### FROM THE **MANAGER**

I'd like to start by welcoming Steve King and his Whitehawk side to The Fortress Stadium for this evening's game.

We were pleased to have hosted a Crystal Palace XI here at the Fortress Stadium for our final pre-season friendly and it proved to be the perfect workout for us prior to our season start whereby we mostly dominated a young Crystal Palace side, keeping a good defensive shape until late in the game and creating a number of goalscoring opportuni-



ties which led to an entertaining game for a good crowd ending in a 3-2 win.

We went to Havant on Saturday knowing that the season itself brings a real different level of application from both sides and it turned out to be exactly what we expected. Therefore it was great to get our early goal away from home to settle us into our way of playing and even more pleasing to go in 2-0 up at half-time with a second great strike from Ali outside the box equal to Moses Ademola's opener.

Following half time we were disappointed that we didn't control the possession as well as we would have liked to. Although we expected Havant to come at us in the 2nd half with more attacking options, our defensive shape wasn't as good as we had been working on as of late and I must say they had a number of opportunities of their own and we were grateful to Seb Brown for a number of good saves. The third goal was critical for us with a great strike from Pierre Joseph-Dubois and it could well have been four when Harry Grant finished off a well-worked goal that was ruled out for offside.

Havant then had a flurry of possession which they took advantage of by being awarded a penalty but all in all, we were delighted to score 3 well-taken goals and get 3 important points away from home to get the season underway in the best way that we could have hoped.

We know what a difficult task it will be this evening against Whitehawk with the great squad that they have, and we know they'll be a very big test for us, but we're hoping that we will take the good work we have done throughout pre-season to try and win the points.

# MATCH REPORT



Bromley 3-2 Crystal Palace: Bromley survived a late fight back to beat a youthful Crystal Palace side at The Fortress Stadium.

Bromley were gifted a chance early on when Ryan Inniss was penalised for a back pass under pressure from Louis Dennis. From the following free-kick, Ali Fuseini laid the ball to Reece Prestedge but his effort was blocked by the wall. A few minutes later Bromley were in front, with

Prestedge providing the chance this time. The midfielder swung in a corner that was headed home powerfully at the far post by Harry Grant to give Bromley the lead. Bromley nearly doubled their lead a few minutes later after Louis Dennis made a superb run with the ball from his own half before crossing for Moses Ademola, whose powerful shot was beaten away by Chris Kettings. Rob Swaine almost scored his second goal of pre-season when he got on the end of a



Harry Grant corner, but headed over the bar. Moses Ademola then forced two saves out of Kettings, the first of which coming after Palace had given the ball away in their own last third. Harry Grant then tested Kettings, who was being kept busy in the first half, with an audacious half-volley on the turn that skidded across the turf and was well held by the Palace goalkeeper. Ademola continued to threaten the visitors, smashing a powerful effort in from 25 yards that flew over the crossbar, before running on to a superb Ali Fuseini through ball and firing over.

Ademola doubled Bromley's lead at the start of the second half with a sweet curling effort. Joe Anderson threw the ball in to Ali Fuseini who flicked it to Ademola, and the skilful player took one touch before burying the ball in the far corner of the net. It was almost a third a few minutes when Ugo Udoji fired a low ball across goal that was just in front of Ademola. Seb Brown was called into action when he made a save from point blank range to prevent a Sullay Kaikai header going in. Bromley made a raft of substitutions shortly after the hour mark, and Pierre Joseph-Dubois was one of them, with the midfielder scoring with his first touch of the game. Reece Prestedge was again the provider from a corner, as his delivery was bundled home from close range by Joseph-Dubois. Palace pulled a goal back when Gus Sow let fry from distance and saw his effort fly in off the underside of the crossbar. Bromley almost scored from the resulting kick-off as Ali Fuseini drove forward and fired a low effort that was well held by Kettings. Adam Birchall then hit the post after a superb attacking move by the home side before Palace were awarded a penalty after Rob Swaine brought down Sullay Kaikai. KaiKai picked himself up and duly dispatched the penalty past Brown, sending the goalkeeper the wrong way.

### MATCH REPORT



Havant & Waterlooville 1-3 Bromley: Bromley got their season off to the perfect start as they comfortably swept aside Havant & Waterlooville at Westleigh Park.

