PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of October, 1940 (P.M. 3872/40), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of service in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine, therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 6th February, 1922, and the 9th March, 1939 sanction was given, *inter alia*, to certain scales of pensions and gratuities to Seamen and Marines who consequent on wounds, hurts, or disability, are invalided from Your Majesty's Naval Service before completing time for Long Service Pension:

“And whereas by Order in Council dated the 21st September, 1939, it was provided that the gratuities payable under Order in Council of the 6th February, 1922, Schedule I (Service element) (b), and Schedule II (b), and under the Schedule to Order in Council of the 9th March, 1939, should not be paid to Seamen and Marines who may be entered only for a period of hostilities:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the provisions of Order in Council dated the 21st September, 1939, should not apply to mobilised members of the Royal Fleet Reserve, Royal Naval Reserve, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer (Wireless) Reserve, who, essentially in the interest of the Service, are discharged from their respective Reserve engagements and execute ‘Hostilities Only’ engagements to serve in other branches of the Naval Service not allowed in the Reserve; and that in such circumstances the time spent under a ‘Hostilities Only’ engagement should be allowed to reckon as mobilised service in the Reserve for the purposes of the award of compensation in the event of invaliding or death during the currency of such engagement, and for the purpose of qualifying for the full Reserve gratuity in the case of Royal Fleet and Royal Naval Reservists.

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the amendment of Order in Council dated 21st September, 1939 accordingly.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Order in Council of 19th *December*, 1923, sanctioned certain revised rates of extra duty pay for Royal Marines employed in appointments at the several Royal Marine Divisions and the Depot, R.M., Deal, and Order in Council of 8th *August*, 1933, authorised the grant of extra duty pay of 1s. 6d. a day to the Sergeant Tailor in responsible charge of the fitting, alteration and repair of clothing and equipment of ranks serving at the Depot, R.M., Deal:

"And whereas we have found it necessary to appoint a Sergeant Tailor for duties at the Royal Marine Reserve Depot, Exmouth, similar in scope to those performed by the Sergeant Tailor at the R.M. Depot, Deal, and we consider that this appointment should also carry with it extra duty pay of 1s. 6d. a day:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of extra duty pay accordingly with effect from 1st *June*, 1940.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 25th *May*, 1922, payment of an allowance of 3d. a day is authorised to Naval ratings while allocated for Hydrophone duties in vessels not carrying qualified Submarine Detectors:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 12th *October*, 1925, payment of Hydrophone Allowance was extended to ratings allocated for duty with hydrophones in vessels of Your Majesty's Navy, notwithstanding the fact that Submarine Detector ratings may also be borne and paid therein:

"And whereas we consider that Naval ratings should be employed as Hydrophone Listeners in certain vessels of Your Majesty's Navy, and that the duties required to be performed by these ratings justify payment of Hydrophone Allowance at the rate of 2d. a day:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of *October*, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry and of the New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, both in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Coventry:

"Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Benefices of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, and of Saint Anne, Coventry are now full, the Reverend Graham William Clitheroe being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, and the Reverend Leonard Bruce being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Anne, Coventry, and the said Graham William Clitheroe and Leonard Bruce have signified their consent to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

" And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Coventry appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a meeting held on the 1st day of August, 1940, signified their consent to the alteration of boundaries herein proposed:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Mervyn, Bishop of Coventry (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, and of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of that detached portion of the Parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, which is known as the Holy Trinity Without, Coventry.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The territory to be annexed to the detached portion of the Parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, which is known as the Holy Trinity Without, Coventry, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Coventry, being:—

" All that portion of the New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, in the said County and Diocese which is bounded upon the east by the said detached portion of the Parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, upon the south by the Parish of Baginton, upon a part of the west by the Parish of Stivichall, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the west and upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Stivichall from the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, at the junction of the River Sherbourne with the stream which flows into that river past the south-western side of Whitley Common and extending thence generally north-eastward along the middle of the River Sherbourne for a distance of 47 chains or thereabouts to a point in the centre of Whitley Bridge which carries London Road across the said river, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of London Road for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the south-western end of the fence forming the north-western boundary of the close numbered 188 upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme and extending thence first north-eastward and then generally eastward along the last mentioned fence and along the fence forming the

northern boundary of the said close to its eastern end and extending thence in a straight line for a distance in all of 18 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, from the said detached portion of the Parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Coventry has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Coventry.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, of the New

Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, of the New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, and of the New Parish of Saint Silas, Blackburn, all in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn:

"Whereas District Chapelries have been assigned to the Church of Saint Mark, Witton, the Church of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, the Church of Saint Luke, Blackburn, the Church of Saint Philip, Griffin, and the Church of Saint Silas, Blackburn, by the Orders in Council the dates of which are stated in the 2nd column of the following Table:—

"And whereas the said District Chapelries have under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parishes shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn; (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and is thereon coloured yellow shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, and (thirdly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Mark, Witton, which

is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and is thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Silas, Blackburn.

And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The First Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn, comprising:—

"1. All that portion of the New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, in the said County and Diocese which lies to the north of the middle of the roads called Redlam Brow and Bank Top.

"2. And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, which lies to the east of the middle of Perth Street.

"3. And also all that portion of the New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, in the said County and Diocese which is bounded upon the north-west by the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south upon the south-east and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, of the New Parish of Saint Aidan, Blackburn, in the said County and Diocese, and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, all meet on the western bank of the river Darwen and extending thence in a straight line due eastward for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Stansfeld Street and Thornber Street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Thornber Street for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Taylor Street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Taylor Street for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the boundary which divides the London Midland and Scottish Railway from the backs of the houses and premises situate on the south-eastern side of Craig Street and extending thence north-eastward along the said wall or fence for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to its north-eastern end and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Galligreaves Street on the south-western side of the bridge under the King Street Branch of the said railway.

"4. And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, which is bounded upon the north-west and upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke,

Blackburn, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, at a point in the middle of Harrison Street on the north-eastern side of the bridge under the King Street Branch of the London Midland and Scottish Railway and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the middle of Harrison Street for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn.

" The Second Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, which is bounded upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, upon the south-east and upon the south-west partly by the said New Parish of Saint Aidan, Blackburn, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Francis, Fenisccliffe, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Francis, Fenisccliffe, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, at a point in the middle of Preston Old Road and extending north-eastward along the middle of Preston Old Road for a distance of $25\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Spring Lane and with the road called Redlam and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Redlam for a distance of $26\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thompson Street and with the road called Redlam Brow and extending thence eastward along the middle of Redlam Brow for a distance of 15 yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, from the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin.

" The Third Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Silas, Blackburn, in the said County and Diocese being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, which is bounded upon the north-east by the said New Parish of Saint Silas, Blackburn, upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Mary, Mellor, upon the west by the New Parish of Immanuel, Feniscowles, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Immanuel, Feniscowles, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, at a point in the middle of Billinge End Road and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of Billinge End Road for a distance of 63 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, from the said New Parish of Saint Silas, Blackburn."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation

and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Blackburn.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Middlesbrough, and of the New Parish of Saint Columba, Middlesbrough, both in the County and Diocese of York:

" Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 16th day of January, 1873, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Paul, situate in the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Middlesbrough, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Middlesbrough':

" And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the 12th day of March, 1903, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Columba, Middlesbrough, situate in the New Parish of All Saints, Middlesbrough, in the said County and Diocese, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Columba, Middlesbrough':

" And whereas the said Consolidated Chapelry and the said District Chapelry have under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

" And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Middlesbrough, and of the said New Parish of Saint Columba, Middlesbrough, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parishes shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Middlesbrough, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Columba, Middlesbrough.

TREASURY DIRECTIONS.

The Treasury, in pursuance of paragraph (2) of Regulation 1 of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, have, by the Acquisition of Securities (No. 4) Order, 1940, transferred to themselves certain securities as detailed in that Order.

name of the Benefice, in respect of which capital sum, so long as the same or any part thereof shall remain in our hands, there shall be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice the yearly sum the amount of which is stated in the seventh column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, or such part thereof as shall be proportionate to any balance of the same capital sum which shall so remain in our hands, the yearly sums so payable in respect of the benefaction and of the grant to commence as from the date stated in the eighth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice. Provided always that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall operate only as a single grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.
