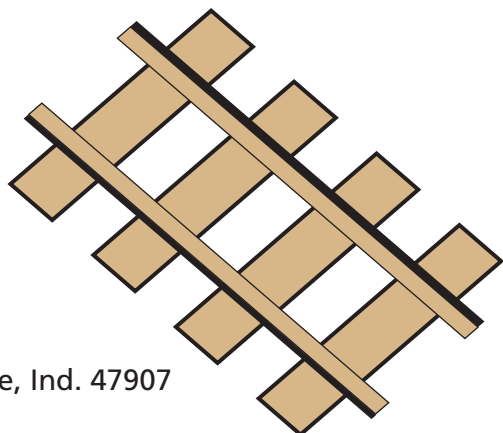

Purdue opens 128th season with road game at Marshall

The game will be televised on Fox Sports 1 Sept. 6 at 3 p.m. ET

THE GAME

- Purdue kicks off the 2015 season with a trip to Marshall, the second-ever meeting between the schools.
- The Boilermakers make their second trip to West Virginia, but the first to Huntington. Purdue won at No. 23 West Virginia 26-24 to open the 1995 season.
- The game is Purdue's first Sunday game since knocking off Syracuse 51-0 at Ross-Ade Stadium in the 2004 season opener. The Boilermakers also opened the 2001 season on a Sunday, winning at Cincinnati 19-14.
- Purdue opens on the road for the second time in three years and fourth time in nine seasons.
- Purdue is 1-4 all-time in games played on Sept. 6, including a loss last year to Central Michigan.
- Prior to Purdue's meeting against Marshall in 2012, the last Conference USA opponent the Boilermakers faced was a 24-22 loss at Rice in 2011. Purdue opened with a win against Middle Tennessee that season, though the Blue Raiders were members of the Sun Belt until 2013.
- Purdue wide receivers coach Gerad Parker returns to Marshall where he held the same position for the Herd in 2011 and 2012.
- Purdue is the first Big Ten team to travel to Huntington, W. Va.
- Sunday's game is Purdue's first on Fox Sports 1.
- Austin Appleby was named Purdue's starting quarterback on Aug. 25. He is Purdue's fifth different season opening starter in the last five years.
- Marshall's offensive coordinator, Bill Legg, was Purdue's co-offensive coordinator in 2006 and 2007, after coaching the Boilermakers' offensive linemen from 2003 to 2005.

CONNECTING THE SCHOOLS

- Third year Purdue assistant coach Gerad Parker spent two seasons coaching the wide receivers in 2011 and 2012. After two seasons coaching Purdue's tight ends, Parker is back working with the wide receivers.
- Purdue's Director of Player Personnel Mike Waugh, in his second year with the Boilermakers, spent three years at Marshall where he earned his master's degree and was the director of high school relations.
- Marshall offensive coordinator Bill Legg was Purdue's co-offensive coordinator in 2006 and 2007, after coaching the Boilermakers' offen-

sive linemen from 2003 to 2005.

- Purdue starting quarterback Austin Appleby's younger brother, Jake, is a redshirt freshman on the golf team at Marshall.

FIRST(S) AND 10

- Purdue's trip to Marshall is the first, not just for the Boilermakers, but for a team in the Big Ten.
- Purdue's Sunday game is its first in 11 years (and one day).
- The game will be Purdue's first to be televised on Fox Sports 1.
- Purdue's game against Marshall marks the first time the Boilermakers have faced a team that won 13 or more games the previous year since 2003 when the Boilermakers played Ohio State, which was coming off a 14-0 season.
- Paul Griggs ranked first in the country last season in field goal percentage on kicks of 50+ yards (min. 3 attempts). Griggs was 3-for-3.
- The Boilermakers return five starters on the offensive line, and six guys who started at least seven games up front a year ago, for the first time since 1963, when Purdue had 11 different guys start on the line that season, after having 10 in 1962.
- D.J. Knox, No. 1, is making his first career start at running back.
- Purdue's first road game of the season, at Marshall, is 28 days earlier than last season's first true road game (at Illinois, Oct. 4, 2014).
- Six Boilermakers are scheduled to make their first career starts for Purdue (WR Domonique Young, TE Jordan Jurasevich, RB D.J. Knox, RE Antoine Miles, FS Robert Gregory, LS Ben Makowski).
- Sunday's game is the first at Purdue for tight ends coach Terry Malone.

