Knit Knook Sampler Cowl

Supplies

- ☞ Yarn: Knit 1 Purl 2 (or lace or sock weight yarn), approximately 450 yards
- ☞ Needles: US 7, straight or circular
- ☞ stitch markers
- ☞ other notions

Gauge

5 ¼ sts = 1" in stitch pattern

Size

8" X 29 1/2" when laid flat

Stitch Abbreviations

CO	Cast On
K	Knit
P	Purl
YO	Yarn Over
BO	Bind Off

One skein pattern for the 2014 Yarn Along the Rockies yarn crawl.



Directions:

Piece is worked lengthwise and then sewn together. Note: If working in a different yarn, you can omit rows or entire sections from the second set of pattern repeats.

Loosely cast on 50 stitches.
Work 64 rows in Pattern A.
Work 64 rows in Pattern B.
Work 64 rows in Pattern C.
Work 64 rows in Pattern D.
Work 32 rows in Pattern A.
Work 32 rows in Pattern B.
Work 32 rows in Pattern C.
Work 32 rows in Pattern D.
Bind off loosely.

Stitch Patterns:

Edge stitches:

Slip the first stitch of each row throughout.

Work the last stitch of each row in stockinette (knit on the front side; purl on the back side).

Pattern A: Horizontal rib

Rows 1-7: Work in stockinette stitch (knit all stitches on the front, purl all stitches on the back).

Row 8: Knit across.

Repeat these 8 rows for pattern.

Pattern B: Wide broken rib

Row 1: Knit across

Row 2: Slip 1 (edge stitch), knit 3, *purl 6, knit 6, repeat from * to last 4 stitches. Knit 4.

Repeat these 2 rows for pattern.

Pattern C: Little shells

Row 1: Slip 1 (edge stitch), knit to end.

Row 2: Slip 1 (edge stitch), purl to end.

Row 3: Slip 1, knit 1, *yo, purl 1, purl 3 together, purl 1, yo, knit 2, repeat from * to last stitch, purl 1.

Row 4: Slip 1, purl to end.

Repeat these 4 rows for pattern.

Pattern D: Narrow broken rib

Row 1: Knit across

Row 2: Slip 1 (edge stitch), *knit 5, purl 2, repeat from * to last 6 stitches, knit to end.

Repeat these 2 rows for pattern.
