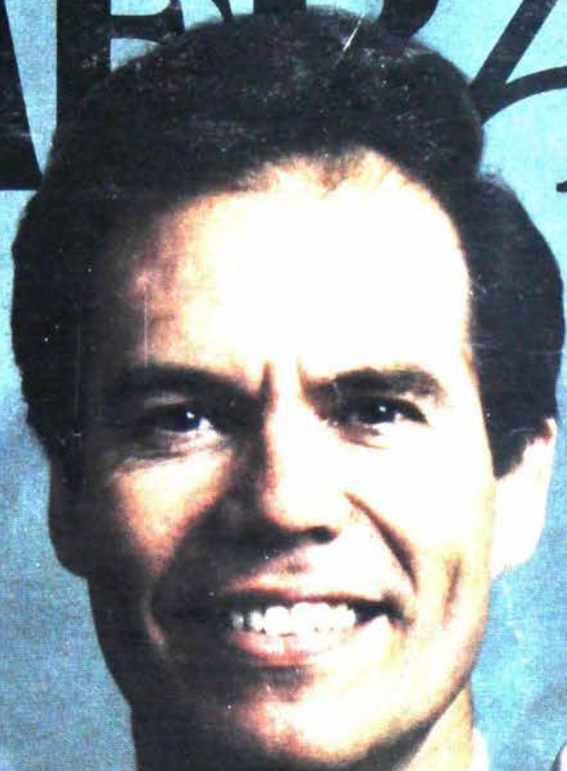

AUBURN HOUSE

Alpha-Delta Chapter left the 1984 International Convocation with the top four awards. The alumni club was sufficiently motivated to take steps to build the active brothers a larger and better facility, motivated they were. In just three short years they raised 1.2 million dollars to begin construction on the new chapter house.

The ground breaking ceremony was held in late February and construction began the first of April. Donations did not stop when the house was being built. Alumni from all over donated to certain sections of the house. One individual contributed two thousand shrubs for the landscaping, while his wife, an interior decorator, designed the interior of the house.

On November 7, 1987 the dedication was held. The house dedication ceremony was attended by the Mayor of Auburn, President of the University, the Grand Sage, representatives from the International Office, alumni, families, and friends. An award was given to Brother Cleveland Adams for sixty years of service to Alpha-Delta Chapter. Brother Dan Breeden was also recognized for his contribution to the Sigma Pi Educational Fund, which set up the Keystone/Rees Scholarship Fund. This scholarship fund will give twelve one-thousand dollar scholarships to Alpha-Delta Chapter this year.

The house is located at 960 West Magnolia Avenue. It is the sixth chapter house they have been in since they were founded in 1926, with each house being larger in size and membership than the previous. The chapter house is situated on a 4.5 plot of land on fraternity row. It sleeps sixty men plus the housemother's suite. The dining room will seat 220 for dinner. The den is capable of holding the entire chapter for a night of TV. This massive structure has 21,500 square feet of living space with the final cost being \$1,450,000. This house is the largest and finest in every respect ever occupied by Alpha-Delta. It is expected that this house will last for centuries and will be their home for many generations to come.

BOBBY BURGESS



From the top of his ears to the tips of his toes, Bobby Burgess has been involved in entertainment for thirty-seven years.

"The years have sped by for me," says Bobby. "It just doesn't seem that the years could have raced by so quickly, and have been so full of excitement for me!"

Bobby's dancing career goes back to when he was a tot of four years of age, and begun dancing lessons. By the time he was eleven, he had appeared in some 75 television shows in Los Angeles. An agent saw him and called the station and got him signed.

In 1955 auditions for a new series called "Spin and Marty" were being conducted and Robert W. Burgess didn't get a part. But down the hall, auditioning for the Mickey Mouse Club was being held by Walt Disney for a kids television show. The exclusive rights were sold to ABC that gave Disney the needed one-million dollars to finish Disneyland.

Over five-thousand kids were auditioned of which thirty-nine were selected, but only nine were on the roll call of the Mouseketeers.

Bobby recalls how he got his start.

"I auditioned doing a jazz rendition barefooted to **Rock Around the Clock**. I went through five auditions in front of Walt Disney himself."

Disney developed and oversaw everything for the Mouseketeers, including the daily routines.

"Really we only did three years of that show, but it was on daily. We would see Mr. Disney walking down Mickey Avenue or Dopey Drive with his head down, thinking about what he was going to do on future shows. He was a real nice guy. He wanted us to call him Uncle Walt, but it was always Mr. Disney."

