## Peter may have lost team place

PERTH. — Until yesterday Victorian sprinter Peter Norman was in the Olympic Games team for Munich - but he probably ran himself out of the team at the National titles.

Norman ran a "shock-er" in the final of the 200 metres championship yes-

metres championship yesterday, and struggled to finish only third.

Ahead, and well clear of Norman, were two other Victorians, Greg Lewis the winner, and Gary Eddy.

"I'm history. I'm out of the team," said Norman, who won a Silver Medal at the Mexico City Olympics four years ago.

"All I had to do was to win, even in a slow time, and I think I would have been off to Munich.

"I knew I was in trouble when I straightened up for the finish, and I struggled over the last 100 metres.

"I felt a lot older than 30 today," he said.

injury for the past two weeks, and could not run the bend of the 200 metres. He has kept it a secret and did not want to talk about

Later I told one of the selectors, Mr. Graeme Briggs, about Norman's Briggs, about Norman's knee. I thought they should If the selectors do the right thing, Norman should still be on the plane to Munich. He has run 20.5 sec. this season, and is a good competitor. In Munich he would do well.

Into a stiff wind, Lewis, Norman's training partner, led all the way to win in 21.5 sec. Norman clocked 21.6.

The 200 metres crown was a consolation to Lewis — he failed completely in a sensational 100 metres final on Saturday.

Lewis did exactly the same as Norman did in the 200 — ran one of the worst races of his life to finish fifth behind the winner, another Victorian, Laurie D'Arcy.

After the 100 metres the judge placed Victorian Graeme Haskell second to Darcy, and South Australian Ian Boswell third, and did not bother to inspect the photo-finish.

SA protested that Boswell was second, and after Has-kell had been presented with his second place medal the places were re-versed and he was given third position.

Three Australian records went to the men yesterday — Gary Knoke clipped a tenth off his 400 metres hurdles record, Graeme Rootham smashed the 800 metres record, and 21-stone Ray Rigby set an Australian residential shot put record.
