**New Television Station Begins LI-Oriented Telecasts in Color**

Long Islanders woke up to a commercial television station they can call their own recently.

The station is WSNL-TV, Channel 67 on the UHF dial, according to David H. Polinger, president of Suburban Broadcasting Corporation, owner and operator of the station.

Licensed to broadcast 24 hours a day, WSNL-TV, Channel 67 will initially broadcast 16 hours a day, all in full color.

WSNL-TV went on the air almost a year to the day after Nassau and Suffolk counties were declared a Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (SMSA) by the Federal Government on November 20, 1972. Mr. Polinger noted, "The Nassau-Suffolk SMSA is generally regarded as the nation's third largest market. Mr. Polinger said, "yet until now, it's been without its own commercial TV station."

Now, WSNL-TV is scheduling more than 40 hours a week of Long Island-oriented programming. "And much of that," he added, "will be live, in contrast to the growing trend in television to broadcast an increasing amount of taped or filmed material."

Foremost among WSNL-TV's local programming efforts is the twice-nightly "67-Action News." Anchorman Gary Gunter and the 67-Action News team will concentrate on covering late-breaking Long Island news stories that often go unreported by other TV stations. "Of course, we'll also cover significant national and international goings-on, but the primary focus of 67 Action News will be on Long Island news, sports and weather," Mr. Gunter said. The show will be aired seven nights a week at 6:30 and 10:30.

Another show, "The Fair-children," aired weekdays 1-1:30 p.m. represents a unique departure in local television programming, Mr. Polinger said. "It's the first locally produced, non-network color 'soap opera' we know of," he said. "And it takes place right on Long Island. Right in Oyster Bay, in fact," Mr. Polinger continued. "It's the continuing story of a widow and her young daughter and son who move from California to Oyster Bay."

"Long Island Tonight," slated for weeknights at 11, is another live, color offering. It's a talk and variety show that draws its hosts, a different one nightly, from the ranks of Long Islanders. "You'll see local celebrities, maybe even neighbors here, performing, being interviewed, even doing the interviewing, on 'Long Island Tonight,'" Mr. Polinger said.

Other locally produced, live color offerings are "Captain Ahab," a children's program; "Trim and Slim," and "The Nassau Suffolk Woman" for the ladies; "The Long Island Home Buyer" and "Home Handyman," plus numerous news, documentary and entertainment features like "67 Nassau Suffolk Special" and "Long Island Newsmakers."

"We've got Long Island sports pretty much covered, too," Mr. Polinger said. "Thanks to our mobile video tape facilities, we'll be presenting 'The Long Island College Game of the Week' Saturday nights at 8:30. And then on Sundays, we've scheduled 'The Long Island High School Game of the Week' at 9 o'clock."

WSNL-TV will present a number of popular syndicated dramatic, adventure and talk shows. "You'll be able to watch 'Voyage to the Bottom of the Sea,' 'Lassie,' even 'The Cisco Kid,' all in color," Mr. Polinger said. "And for movie buffs, WSNL-TV's got some great ones lined up," he said. "On '67 Premier Feature Film Theater' on Monday, Wednesday and Friday nights from 8:30 to 10:30, WSNL-TV will be presenting such greats as 'The Flim Flam Man' with George C. Scott; 'A Guide for the Married Man' with Walter Matthau; and 'Von Ryan's Express' with Frank Sinatra."

Feature films are also on tap weekday afternoons from 1:30 to 3:30. Mr. Polinger said, "67 Matinee Feature Film Theater" will air top films like "Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow" with Sophia Loren; "Modesty Blaise" with Dirk Bogarde; and "The Moon is Blue" with William Holden and David Niven.

Other feature films slated for showing on WSNL-TV, Channel 67 include: "The King and I" with

Academy Award winner Yul Brynner; "The Flight of the Phoenix" with James Stewart; "The Agony and the Ecstasy" with Charlton Heston; and "Darling" with Academy Award winner Julie Christie.

The transmitting facilities are located just off the service road on the Long Island Expressway at Veterans Memorial Highway. There, on 1 1/2 acres, the station has its multi-million dollar studios, plus a 50-story antenna - one of the tallest structures on Long Island.

Mr. Polinger said "Most sets in use today are equipped to receive Channel 67. It's just a matter of learning to use the other tuning knob on your set and having a good antenna."

Long Island's more than 100,000 cable television (CATV) subscribers also will be able to receive WSNL-TV, according to Mr. Polinger. FCC regulations, he said, require all CATV services on Long Island to provide channels for WSNL-TV. "In fact," he said, "due to CATV's proven effectiveness, Long Island subscribers will have one of the best antennas in town to get us."
