YARN *along the* ROCKIES

Yarn Along The Rockies 2016



Finished Measurements:

43" / 109cm along top edge
19" / 48.5 cm height at center

Gauge:

19 sts & 28 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Garter St
Meeting this exact gauge is not crucial, but any major differences will affect the size of the finished shawl.

Yarn:

132 yards bulky (#6) weight. The scarf is made with double crochets from one skein of Brown Sheep Burly Spun.

Needles & Notions:

Size M (13mm) Hook
Yardstick or Measuring Tape
Scissors

Abbreviations:

Ch(s) = chain(s)
st(s) = Stitch(es)
dc = double crochet
rep = repeat

Pattern

Cut the Fringes:

Measure 60 inches of yarn and cut 13 pieces then lay aside.

Scarf Body

Measure 30 inches of yarn and make a slip knot.

Row 1: ch15, dc in 3rd ch from hook (13dc), turn.

Row 2: ch2, dc in front loop of every st to end (13dc), turn.

Rep R2 until 30 inches of yarn remains and tie off.

Finishing

Fold scarf over and line up the beginning chain and the last row. Knot the 2 yarn tails together (they serve as the first fringe). Now fold the cut yarn strands in half and make a fusing fringe by pulling the loop with your hook through each stitch from both sides across the 13sts.
