### 3. Type of Allocation of Quota Places:

The quota place is allocated to the athlete(s) by name.

An NOC/National Association which has more than four (4) players eligible for direct acceptance into a singles event must select its four (4) highest ranked eligible players based on the computer rankings. Any player nominated and accepted for the singles event will automatically be eligible for selection for the doubles and mixed doubles events though there is no guarantee of a place.





### C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to, Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors). Only those athletes who have complied with the Olympic Charter may participate in the Olympic Games.

#### Additional IF Requirements:

To be eligible to participate in the Rio 2016 Olympic Games, all athletes must be in good standing with their National Association and the ITF. In addition, athletes must meet the minimum requirements regarding participation in Davis Cup/Fed Cup competitions, as per ITF regulations (link to be provided in due course).

Only NOCs with National Associations which have been members of the ITF prior to 1 January 2016 may nominate players for participation in the 2016 Olympic Tennis Event. For the purposes of such eligibility, both Full and Associate Members of the ITF may participate.

### D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

Nation Participation Forms will be sent by the ITF to all NOCs and National Associations (NA) eligible to participate by no later than 5 February 2016. The completed Nation Participation Forms, endorsed by the respective NOC and NA, are to be received by the ITF no later than 1 April 2016.

The qualification events are listed in hierarchical order of qualification.

#### **TRIPARTITE COMMISSION INVITATION PLACES**

Four (4) Tripartite Commission Invitation Places are made available to eligible NOCs at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games, two (2) in each of the men's and women's singles events.

On 15 October 2015, the International Olympic Committee will invite all eligible NOCs to submit their requests for Tripartite Commission Invitation Places. The deadline for NOCs to submit their requests is 15 January 2016. The Tripartite Commission will confirm, in writing, the allocation of invitation places to the relevant NOCs after the end of the qualification period for the concerned sport.

Detailed information on Tripartite Invitation places is contained in the "Games of the XXXI Olympiad, Rio 2016 - Olympic Games Tripartite Commission Invitation Places - Allocation Procedure and Regulations".

### E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

By no later than 9 June 2016, the ITF shall confirm to NOCs/National Associations the names of players eligible for Direct Acceptance for singles and/or doubles based on the international computer rankings of 6 June 2016. At this time the ITF will send out the application form for Final Qualification Places (ITF places).

By no later than 16 June 2016 the NOCs/National Associations shall confirm to the ITF the entry in singles and doubles of those athletes qualified by name to compete. This is also the deadline to submit the application form for Final Qualification Places (ITF places) to the ITF. The application form is also confirmation of entry for any athlete who subsequently gains an ITF place.

By no later than 29 June 2016 the ITF shall advise NOCs/National Associations of Final Qualification Places (ITF places).

### F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

#### **REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES**

If an allocated quota place(s) is not confirmed by the NOC/National Association by the confirmation of quota place deadline (16 June 2016) or is declined by the NOC/National Association, the quota place(s) will be reallocated to the next highest ranked player/team in the ITF World Ranking of 6 June 2016.

#### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED TRIPARTITE COMMISSION INVITATION PLACES

If the Tripartite Commission is not able to allocate a Tripartite Commission Invitation Place, it will be reallocated using the process outlined above to reallocate unused quota places.
