Chancellor Paula Allen-Meares



Paula Allen-Meares joined the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC) January 16, 2009 as Chancellor and John Corbally Presidential Professor.

Chancellor Allen-Meares is a member of the Institute of Medicine (IOM) of the National Academies, the Royal Academy of Medicine, and is a trustee of the New York Academy of Medicine. She was appointed Chair of Section X of the IOM in July 2009 and is a member of the Sarnat Prize Selection

Committee for two seasons, 2010 and 2011.

At the University of Michigan she was principal investigator of the Global Program on Youth, an initiative supported by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation and co-PI of the National Institute of Mental Health's Research Center on Poverty, Risk and Mental Health.

She is currently the principal investigator of the Skillman Good Neighborhoods Grant.

Dr. Allen-Meares has over 150 publications and several books including the recently released Cross Cultural Research, Oxford Press.

Since joining UIC, Allen-Meares has become active as a Board Member of the Civic Consulting Alliance, as a member of the American Council on Education's Commission on Racial and Ethnic Equity, and as a board member of the Coalition of Urban Serving Universities.

UIC is Chicago's largest university and a major academic research center. UIC has more than 27,000 undergraduate, graduate and professional students; 12,000 faculty and staff, making it one of Chicago's 20 largest employers; a budget of nearly \$2 billion; and 15 colleges, including the nation's largest college of medicine. UIC also operates the state's major public medical center and regional health sciences campuses in Peoria, Rockford and Urbana-Champaign.

The Chancellor serves as the executive officer of UIC and reports to the President of the University of Illinois, a system that also includes campuses at Urbana-Champaign and Springfield.

Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs Barbara Henley



Barbara Henley, Ph.D. is currently the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs and an Associate Professor of Policy Studies in the College of Education at the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC).

Prior to joining UIC, Henley served Northern Illinois University (NIU) in the capacities of Assistant and Associate Vice President for Student Affairs. She served as the Vice President for seven years.

Previously, Henley was a tenured Associate Professor of Counseling, Director of the Counseling Center, Director of the Special Services Program and Acting Dean for Student Development at Chicago State University. She has served as a part-time lecturer at Roosevelt University in Chicago and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

Henley received her elementary and high school diplomas from Chicago Public Schools and her undergraduate degree in History and Teacher Education from the University of Illinois at Chicago. She earned a master's degree and a doctorate in Counselor Education from The Ohio State University.

Henley has been highly involved in professional and scholarly activities throughout her career. She has presented papers and workshops at more than sixty state, regional and national conferences and has authored or co-authored articles and book chapters. She has been active with numerous professional organizations including the American Counseling Association, the American Psychological Association, the American College Personnel Association, the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA), the Mid-America Association of Educational Opportunity Program Personnel, and the Illinois Committee on Black Concerns in Higher Education.

