Strengthening Education Management Information Systems (EMIS) in the Pacific

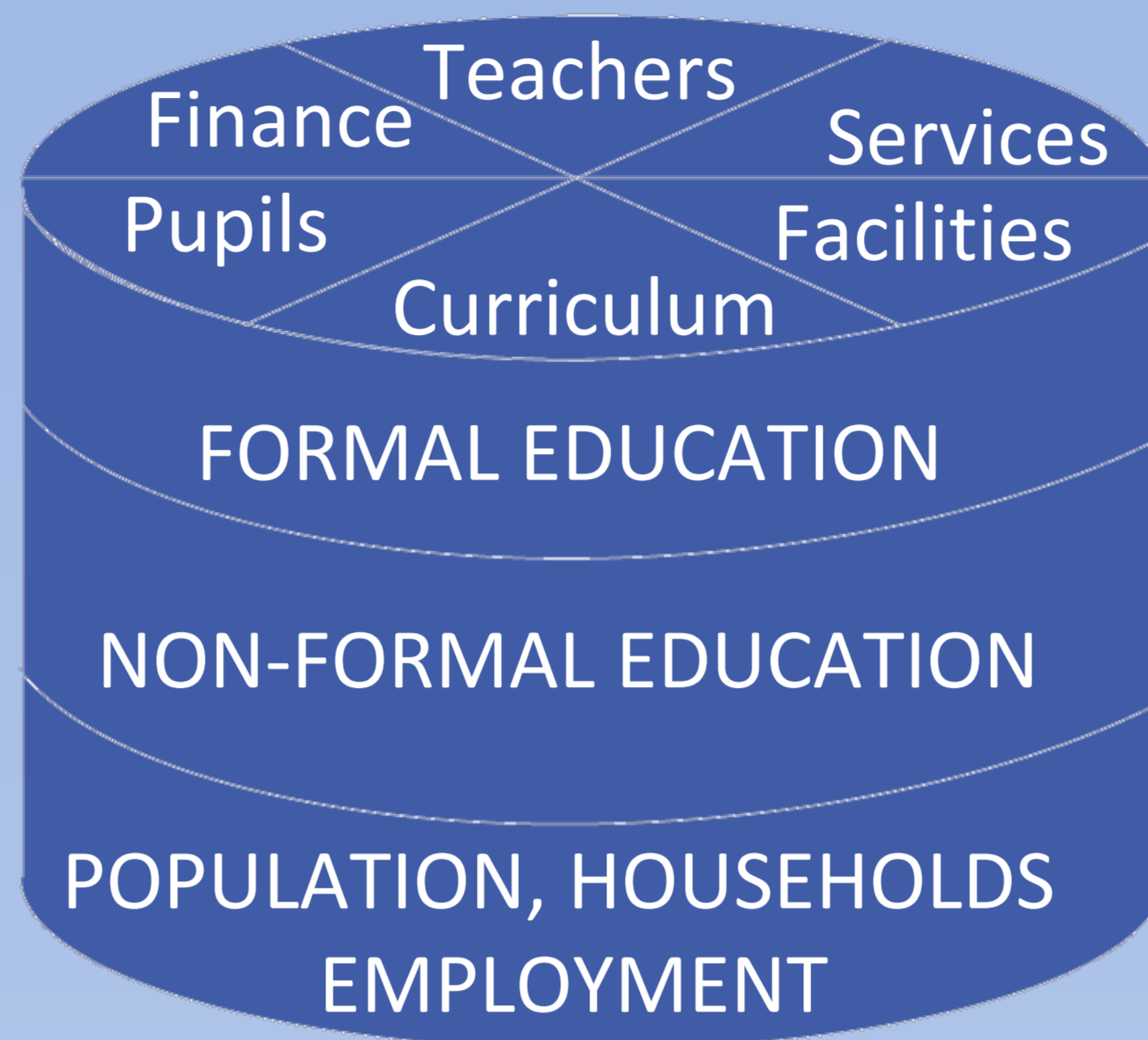
A new regional technical support facility established at the Secretariat of the Pacific Community (SPC) will assist Pacific Island countries in improving their national Education Management Information Systems (EMIS) and monitoring, leading to better education policies, programmes and resource allocation.

Education data are used by a broad spectrum of stakeholders, including parents and local communities, teachers and principals, Ministries of Education and Finance, and regional and international development partners, who all require high-quality, timely statistics to make informed decisions.