Bromley opened the lead in the sixth minute with the first effort of the game. Joe Anderson and Harry Grant kept the ball well on the left hand side and fed birthday boy Moses Ademola who exchanged passes with Pierre Joseph-Dubois before firing a

half-volley that flew into the top corner despite Ryan Young getting a hand to it. The Lillywhites doubled their lead soon after with another superb strike, again coming from a half-volley. Joe Anderson's clever throw found Ali Fuseini in space, and the midfielder hit an incredible half-volley that Young could get nowhere near. Seb Brown then pulled off an amazing save after Havant broke quickly from a Bromley corner. Ryan Young did well to collect the cross under pressure from



Ademola before kicking the ball long quickly, with Mullings holding off Ugo Udoji before feeding Nic Ciardini, and Brown got down superbly to his left to tip the ball onto the post.

Bromley nearly got the second half off to the perfect start through Harry Grant. Adam Bailey-Dennis cleared the ball into the path of Sam Higgins who linked with Ademola well, with the former feeding the ball for Grant, whose shot was spilt by Young and nearly rolled in, only for Dan Strugnell to put the ball behind. Substitute JJ Hooper saw a powerful effort deflected over as Havant tried to get back into the game, before Shamir Mullings saw a header cleared off the line by Ali Fuseini from the resulting corner. Seb Brown then pulled off his second superb reaction save of the game, somehow getting a hand to a Perry Ryan effort and helping the ball over the bar. Scott Donnelly then went extremely close to pulling a goal back for the home side when he curled in a free-kick that crashed off the top of the crossbar and went behind before Harry Grant saw a volley tipped over the crossbar by Young after a great Udoji cross. Bromley then got their well-deserved third goal when Pierre Joseph-Dubois won the ball well inside the Havant half and smashed the ball home past Young

and into the top corner with his left foot. Bromley had the ball in the net for the fourth time just a minute later after an incredible move involving six players that started in their own half and finished with Grant heading home a Udoji cross, only for it to be ruled out for offside. Havant then had a chance to pull a goal back when Adam Bailey-Dennis was judged to have fouled Scott Donnelly, and the midfielder picked himself up and put the resulting penalty past Brown.

## HARRY **GRANT**



Midfielder Harry Grant couldn't hide his delight after Bromley's 3-1 win over Havant & Waterlooville on the opening day of the season.

"I was over the moon at full-time on Saturday, it was the exact performance that we had been working towards throughout pre-season. It's great to get off to such a good start with a great result."

Two early goals from Moses Ademo-

la and Ali Fuseini helped Bromley race into a 2-0 lead, something that pleased Grant.

"It was unbelievable to get off the mark so early with two great goals. It put us in such a strong position going into half-time which we wanted, and it gave us such a great platform to go into the second half and control the game."

The home side enjoyed a lot more



possession in the second-half, meaning that both wingers put quite the shift in, and Harry was pleased with his own performance.

"It was a hard-working performance and I had to do a lot of the dirty work throughout the game, but I was very pleased with both my own, and the team's performance."

Grant got on the end of a Ugo Udoji cross and headed home at the end of an incredible move involving a number of one touch passes, only to be cruelly ruled offside.

"I was absolutely gutted to be given offside. It was such a great move by the boys and I was so happy to be on the end of it but gutted that it didn't count."

The midfielder arrived from Gillingham in the summer, and has enjoyed his time so far at the club. "The lads are great and everyone's really nice to each other. I've settled in really well and can't wait to keep playing throughout the season."

Having been handed a starting shirt for the first game of the season, Grant admits to being happy to start, and is determined to keep his place in the side. "It's always nice to be in the starting eleven, but you have to know that your performance has got to be up there because other lads are right there behind you ready to take your place if needs be. It keeps you on your toes and it's always great to have competition."

Tonight sees Bromley play at The Fortress Stadium for the first time in the league this season, and Harry makes it clear that there is one target.

"We hope to get three points every game we go into this season, particularly being at home. So we've just got to build on that, starting on Tuesday."

As well as a convincing display at Westleigh Park, all three of the goals on Saturday were excellent strikes, something that Harry feels sums up the quality of the side on show.

"It's great to be in training with some of the lads, it's a great group of players and you saw today the quality that we have. All three goals were brilliant and came from outside of the area and sums up the quality we have here."