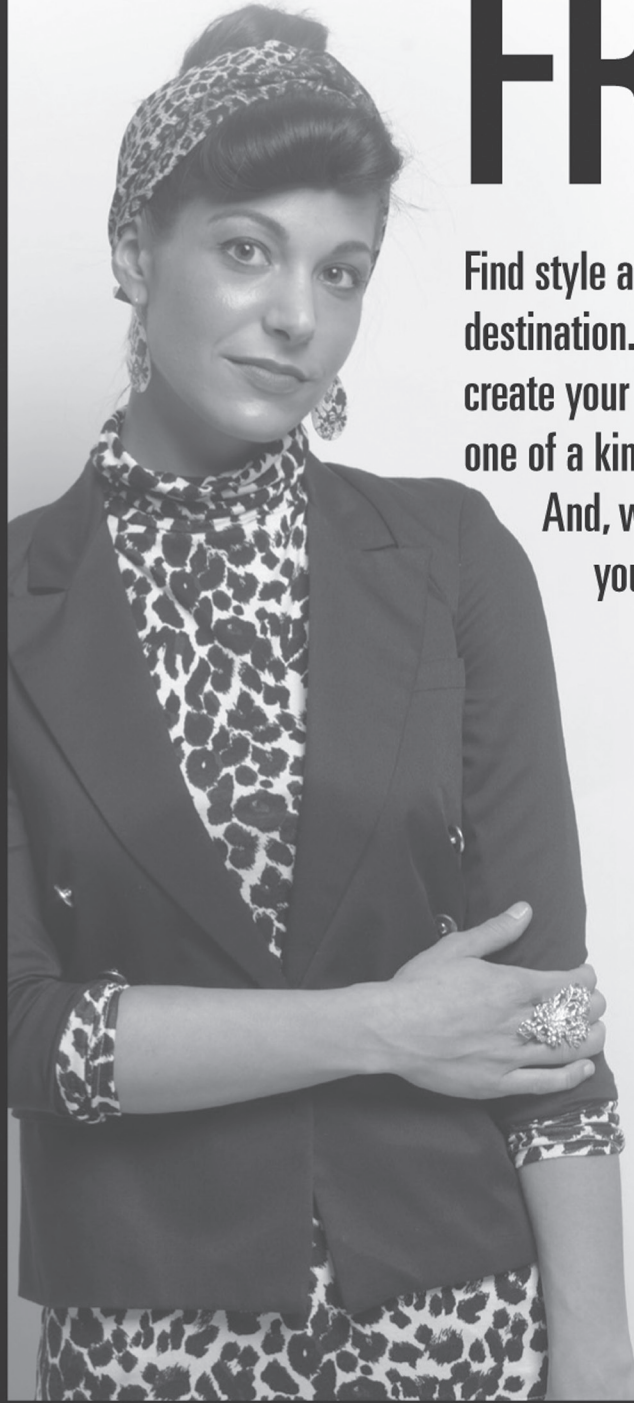

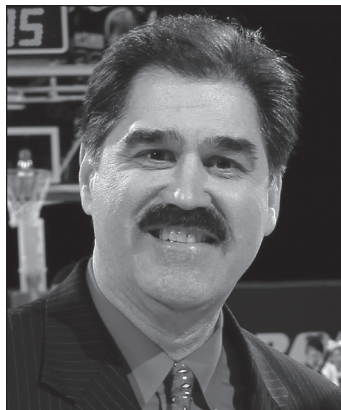

Athletic Director Jim Schmidt

16th YEAR AT UIC // WESTERN ILLINOIS '81

Regarded as an engineer of championship programs, an advocate for academic success and a dynamic leader, Jim Schmidt enters his 16th year as the Athletic Director at UIC. The longest-tenured AD in the Horizon League, Schmidt's

tenure has produced the most comprehensive run of athletic and academic success in school history.

Named UIC's fourth Director of Athletics on January 24, 1997, Schmidt quickly put together a department that could succeed on a championship level, not only within the Horizon League, but on regional and national scenes as well.

Under Schmidt's direction, UIC has advanced to NCAA postseason competition on 47 occasions while amassing a total of 72 conference championships. In 15 years of NCAA Division I status prior to Schmidt's tenure as athletic director, UIC earned nine NCAA postseason berths and accumulated 11 conference titles.

UIC has won the James J. McCafferty Trophy, the award honoring the most successful all-around athletic program in the Horizon League each season, in 2000 and 2007 under Schmidt's watch.

In August 2010, Schmidt secured the official addition of women's golf as a varsity sport at UIC, further proving the department's commitment to providing opportunities for women's athletics. Schmidt and his administration are also in the process of hiring the school's first-ever women's soccer coach - the addition of UIC's 20th varsity program will give the Flames 10 women's sports, including all nine programs sponsored by the Horizon League. Valparaiso and Youngstown State are the only two other schools in the League to sponsor all nine women's programs.

Schmidt has laid the foundation for a bevy of Flames programs that are consistently in the mix for regional and national success. The first-ever NCAA bids for men's basketball, men's soccer, women's tennis and baseball have occurred since Schmidt took office, setting the stage for championship and postseason pedigrees for those teams.

The men's soccer program has been ranked as high as fourth nationally and advanced to the 2007 NCAA Elite Eight; the baseball team has won 10 of the last 13 League regular-season championships and advanced to NCAA Regional play four times since 2003; and the women's tennis team has established itself as a dynasty by winning an unprecedented 16-consecutive League titles and making 14-straight NCAA tournament appearances.

"At UIC, we are committed to excellence, both academically and athletically," Schmidt said. "We will create an atmosphere that will assist each student in attaining lifelong experiences that will help them be successful."

In keeping with that commitment, UIC has continued to enhance the academic performance of its student-athletes under Schmidt. For the third-straight term, UIC student-athletes compiled a 3.0 grade-point-average during the 2012 Spring Semester. In addition, NCAA graduation reports list UIC Athletics' graduation rates well above the national average.