The Mouseketeers have kept in touch through the years, including a 25 year reunion and shows in celebration of Mickey Mouse's birthday.

"I was really close to Sharon, the little gal that I jitterbugged with on the show. We went to school three hours a day and were taking the same subjects. In fact, we're going to New York next week to do the Today Show and start doing a show for the Disney Sunday Movie about how the Mickey Mouse Club got it's start."

Bobby finished his senior year at Poly High School in Long Beach, California. He continued working in acting on the Donna Reed Show, Ozzie and Harriet, and many other national programs.

At a dancing school fate stepped in and found a ready-made partner for him, Barbara Boylan, another school member, when their teacher paired them in ballroom dancing. Ideal dance partners from the very outset, they vied against countless other ballroom couples in competitions waged all over the country, finally scoring a grand coup by being named King and Queen of the national Call's Grand Medal Ball, over some 11,000 who had competed.

Following this, the duo entered Lawrence Welk's "Calcutta Dance Contest," and Bobby's especially-created routine won top honors for them, netting them a guest appearance on Lawrence's nationwide television show. That was in April, 1961, and an avalanche of acclamatory mail flooded the Welk offices, resulting finally in their being named "regulars" on the program by the maestro six months later.

"I was practically forced into hiring them," recalls Welk. "Every time we recorded a new song, they would create a special dance routine, and the viewers reaction was simply tremendous. Actually, they really created a job with us for themselves."

While at Cal State-Long Beach, Bobby met a girl in dance school that was dating a Sigma Pi. Although rushed by several of the fraternities, he pledged the Beta-Omicron Chapter.

"I just felt real comfortable with the guys, they were the friendliest. You know it's a great chapter, so I pledged!"

In 1962 the Lawrence Welk Band started playing at Harrah's in Lake Tahoe and several fraternity brothers with their dates would go up every year.

"Lawrence Welk loved to have those guys in the audience, they were fabulous." He would say, "When are all those fraternity boys going to come to our show, they're such a wonderful audience."

Due to all the traveling time, Bobby's involvement as an officer in the chapter was limited.

"I was Herald for a few months, but I really didn't hold any other offices. I was Chairman of the Spring Sing, and we won the Men's Division one year."

"Of course, being from Cal State-Long Beach, you had to live in the house as a pledge and our house was right on the beach. We'd go across the street and play volleyball or just get some rays."

"One of the real fun things that we always did was have a pajama party with the UCLA Chapter. I would go to work at the Hollywood Paladium with Lawrence Welk and as soon as it would get over - about eleven o'clock, I'd hop into my pajamas, grab my date and head over to UCLA."

Bobby Burgess married Kristie Florin, the daughter of Myron Florin who is the accordionist of the Lawrence Welk Show. "I knew her since she was nine years old. She was always on the Lawrence Welk Christmas shows and I watched her grow up. So, when she was nineteen and I was twenty-nine, we got married."

For the next several years they traveled with the Lawrence Welk Show all over the world; including Bali, Indonesia, Asia, Europe and South America. "We really got acquainted and thought it was time to have a family."

Bobby and Kristie now reside in Hollywood Hills with their four children - Becky, Robert, Wendy and Brent.

"Everything has gone my way, I have been dancing all my life. I'm still dancing with the girl from the Lawrence Welk Show, Elaine Balden. We still play state fairs, club dates, and conventions. I'm teaching a couple times a month with the teacher who taught me how to dance in Long Beach, California."

Bobby is also a spokesman for Disneyland, touring the United States, Hawaii, Australia and New Zealand. "It's a tough schedule," Bobby admits, "but the rewards are great, and it gives me an opportunity to meet in person the thousands of folks who watch us each week. It calls for a lot of stamina, and no little personal sacrifice. But I've been lucky going from one family institution to another."

When on tour, Burgess sometimes drops by chapter houses in the area. In 1984 while doing a one-nighter at a hotel in Vincennes, Indiana, he visited the International Headquarters of Sigma Pi. "I rented a car and drove out in the country, there it was - the big estate on the hill, Shaddowood. I saw my pledge forms in the museum and forms of a couple other members of Beta-Omicron Chapter."



