl Campbell (football), Ricky Williams (football) and Roger Clemens (baseball).

### Slater Martin (#15) • At Texas: 1944, '47-49 • Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Inductee

Slater Martin led Texas to a 63-14 record from 1947-49, including a third-place finish at the NCAA Tournament during his sophomore campaign in 1946-47. Martin (born Oct. 22, 1925) actually enrolled at Texas in the fall of 1943 and played four games as a freshman on the varsity squad. He went into military service following a 77-40 home victory over Texas A&M on Jan. 15, 1944.

Martin rejoined the Longhorns for the 1946-47 Final Four run. He earned third-team All-America honors from both the Helms Foundation and True Magazine as a junior in 1947-48. Martin garnered first-team All-America honors from the Helms Foundation and second-team All-America mention from Look Magazine during his senior year in 1948-49.

In his next-to-last game at Texas, he set a school single-game record with 49 points in an 81-60 victory against TCU on Feb. 26, 1949. During his collegiate career, he played in 78 games and broke UT's all-time scoring mark (984 points).

Following his collegiate days, Martin began an 11-year career in the National Basketball Association with the Minneapolis Lakers (1949-50 to 1955-56) and the St. Louis Hawks (1956-57 to 1959-60). The 5-10 guard established a reputation as one of the top defensive players in the league. He led his teams to five World Championships and reached the NBA Finals three additional times.

Martin earned All-NBA honors seven times and is still considered one of the greatest small men to ever play the game. He was inducted into the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1962. In 1982, he became the first Longhorns player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass. His No. 15 jersey was retired by The University of Texas on Jan. 31, 2009. Martin passed away on Oct. 18, 2012 at the age of 86.

## KEVIN DURANT

United States (2012)

Kevin Durant, the consensus National Player of Year for the Longhorns in 2006-07, was the leading scorer on the United States team that won Gold at the 2012 London Olympics. Durant's 30 points in the gold medal game tied for the third-highest single-game total in U.S. Olympic history. His 156 total points during the Olympic tournament set a record for most points scored by an American player in an Olympic competition, topping the previous mark of 145 set by Spencer Haywood in 1968 (Mexico City). In addition, Durant set the U.S. record for most three-point field goals made in an Olympic tournament with 34.

During the eight games of the Olympics, Durant led Team USA in scoring (19.5 ppg) and ranked second in rebounding (5.8 rpg) while averaging 26.0 minutes per contest. He converted 49-of-101 (.485) field goals, including 34-of-65 (.523) from three-point range, and 24-of-27 (.889) free throws. Durant added five blocks (tops on the team), 13 steals (second on the team) and 21 assists against nine turnovers.

## ALBERT ALMANZA

Mexico (1960, 1964)

A three-year letterwinner at Texas (1959-61), Albert Almanza was a two-time member of the Mexican Olympic team. In the 1960 Rome Olympics, he served as a co-captain and led the team in scoring (19.8 ppg) while helping Mexico to a 4-4 record and a 12th-place finish. Almanza returned for the 1964 Tokyo Olympics and again led the squad in scoring (14.7 ppg) while helping Mexico to a 3-6 mark and a 12th-place finish.

## JAY ARNETTE

United States (1960)

A three-year letterwinner for the Longhorns (1958-60) who garnered All-America honors during his senior year, Jay Arnette earned a gold medal with the United States at the 1960 Rome Olympics. Arnette, who had just completed his collegiate eligibility, played in all eight games and averaged 2.9 points per contest for the Americans.

The U.S. squad, coached by Cal's legendary Pete Newell, featured Oscar Robertson and Jerry West and is considered by many to be the best amateur basketball team in Olympic history. Ten members of the 12-man American roster went on to play in the NBA. Team USA averaged 101.9 points per game and posted a +42.4 points per game margin of victory en route to the gold medal.

## GILBERT 'GIB' FORD

United States (1956)

A three-year letterwinner at Texas (1952-54), "Gib" Ford became Texas' first hardwood Olympian when he earned a gold medal with the United States at the 1956 Melbourne Games. Ford, who had finished his playing career at Texas in 1954, was 25 at the time of the Olympics and enlisted in the U.S. Armed Forces. He played in all eight games and averaged 4.9 points per contest.

Behind the play of Bill Russell and K.C. Jones, two key players on the University of San Francisco's 1956 NCAA Championship team, Team USA averaged nearly 100 points per game and posted an impressive +53.5 points per game margin of victory en route to the gold medal.

## Funny-Looking Horns Have Last NIT Laugh

NEW YORK – The funniest-looking college basketball team in America won the National Invitation Tournament Tuesday night at Madison Square Garden.

"When the other team sees our guys, they're so busy giggling they can't play," analyzed Texas' Abe Lemons, the funniest coach in America. "We've been able to beat a lot of teams this way at the line-up."

After his team was dominated far worse than the 101-93 final indicated, North Carolina State Coach Norm Sloan said, "Texas is very deceptive. They don't have the look of a great basketball team physically, but they are quick and smart."

In order of appearance on the box score, Texas starts 6-5, 220-pound sophomore Ron Baxter. "For a little, fat kid, he didn't do too bad," said Lemons.

Baxter scored 26 points and hauled down 12 rebounds, eight of them offensive, in the championship game. Throwing over North Carolina State's fullcourt press, Baxter also passed for more points than any Longhorn quarterback since Bobby Layne.

Baxter and 5-11 junior guard Jim Krivacs were honored as the tournament's most valuable players. Krivacs doesn't play defense. On offense, he considers any shot within 35 feet a layup.

To go with these two unlikely MVPs, Abe recruited 6-7, 220-pound junior transfer Tyrone Branyan. Branyan neither runs nor jumps. He copied his shot from Randy Matson. He scored 14 points against the Wolfpack.

Gary Goodner, Texas' 6-7 center, fouled out of seven games this year. He looks like "before" in a Nautilus ad. The Wolfpack has about eight guys who look like "afters." Goodner scored four points and was credited with two rebounds. But as Lemons put it, "They should have put a saddle on Goodner and Krivacs the way they were getting ridden around out there."

John Moore, the 6-1 junior guard, is the only Longhorn starter who really looks like a basketball player. He tries to hide it with a shot that spins like Mother Earth. Working with Krivacs as Baxter's wide receivers, Moore ended up with 22 points.

"I might have had eight better teams during my coaching career," said Lemons. "But I never had one that played better."

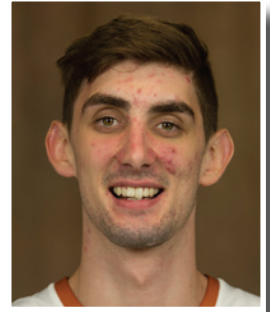

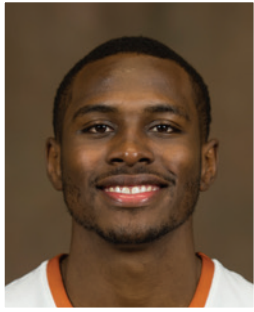