Under Schmidt's direction in 1994, UIC Athletics instituted a Life Skills program designed to enhance the total student-athlete, with activities designed to improve personal, social and career development. Team builders, community service projects and leadership opportunities through the Student Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) were also implemented.

Schmidt has also played a key role in the local and national exposure of UIC Athletics. He partnered with ESPN Radio 1000, one of the premier sports radio stations in America; to make WMVP-AM and ESPNChicago.com the exclusive radio broadcast homes of UIC men's basketball. He also helped expand radio coverage of UIC on WSCR, WGN, WBBM and other stations while increasing television exposure on the ESPN family of networks, Comcast SportsNet Chicago and other local and national outlets. In the past two men's basketball seasons, the Flames had a combined 19 regular season games televised, including an 11-game regional package on Comcast SportsNet.

With a strong desire to win conference titles and earn regular appearances in NCAA postseason action, Schmidt has brought numerous conference championships to the UIC campus. For the first time ever, the Flames

hosted the League's men's basketball championship in 1999 and 2000. UIC has also hosted conference tournaments in softball, baseball, soccer, cross country, gymnastics, women's basketball, and swimming & diving; and welcomed the NCAA Softball Regional Championships to its field in 1999 and the NCAA Softball Super Regional Championships in 2005. An NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament first-round match was also played at Flames Field for the first time in the fall of 2006, and again in 2008. In 2013, UIC is slated to host the Horizon League Swimming & Diving Championship, just nine months after hosting the League's baseball tournament at Les Miller Field, in which the fourth-seeded Flames advanced to the championship game.

UIC's administrative long-term plans are aggressive as well. In addition to major projects such as the first phase of the "Campaign for Athletics" that was implemented and the Flames Athletic Center fundraising campaign that was completed under Schmidt, UIC's overall strategic plan outlines detailed improvements for scholarship funding; renovations to facilities, including the UIC Pavilion, Flames Natatorium; and improvements to indoor competition/practice facilities for baseball, softball, track, tennis and volleyball. Construction of the stadium portion of the baseball and softball complexes and renovations to the soccer field are also high on the capital program's list of improvements. Additionally, new team locker rooms for all 20 sports will be installed before 2015.

Many of those projects are already underway, or have been completed. Lights have been installed at the baseball, softball and soccer facilities, and turf was installed as the playing surface at Les Miller Field, the home of Flames baseball. Indoor practice areas for baseball, softball and women's golf



have been added, while Flames Field, the home to UIC softball, and Les Miller Field are both operating with brand-new digital scoreboards.

While serving as associate athletic director, Schmidt helped develop a broad-based athletic program headed by strong men's and women's basketball programs and rapidly improving, nationally-competitive Olympic sports teams. He also saw UIC's student-athletes gain national recognition for top academic achievements while the teams and coaches earned regional and national exposure through conference championships and NCAA postseason competition.

Schmidt assisted during the many historical decisions that took place over the last several years, including changes in conference affiliation leading up to UIC's current membership in the Horizon League. Schmidt recently finished a term as chair of the NCAA Division I Championship/Sports Management Committee. He had previously served as the chair of the television, finance and men's basketball committees.

Schmidt has also served on the championships/facilities committee, equity committee and executive council.

Schmidt began his collegiate athletics career in the fall of 1980, serving one year as the pitching coach at Western Illinois University while earning his master's degree in sports administration. Arriving at UIC in 1982, Schmidt served as a pitching coach on the Flames' baseball staff before being named an assistant to the athletic director in charge of marketing/promotions and daily operations.

From 1983-86, Schmidt handled all sports information duties as an assistant athletic director and assumed the title of associate athletic director in 1987.

A 1981 graduate of sports management from WIU, Schmidt and his wife, Mary, reside in Naperville, Ill. They have two children, Bill and Eva.

THIRD SEASON AT UIC // WISCONSIN '95

Have a conversation with Head Coach Howard Moore about his vision for UIC Basketball, and you'll come away with one common understanding: he wants to develop a program that is a consistent winner, year-in and year-out. His goal is to build something special. After two years of building the blocks essential for long-term success, it appears the third-year mentor has his Flames ready to turn the corner.

The 10th head coach in the history of the program, Moore grew up on the west side of Chicago, mere blocks from the UIC campus, and attended Taft High School on the northwest side of the city. In his five previous collegiate assistant coaching stops, the 40-year-old Moore utilized the Windy City as his main pipeline for recruiting talent.

