

In her nine seasons at the helm of the Long Beach State softball program, three-time Big West Coach of the Year Kim Sowder has continued a Beach tradition of winning and advancing to the NCAA Tournament. The 1998 inductee into the Long Beach State Athletics Hall of Fame has won over 60 percent of her games as the 49ers' head coach while leading LBSU to five NCAA Regional appearances.

Last season, Sowder reached 300 wins, becoming just the eighth coach in Big West history to reach that milestone, and the only current coach in the Big West to win that many games as a member of the conference. Overall, Sowder has combiled a 300-195 (.606) record, including a 129-60 (.623) record in Big West Conference games.

In addition to five trips to the NCAA Tournament, she has led the 49ers to a trio of Big West Conference championships in 2008, 2012 and 2014. Sowder has never finished a season with a losing record.

In three of the last five seasons, Sowder's club has won more than 35 games, posting a 39-19 overall record, winning the Big West and advancing to NCAA Regionals for the 22nd time in program history in 2014.

Two of her players received top honors in the conference, as sophomore Christina Clermont was Co-Big West Pitcher of the Year after posting a 20-7 overall record along with a 14-1 mark in Big West action. Senior Shayna Kimbrough also won a second-straight Big West Defensive Player of the Year award, closing out her stellar four-year career under Sowder as the program's record holder in batting average and runs scored.

Under Sowder, offensive team records have become the norm. The 2014 squad became the first to finish a season batting over .300 at .306, and also set new records in scoring (318 runs), RBI (237) and doubles (74) while finishing just behind 2013's record home run mark of 53.

Sowder earned Big West Coach of the Year honors in 2014 as Long Beach State outlasted UC Santa Barbara in a thrilling extra-inning victory to clinch a third Big West championship with Sowder at the helm. The 49ers have had 69 players received all-conference over the last nine years under Sowder.

Behind Sowder's leadership in 2012, the 49ers rallied from a slow start to win the Big West Conference title and an automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament. LBSU won 20 of its final 26 regular-season games, including a 16-5 Big West Conference record, to clinch the program's 21st NCAA Tournament berth.

In 2011, Sowder blended a core group of returning players with a talented group of freshmen into a Big West Conference title contender. The 49ers finished the season with a 38-18 record, including a 15-6 conference mark that allowed the 49ers to finish in second place, one game behind conference champion Pacific. The 49ers' season, which included wins over four nationally-ranked teams, (No. 6 Oklahoma, No. 21 Baylor, No. 23 Fresno State, and No. 23 Houston) ended with the school's 20th trip to the NCAA Tournament. The 49ers opened the tournament with a win over San Diego State in the first round before dropping a pair of games, one to eventual national-champion Arizona State.

Sowder saw her squad make its second straight trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2009. Long Beach State finished the season with a 35-21 record, marking its eighth consecutive winning season. Eight players were named to the all-conference team, while Jennifer Griffin was tabbed the Big West Field Player of the Year and Petty earned co-Freshman Pitcher of the Year honors.

In 2008, Sowder led LBSU to its sixth Big West Conference title and a NCAA Regional appearance. The 49ers reached the 40-win mark for just the eighth time in school history, finishing with a 40-17 record. LBSU was ranked 22nd and 23rd in the final USA Softball and NFCA polls, respectively. Sowder, who was tabbed the co-Big West Coach of the Year, also saw eight of her players earn all-conference recognition. In addition, freshman Brooke Turner, picked up All-America and All-West Region honors after being named the BWC Pitcher of the Year.

Along with on-field accomplishments, the 49ers have also earned a number of accolades off the field. In 2007, Sowder's first as head coach, Long Beach State had a record number of student-athletes honored academically, as six players were named NFCA Scholar All-Americans by the national coaching organization.

In Sowder's 11 years as an assistant and associate head coach at Long Beach State, the program recorded a .637 overall winning percentage, won five conference championships, and made nine NCAA appearances.

As the former Kim Kostyk, Sowder was a speedy, slick-fielding shortstop in her four years (1989-92) at LBSU. A 1991 third-team All-American, she helped the 49ers to three (1990-92) of their five trips to the NCAA Women's College World Series. She also earned second-team All-Big West honors as a junior in 1991 and was a Big West honorable-mention pick in 1992.

The school's all-time stolen base leader (50), Sowder's 19 thefts in 1991 still ranks as the 49ers' single-season high. She also ranks in the top 10 in career at-bats (860), runs (96), hits (204) and sacrifices (52). Defensively, she holds three of the top four 49er single-season assist marks with 243 in 1992, 233 in 1990, and 214 in 1991.

