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**COLLECTION OF IDENTIFYING INFORMATION IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES –
PROHIBITION AND DUTIES**

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PART I
APPLICATION AND INTERPRETATION

Application — attempts to collect

1. (1) This Regulation applies with respect to an attempt by a police officer to collect identifying information about an individual from the individual, if that attempt is done for the purpose of,

- (a) inquiring into offences that have been or might be committed;
- (b) inquiring into suspicious activities to detect offences; or
- (c) gathering information for intelligence purposes.

(2) Despite subsection (1), this Regulation does not apply with respect to an attempted collection made by a police officer for the purpose of investigating an offence the officer reasonably suspects has been or will be committed.

(3) Despite subsection (1), this Regulation does not apply with respect to an attempt by a police officer to collect identifying information from an individual if,

- (a) the individual is legally required to provide the information to a police officer;
- (b) the individual is under arrest or is being detained;
- (c) the officer is engaged in a covert operation;
- (d) the officer is executing a warrant, acting pursuant to a court order or performing related duties; or
- (e) the individual from whom the officer attempts to collect information is employed in the administration of justice or is carrying out duties or providing services that are otherwise relevant to the carrying out of the officer's duties.

Application — information collected

2. (1) This Regulation applies with respect to identifying information collected on or after January 1, 2017 as a result of an attempt to collect to which this Regulation applies.

(2) This Regulation applies with respect to identifying information that was collected before January 1, 2017 only as provided under paragraph 5 of subsection 12 (1) and under subsection 13 (1) in relation to that paragraph.

Non-application — person appointed under the *Interprovincial Policing Act, 2009*

3. This Regulation does not apply with respect to attempts to collect information by a person appointed as a police officer under the *Interprovincial Policing Act, 2009* or with respect to information collected by such a person.

Interpretation — attempt to collect identifying information

- 4.** For the purposes of this Regulation,

“attempt to collect identifying information about an individual from the individual” means attempt to collect identifying information by asking the individual, in a face-to-face encounter, to identify himself or herself or to provide information for the purpose of identifying the individual and includes such an attempt whether or not identifying information is collected.

PART II
PROHIBITION — CERTAIN COLLECTIONS OF INFORMATION

Limitations on collection of certain information

- 5.** (1) A police officer shall not attempt to collect identifying information about an individual from the individual if,

- (a) any part of the reason for the attempted collection is that the officer perceives the individual to be within a particular racialized group unless,
 - (i) the officer is seeking a particular individual,
 - (ii) being within the racialized group forms part of a description of the particular individual or is evident from a visual representation of the particular individual, and
 - (iii) the officer has additional information, in addition to information about the particular individual being in a racialized group, that may help to identify the individual or narrow the description of the individual; or
- (b) the attempted collection is done in an arbitrary way.

(2) Without limiting what might constitute the additional information required under subclause (1) (a) (iii), such information may consist of information about,

- (a) the appearance of the individual, including information about the individual's clothing, height, weight, eye colour, hair colour or hair style;

- (b) the location where the individual might be found;
 - (c) the type of vehicle the individual might be found in;
 - (d) the associates the individual might be found with; or
 - (e) the behaviour of the individual.
- (3) The additional information required under subclause (1) (a) (iii) may not consist only of the sex of the individual, the approximate age of the individual or both.
- (4) For the purpose of clause (1) (b), an attempted collection by a police officer from an individual is done in an arbitrary way unless the officer has a reason that the officer can articulate that complies with all of the following:
1. The reason includes details about the individual that cause the officer to reasonably suspect that identifying the individual may contribute to or assist in an inquiry described in clause 1 (1) (a) or (b) or the gathering of information described in clause 1 (1) (c).
 2. The reason does not include either of the following:
 - i. that the individual has declined to answer a question from the officer which the individual is not legally required to answer, or
 - ii. that the individual has attempted or is attempting to discontinue interaction with the officer in circumstances in which the individual has the legal right to do so.
 3. The reason is not only that the individual is present in a high crime location.

PART III DUTIES RELATING TO COLLECTIONS OF INFORMATION

OFFICER DUTIES

Duties to inform before attempting to collect information

- 6.** (1) A police officer shall not attempt to collect identifying information about an individual from the individual unless the police officer, in accordance with the procedures developed under section 13,
- (a) has informed the individual that he or she is not required to provide identifying information to the officer; and
 - (b) has informed the individual why the police officer is attempting to collect identifying information about the individual.
- (2) A police officer is not required to inform the individual under clause (1) (a) or (b) if the officer has a reason to believe that informing the individual under that clause might compromise the safety of an individual.
- (3) A police officer is not required to inform the individual under clause (1) (b) if the officer has a reason to believe that informing the individual under that clause,
- (a) would likely compromise an ongoing police investigation;
 - (b) might allow a confidential informant to be identified; or
 - (c) might disclose the identity of a person contrary to the law, including disclose the identity of a young person contrary to the *Youth Criminal Justice Act* (Canada).
- (4) A reason required under subsection (2) or (3) must be a reason the police officer can articulate and must include details relating to the particular circumstances.

Document for individual

- 7.** (1) A police officer who attempts to collect identifying information about an individual from the individual shall,
- (a) offer to give the individual a document that provides a record of the attempt; and
 - (b) give the individual such a document if the individual indicates that he or she wants it.
- (2) A police officer is not required to comply with subsection (1) if the officer has a reason to believe that continuing to interact with the individual,
- (a) might compromise the safety of an individual; or
 - (b) might delay the officer from responding to another matter that should be responded to immediately.
- (3) A reason required under subsection (2) must be a reason the police officer can articulate and must include details relating to the particular circumstances.
- (4) The document required under subsection (1) shall contain at least the following information:

1. The officer's name and officer identification number and the date, time and location of the attempted collection.
2. Information about how to contact the Independent Police Review Director.
3. An explanation that the individual can request access to information about himself or herself that is in the custody or under the control of a police force, under the *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* in the case of a municipal police force, or under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* in the case of the Ontario Provincial Police, and information about how to contact persons to whom such a request may be given.