The first two seasons of the Howard Moore era have produced impressive wins over in-state rival Illinois, Rhode Island, Evansville and 2012 NCAA Tournament participant Detroit. Heading into the 2012-13 campaign, the Flames are poised to produce wins on a much more consistent basis in the Horizon League. UIC is set to return four starters from last year's team, including the highest-scoring returning backcourt in the conference. In all, the Flames will return four-of their top-five scorers from the 2011-12 season.

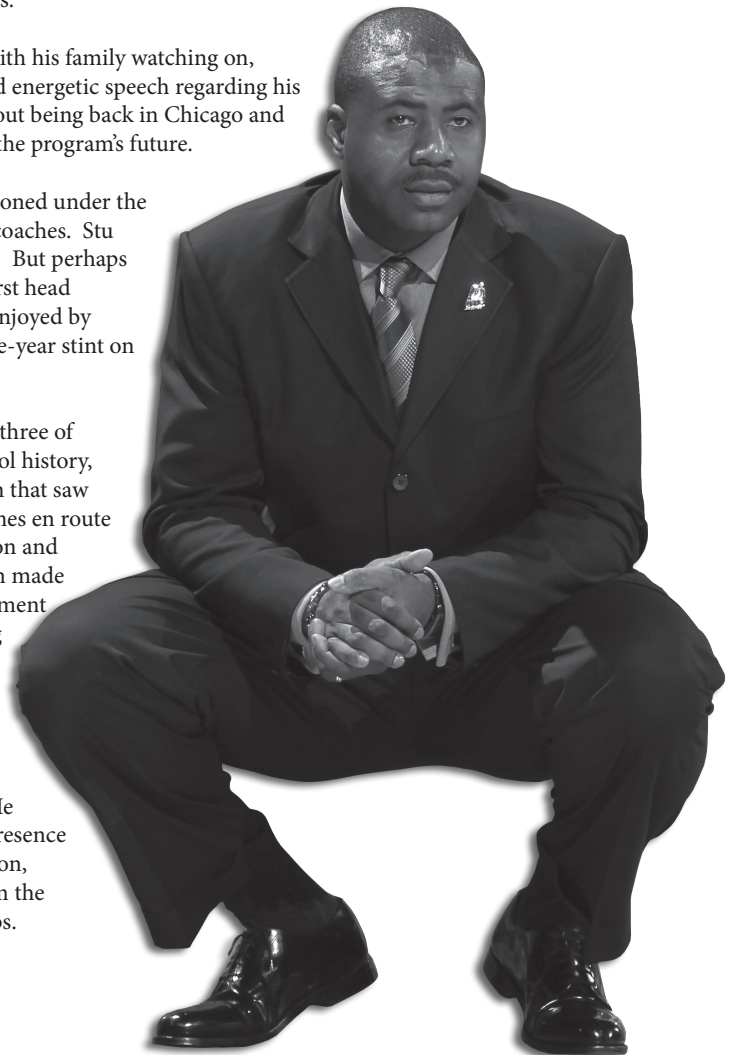
Among UIC's notable returnees is senior point guard Gary Talton, who chalked up Horizon League All-Newcomer Team honors last season; senior guard Daniel Barnes, an Oak Park, Ill., native that ranked fourth in the Horizon League in made three-pointers in 2011-12; and junior Hayden Humes, a sharp-shooting forward that shot nearly 42 percent (.418) from beyond the three-point arc in his first season with the Flames. Humes scored in double figures in seven of the last nine games of the 2011-12 campaign, and led the Flames in rebounding in 10 of the final 12 contests.

At his introductory press conference, with his family watching on, Moore gave a passionate, emotional and energetic speech regarding his pride for the UIC job, his happiness about being back in Chicago and his vision of championship success for the program's future.

Moore's basketball coaching craft was honed under the tutelage of some of the game's greatest coaches. Stu Jackson. Steve Yoder. Stan Van Gundy. But perhaps what directly prepared Moore for his first head coaching job was the success that was enjoyed by Wisconsin, his alma mater, during a five-year stint on Bo Ryan's staff.

With Moore on the bench, UW posted three of the top-five winningest seasons in school history, including an historic 2007-08 campaign that saw the Badgers win a school-record 31 games en route to the Big Ten Conference regular season and tournament championships. Wisconsin made five-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament during Moore's tenure on staff, winning a total of eight games in the "Big Dance." The memorable 2007-08 run produced a "Sweet 16" berth.