### WHAT'S **NEW**



Since last season, there have been several changes within the Conference League. Below are some of those alterations, particularly those appertaining to our division as follows:

This season the League will be known as the Vanarama Conference South League. Previous sponsors Skrill have ended their association after just one season, and have been replaced by Vanarama Car & Van Leading who have signed a three year agreement.

St Albans City have regained their Conference South position by virtue of winning the Southern League Play Off, after three seasons in the lower Division.



Accompanying them from that League are Champions Hemel Hempstead (above), who secured top spot winning the title by ten points.

From the Isthmian League, Wealdstone are promoted as Champions to a League they were members of in the 1980s, before the addition of the North and South Divisions a few years ago.

Lowestoft Town were the other Club prompted from the Ryman League and originally placed in the South section. But, following the shambles at Salisbury City the Norfolk side have now been placed in the North Division.

The Wiltshire Club have been relegated after just one season in the top division, due to financial irregularities and it is still not clear as to whether they will take up their place in the Division. The League Management must take all of the blame for allowing this situation to develop, and it is now the subject of an FA Appeal. It remains to be seen whether there are 21 or 22 Clubs competing this season. The second time Salisbury have suffered this fate in five seasons.

With four new Club's arriving, it means the same number must ply their trade in other directions, and as a consequence Eastleigh (as Champions) and Dover Athletic (play off winners) have been promoted to the top division.

The Kent side overcame Sutton United and Ebbsfleet United in the Play Offs, after snatching a play off spot with a penalty in the 87th minute of their last fixture against Hayes & Yeading United, a victory which also condemned the Middlesex Club to relegation.

However, following an unsuccessful appeal to both the League and the Football Association concerning their relegation, Hayes were finally given a reprieve following Hereford United's expulsion from the Premier Division.

His change of mind came when his budget figures for this season were revealed.

He has been replaced by Micky Bell, the former Bristol City full back and

more recently at Southern League South & West side, Clevedon Town.

Laird has been appointed Assistant Manager at Weymouth.

Salisbury City manager, Mikey

Harris (below), has quit the troubled Wiltshire Club to become Youth Team boss at Portsmouth.

He led the Whites to a 12th place finish in Conference Premier last season, after being promoted from Assistant in July 2013.



### WHITEHAWK



Based in Sussex, the suburban Brighton side were founded in 1945 as Whitehawk & Manor Farm Boys, and joined the Sussex County League in 1952/53.

After finishing 3rd in their inaugural season, The Hawks were runners-up for the next successive seasons and were never out of the top five before changing their name to Whitehawk FC in 1960.

Then In 1961/62 Whitehawk won the

first of Four Division One titles. The following season the competition was abandoned due to bad weather, but in 1963/64 the Hawks retained the championship finishing 3 points above Lewes.

The next 3 seasons were nowhere near as successful and the club found itself relegated at the end of the 1966/67 season, but made an immediate return as Division 2 champions in 1968.



The next 9 years saw the Hawks continue to compete in the top division, until relegation for a second time in 1976/77, spending 4 seasons in Division 2 before promotion as champions in 1980/81. In 1983/4, the Hawks won Division 1 for the 3rd time and also enjoyed a good run in the FA Vase before losing in the 4th round.

Then in 1986/87, the Hawks finished as runners up to Arundel, whilst enjoying their best ever run in the FA Cup in 1988/89, going out in the 4th Round Qualifying after a replay to Bognor Regis Town. In 1993/94 the Hawks finished runners-up again, this time to Wick, but also had a great run in the FA Vase, reaching the 5th round before defeat 3-2 at home by Boston Town.

The 2002/3 season saw the club finish in the 2nd spot to run away winners Burgess Hill Town.

A modest 8th place followed the next season, but things improved in 2004/05 with a 3rd place finish only a point behind runners-up Rye & Iden Utd. The 2006/07 season saw The Hawks come 2nd in the league again and be beaten finalists in the R.U.R. Cup, losing 2-1 to Chichester City. The club also reached the quarter final of the FA Vase, losing a 1-0 to eventual winners Truro City. Then in

2009/10 The Hawks finished top of the Sussex Country Football League Division 1 gaining promotion the Isthmian League. After a season at that level, Whitehawk won the league in 2011/12 and won the Sussex Senior Cup beating Crawley Down 2-1 in the final. After promotion to the Premier Division for the 2012/13 season the club won the division at their first attempt, meaning they would play in the Conference South for the first time in their history.

