Property Description

St Helen Curtain is a long casemated curtain that plugs the floor of the Valley descending down into Bormla. The curtain is a stepped casemated structure protected by traverses, A gateway with decorated Baroque portal, known as St Helen Gate o Porta dei Mortari, provided a main entrance point into the town of Bormla. The curtain was protected by a large lunette, no longer standing. Two modern openings, one on each side of St Helen Gate were made to facilitate the flow of vehicular traffic.