Police officer must record reason and other information

8. A police officer who attempts to collect identifying information about an individual from the individual shall record the following:

1. The officer's reason for the attempted collection, including the details referred to in paragraph 1 of subsection 5 (4).
2. Whether the individual was informed as required under clauses 6 (1) (a) and (b) or, if informing the individual under one of those clauses was not required under subsection 6 (2) or (3), the reason why that was not required.
3. Whether the individual was offered the document as required under clause 7 (1) (a) or, if offering the document was not required under subsection 7 (2), the reason why that was not required.
4. Whether the individual was given the document offered under clause 7 (1) (a) or, if giving the document was not required under clause 7 (1) (b) or subsection 7 (2), the reason why that was not required.
5. Such other information as the chief of police requires the officer to record.

INCLUSION OF COLLECTED INFORMATION IN POLICE DATABASES

Collected information in police databases

9. (1) This section applies with respect to the inclusion, in databases under the control of a police force, of identifying information about an individual collected by a police officer from the individual.

(2) The chief of police shall ensure that the requirements under this section are complied with.

(3) Access to identifying information shall be restricted in accordance with subsection (10) unless the information may be included in a database, under this section, without limiting the access of members of the police force.

(4) Identifying information may be included in a database without limiting the access of members of the police force if,

(a) the police officer who collected the information,

- (i) has indicated that the attempted collection complied with section 5,
- (ii) has indicated that the individual was informed as required under clauses 6 (1) (a) and (b) or, if informing the individual under one of those clauses was not required under subsection 6 (2) or (3), has indicated the reason why that was not required,
- (iii) has indicated that the individual was offered the document as required under clause 7 (1) (a) or, if offering the document was not required under subsection 7 (2), has indicated the reason why that was not required, and
- (iv) has indicated that the individual was given the document offered under clause 7 (1) (a) or, if giving the document was not required under clause 7 (1) (b) or subsection 7 (2), has indicated the reason why that was not required; and

(b) either,

- (i) the chief of police or a person designated by the chief of police has determined, after considering the officer's reasons for the attempted collection, including the details referred to in paragraph 1 of subsection 5 (4), that it appears that section 5 was complied with and has ensured that clause (a) has been complied with, or
- (ii) the database indicates that what is required under subclause (i) has not yet been done.

(5) The following apply if what is required under subclause (4) (b) (i) was not done when the identifying information was included in the database:

1. The chief of police or a person designated by the chief of police shall conduct a review, within 30 days after the information was first entered into a database under the control of the police force, to determine, after considering the officer's reasons for the attempted collection, including the details referred to in paragraph 1 of subsection 5 (4), whether it appears that section 5 was complied with and whether clause (4) (a) has been complied with.
2. If it is determined that it appears that section 5 was complied with and that clause (4) (a) has been complied with, the indication required under subclause (4) (b) (ii) may be removed.

3. If it is not determined, before the end of the 30-day period described in paragraph 1, that it appears that section 5 was complied with and that clause (4) (a) has been complied with, the identifying information shall be retained, subject to the procedures developed under section 13 in relation to paragraph 4 of subsection 12 (1), in a database under the control of the police force but access to such retained information shall be restricted in accordance with subsection (10).
- (6) At least once a year, the chief of police or a person designated by the chief of police shall conduct detailed reviews of an appropriately sized random sample of the entries of identifying information included in a database under subsection (4) to estimate, within a margin of error of plus or minus 5 per cent, at a 95 per cent confidence level, whether it appears that sections 5, 6 and 7 were complied with.
- (7) If, as a result of a detailed review under subsection (6), it is determined, with respect to identifying information included in a database under subsection (4), that section 5, 6 or 7 was not complied with, the identifying information shall be retained, subject to the procedures developed under section 13 in relation to paragraph 4 of subsection 12 (1), in a database under the control of the police force but access to such retained information shall be restricted in accordance with subsection (10).
- (8) The chief of police shall consider the results of the detailed reviews under subsection (6) and take such actions as the chief of police considers appropriate.
- (9) Access to identifying information shall be restricted in accordance with subsection (10) after the fifth anniversary of the date on which the information was first entered into a database under the control of the police force.

(10) The following apply with respect to identifying information to which access must be restricted:

1. No person may access the information without the permission of the chief of police or a person designated by the chief of police.
2. A member of the police force may be permitted to access the information only if the chief of police or a person designated by the chief of police is satisfied that access is needed,
 - i. for the purpose of an ongoing police investigation,
 - ii. in connection with legal proceedings or anticipated legal proceedings,
 - iii. for the purpose of dealing with a complaint under Part V of the Act or for the purpose of an investigation or inquiry under clause 25 (1) (a) of the Act,
 - iv. in order to prepare the annual report described in subsection 14 (1) or the report required under section 15,
 - v. for the purpose of complying with a legal requirement, or
 - vi. for the purpose of evaluating a police officer's performance.

RESTRICTIONS ON PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Performance targets not to be used in evaluating work performance

10. A chief of police shall ensure that no performance target based on any of the following factors is used to evaluate the work performance of a police officer on his or her force:

1. The number of times, within a particular period, that the officer collects or attempts to collect identifying information about individuals from the individuals.
2. The number of individuals from whom the officer collects or attempts to collect identifying information within a particular period.

