## Proclamation

WHEREAS: ALS, known by many as Lou Gehrig's disease, is a progressive, fatal, neurodegenerative

disease that attacks nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord, making even the simplest

movements - walking, speaking, gesturing - nearly impossible; and

WHEREAS: Approximately 30,000 individuals in the United States are afflicted with ALS at any

given time, with 5,000 new cases appearing each year. Approximately 15 new cases of ALS are diagnosed every day, with a person losing their battle with the disease every 90

minutes, and ALS strikes people regardless of race, sex, age, or ethnicity; and

WHEREAS: Finding a cure for ALS will prevent the disease from robbing hundreds of thousands of

Americans of their dignity and lives; and

WHEREAS: Aggressive treatments of the symptoms of ALS can extend the lives of those living with

the disease; and

WHEREAS: The Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA) leads the search for treatments and a cure

for ALS through its aggressive, worldwide research and MDA/ALS clinical programs. The Muscular Dystrophy Association's aggregate expenditures for services and research

for ALS total more than \$365 million; and

WHEREAS: Raising public awareness of this disease will facilitate the discovery of a cure, bring

much needed dollars for support, and services for families in Minnesota dealing with

ALS.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of May 2014, as:

in the State of Minnesota.
