Global Community Pledges \$835 million (Rs. 4175 crores) for Polio Eradication

Rotary International, Gates Foundation as well as the British & German Government have made a total commitment of US \$835 million (Rs. 4175 crores) for the global fight against Polio.

The Gates Foundation will be awarding a US \$ 355 million challenge grant to Rotary, which Rotary will match by raising \$200 million from its members, over the next three years. Britain will be giving a contribution of \$ 150 million (200 million pounds) and Germany will be awarding \$ 130 million, that will go to the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) over the next five years.

"Rotarians, Government leaders and Health Professionals have made a phenomenal commitment, so Polio afflicts only a small number of the world's Children. Rotary in particular has inspired my own personal commitment to get deeply involved in achieving eradication." Said Bill Gates. co-chair of the Gates Foundation.



Stressing on the importance of this new commitment of Polio funds to India, Rotary's INPPC Chairman Deepak Kapur said, "For India to continue with the Polio campaign, these funds are very necessary and significant in eradicating the virus from its stronghold in U.P and Bihar". So far, Rotary's contribution of US \$86.97 million (Rs. 391 crores) to India alone has helped provide the much needed operational support, surveillance, medical personnel, social mobilization and educational materials for health workers and parents."

Weekly Meetings A glimpse of our Club Meetings



3rd Nov 2008.

Speaker: Mr. Manish Chokhani
(Director: Enam Securities Pvt. Ltd.),
Topic: Outlook in Stock Markets and Current Economic Situation

Mr. Manish Chokani spoke about how the world markets are going through times of de-leveraging. He said everyone was focusing on the sub – prime problem and American banks, whereas European banks are the ones which were more leveraged than American banks. He stated that it is in times such as these that one should choose the businesses which one wants to invest in as many are available at near distress levels. If one were to make good investments at this point of time one may make good returns in times to come. However he added that the coming few months could be those of intense pain and bad news would continue to flow from overseas markets.

10 November 2008 Speaker: Dr. Vidyadhar Oke, Topic: Astrology

Dr. Vidyadhar Oke spoke about Astrology in general and how planetary positioning affects a mans life. He stated that man is a maker of his own destiny. His life depends on 2 aspects - his karma, which he creates for himself and the second is the planetary alignment at different points of time. He went on to say that Astrology cannot be used to predict definitive dates and events, and should be used merely for guidance to tell us if we are swimming with the tide or against the tide.





18th November 2008 Speaker: Mr. Ajay Mitra (CEO World Gold Council), Topic: Investment Opportunities in Gold

Mr. Ajay Mitra gave us a perspective on the demand – supply of gold and its uses. Although jewellery still accounts for about 70% of the total demand of this yellow metal, new uses are being developed with efforts from World Gold Council. India continues to be one the largest consumers of gold today. Mr. Mitra also spoke of Gold as an alternative investment and how it has appreciated faster than many other asset classes and how it is used as a store of value especially in times of economic upheaval and times of war.

24th November 2008 Speaker: DGN Jayant Kulkarni Topic: Relevance of Rotary Today

DGN Jayant Kulkarni spoke about the Relevance of Rotary and of his Vision of Rotary and our District in the future. He spoke eloquently about the current World need for serious NGOs such as Rotary and about how Rotary is even more relevant and necessary in these critical times.

15th December 2008 Speaker: Mr. N. Chandra, (Well Known Filmmaker) Topic: Changing Face of Indian Cinema



22 December 2008. Speaker: Ms. Shaheen Mistri, Topic: Teach For India

Teach for India's mission is to create a movement of leaders who will bring in equality in education. Teach for India aims to narrow the education gap in India by placing India's most outstanding college graduates, post graduates and young professionals in low- income schools to Teach for 2 years. Teach for India is inspired by Teach for America in the US, which, since 1990, has successfully recruited and placed top graduates from colleges like Harvard, Yale. Princeton, etc as teachers in low – income schools in the U.S. In the same way Teach for India will provide a source of dedicated teachers who will expand educational opportunities to thousands of India's underprivileged children

5th January 2009. Speaker Col. Tarneja, Tops Intl Security. Topic: Security Challenges of the day

Col. Tarneja made a presentation on the need for a very alert security in our residence and workplace in the current environment. He spoke of the methodology adopted by his firm in recruitment, training, rotation of guards etc. He gave us real life examples and tried to tell us how a well trained security is different and better equipped to tackle emergency situations as against the conventional watchman that z a lot of buildings still employ.