PART IV OTHER MATTERS

TRAINING

Chiefs of police must ensure training

11. (1) A chief of police shall ensure that every police officer on his or her police force who attempts to collect identifying information about an individual from the individual, or who acts as the designate of the chief of police under section 9, has successfully completed the training required under this section within the previous 36 months.

(2) The training referred to in subsection (1) shall include training on the following topics:

1. The right of an individual not to provide information to a police officer, the limitations on this right and how to ensure that this right is respected.
2. The right of an individual to discontinue an interaction with a police officer, the limitations on this right and how to avoid unlawfully psychologically detaining an individual.

3. Bias awareness, discrimination and racism and how to avoid bias, discrimination and racism when providing police services.
4. The rights that individuals have to access information about themselves that is in the custody, or under the control, of a police force.
5. The initiation of interactions with members of the public.
6. This Regulation and its application.

(3) The training referred to in subsection (1) shall be provided at the Ontario Police College or by a trainer who has been trained, at the Ontario Police College, to provide the training referred to in subsection (1).

(4) The training referred to in subsection (1) shall be based on a curriculum approved by the Director of the Ontario Police College.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Boards and Minister must develop policies

- 12.** (1) A board shall develop policies regarding the following matters:
 1. The document to be given to individuals under section 7.
 2. The contents, in relation to matters to which this Regulation applies, of the annual report described in subsection 14 (1).
 3. The report required under section 15.
 4. The retention of, access to, and disclosure of identifying information collected on or after January 1, 2017, including the retention of identifying information collected contrary to this Regulation.
 5. The retention of, access to, and disclosure of identifying information collected before January 1, 2017 with respect to which this Regulation would have applied had the collection taken place on January 1, 2017.
- (2) The policy developed under paragraph 4 of subsection (1) shall provide that identifying information collected contrary to this Regulation shall not be retained longer than is reasonably necessary to ensure the information is available in the circumstances in which access may be permitted under paragraph 2 of subsection 9 (10).
- (3) The duties imposed by subsections (1) and (2) on boards in relation to municipal police forces apply to the Minister of Community Safety and Correctional Services in relation to the Ontario Provincial Police.
- (4) The policies developed under this section shall be consistent with this Regulation.

Chiefs of police must develop procedures

- 13.** (1) A chief of police shall develop procedures regarding the matters set out in subsection 12 (1).
- (2) The procedures developed under subsection (1) shall be consistent with this Regulation and the relevant policies developed under section 12.

REPORTS, REVIEWS AND COMPLIANCE

Annual report

- 14.** (1) This section applies to,
 - (a) an annual report provided by a municipal chief of police to a board under section 31 of Ontario Regulation 3/99 (Adequacy and Effectiveness of Police Services) made under the Act; and
 - (b) the annual report provided by the Commissioner under subsection 17 (4) of the Act.
- (2) A chief of police shall ensure that his or her annual report includes the following information in relation to attempted collections of identifying information:
 1. The number of attempted collections and the number of attempted collections in which identifying information was collected.
 2. The number of individuals from whom identifying information was collected.
 3. The number of times each of the following provisions was relied upon to not do something that would otherwise be required under subsection 6 (1):
 - i. subsection 6 (2),
 - ii. clause 6 (3) (a),
 - iii. clause 6 (3) (b), and

- iv. clause 6 (3) (c).
 - 4. The number of times an individual was not given a document under clause 7 (1) (b) because the individual did not indicate that they wanted it.
 - 5. The number of times each of the following clauses was relied upon to not do something that would otherwise be required under subsection 7 (1):
 - i. clause 7 (2) (a), and
 - ii. clause 7 (2) (b).
 - 6. The number of attempted collections from individuals who are perceived, by a police officer, to be within the following groups based on the sex of the individual:
 - i. male individuals, and
 - ii. female individuals.
 - 7. For each age group established by the chief of police for the purpose of this paragraph, the number of attempted collections from individuals who are perceived, by a police officer, to be within that age group.
 - 8. For each racialized group established by the chief of police for the purpose of this paragraph, the number of attempted collections from individuals who are perceived, by a police officer, to be within that racialized group.
 - 9. A statement, based on an analysis of the information provided under this subsection, as to whether the collections were attempted disproportionately from individuals within a group based on the sex of the individual, a particular age or racialized group, or a combination of groups and if so, any additional information that the chief of police considers relevant to explain the disproportionate attempted collections.
 - 10. The neighbourhoods or areas where collections were attempted and the number of attempted collections in each neighbourhood or area.
 - 11. The number of determinations, referred to in subsection 9 (5), that section 5 or clause 9 (4) (a) was not complied with.
 - 12. The number of determinations, referred to in subsections 9 (6) and (7), that section 5, 6 or 7 was not complied with.
 - 13. The number of times members of the police force were permitted under subsection 9 (10) to access identifying information to which access must be restricted.
- (3) A chief of police shall establish age groups for the purpose of paragraph 7 of subsection (2).
- (4) A chief of police shall establish racialized groups for the purpose of paragraph 8 of subsection (2) and shall do so in a way that allows the information required by subsection (2) relating to the racialized groups to be comparable to the data referred to in the following paragraphs, as released by the Government of Canada on the basis of its most recent National Household Survey preceding the period covered by the chief of police's annual report:
1. For each derived visible minority group set out in the National Household Survey, the number of individuals who identified themselves as being within that group.
 2. The number of individuals who claimed Aboriginal identity.
- (5) This section does not require the inclusion of information about anything that occurred before January 1, 2017.

