Morocco

The Moroccan film industry has experienced continuous growth during the last two decades. Its strength resides today in its structures, and in particular in a balance between the public sector and the different support funds, and private investment illustrated by the success of Ouarzazate. Since the creation of the support fund in 1987, and thanks to a special tax on film screenings, Moroccan film production has continued to develop in quality and quantity.

Morocco has managed to create the right conditions to attract Western super-productions while fostering the emergence of a real national film industry. The development of the film exhibition circuit had made it possible from 1993 with "In Search of my Wife's Husband" by A. Tazi, for Moroccan films to enjoy remarkable box-office successes. More recently, "Satan's Angels" by Ahmed Boulane or "Nancy and the Monster" by Mahmoud Frites beat "Harry Potter" and "Spider Man". The young talent and success is there, but cinema theatres are regularly closing and box-office takings are dwindling. For the Moroccan film industry, the fight against piracy remains a big challenge for the future.

The financial envelope of the support fund went from 12 m MAD in 2000 to 50m MAD in 2006, mainly thanks to the injection of 5% of the tax revenue from advertising.

A new audiovisual production support fund was also created in 2007, but the legislative procedures for its institutionalisation are still being completed.