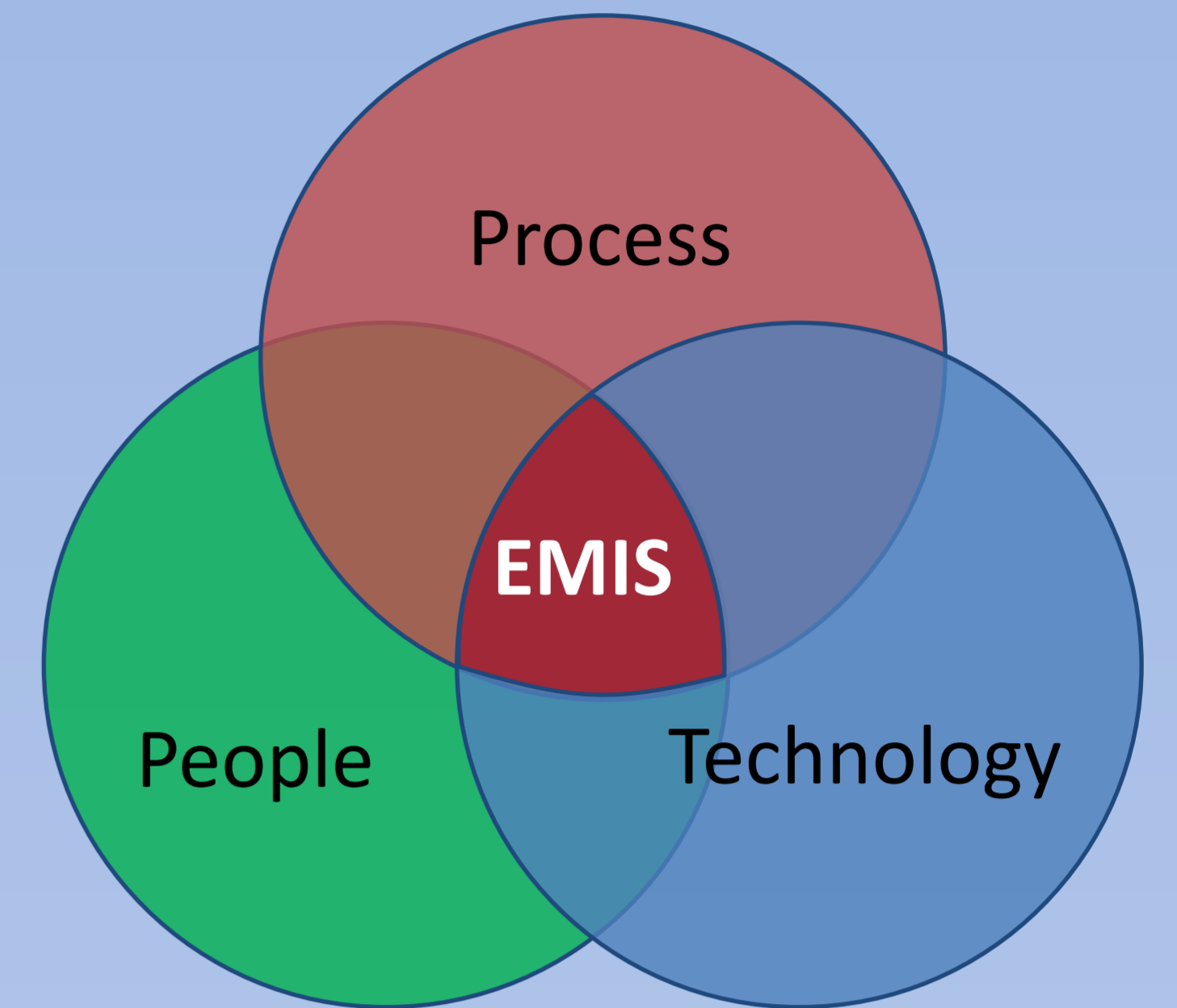
Activities of the regional facility include:

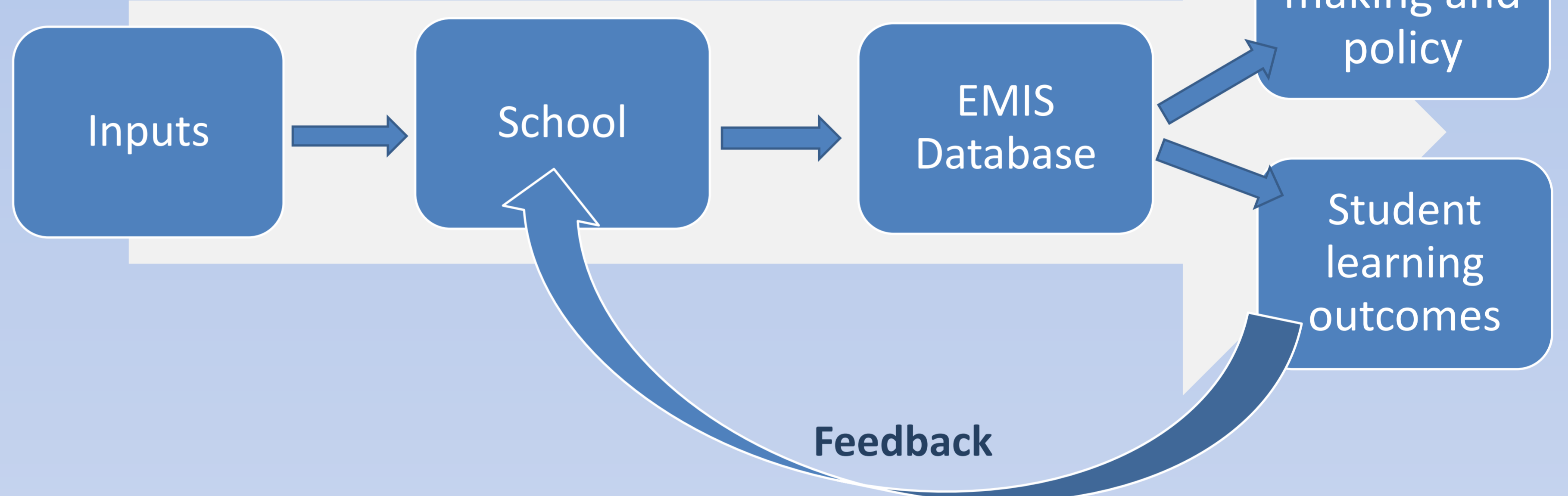

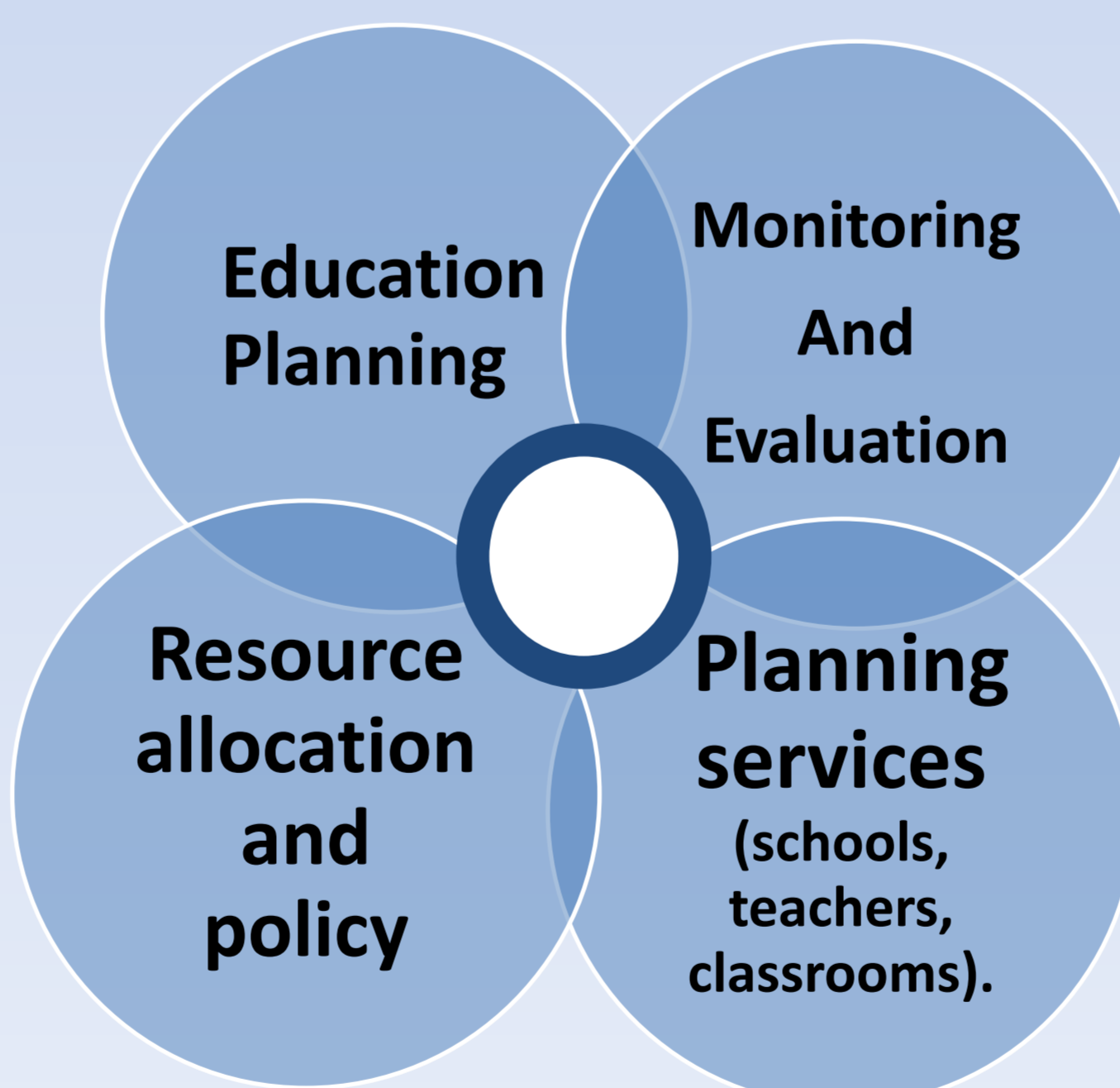
EMIS data lifecycle

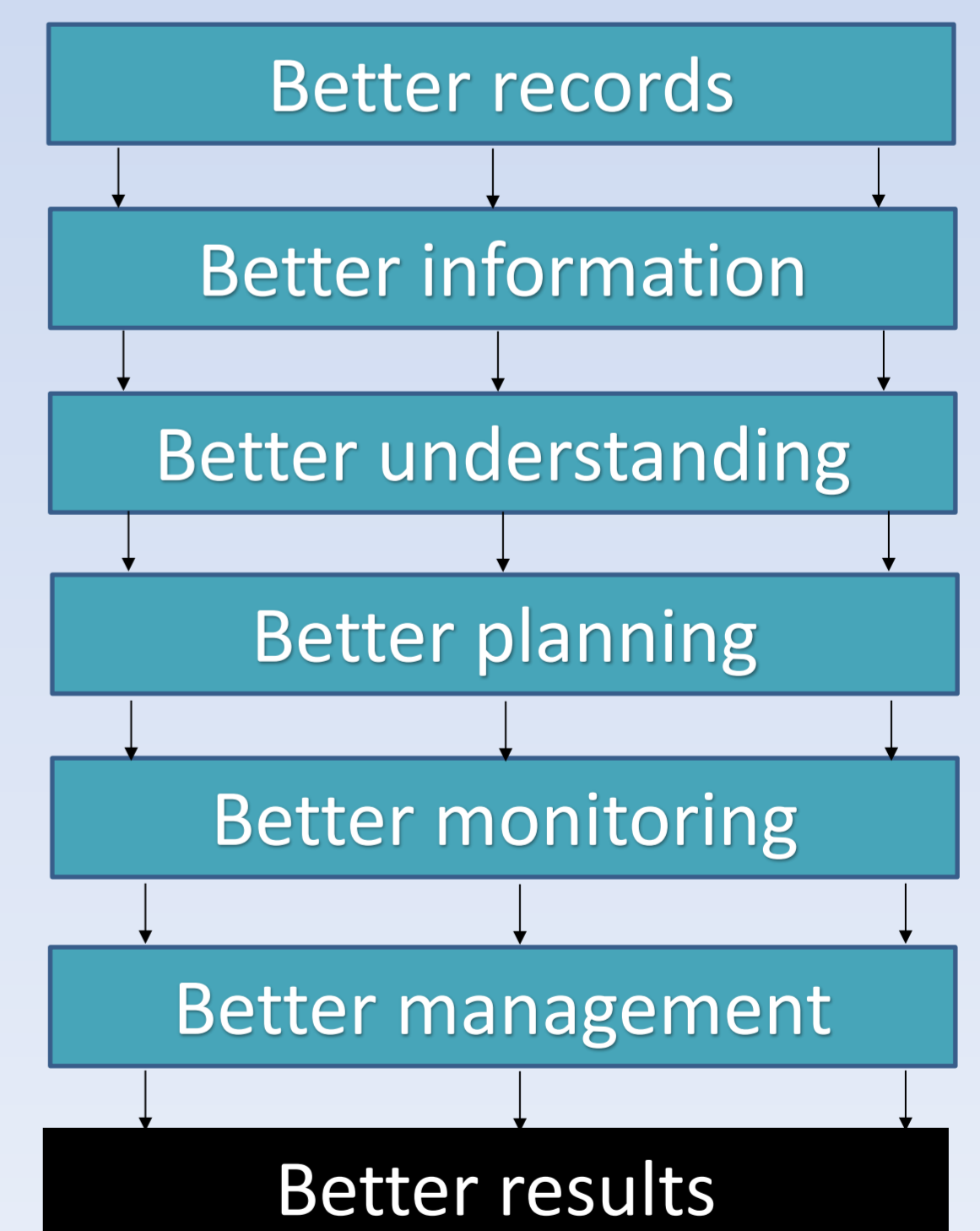

The EMIS Monitoring Evaluation (M&E) Taskforce

The Pacific EMIS M&E task force was developed by a consortium of development partners, with the aim of improving education statistics and monitoring and evaluation in the Pacific region, and improving coordination between development partners. The main activity of the EMIS M&E taskforce setup with membership from partners (UNESCO, SPC, UNICEF, NZAP, USP, DFAT and PIFS) is the development of an appropriate M&E Framework and performance indicators for Pacific Education (PEDF).