Chiefs of police must review practices and report

- 15.** (1) If an annual report referred to in section 14 reveals that identifying information was attempted to be collected disproportionately from individuals perceived to be within a group or combination of groups, the chief of police shall review the practices of his or her police force and shall prepare a report setting out the results of the review and his or her proposals, if any, to address the disproportionate attempted collection of information.
- (2) A municipal chief of police shall provide his or her report to the relevant board, and the Commissioner shall provide his or her report to the Minister of Community Safety and Correctional Services.
- (3) When a board receives a report from a municipal chief of police under subsection (2), and when the Minister of Community Safety and Correctional Services receives a report from the Commissioner under subsection (2), the board or the Minister, as the case may be,
- (a) shall publish the report on the Internet in a manner that makes it available to the public free of charge and may make the report available to the public free of charge in any other manner that the board or the Minister, as the case may be, considers appropriate; and
 - (b) shall consider the report and the proposals, if any, set out in the report and consider, in the case of a board, whether to give directions under clause 31 (1) (e) of the Act or, in the case of the Minister, whether to give directions to which the Commissioner would be subject under subsection 17 (2) of the Act.

Chiefs of police must make records available

16. (1) For the purpose of carrying out a duty, or exercising a power, under clause 3 (2) (b), (d), (e) or (h) of the Act, in relation to matters to which this Regulation applies, the Minister of Community Safety and Correctional Services may request a chief of police to provide any relevant information that is in the possession or under the control of the chief of police's police force.

(2) A chief of police shall comply with a request made under subsection (1) and shall do so in the manner specified by the Minister.

Review of Regulation

17. (1) The Minister of Community Safety and Correctional Services shall ensure that a review of this Regulation is conducted and that a report on the findings of the review is published no later than January 1, 2019.

Review not by a government employee

(2) The Minister shall ensure that the person who conducts the review is not a public servant within the meaning of the *Public Service of Ontario Act, 2006* and is not employed in the Office of the Premier or in the office of a minister.

Consultation with Minister Responsible for Anti-Racism

(3) The Minister shall ensure that the person who conducts the review consults with the Minister Responsible for Anti-Racism.

PART V
COMMENCEMENT

Commencement

18. (1) Subject to subsections (2) and (3), this Regulation comes into force on the day it is filed.

(2) Sections 1 to 4, 10, 12 and 13 come into force on July 1, 2016.

(3) Sections 5 to 9, 11 and 14 to 17 come into force on January 1, 2017.

- c) l'agent participe à une opération secrète;
- d) l'agent exécute un mandat, agit conformément à une ordonnance judiciaire ou exerce des fonctions connexes;
- e) le particulier auprès duquel l'agent tente de recueillir des renseignements est employé dans l'administration de la justice, ou exerce des fonctions ou fournit des services qui se rapportent d'une autre façon à l'exécution des fonctions de l'agent.

Application — renseignements recueillis

2. (1) Le présent règlement s'applique à l'égard des renseignements identificatoires recueillis le 1^{er} janvier 2017 ou après cette date par suite d'une tentative de collecte qu'il vise.

(2) Le présent règlement ne s'applique à l'égard des renseignements identificatoires qui ont été recueillis avant le 1^{er} janvier 2017 que conformément à la disposition 5 du paragraphe 12 (1) et au paragraphe 13 (1) en ce qui concerne cette disposition.

Non-application — personne nommée en vertu de la *Loi de 2009 sur les services policiers interprovinciaux*

3. Le présent règlement ne s'applique pas à l'égard des tentatives de collecte de renseignements effectuées par une personne nommée à titre d'agent de police en vertu de la *Loi de 2009 sur les services policiers interprovinciaux* ou à l'égard des renseignements recueillis par cette personne.

Interprétation — tentative de collecte de renseignements identificatoires

4. La définition suivante s'applique dans le cadre du présent règlement.

«tentative de collecte auprès d'un particulier de renseignements identificatoires le concernant» S'entend d'une tentative de collecte de renseignements identificatoires consistant à demander au particulier, lors d'une rencontre en tête-à-tête, de donner son identité ou de fournir des renseignements permettant de l'identifier. S'entend notamment d'une telle tentative, que des renseignements identificatoires soient recueillis ou non.

PARTIE II
INTERDICTION : CERTAINES COLLECTES DE RENSEIGNEMENTS

Restrictions applicables à la collecte de certains renseignements

5. (1) L'agent de police ne doit pas tenter de recueillir auprès d'un particulier des renseignements identificatoires le concernant si, selon le cas :

- a) un élément du motif de la tentative de collecte consiste dans le fait que l'agent perçoit le particulier comme appartenant à un groupe racialisé donné, sauf si les conditions suivantes sont réunies :
 - (i) l'agent cherche un particulier donné,
 - (ii) l'appartenance au groupe racialisé fait partie d'une description du particulier donné ou est évidente d'après une représentation visuelle de ce particulier,
 - (iii) l'agent a des renseignements supplémentaires, outre le fait que le particulier donné appartient à un groupe racialisé, qui peuvent aider à identifier le particulier ou à en affiner la description;
- b) la tentative de collecte est effectuée d'une façon arbitraire.