With the Badgers, Moore helped coach four All-Big Ten Conference players. He also enhanced Wisconsin's recruiting presence in the highly talented Chicagoland region, successfully recruiting four players from the Windy City and its surrounding suburbs.

In his two years at UIC, Moore has also made his loyalty to the city of Chicago well-known - eight players on the 2012-13 roster hail from the Chicagoland region. He has also been visible in the city, making numerous speaking engagements and appearances - in December 2010, Moore was presented the Ricky Byrdsong Award at the Union Club of Chicago. The award annually recognizes men who are good fathers, have made a difference in the lives of youth, and have demonstrated a spiritual dimension to their lives.

Additionally, early in the 2012 Major League Baseball season, Moore threw out the first pitch at both Wrigley Field, home of the Chicago Cubs, and U.S. Cellular Field, home to the Chicago White Sox.

Before joining the staff in Madison, Moore spent one season as an assistant coach under Jim Whitesell at Horizon League foe Loyola in 2004-05. In his brief tenure in Rogers Park, Moore helped the Ramblers win six of their final seven contests and advance to the Horizon League Tournament semifinals. Moore handled off-campus recruiting duties and worked primarily with Loyola's post players during the turnaround season.

In 2003-04, Moore served as an assistant under Head Coach Tim Buckley at Ball State, where he helped shape the Cardinals into the top three-point field goal percentage defensive team in the Mid-American Conference. Off the court, the Chicago native worked to reel in what many recruiting experts dubbed as the best class in the MAC.

From 2000-03, Moore served as an assistant coach at Bradley University where he worked as the lead off-campus recruiter and mentor to both the guards and post players. The 2001 recruiting class was one of his best, featuring Danny Granger, who eventually blossomed into a 2009 NBA All-Star as a member of the Indiana Pacers. He also helped mold Phillip Gilbert and James Gillingham into All-Missouri Valley Conference selections. Moore also served as an administrative assistant at Bradley during the 1999-2000 season.

The loyal Chicagoan began his collegiate coaching career in his hometown by serving as an assistant coach at the University of Chicago during the 1998-99 campaign; prior to that, he served as an assistant coach for two years at his alma mater, Taft High School.

Moore led the Flames to a monumental win over nationally-ranked Illinois at the United Center, 57-54, on Dec. 18, 2010.

Moore played in 47 games for Wisconsin from 1990-95, including 21 appearances as a senior. During his playing career under Head Coaches Steve Yoder, Stu Jackson and Stan Van Gundy, the Badgers earned back-to-back NIT berths in 1991 and 1992.

In 1994, Moore teamed with Michael Finley, Rashard Griffith, Tracy Webster, Andy Kilbride and Brian Kelley to help Wisconsin end a 47-year drought and return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1947. In 1994, Moore represented the Big Ten Conference on a team of league all-stars who were selected to compete in Argentina.

A recipient of the University of Wisconsin African-American Alumni Association Student Leadership Award in 1993, Moore graduated from Wisconsin with a Bachelor's Degree in African-American Studies in 1995.

Moore graduated from Taft High School in 1990, guiding his team to the Chicago Public League semifinals as a senior. He was named to the CPL Hall of Fame in 1999.

Moore and his wife, Jennifer, have two children: a son, Jerell, and a daughter, Jaidyn.

THIRD SEASON AT UIC // ELMHURST '82

Al Biancalana, the former Interim Head Coach and top Assistant Coach at Bradley University, enters his third season on Head Coach Howard Moore's staff at UIC, and his second campaign as the Associate Head Coach.

Biancalana is no stranger to the bench, having spent more than 30 years as a coach throughout Illinois and California, including 17 years as a high school head coach. As a high school mentor, Biancalana's overall record was an impressive 313-171 (.647 winning percentage), including a 33-16 record in the state tournament.

Before joining Moore's staff, Biancalana served as the Head Basketball Coach at York High School in suburban Elmhurst, Ill. In five seasons at the helm, his teams posted a record of 90-51 and a winning percentage of .638, which ranks as the second highest in school history. He guided the Dukes to four-straight Illinois High School Athletic Association (IHSA) regional championship appearances, and in 2005-06, Biancalana led the school to its first West Suburban Conference Championship in 38 seasons.

