
# PARISH PROFILE

# **OUR COMMUNITIES**

Ours is a caring community and in recent years we have grown together and strengthened our Christian commitment. We now pray for a Rector who will enable us to build on what we have achieved.

Our parish is a rural community within the Yorkshire Dales, offering some of England's loveliest scenery. The area is large -20 miles from end to end - and ranges from deeply rural villages and outlying farms in Coverdale, taking in the historic market town of Middleham with its long-established horse racing traditions, to the delightful villages of East Witton and Thornton Steward.

*On 1 October 2015 we became a United Parish. Until then Thornton Steward had been a separate parish in a United Benefice.* 

Farming has a strong influence throughout, as does tourism. The populations are a mix of old families, incomers, second/holiday homes and a more transient group of employees in the stable yards. Some people commute to the local towns, some further afield.

Most children in the parish attend Middleham CE Aided Primary School, going on to The Wensleydale School in nearby Leyburn.





# **OUR WORSHIP**

We have fairly recently revised the parish service books for each season of the year. These are mainly Common Worship Order 1. Some additional services use the Book of Common Prayer, and we have our own Morning Service book.

We have United Parish Communion on the second and fifth Sundays of each month, rotating around the four churches. Numbers attending have been declining, and this is an area that needs some attention.

In addition, we have: Holy Communion, Evening Prayer, Evensong, Morning Worship and Middleham Praise.

**Middleham Praise** adopts a more modern approach, usually with Powerpoint presentations, worship songs and sometimes involves children

Individual service leaflets are produced for Carol Services, Middleham Town Service, United service at Jervaulx Abbey, Maundy Thursday, Service on the Green among others.

*Our main hymn books are: Complete Anglican Hymns Old and New, but Hymns Ancient and Modern New Standard is used at Thornton Steward. Middleham have a robed choir, and there is a United Parish Choir who come together for the United Service.* 

# **CHURCH TRADITION:**

The worship and theological tradition of our churches is central, prayerful and meaningful.

Cassock, surplice and stole are worn.

We have an open policy for Baptisms and the Rector conducts preparation. Where possible these take place within a service.

We are happy to marry those who have a qualifying connection to the parishes. The Rector conducts preparation.

The Rector makes the decision on marriage of divorced people, taking into account individual circumstances.

The PCC have agreed a policy of communion before confirmation for younger people. If visitors are accustomed to receive Communion in their own church, they are welcome to take Communion with us, even before Confirmation.

We are happy to explore further lay involvement.





# **OUR MISSION PRIORITIES**

- Outreach to 20 55 age group as we seek to encourage more to join us, to learn of God's love, and be active in our churches
- Continued awareness of rural poverty/hardship/isolation, and mission to this group
- Continue support for the youth worker and contact with children and young people, especially a presence in school with Trekkers as an example of 'Fresh Expression'.
- Investigate service styles to invigorate worship experience, encouraging younger people, for example the Breakfast Service, but at the same time balancing the needs of existing congregations
- Look at ways of increasing attendance at the United Parish Communion Services.
- Continue to keep control of finance
- To develop the website and other forms of communication as part of our mission strategy.
- How to make church relevant to people leading very busy lives.

# EAST WITTON

• We would like to make more impact among people in the village who have little involvement in church activities. We would like to maintain established links with the Village Mother and Toddler Group and those who find it increasingly difficult to attend church activities.

# MIDDLEHAM

• We would like to built relationships with stable staff and those connected with the racing world.

# THORNTON STEWARD

• Would like to make more connections with many of the people who live in the village. They live very busy lives and their interests take them out of the village. Children go to school by bus, and are taken by parents to other youth groups such as guides, so there is no natural focus for young people in the village.

Bridge is printed in-house on our own machine and is a community magazine, containing reports and notices for the Methodist churches and social groups within the area. # **PARISH ACTIVITIES**

We are a group of four church communities set in the beautiful Yorkshire Dales. Together we seek to respond to, learn more of and share, the love of God shown to us in Jesus Christ. Within our group of churches there is much going on and a wide variety of people involved. We seek to take the church out to the communities using outdoor services, pastoral care, social events and fun!