(2) Sans préjudice de ce qui pourrait constituer les renseignements supplémentaires requis aux termes du sous-alinéa (1) a) (iii), ces renseignements peuvent comprendre un ou plusieurs des éléments suivants :

- a) l'apparence du particulier, y compris des renseignements sur ses vêtements, sa taille, son poids, la couleur de ses yeux, la couleur de ses cheveux ou sa coiffure;
- b) l'endroit où pourrait se trouver le particulier;
- c) le type de véhicule dans lequel pourrait se trouver le particulier;
- d) les personnes fréquentées par le particulier et avec lesquelles il pourrait se trouver;
- e) le comportement du particulier.

(3) Les renseignements supplémentaires requis aux termes du sous-alinéa (1) a) (iii) ne peuvent pas consister uniquement en le sexe du particulier, l'âge approximatif du particulier ou ces deux éléments.

(4) Pour l'application de l'alinéa (1) b), la tentative de collecte par l'agent de police auprès d'un particulier est effectuée d'une façon arbitraire, sauf si l'agent a un motif qu'il peut formuler clairement et qui remplit les critères suivants :

1. Le motif comprend des précisions concernant le particulier qui font soupçonner raisonnablement l'agent que l'identification du particulier peut contribuer ou aider à une recherche de renseignements visée à l'alinéa 1 (1) a) ou b) ou à une collecte d'informations visée à l'alinéa 1 (1) c).
2. Le motif ne comprend pas l'un ou l'autre des faits suivants :
 - i. le fait que le particulier a refusé de répondre à une question de l'agent à laquelle il n'était pas légalement tenu de répondre,
 - ii. le fait que le particulier a tenté ou tente de mettre fin à l'interaction avec l'agent dans des circonstances où il en a légalement le droit.
3. Le motif ne consiste pas uniquement dans le fait que le particulier se trouve dans un lieu à forte criminalité.

PARTIE III OBLIGATIONS RELATIVES AUX COLLECTES DE RENSEIGNEMENTS

OBLIGATIONS DE L'AGENT DE POLICE

Obligation d'informer avant une tentative de collecte de renseignements

6. (1) L'agent de police ne doit pas tenter de recueillir auprès d'un particulier des renseignements identificatoires le concernant à moins de faire ce qui suit, conformément aux marches à suivre établies en application de l'article 13 :

- a) il a informé le particulier que ce dernier n'est pas tenu de lui fournir des renseignements identificatoires;
 - b) il a informé le particulier du motif pour lequel il tente de recueillir les renseignements identificatoires le concernant.
- (2) L'agent de police n'est pas tenu d'informer le particulier en application de l'alinéa (1) a) ou b) s'il a un motif de croire que le fait de l'informer en application de cet alinéa pourrait compromettre la sécurité d'un particulier.
- (3) L'agent de police n'est pas tenu d'informer le particulier en application de l'alinéa (1) b) s'il a un motif de croire que le fait de l'informer en application de cet alinéa :
- a) soit compromettrait vraisemblablement une enquête policière en cours;
 - b) soit permettrait l'identification d'un informateur;
 - c) soit pourrait, contrairement à la loi, révéler l'identité d'une personne, y compris l'identité d'un adolescent contrairement à la *Loi sur le système de justice pénale pour les adolescents* (Canada).

(4) Le motif requis aux termes du paragraphe (2) ou (3) doit être un motif que l'agent de police peut formuler clairement et doit comprendre des précisions se rapportant aux circonstances particulières.

Document à l'intention du particulier

7. (1) L'agent de police qui tente de recueillir auprès d'un particulier des renseignements identificatoires le concernant :
- a) d'une part, offre au particulier de lui remettre un document dans lequel la tentative est consignée;
 - b) d'autre part, remet ce document au particulier si ce dernier lui fait savoir qu'il le veut.
- (2) L'agent de police n'est pas tenu de se conformer au paragraphe (1) s'il a un motif de croire que le fait de continuer d'interagir avec le particulier, selon le cas :
- a) pourrait compromettre la sécurité d'un particulier;
 - b) pourrait retarder l'intervention de l'agent en ce qui concerne une autre question nécessitant une intervention immédiate.
- (3) Le motif requis aux termes du paragraphe (2) doit être un motif que l'agent de police peut formuler clairement et doit comprendre des précisions se rapportant aux circonstances particulières.
- (4) Le document dont la remise est exigée aux termes du paragraphe (1) comprend, au minimum, les renseignements suivants :
1. Les nom et numéro matricule de l'agent ainsi que les date, heure et lieu où est effectuée la tentative de collecte.
 2. Des renseignements sur la façon de communiquer avec le directeur indépendant d'examen de la police.
 3. Une explication du fait que le particulier peut demander l'accès aux renseignements le concernant dont un corps de police a la garde ou le contrôle en vertu de la *Loi sur l'accès à l'information municipale et la protection de la vie privée*, dans le cas d'un corps de police municipal, ou en vertu de la *Loi sur l'accès à l'information et la protection de*

la vie privée, dans le cas de la Police provinciale de l'Ontario, et des renseignements sur la façon de communiquer avec les personnes auxquelles une telle demande peut être présentée.

Obligation de l'agent de police de consigner son motif et d'autres renseignements

8. L'agent de police qui tente de recueillir auprès d'un particulier des renseignements identificatoires le concernant consigne ce qui suit :

1. Le motif de l'agent pour la tentative de collecte effectuée, y compris les précisions visées à la disposition 1 du paragraphe 5 (4).
2. Une mention indiquant si le particulier a été informé conformément aux alinéas 6 (1) a) et b) ou, si le fait de l'informer en application de l'un de ces alinéas n'était pas requis aux termes du paragraphe 6 (2) ou (3), le motif pour lequel cela ne l'était pas.
3. Une mention indiquant si le document a été offert au particulier conformément à l'alinéa 7 (1) a) ou, si l'offre du document n'était pas exigée aux termes du paragraphe 7 (2), le motif pour lequel elle ne l'était pas.
4. Une mention indiquant si le document offert aux termes de l'alinéa 7 (1) a) a été remis au particulier ou, si la remise du document n'était pas exigée aux termes de l'alinéa 7 (1) b) ou du paragraphe 7 (2), le motif pour lequel elle ne l'était pas.
5. Les autres renseignements dont le chef de police exige la consignation par l'agent.