THE DARRELL HAZELL FILE



Darrell Hazell was named the 35th head coach in Purdue football history on Dec. 5, 2012. He signed a six-year contract with the Boilermakers. Hazell is in his third year at

Purdue, after spending two seasons as the head coach at Kent State.

Hazell (HAY-zull) was named the 2012 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year after leading Kent State to arguably its most successful season ever, with an 11-3 record and MAC East Division championship. The 11 wins set a school record.

Prior to his time at Kent State, Hazell spent seven seasons at Ohio State, where he served as an assistant head coach and wide receivers coach under Jim Tressel. Hazell has spent 28 years in the college coaching ranks, and has previous stints as Rutgers (2001-03), West Virginia (1999-2000), the U.S. Military Academy (1997-98), Western Michigan (1995-96), Pennsylvania (1992-94), Eastern Illinois (1988) and Oberlin (1986-87, 1989-91).

Hazell graduated in 1986 from Muskingum College with a B.A. in speech communications and business. He was a three-time all-conference selection as a wide receiver and an All-American as a senior.

A native of Cinnaminson, N.J., Hazell (born April 14, 1964) and Annmarie have a son, Kyle.

STARTING UP FRONT

- Purdue returns all five starters on the offensive line, and six guys who started at least seven games up front last season.
- **Robert Kugler** (Sr. - Center) has 31 consecutive starts heading into Sunday's game.
- **Jordan Roos** (Jr. - Right guard) started all 12 games last year and has 18 for his career.
- **Jason King** (Jr. - Left guard) has started 17 straight games.
- **J.J. Prince** (Jr. - Right tackle) started nine games at right tackle last season and has 10 career starts.
- **Cameron Cermin** (Jr. - Tackle) started eight games last season, five at left tackle, three at right.
- **David Hedelin** (Sr. - Left tackle) started the final seven games of the season last year at left tackle.
- The group helped Purdue increase its rushing total by 91 yards per game from 2013 to 2014.
- The group allowed 14 fewer sacks in 2014 than the offensive line did in 2013.
- The group paved the way for 11 more rushing touchdowns in 2014 than in 2013 - nearly triple the total number.
- Purdue is one of nine schools in the country that returns five starters on the offensive line (also Ball State, Boise State, Bowling Green, North Carolina, Ole Miss, Oregon State, Texas, Washington State).
- Thirty-four other schools return four offensive line starters, including Purdue opponents Indiana and Michigan State.

THIS AND THAT

- Purdue was 0-2 in 2014 in games decided by one possession or less. Both games were on the road (Minnesota and Indiana), while both come to Ross-Ade Stadium this season.
- Purdue was within one possession in the fourth quarter in four of its losses last season (vs. Iowa, vs. Michigan State, at Minnesota, at Indiana).
- Purdue increased its scoring output by 8.91 points per game from 2013 to 2014. That is the biggest increase in points per game since 1996 to 1997 (+15.36 ppg). Purdue's offense returns eight starters this season.
- The Boilermakers return 53.3 percent of their total scoring from the last two seasons combined.
- The last time Purdue came off a three-win season, the Boilermakers went 9-3 with a first year starting quarterback (1997).

- Purdue is 4-2 vs. current members of Conference USA. In seasons that the Boilermakers beat a now-Conference USA opponent, Purdue went to three bowl games and had a 6-1 season in 1958.
- The Sept. 6 start date is Purdue's latest opener since 2008 (also Sept. 6).

A WIN WOULD MEAN...

- Purdue picks up its first non-conference road win since 2007 at Toledo.
- Purdue is victorious in its first true road game of the season for the second straight year (at Illinois in 2014).
- Purdue improves to 2-0 all-time vs. Marshall.
- Purdue improves to 5-2 vs. current Conference USA opponents.
- Purdue improves to 2-0 in the state of West Virginia.
- Purdue defeated a team coming off a 13+ win season for the first time in program history.
- Purdue starts the season 1-0 for the second straight year, fourth time in the last five seasons and 10th time in the last 12 years.
- Purdue picks up its 597th win in program history.