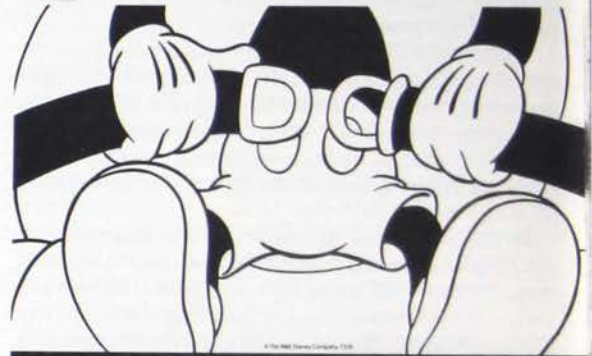

When asked what he got out of being in the Fraternity, Bobby summed it up by saying, "Fraternity - the life-long friendships that were formed in the chapter, is what I got out of it. Having somebody to hang out with in school and to help you in every way."

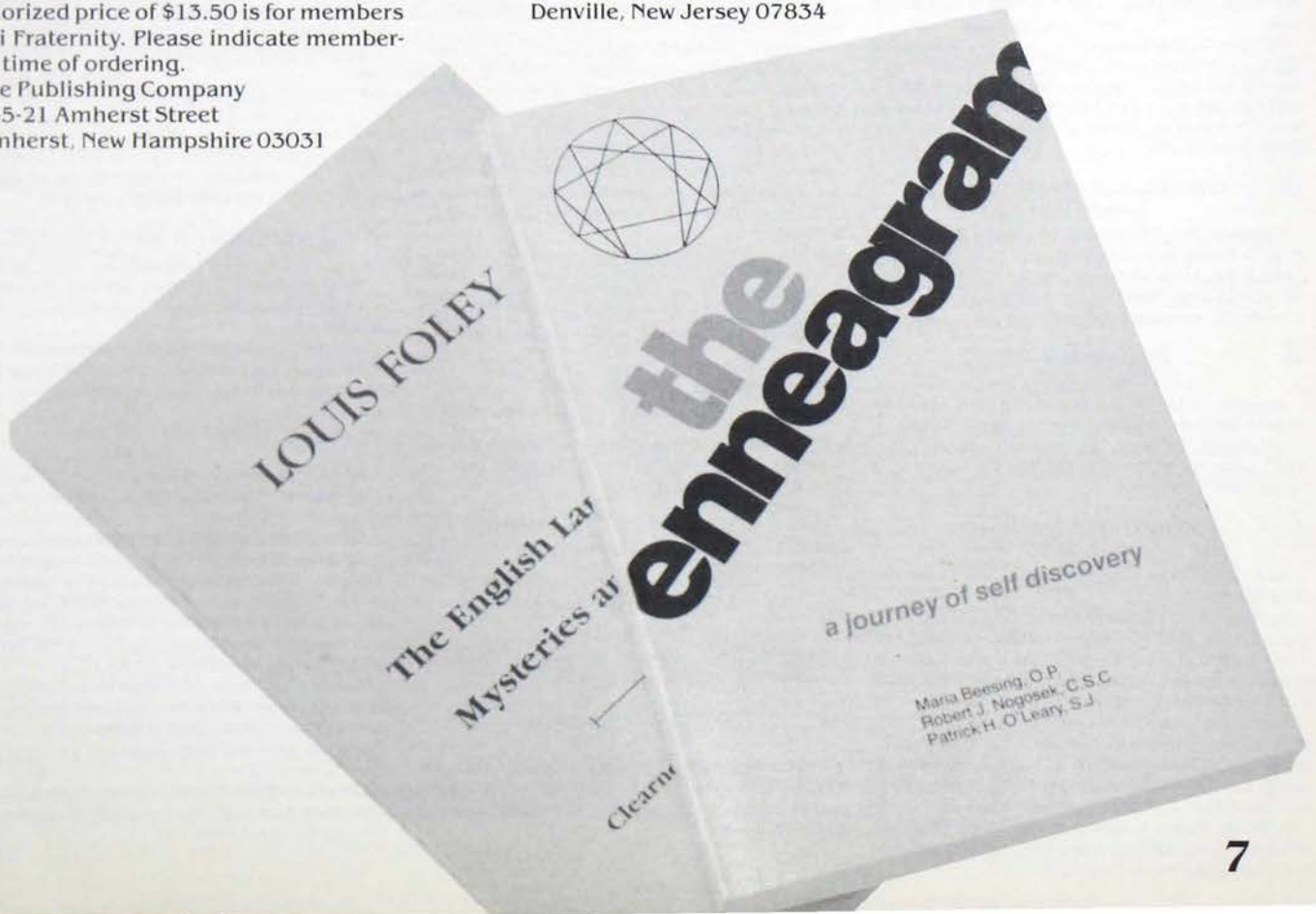

History of ZETA-PHI

Southeastern Louisiana University is now the home of Sigma Pi Fraternity's 160th chartering and the Zeta-Phi Chapter.