INCLUSION DES RENSEIGNEMENTS RECUEILLIS DANS DES BASES DE DONNÉES POLICIÈRES

Renseignements recueillis dans des bases de données policières

9. (1) Le présent article s'applique à l'égard de l'inclusion, dans des bases de données sous le contrôle d'un corps de police, de renseignements identificatoires concernant un particulier qu'un agent de police a recueillis auprès de ce dernier.

(2) Le chef de police veille à ce que les exigences du présent article soient respectées.

(3) L'accès aux renseignements identificatoires doit être restreint conformément au paragraphe (10), à moins que les renseignements ne puissent être inclus dans une base de données en vertu du présent article, sans qu'en soit restreint l'accès par les membres du corps de police.

(4) Des renseignements identificatoires peuvent être inclus dans une base de données sans qu'en soit restreint l'accès par les membres du corps de police si les conditions suivantes sont remplies :

- a) l'agent de police qui a recueilli les renseignements a inscrit les mentions suivantes :
 - (i) la tentative de collecte était conforme à l'article 5,
 - (ii) le particulier a été informé conformément aux alinéas 6 (1) a) et b) ou, si le fait de l'informer en application de l'un de ces alinéas n'était pas requis aux termes du paragraphe 6 (2) ou (3), le motif pour lequel cela ne l'était pas,
 - (iii) le document a été offert au particulier conformément à l'alinéa 7 (1) a) ou, si l'offre du document n'était pas exigée aux termes du paragraphe 7 (2), le motif pour lequel elle ne l'était pas,
 - (iv) le document offert a été remis au particulier conformément à l'alinéa 7 (1) a) ou, si la remise du document n'était pas exigée aux termes de l'alinéa 7 (1) b) ou du paragraphe 7 (2), le motif pour lequel elle ne l'était pas;
- b) selon le cas :
 - (i) le chef de police ou la personne désignée par le chef de police a déterminé, après étude des motifs de l'agent pour effectuer la tentative de collecte, y compris les précisions visées à la disposition 1 du paragraphe 5 (4), que l'article 5, selon toute apparence, a été observé, et s'est assuré que l'alinéa a) a été observé,
 - (ii) la base de données contient une mention indiquant que ce qui est requis aux termes du sous-alinéa (i) n'a pas encore été fait.

(5) Les exigences suivantes s'appliquent si ce qui est requis aux termes du sous-alinéa (4) b) (i) n'a pas été fait lorsque les renseignements identificatoires ont été inclus dans la base de données :

1. Le chef de police ou la personne désignée par le chef de police effectue un examen, au plus tard 30 jours après que les renseignements ont été entrés pour la première fois dans une base de données sous le contrôle du corps de police, pour déterminer, après étude des motifs de l'agent pour effectuer la tentative de collecte, y compris les précisions visées à la disposition 1 du paragraphe 5 (4), si l'article 5, selon toute apparence, a été observé ou non, et si l'alinéa (4) a) a été observé ou non.
2. S'il est déterminé que l'article 5, selon toute apparence, a été observé et que l'alinéa (4) a) a été observé, la mention exigée aux termes du sous-alinéa (4) b) (ii) peut être supprimée.

3. Si, avant la fin du délai de 30 jours prévu à la disposition 1, il n'est pas déterminé que l'article 5, selon toute apparence, a été observé et que l'alinéa (4) a) a été observé, les renseignements identificatoires sont conservés, sous réserve des marches à suivre établies en application de l'article 13 en ce qui concerne la disposition 4 du paragraphe 12 (1), dans une base de données sous le contrôle du corps de police, mais l'accès aux renseignements ainsi conservés doit être restreint conformément au paragraphe (10).
- (6) Au moins une fois par année, le chef de police ou la personne désignée par le chef de police effectue des examens détaillés d'un échantillon aléatoire de taille appropriée des entrées de renseignements identificatoires inclus dans une base de données en vertu du paragraphe (4) pour estimer, avec une marge d'erreur de plus ou moins 5 % et un niveau de confiance de 95 %, si les articles 5, 6 et 7, selon toute apparence, ont été observés ou non.
- (7) Si, par suite d'un examen détaillé effectué en application du paragraphe (6), il est déterminé, à l'égard de renseignements identificatoires inclus dans une base de données en vertu du paragraphe (4), que l'article 5, 6 ou 7 n'a pas été observé, les renseignements identificatoires doivent être conservés, sous réserve des marches à suivre établies en application de l'article 13 en ce qui concerne la disposition 4 du paragraphe 12 (1), dans une base de données sous le contrôle du corps de police, mais l'accès aux renseignements ainsi conservés doit être restreint conformément au paragraphe (10).
- (8) Le chef de police étudie les résultats des examens détaillés effectués en application du paragraphe (6) et prend les mesures qu'il estime appropriées.
- (9) L'accès aux renseignements identificatoires doit être restreint conformément au paragraphe (10) après le cinquième anniversaire de la date à laquelle ils ont été entrés pour la première fois dans une base de données sous le contrôle du corps de police.
- (10) Les règles suivantes s'appliquent à l'égard des renseignements identificatoires auxquels l'accès doit être restreint :
 1. Nul ne peut accéder à ces renseignements sans l'autorisation du chef de police ou de la personne désignée par le chef de police.
 2. Un membre du corps de police ne peut être autorisé à accéder à ces renseignements que si le chef de police ou la personne désignée par le chef de police est convaincu que l'accès à ceux-ci est requis dans l'un ou l'autre des cas suivants :
 - i. aux fins d'une enquête policière en cours,
 - ii. relativement à une instance judiciaire en cours ou envisagée,
 - iii. aux fins de traitement d'une plainte visée à la partie V de la Loi ou pour les besoins d'une enquête visée à l'alinéa 25 (1) a) de la Loi,
 - iv. afin de dresser le rapport annuel visé au paragraphe 14 (1) ou le rapport requis aux termes de l'article 15,
 - v. aux fins de conformité à une exigence légale,
 - vi. aux fins d'évaluation du rendement d'un agent de police.