THE 'BACKERS ARE BACK

- Purdue returns all three starting linebackers from last season with Ja'Whaun Bentley, Danny Ezechukwu and Jimmy Herman.
- Purdue's linebacking corps, which comprises 11 individuals, has three juniors, four sophomores and four freshmen.
- Purdue is one of just three schools in the country to return all three linebacker starters and have all three with remaining eligibility after this season (also New Mexico State and UCLA).
- **Ja'Whaun Bentley** (So. - MLB) was voted as a captain by the team on Aug. 21. He is Purdue's first sophomore captain since Raheem Mostert in 2012. Bentley is Purdue's top returning tackler from 2014, after starting all 12 games and amassing 76 tackles, including 3.5 for loss, three fumble recoveries and an interception. Bentley was named to ESPN.com's True Freshman All-America team and USA Today Sports Freshman All-America team.
- **Danny Ezechukwu** (So. - OLB) started six games last season as a redshirt freshman. He finished the season with 43 tackles, including 3.0 for loss, 1.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and an interception. Ezechukwu had a career-high 12 tackles at Nebraska



a week after racking up 10 at Minnesota. He had 34 tackles over the final five games last season.

- **Jimmy Herman** (Jr. - OLB) started eight games last season and appeared in 10, missing two with an injury. Herman finished the season with 56 tackles, including 1.5 for loss. He finished with eight tackles in four different games.

AUSTIN APPLEBY

- Austin Appleby was named the starting quarterback on Aug. 25, after starting the final seven games of the 2014 season.
- Appleby has appeared in 11 games, including 10 last season. He is 149-278-11 for 1,517 yards and 11 touchdowns.
- Appleby is Purdue's fifth different opening day starting quarterback in the last five years. No Purdue quarterback has started the season opener in consecutive years since Curtis Painter in 2006, 2007 and 2008.

- Appleby's first start came on the road at Illinois in 2014. He went 15 for 20 for 202 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing for 76 yards and two scores.

OPENING ON THE ROAD

- Purdue is one of six Big Ten teams

that open the 2015 season away from home (also Michigan at Utah, Michigan State at Western Michigan, Penn State at Temple, Wisconsin vs. Alabama in Arlington, Texas, Ohio State at Virginia Tech).

- Purdue opens the season on the road for the second time in three years and third time in the last six seasons.
- Purdue is 11-26-3 all-time in season-opening road games, and 13-26-3 in season openers away from home.
- Purdue's last season-opening road game win was 52-24 in 2007 at Toledo.
- In 1995, Purdue opened the season at No. 23 West Virginia and won 26-24 led by Mike Alstott's 109 rushing yards on 17 carries.
- Austin Appleby's first career start came on the road last season at Illinois. He led the Boilermakers to a 38-27 victory.

CAPTAINS

- Darrell Hazell announced team captains at the team's Kickoff Luncheon on Aug. 21.
- Hazell named seniors Danny Anthrop, Robert Kugler and Frankie Williams captains, as well as sophomore Ja'Whaun Bentley.
- Kugler earned captain status for the second year in a row.
- Bentley is the youngest captain Hazell has ever had. He is Purdue's first sophomore captain since Raheem Mostert was the special teams captain as a sophomore in 2012.
- Captains were voted on by the team. The vote was for upperclassmen, though one slot was opened up for a possible write-in. Bentley was written in by the majority of the team.