### Breakfast Church

We have held one very successful Breakfast Church in Coverdale and would like to repeat this within the Parish.

#### Burns supper

A traditional Burns Supper in The Key Centre at Middleham.

**Coffee mornings** All churches hold coffee mornings for fellowship and fundraising.

#### Coverdale fun day

An exciting event for Coverdale held every two years, with emphasis on outdoor activities and a family picnic. All ages participate

**Crib services** Based on East Witton and Coverham Churches but for everyone. All ages.

#### Drop in for coffee and chat

Every three weeks a group from East Witton Church host a drop in session at the Parish Room.

### Food for Thought

We have, in recent years, held three sessions during Lent with a delicious meal followed by a speaker talking on the place of Christian beliefs in his/her life. Each meal prepared by one of the churches.

#### Middleham Stable Open Day Event.

We invite visitors to come into church for free refreshments.

#### Harvest

All churches have a Harvest Festival service followed by refreshment, and often an auction of produce.

#### House/Study Groups In the past we have held:

Alpha courses Monthly housegroups Nooma course Pilgrim Confirmation/Baptism preparation

#### Jervaulx service

A special annual outdoor United Parishes Service in the grounds of Jervaulx Abbey, followed by picnic lunch and games for the children.





#### *Lambing Service A special service in Coverdale for all ages to give thanks for this season's lambs.*

## Music

We are indebted to our organists who play for all the services, and in addition lead choir practice sessions. Occasionally other music is provided. There is a team of ten bellringers, with more in training, who ring at East Witton and Middleham.

### **Open Gardens** :

Thornton Steward and Middleham have both operated Open Gardens, offering an opportunity to talk to visitors. Afternoon tea available in the Institute (TS) and Church (M). Thornton Steward also hold a Garden Party.

### Palm Sunday procession

Palm Sunday starts with bacon butties at East Witton Parish Room, followed by a procession to church. This is a United Parish Service.





Parish lunches

Many of the churches have parish lunches. These are mainly for fellowship, inviting people from the village.

# Parish Pilgrimage

An annual parish trip taking a coachload (up to 53) to places such as Holy Island, Durham, York Minster, Rievaulx Abbey. The day finishes with our own act of worship.

#### Parish visiting team

A team with trained volunteers who arrange to visit the sick, the needy and the lonely of the parishes.

#### Plant sales

Coverdale Churches have annual plant sales.

#### School events

The church is involved in school events throughout the year, and the school visit for a special service at the end of each term. There is a team of people taking weekly assembly on a rota basis. A particularly successful event is the Christingle Service.



**St Botolph's Day** This is a special day's celebration at Horsehouse with an outdoor service followed by a picnic lunch.

### Service on the Green

An outdoor service at East Witton in the summer.

#### The Trekkers

A fortnightly after school club based in Middleham School with music, drama, craft and stories. Open to all primary aged children. It always starts with a healthy snack. A dedicated team from both the Anglican and Methodist churches.



#### Town Service

A special service at Middleham involving people from the community to celebrate all that is good in the area. We would like it to continue.

### East Witton Under 5s

Although not a church group, there is a regular presence from church to encourage young parents and their children.

## Youth Work - The Lower Wensleydale Youth Project

The Parishes have worked together on fundraising with the local Methodist Church, and also the Anglican and Methodist Churches in Masham and now employ a part-time youth worker. She holds regular sessions for children and young people throughout the two areas. The Rector would be involved in management of the youth worker and also occasionally with a presence at the youth sessions.



# A Festival of Angels

In December 2014 Middleham held a Festival of Angels, inviting contributions from the local groups and the community. The response was overwhelming, covering all ages and abilities. We would like to continue with similar events that capture the imagination of the whole community.



#### Concerts

The Swaledale Festival use some of our churches as venues for concerts. In addition, East Witton hosts concerts by The Rural Belles and The Wensleydale Chorus.

#### Richard III

There is a strong link with Richard III at Middleham Church and there is a permanent display there. The Richard III Society visit on the anniversary of the Battle of Bosworth and hold a prayer service.