RESTRICTIONS RELATIVES AUX OBJECTIFS DE RENDEMENT

Interdiction de prendre en compte des objectifs de rendement dans l'évaluation du travail

10. Tout chef de police veille à ce qu'aucun objectif de rendement fondé sur l'un ou l'autre des facteurs suivants ne soit pris en compte pour évaluer l'exécution par un agent de police de son corps de police de son travail :
 1. Le nombre de fois, au cours d'une période déterminée, que l'agent recueille ou tente de recueillir auprès de particuliers des renseignements identificatoires les concernant.
 2. Le nombre de particuliers auprès desquels l'agent recueille ou tente de recueillir des renseignements identificatoires au cours d'une période déterminée.

PARTIE IV **AUTRES QUESTIONS**

FORMATION

Obligation des chefs de police d'assurer la formation

11. (1) Tout chef de police veille à ce que chaque agent de police de son corps de police qui tente de recueillir auprès d'un particulier des renseignements identificatoires le concernant, ou qui agit en qualité de personne désignée par le chef de police aux termes de l'article 9, ait terminé avec succès la formation exigée aux termes du présent article au cours des 36 mois précédents.

(2) La formation visée au paragraphe (1) comprend une formation sur les sujets suivants :

1. Le droit d'un particulier de ne pas fournir de renseignements à un agent de police, les limitations de ce droit et la façon de veiller à ce que ce droit soit respecté.
2. Le droit d'un particulier de mettre fin à une interaction avec un agent de police, les limitations de ce droit et la façon d'éviter la détention psychologique illégale d'un particulier.
3. La sensibilisation aux préjugés, à la discrimination et au racisme ainsi que la façon de les éviter lors de la prestation des services policiers.
4. Le droit des particuliers d'avoir accès aux renseignements les concernant dont un corps de police a la garde ou le contrôle.
5. L'amorce d'interactions avec des membres du public.
6. Le présent règlement et son application.

(3) La formation visée au paragraphe (1) doit être dispensée au Collège de police de l'Ontario ou par un instructeur qui a reçu, à ce même collège, une formation l'habilitant à dispenser la formation visée au paragraphe (1).

(4) La formation visée au paragraphe (1) doit être basée sur un programme approuvé par le directeur du Collège de police de l'Ontario.

POLITIQUES ET MARCHES À SUIVRE

Obligation des commissions de police et du ministre d'élaborer des politiques

12. (1) Les commissions de police élaborent des politiques en ce qui concerne les questions suivantes :

1. Le document à remettre aux particuliers en application de l'article 7.
2. La teneur, en ce qui concerne les questions auxquelles s'applique le présent règlement, du rapport annuel visé au paragraphe 14 (1).
3. Le rapport requis aux termes de l'article 15.
4. La conservation des renseignements identificatoires recueillis le 1^{er} janvier 2017 ou après cette date et l'accès à ceux-ci et leur divulgation, y compris la conservation des renseignements identificatoires recueillis contrairement au présent règlement.
5. La conservation des renseignements identificatoires recueillis avant le 1^{er} janvier 2017 à l'égard desquels le présent règlement se serait appliqué si la collecte avait été effectuée le 1^{er} janvier 2017, l'accès à ceux-ci et leur divulgation.

(2) La politique élaborée en application de la disposition 4 du paragraphe (1) doit prévoir que les renseignements identificatoires recueillis contrairement au présent règlement ne sont pas conservés plus longtemps qu'il n'est raisonnablement nécessaire pour faire en sorte qu'ils puissent être consultés dans les cas autorisés aux termes de la disposition 2 du paragraphe 9 (10).

(3) Les obligations imposées par les paragraphes (1) et (2) aux commissions de police en ce qui concerne les corps de police municipaux s'appliquent au ministre de la Sécurité communautaire et des Services correctionnels en ce qui concerne la Police provinciale de l'Ontario.

(4) Les politiques élaborées en application du présent article doivent être conformes au présent règlement.

Obligation des chefs de police d'établir des marches à suivre

13. (1) Les chefs de police établissent des marches à suivre relatives aux questions énoncées au paragraphe 12 (1).

(2) Les marches à suivre établies en application du paragraphe (1) doivent être conformes au présent règlement et aux politiques pertinentes élaborées en application de l'article 12.

RAPPORTS, EXAMENS ET CONFORMITÉ

Rapport annuel

14. (1) Le présent article s'applique :

- a) au rapport annuel remis par un chef de police municipal à une commission de police en application de l'article 31 du Règlement de l'Ontario 3/99 (Adequacy and Effectiveness of Police Services) pris en vertu de la Loi;
- b) au rapport annuel remis par le commissaire en application du paragraphe 17 (4) de la Loi.