FACING THE NATION'S BEST RUSHERS

- Purdue seems to face one of the nation's top running backs week in and week out. Sunday's game will be no different.
- Marshall running back Devon Johnson ranked fifth in the country in rushing yards per game in 2014 with 135.9.
- The Boilermakers faced last year's Nos. 1 and 2 backs in the country in Melvin Gordon (Wisconsin) and Tevin Coleman (Indiana), who averaged 184.8 and 169.7 yards per game, respectively. Against Purdue, Coleman was held nearly 40 yards below his season average.
- Purdue also faced Nebraska's Ameer

COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

- 12** Purdue has played 12 Sunday games in program history and is 6-6.
- 11** Quarterback Austin Appleby has appeared in 11 games in his career, including seven starts. He has thrown 11 career touchdown passes.
- 10** Purdue has 11 players on offense and defense that have started at least 10 games during their career.
- 9** Of Purdue's 12 regular season games, nine are against teams that played in bowl games last season, just one behind the national leaders.
- 8** Over the last eight seasons, Purdue has had seven different opening-game starting quarterbacks and none have started the opener in back-to-back seasons in that span.
- 7** Purdue faced seven of the nation's top-31 rushers last season, including the top two. Sunday, Purdue will make it eight in the last 13 games, as Devon Johnson was fifth in yards per game in 2014.
- 6** Six Big Ten teams open their season away from home, including Purdue.
- 5** Purdue returns all five starters on the offensive line, one of just nine schools in the country to do so and the only one from the Big Ten.
- 4** Purdue has four true freshmen on its offensive and defensive two-deeps, with two on offense and two on defense.
- 3** Purdue is one of just three team in the country to return three starting linebackers who all have eligibility remaining after the season.
- 2** The Boilermakers had two pick-sixes in a span of one minute and 42 seconds in the second quarter the last time they faced Marshall.
- 1** Running back D.J. Knox, No. 1, is making his first career start Sunday, looking to add to an offense that increased its rushing attack by 91-yards per game from 2013.
- 0** There are zero other football games, FBS or NFL, on Sunday.

Abdullah, who was top five in the NCAA prior to an injury. Abdullah finished 14th in the country with 123.9 rush yards per game, but against Purdue, he only gained one yard.

- Purdue also faced Minnesota's David Cobb, Western Michigan's Jarvion Franklin and Michigan State's Jeremy Langford, who ranked 13th, 17th and 20th in the country, respectively. Purdue held Langford 13 yards below his season average.
- Purdue also faced Northwestern's Justin Jackson, who finished the year 31st in the country in rush yards per game.

IRON MEN

- **Robert Kugler** has started 31 straight games at center.
- **Anthony Brown** has started 22 straight games at cornerback.
- **Jason King** has started 17 straight games at left guard.
- **Ja'Whaun Bentley** started all 12 games at linebacker last season as a freshman.
- **Jake Replogle** started all 12 games at defensive tackle last season.
- **Frankie Williams** has started 27 games at cornerback and safety in his career, including 11 each in 2013 and 2014.
- **Austin Appleby and David Hedelin** had both started the last seven games at quarterback and left tackle, respectively.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE FRESHMAN

- Purdue freshman Jarrett Burgess turned 25 on August 25.
- Burgess played five seasons of minor league baseball after being selected in the sixth round of the 2008 Major League Baseball draft by the Seattle Mariners.
- Burgess played outfield and pitched, throwing 97 miles per hour off the mound, during his career in rookie and 'A' ball.
- Burgess came to Purdue during the summer after not playing organized football for more than 10 years, as he did not play in high school.
- Burgess comes from a football-heavy family, as his dad, Fernandez, was a wide receiver for the New York Jets and Miami Dolphins, and his uncle James Burgess, played two seasons as a linebacker for the San Diego Chargers. Jarrett's cousin, James Jr., is a senior linebacker at Louisville.
- Burgess is not the only football player in the country that began their

professional career in another sport: -Hayden Hurst, a 22-year old freshman tight end for South Carolina played baseball in the Pittsburgh Pirates organization prior to playing for the Gamecocks.

- Morgan James, a 25-year old freshman offensive lineman for Cincinnati, played minor league hockey prior to joining the Bearcats football team.
- Melvin Ray, a 26-year old senior wide receiver for Auburn, was a 33rd-round draft pick of the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2008.
- Tyler Stovall, a 26-year old sophomore wide receiver and holder for Auburn, was a second-round draft pick of the Atlanta Braves in the 2008 MLB draft. He also played in the Kansas City Royals system.
- Andy Phillips, a 26-year old junior kicker at Utah, spent five years after high school competing on the U.S. National Ski Team as an alpine racer.
- Wallace Gonzalez, a 22-year old redshirt freshman tight end at Utah, spent three seasons in the Houston Astros' organization after being selected in the 29th round of the 2011 MLB draft.