Prior to his stint at York, where he also served as the school's College and Career Advisor, Biancalana worked for six seasons as the first assistant and Interim Head Coach at Bradley University from 1999-2005. It was there that he formed a relationship with Howard Moore who was on the staff from 1999-2003. Biancalana served as the program's main recruiter and was responsible for bringing in the majority of the roster from the Braves' 2006 "Sweet 16" run. The last two players from the Missouri Valley Conference to be drafted in the NBA, Danny Granger (Indiana Pacers) and Patrick O'Bryant (Golden State Warriors), were recruited by Biancalana. In the six years with Biancalana on BU's staff, 27-of-30 seniors graduated.

Biancalana has also served as a head coach at Stagg High School (1995-99) in Palos Hills, Ill., Downers Grove North High School (1993-95), Clovis High School (1989-93) in Clovis, Calif., and Washington Union High School (1987-89) in Fresno, Calif. In 1988, while at Washington Union, Biancalana was named California Coach of the Year and led his squad to a Division IV State Championship. Over a two-year stretch, Washington Union won 36-consecutive games with Biancalana at the helm.

Biancalana received his Bachelor's Degree in Education from Elmhurst College in 1982 and a Master's Degree in Educational Administration from National University in Fresno in 1993.

Before returning to the Midwest, Robinson spent the previous eight seasons as an assistant with the Red Raiders under Head Coaches Bob Knight and Pat Knight. Tech advanced to three NCAA Tournaments (2003-05, 2004-05 and 2006-07) with Robinson on staff, and won 19 or more games four times. The Red Raiders also advanced to the quarterfinals of the NIT in 2010.

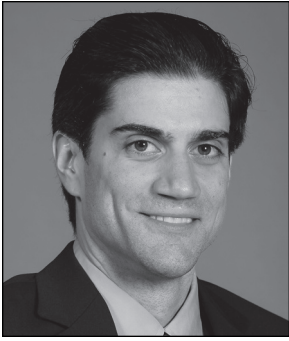

THIRD SEASON AT UIC // UIC '09

Jeremy Buttell enters his third season on the coaching staff at UIC, and his second campaign as the Coordinator of Video and Basketball Operations - he served as the program's administrative assistant during the 2010-11 campaign. Buttell joined the staff following a tremendous three-year playing career for the Flames under former Head Coach Jimmy Collins.

Buttell played three seasons at UIC (2007-10), competing in 88 games and garnering 60 starts. In 2009-10, Buttell ranked fifth in the Horizon League with 7.5 rebounds per game, while producing five double-doubles, including four in the final five games of the season.

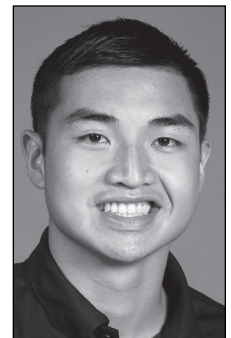

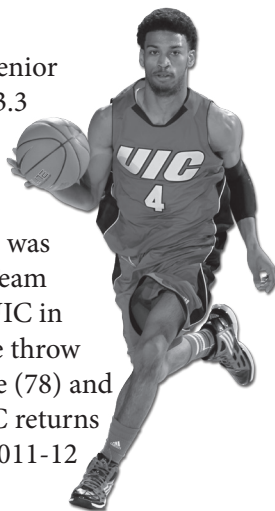

PRESEASON NOTABLES

The UIC men's basketball team enters the 2012-13 campaign with hopes of becoming the next upstart team in the Horizon League. The Flames return four starters from the 2011-12 campaign, including the highest-scoring returning backcourt in the League. UIC is under the direction of third-year Head Coach **Howard Moore**, a Chicago native that spent five seasons as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Wisconsin, before taking over the helm of the Flames prior to the 2010-11 campaign.

WHAT'S BACK?

UIC's returning starters include senior point guard **Gary Talton** (11.6 ppg/3.3 apg), senior guard **Daniel Barnes** (10.4 ppg), junior forward **Hayden Humes** (8.2 ppg) and sophomore wing **Marc Brown** (6.7 ppg). Talton was a Horizon League All-Newcomer Team selection last season after leading UIC in scoring, field goals made (122), free throw percentage (.867), free throws made (78) and assists per game (3.3). Overall, UIC returns 65 percent of its scoring from the 2011-12 campaign.