Sowder earned her undergraduate degree in marketing in 1993. She then went into the coaching ranks, serving two years as an assistant coach at Pacific.

A product of Wilson High School in Hacienda Heights, she resides with her husband, Shawn, and their two children, Zachary and Jacob, in Yorba Linda.

Assistant Coaches





Stephanie Brown Assistant Coach - 13th Year Stephanie Brown, who works primarily with the pitching staff, is in her 13th season as an assistant coach at Long Beach State. During her 12 years at LBSU, Brown has acquired a deserved reputation for developing young arms and helping pitchers mature.

Brown has now helped six pitchers earn Big West Conference Pitcher of the Year awards, as Christina Clermont was named Co-Pitcher of the Year last season for the Beach. In 2015, Clermont went 20-7 overall, throwing 19 complete games and striking out 179 batters while posting a 2.35 ERA. In Big West play, Clermont led the conference in wins, strikeouts, and opposing batting average, going 14-1 against conference opponents.

Helping Long Beach State pitchers win the top award in three straight seasons, including co-honors for Meredith Cervenka

and Marcel Torres in 2004 and 2005. Long Beach State has also had at least one pitcher named first-team All-Big West in 11 of Brown's 12 seasons as the 49ers' pitching coach. Clermont garnered the honor last season, following four straight seasons of dominance from Erin Jones-Wesley, who became just the seventh player in Big West history to earn first-team honors four times.

Brown has previously guided Beach players to three consecutive Big West Freshman Pitcher of the Year awards, and has helped four pitchers earn the honor in her time with Long Beach State. The first came in 2007, when Bridgette Pagano earned the award, and then Brooke Turner followed in her footsteps, while also earning second-team All-America and first-team All-West Region honors. Taylor Petty kept the streak going in 2009 as she was also a first-team all-conference selection. After one season without a freshman pitcher on the roster, Erin Jones-Wesley won the award in 2011, while also being named the Big West Conference Pitcher of

the Year, first-team All-Big West and second-team All-West Region.

Under Brown's tutelage, the 49ers have finished with an earned run average of over 3.00 only four times. In 2004, the 49ers posted a 1.22 season ERA en route to a Big West Championship run and a 51-13 overall record, the best under Brown, and in 2011, the 49ers set a school record with 361 strikeouts as a staff.

Brown, nee Swenson was a standout pitcher at UCLA under long-time former Bruin coach Sue Enquist. She was an honorable mention All-Pac 10 selection in 2000, posting a 10-1 record with five shutouts and three one-hitters. Brown finished the 2000 campaign with a 0.81 ERA in 77.2 innings pitched. After her playing days, Brown assisted the Bruin coaching staff with recruiting.





Panita Thanatharn

Assistant Coach - 6th Year

Panita Thanatharn is in her sixth season as an assistant coach at Long Beach State. Thanatharn assists with recruiting and conditioning while serving as the hitting coach, assisting head coach Kim Sowder with the offense.

With Thanatharn's assistance, the 49ers have posted the five highest batting averages in school history over the last five seasons.

In 2011, Long Beach State hit .279, and then was just behind that mark in 2012 at .277. After breaking four offensive school records as a team in 2013, the Beach set four more in 2014, scoring 319 runs, driving in 289 RBI, and hitting 74 doubles, while becoming the first team to hit over .300 for a season with a .306 team batting average. The batting average, RBI and scoring records all topped 2013's record marks, while the 53 home runs hit during 2013 remains the school record. Last season, the numbers continued to pile up, with the Beach hitting .281 with 40 home runs and 69 doubles.

Thanatharn returned to Long Beach State for the 2011 season after spending two seasons as an assistant coach under former 49er head coach Pete Manarino at UNLV. During her career, she has helped teams to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2012 Long Beach State team. She also helped coach UNLV to the NCAA Tournament in 2009, while working with outfielders and hitters. She also served as the team's recruiting coordinator.

Thanatharn started her coaching career at Long Beach State in 2007 where she served as the team's director of operations/assistant coach for one season. She helped with coaching and administrative duties, while handling the conditioning program.

A four-year letterwinner (2002, 2005-07) at Long Beach State, Thanatharn earned a double major in exercise science and sport psychology and coaching in 2006.

She earned a master's in kinesiology with an option in sports management from Cal State University, Long Beach in 2008.


Carrasco graduated with a bachelor's degree in Community Health Education last May.