WATCHLISTS

- Purdue has three players on watch lists to start the season.
- **Paul Griggs**, a senior kicker, has been named to the Lou Groza Award Watch List a year after making 16 of 20 field goals, including 3-for-3 from 50+ yards.
- **Robert Kugler**, a senior center, has been named to the Rimington Award Watch List after starting the last 31 games.
- **Cameron Cermin**, a junior tackle, has been named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List for the top offensive player from Texas who has overcome adversity, especially injury.

PEP BAND ON HAND

- Purdue is sending a 50 member pep band, made up of members of the Purdue "All-American" Marching Band, to play in the stands at the game.
- It is the first time that any portion of the visiting team band will travel in the Purdue vs. Marshall series.

STARTERS FROM NEAR AND FAR

- Purdue's projected offensive starters are from seven different states and one foreign country, while no state is represented more than twice.
- The defensive starters are from six different states.

- The specialists, long snapper, kicker and punter, are from three different states.
- In all, Purdue's 25 starters are from 12 different states and one foreign country.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

- Purdue expects to have five first time starters for Sunday's game at Marshall:
 - Domonique Young (Jr., WR)
 - Jordan Jurasevich (5th, TE)
 - D.J. Knox (So., RB)
 - Antoine Miles (So., RE)
 - Robert Gregory (Jr., FS)
- Last season, the Boilermakers had six first time starters for the season opener, with two on offense and four on defense.
- In 2013, the first year of the Darrell Hazell head coaching era, Boilermakers had five first time starters.

FIFTEEN-YEAR SALUTE

- The Boilermakers remember the 2000 Big Ten Champion and 2001 Rose Bowl team 15 years later.
- The 15th-ranked Boilermakers raised the curtain on the 2000 season with a 48-0 blanking of Central Michigan on Sept. 2 at Ross-Ade Stadium.
- It marked Purdue's first shutout since Oct. 17, 1981; first home shutout since Nov. 4, 1978; and first season-opening shutout since Sept. 19, 1970.
- The Boilermakers amassed 481 yards of total offense while limiting the Chippewas to merely 215 yards.

ANTHROP-OLOGY

- Purdue football's version of Anthropology focuses on senior wide receiver Danny Anthrop.
- Anthrop led Purdue in receiving seven straight games last season, including the Nebraska game, where he incurred a season-ending injury.
- Anthrop had two 100-yard receiving games, and a third with 99 reception yards: Southern Illinois (106), Michigan State (133) and Illinois (99).
- Anthrop also finished the 2013 season on a high with 151 receiving yards and a touchdown on five catches.
- Anthrop seemed to be the piece that kept Purdue's offense going, as in the eight games he was fully healthy, the Boilermakers averaged 28.3 points per game. In the other four, including at Nebraska where he was injured, Purdue averaged just 15.0 points per game.
- Anthrop needs just 46 receiving yards to eclipse 1,000 for his career.
- For his career, Anthrop, from West Lafayette, Ind., has 56 catches for 954 yards and seven touchdowns.

QUARTERBACKS ON THE FIELD

- The Boilermakers look to play three different players on Sunday that were recruiting to Purdue as quarterbacks.
- **Robert Gregory**, listed as the starting free safety on the depth chart, came to Purdue in 2012 as a dual-threat quarterback. That fall, he volunteered to switch positions to running back. Gregory was a reserve running back in 2013, before switching to safety in spring before the 2014 season. Gregory won the Hammer Award, given to the player who is the most outstanding hitter during spring practice, in 2014 and 2015.
- **Bilal Marshall** came to Purdue in the same recruiting class as Gregory. He switched to wide receiver after one season as a reserve quarterback. Marshall has shown promise through fall and spring practices, including being named the offense's Most Improved Player during this year's spring ball.
- **Austin Appleby** was also a member of the 2012 quarterback recruiting class. He stuck with the position and is slated to make his eighth straight start for Purdue.
