Resulted in interventions such as peer reproductive health educators (co-residents of public housing complex), an on-site health facilitator, and regular health “fairs” in the housing complex to create relationships between women and community resources.
  - Individual research (since June 2013) focuses on experience of peer educators and double position as “audience’ and “messenger” of reproductive health information. Two co-authored manuscripts (with Annis Golden) in preparation.