In November of 1985, after the visit of Chapter Consultant, Larry Rovira with his brothers Marcus and Ward Rovira who attended SLU, an interest group of nine founding fathers established the first colony in fourteen years on the campus.

By December the colony was accepted into the I.F.C. and six more neophytes formally pledged the group.

The next semester Sigma Pi spear headed the Muscular Dystrophy fundraiser and added an additional eight members before the summer break.

The fall brought new direction for the colony after members attended the 38th Biennial Convocation in Washington, D.C. The colony excelled in sports, in both football and volleyball. The numbers again grew with the seven new pledges.

By spring work was begun on the formal petition and it was submitted to the Executive Office for Grand Chapter approval.

History of the University

In 1925 the citizens of Tangipahoa Parish established a college in Hammond, Louisiana, that became the Southeastern Louisiana College.

The college prepared teachers for two year certificates in undergraduate courses to enter professional colleges and universities in the state.

In 1937 the State Board of Education extended the college to a four year college with the first degrees conferred in 1939.

During the years 1938-1940, Southeastern received more than one million dollars from a state colleges' bond issue and the Works Progress Administration of the federal government for the construction of new buildings. In this program, modern facilities were provided for all departments.

March 3, 1946, Southeastern was formally approved and was formally accepted into full membership in the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools as a four-year, degree-granting institution.

On June 16, 1970, the Hon. John J. McKeithen, Governor of the State of Louisiana, signed a legislative act changing the name of the institution to Southeastern Louisiana University.

The 1974 Constitution of the State of Louisiana created the Louisiana State Board of Regents with certain powers, duties, and responsibilities relative to all public institutions of higher education in the State of Louisiana. The 1974 Constitution also established three higher education management boards, placing Southeastern under the Board of Trustees for State Colleges and Universities.

In memory of Dr. Richard L. Jacques, Jr., January 1, 1988, Professor of Biology and Assistant Dean of the College of Science and Engineering.

On the morning of January 1, 1988, Dr. Richard L. Jacques, Jr. succumbed to the cancer he had bravely fought for much of the year. In the Hackensack Meadowlands he discovered the permanent home of the ladybug. In 1979 Dr. Richard Jacques, Jr. helped in establishing a Sigma Pi colony at Fairleigh Dickinson University. He became a founding father and has been an integral part of the Sigma Pi Brotherhood of Epsilon-Xi Chapter ever since.

Dr. Richard Jacques, "Doc," in his Gator sweats, F.D.U. T-shirt, and Sigma Pi cap was always around with the fraternity, taking pictures, helping the executive board, and being an advisor and true brother to all. If anyone set an example of true brotherhood and leadership it was Doc. He will stand out as one of the greatest leaders, advisor, and brother Sigma Pi Fraternity has ever seen. Doc you will always be loved by everyone who knew you.

I heard the news today about a man who made the grave. Brothers and friends we are here to say our last good-byes, to a great man. One who believed and lived with Sigma Pi Fraternity in his heart. One who believed in the creed in his day-to-day life. One who believed in the equal friendship and loved all who surrounded him. One who was the motivation and power of the fraternity. One who was very close to all and me. We must remember there are no walls but the walls we build. I hope one good thing will come out of this day. 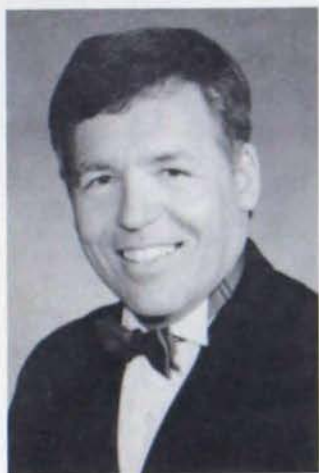

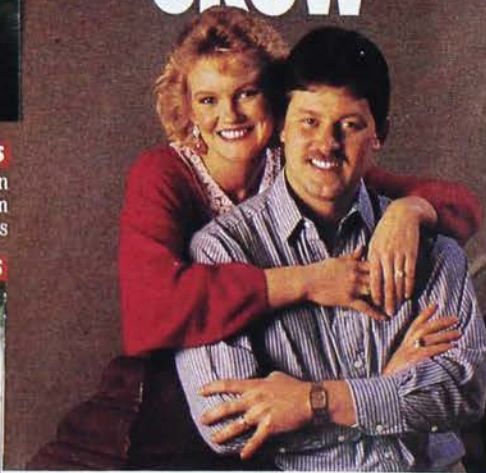