After the impressive 3 promotions in 4 years the 2013/14 season resulted in a 19th place finish meaning the club secured a second season at this level.



#### WHITEHAWK

Lance Cronin: Brighton-born former England C goalkeeper who began his career as a professional at Crystal Palace. He had a loan spell at Wycombe before joining Oldham Athletic. Picked for England C while at Ebbsfleet, where he made 176 league appearances, later played for Gillingham, Bristol Rovers. Lance spent last season at Macclesfield Town in the Conference Premier.

Paul Lorraine: Signed from play-off finalists Ebbsfleet after spending 4 seasons at the Kent side. Paul was club captain for The Fleet but ultimately left during the summer for pastures new at Whitehawk. Paul has won the Conference South and played in last season's 2013/14 play-off final losing to Dover 1-0. Lorraine's previous clubs include Woking and AFC Wimbledon.

Frantz Tchonang Ngassa: Cameroonian defender who has joined Whitehawk via France. Frantz put pen to paper during the Summer of 2014 after a short spell with Waltham Forest. Previous clubs include AS De Poissy and Les Mureaux.

Tom Cadmore: Signed during pre-season of 2013. Tom made 200+ appearances for Hayes & Yeading over 5 seasons, which is a club record. An excellent season in 2008/09

saw him lifting the Conference South play-off trophy and being voted the club's Player of The Year. He made his England `C` debut in 2009 in Hungary.

Osei Sankofa: The former England U20 international and Charlton man signed for The Hawks in Pre-Season of this year. He made 19 first team appearances for The Addicks making his debut at Old Trafford. Previous clubs include Bristol City, Brentford, Southend, Farnborough and Ebbsfleet.

Lee Hills: Was a junior at Wimbledon for 5 years before briefly joining Arsenal. In 2005 he joined Crystal Palace and progressed through the youth ranks to make the first-team at 17 going on to make 45 appearances. Had spells at Colchester, Oldham, Southend. Hills igned from Stevenage and has represented England at U18 & U19.

Sergio Torres: Signed for Whitehawk when his contract at Crawley expired at the end of last season. Torres spent 4 seasons at Crawley during which time he won promotion to the Football League under Steve Evans, reached the fifth round of the FA Cup where they played Manchester United at Old Trafford and then gaining promotion to League One. Sam Deering: A Chelsea junior but made his breakthrough at Oxford United appearing in 58 first team games after making his debut in 2008. Ahmed Abdulla: A Saudi Arabian born player who played for Arsenal's youth team before joining West Ham as a sixteen year-old in 2008 and signing as a professional contract with the Hammers in 2011. Had a loan spells at Swindon Town and Dagenham & Redbridge. Signed for Whitehawk from Barnet.

Serge Makofo: Congolese player who began at Milton Keynes Dons where he scored on his debut in a Football League Trophy game against Bristol City. Last season he played in Cyprus with second division side PAEEK. Also had spells at Kettering, Maidenhead, Grays Athletic, Burton Albion, Grimsby and Farnborough.

Pa Saikou Kujabi: A full Gambian international with ten caps, who played

in the Scottish Cup Final two years ago. After unsuccessful trials with Portsmouth, QPR and West Ham he signed for Hibernian. Has also played in Germany for FSV Frankfurt.

Jake Robinson: Brighton born, a successful player for Brighton & Hove Albion. A product of BHA's youth system making his debut in 2003 against Middlesbrough. He is Brighton's youngest-ever scorer at 16. In 2006 he scored his first hat-trick for Brighton against Huddersfield. Other clubs include Shrewsbury, Torquay, Northampton.

Danny Mills: Started his career with the Croydon FC youth system in 2007, before signing for Conference National club Crawley Town in 2008. Has also played for Peterborough United, Torquay United and Histon in the Conference National. Other teams include Kettering Town, Tamworth and Carshalton Athletic. Mills was Whitehawks Top Scorer last season.

Sam Gargan: Started at Brighton in 2007 and made his League debut in April 2008 at Bristol Rovers. He enjoyed loan spells at Worthing, Bognor, Welling, Havant & Waterlooville, Lewes and Eastbourne Borough. In 2009 he signed for Sutton United before moving to Whitehawk in 2010.