12th January 2009. Speaker : Dr. Anand Gokani, Topic : The Health Balance

Dr. Anand Gokhani visited our Club and Spoke on **The Health Balance**. He explained his theory about how the pH of our human body affects our health and functioning.

He then went on outline how Alkaline foods improve the functioning of our system as against Acidic foods.

He explained this new Philosophy with specific incidents about how a correction in food habits actually helped to relieve and correct grave Physical Disorders and improve health dramatically.





2nd February 2009. Speaker: Dr. Dara Rupa Topic: Biorhythm

Dr . Dara Rupa explained the interesting concept of Biorhythm. He said, life is subject to consistent changes and is governed by a set of regular cycles influenced by the Sun, Moon, Day, Night, etc. The biorhythm sinusoidal cycles can be calculated, interpreted and day to day life movements can be predicted. The study helps is to predict the future based on 8 different cycles such as Physical cycle, Emotional cycle, Intellectual cycle, etc. These predictions can help us take better decisions pertaining to day to day life, business and relationships.

16th February 2009. Speaker : Mr. Julio Ribeiro Topic : CTC(Citizens Take Charge) Following 26/11

Mr. Julio Ribeiro, former Police Commissioner of Mumbai came together with other active citizens of CTC. The CTC is a movement whereby citizens through a common platform constantly remind the government of the need to increase security and beef up intelligence for protection of the common man. All members of the CTC are free to come with suggestions to increase security. They want responsible people to form an area-wise crisis management committee so that proper aid can reach the people in case of emergencies. 5 Rotary Presidents from our district attended the meeting and many clubs guaranteed membership to CTC.



Major Projects



7th December 2008 to 13th December 2008 Rose Festival Week at Phoenix Mills

We co-hosted a large function for the Rose Festival Week from 7th December to 13th December. DG Bansi Dhurandhar & Other Dignitaries came and graced this 7 day long function. We also conducted Blood and Sugar Tests free of cost for all those who came there. We also felicitated policemen who bravely faced the Mumbai 26/11 dastardly act.

8th December 2008 Micro Credit Project

We did the Micro Credit Project on 08.12.08 with Streehitakarini. We handed over contribution amount of Rs. 75,000/- besides asking them to rollover our previous contribution of Rs 25,000/- taking our total current support to Rs 1,00,000/-

16th December 2008 Cancer Camp at Small Causes Court

We held a Cancer Camp Project at Mazgaon. 50 Female and 44 Male were given a complete check up for detection of Cancer.



Dharampur School Visit on 14th December 2008



Dharampur is a village located close to Vapi in Gujarat. Our club has undertaken several projects at Dharampur for the last couple of years. Dharampur which is a hilly terrain is inhabited by tribals, none of which had any formal education. Most of them have never even seen what a city looks like. For them Agriculture is the only means of sustenance. It is for a place like this that a wonderful couple Kokilaben and Bhikhubhai left their life in the city and re – located to help in the upliftment of the area. Their life has truly been dedicated for the people of that area. The couple is running 7 boarding schools with 800 children (one of them adopted by our Rotary Club since two years) where children from neighbouring area's come to study. They are charged very nominal fees so that education is valued by the children. They are the first generation in their families to be educated. Many of the students have completed standard 10 with distinction and first class. After completion they have the option to go to nearby towns

where a 45 – 60 days vocational course is arranged for them in fields like carpentry, plumbing, tailoring, etc so that they can get self employed and live a better life. Besides adopting a school, our Club has built 40 Check dams that help the farmers store water during monsoon and use it for farming for the rest of the year.

We have also helped the farmers with Soil Bunding to conserve the upper soil and minerals from being washed away with the monsoon water. Other activities that our Club has undertaken in the district are Cleft Palate surgeries and Tree Plantation. The members who attended the project had a wonderful experience of knowing what life is like in backward areas &how people who have so little in monetary terms are still content. We look forward to our member's and our friend's support so that we can continue to do the good work that has been started.

We visited Dharampur on 14.12.08 for inspection of the School and handing over of our contribution of Rs. 3,50,000/- for the School. 15 Members and 4 Spouses came to Dharampur for this project.

We have conducted Polio NID on 21.12.08 and 01.02.09 where a number of children were given Polio Vaccines at Nana Chowk.