(2) Tout chef de police veille à ce que son rapport annuel comprenne les renseignements suivants relativement aux tentatives de collecte de renseignements identificatoires effectuées :

1. Le nombre de tentatives de collecte et le nombre de ces tentatives dans le cadre desquelles des renseignements identificatoires ont été recueillis.

2. Le nombre de particuliers auprès desquels des renseignements identificatoires ont été recueillis.
 3. Le nombre de fois que chacune des dispositions suivantes a été invoquée pour ne pas faire quelque chose qui aurait été exigé par ailleurs aux termes du paragraphe 6 (1) :
 - i. le paragraphe 6 (2),
 - ii. l'alinéa 6 (3) a),
 - iii. l'alinéa 6 (3) b),
 - iv. l'alinéa 6 (3) c).
 4. Le nombre de fois qu'un document n'a pas été remis à un particulier en application de l'alinéa 7 (1) b) parce qu'il n'a pas fait savoir qu'il le voulait.

 9. Une mention, fondée sur une analyse des renseignements fournis en application du présent paragraphe, indiquant si les tentatives de collecte ont été effectuées de façon disproportionnée auprès de particuliers appartenant à un groupe fondé sur le sexe du particulier, à un groupe d'âge donné ou à un groupe racialisé donné, ou à une combinaison de ces groupes, et, si tel est le cas, tout renseignement supplémentaire que le chef de police estime pertinent pour expliquer cette disproportion.

Obligation des chefs de police d'examiner les pratiques et d'en faire rapport

- 15.** (1) Si un rapport annuel visé à l'article 14 révèle qu'il y a eu tentative de collecte, de façon disproportionnée, de renseignements identificatoires auprès de particuliers perçus comme appartenant à un groupe ou à une combinaison de groupes, le chef de police effectue un examen des pratiques de son corps de police et dresse un rapport énonçant les résultats

de l'examen et les solutions qu'il propose, le cas échéant, pour remédier à la tentative de collecte disproportionnée de renseignements.

(2) Tout chef de police municipal remet son rapport à la commission de police concernée et le commissaire remet le sien au ministre de la Sécurité communautaire et des Services correctionnels.

(3) Lorsqu'une commission de police reçoit un rapport d'un chef de police municipal en application du paragraphe (2) et que le ministre de la Sécurité communautaire et des Services correctionnels reçoit un rapport du commissaire en application du paragraphe (2), la commission de police ou le ministre, selon le cas :

1. The following are the prescribed requirements in order for a person to be eligible to be appointed to the Panel for the purposes of subsection 7 (3) of the Act:

1. The person must be of good character and reputation.
2. The person must have experience, knowledge or training in the subject matter and legal issues dealt with by the Panel.
3. The person must have the ability to carry out the duties of a Panel member with honesty and integrity and in the public interest.
4. The person must have successfully completed such evaluations of the matters referred to in paragraphs 1 to 3 as have been set by the Board.

Additional licences

2. The following are additional capacities, with respect to horse racing in any of its forms, for which a licence is required under section 10 of the Act, together with the licence that is required with respect to that capacity:

1. A person acting as an assistant trainer is required to have an Assistant Trainer licence.
2. A person acting as a hot walker is required to have a Hot Walker licence.
3. A person acting as a pari-mutuel ticket seller is required to have a Pari-Mutuel Ticket Seller licence.
4. A person acting in respect of maintenance, housekeeping or security at a racetrack is required to have an Occupational licence.
5. A person acting as a Commission official is required to have a Commission Official licence.
6. A person acting on behalf of an association is required to have an Association Official licence.
7. A person acting with respect to horse racing while being the spouse of a licensee is required to have a Spouse of a Licensee licence (this does not apply to a person who already holds another licence).
8. A person acting as the authorized agent of a licensee is required to have an Authorized Agent of a Licensee licence.
9. A person carrying on business as a stable or as a corporation that works with respect to horse racing is required to have a Stable/Corporation licence.
10. A person acting as a stable manager or corporate manager is required to have a Stable or Corporate Manager licence.
11. A person participating in the horse improvement program known as “the breeder benefit program” is required to have a Program Breed licence.
12. A person acting as the trustee or estate trustee of a licensee is required to have an Estate/Trust licence.
13. A person acting as an operator of pari-mutuel operations is required to have an Operator of Pari-Mutuel Operations licence.
14. A person acting as the operator of a fair or non-extended meet is required to have an Operator of a Fair/Non-Extended Meet licence.

Transitional

3. (1) The procedures under the Ontario Racing Commission Rules of Procedure, dated March 4, 2008, shall be followed where a proceeding under the *Racing Commission Act, 2000* is continued after the repeal of that Act.

(2) The Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario may continue to hold, in the name of the Ontario Racing Commission, bank accounts of the Ontario Racing Commission that existed before section 2 of the Act came into force, until the member of the Executive Council responsible for the administration of the Act directs that those accounts be closed.

(3) A conviction against, or a ruling, order or judgment in favour of or against the Ontario Racing Commission that existed before section 2 of the Act came into force may be enforced by or against the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario.

(4) The Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario shall be deemed to be the party plaintiff, or the party defendant, as the case may be, in any civil action commenced by or against the Ontario Racing Commission before section 2 of the Act came into force.

Commencement

4. This Regulation comes into force on the later of the day section 2 of the Act comes into force and the day it is filed.

12. La personne agissant à titre de fiduciaire ou de fiduciaire de la succession d'un titulaire de licence est tenue d'être titulaire d'une licence de succession/fiducie.

Dispositions transitoires