NEW TO THE SCENE

Head Coach **Howard Moore** and his staff have welcomed seven newcomers to the mix, including two Division I transfers that will be immediately eligible. Senior center **Josh Crittle**, a native of Bellwood, Ill., spent the past two seasons at UCF, where he started 25 games as a junior (2011-12) - he is enrolled in UIC's graduate school, and will have one season of eligibility remaining with the Flames. Crittle began his college career at Oregon after a stellar prep career at nearby Hales Franciscan.

Sophomore guard **Joey Miller** played his first season of college basketball at Eastern Illinois before transferring to UIC - he was given immediate eligibility with the Flames after being granted a hardship waiver from the NCAA. Miller scored 10.4 points per game in his freshman season with the Panthers, and was named the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC) Freshman of the Week on three occasions.

Other newcomers include point guard **Jay Parker** (So.), a transfer from Highland C.C., along with freshmen post players **Matt Gorski** and **Jake Wiegand**, a pair of Virginia natives that both played one year of postgraduate basketball at Fishburne Military Academy (Va.). Gorski is a 7-footer that possesses both the size and upside to be a dominant center in the Horizon League.



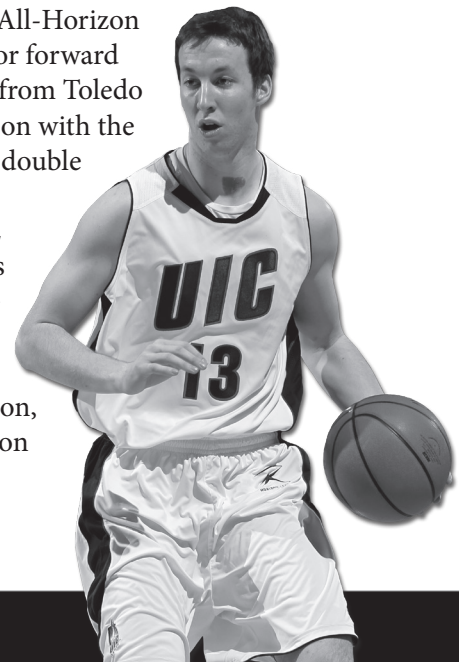
Gabe Snider, a local product from Whitney Young High School in Chicago, joins the Flames after a standout prep career. One of the top shooters in the state of Illinois as a senior, Snider helped the Dolphins capture back-to-back regional titles and make two deep runs in the IHSA State Tournament. Also joining the program are freshmen guard walk-ons **Austin Angel** (Wilmette, Ill./New Trier) and **Ngijol Songolo** (Madison, Wis./Memorial).

BARLOW TRANSFERS TO UIC

Former Purdue guard **Kelsey Barlow**, who played in 93 games for the Boilermakers over the past three seasons, also transferred to UIC during the offseason. The Indianapolis, Ind., native will be required to sit out the 2012-13 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. Last season, in 26 games played, Barlow averaged 8.3 points, 3.7 rebounds and 1.7 assists per contest. Barlow, who will be permitted to practice with the Flames this season, was also named to the Big Ten Conference All-Freshman Team in 2009-10, after seeing action in all 35 games, tying for the second-most by a freshman in Purdue's history.

HUMES RETURNS FOR SECOND SEASON

One of UIC's preseason All-Horizon League performers is junior forward **Hayden Humes**, a transfer from Toledo that enters his second season with the Flames. Humes scored in double figures in seven of the last nine games of the 2011-12 season, and led the Flames in rebounding in 10 of the final 12 contests. Humes shot 41.8 percent from three-point range last season, ranking sixth in the Horizon League.



AGGRESSIVE SCHEDULE LIES AHEAD

UIC's 2012-13 schedule features 14 regular season home games, four non-conference match-ups against in-state foes and a trip to the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam at University of the Virgin Islands. The Flames will also play at least 13 games against teams that made appearances in the 2012 postseason, including three NCAA Tournament foes.

UIC will take on New Mexico in the first-round of the Paradise Jam (11/16/12). Depending on the outcome of that contest, the Flames will face either George Mason or Mercer on either Nov. 17 or 18.

The month of December will see the Flames take on four opponents that garnered berths to the postseason in 2012, beginning with a Dec. 1 contest at Northwestern. The 16-game Horizon League slate will begin on Jan. 2, when UIC hosts Youngstown State.

Notable home games in Horizon League play include preseason favorite Valparaiso on Wednesday, Jan. 9, rival Loyola on Wednesday, Jan. 16 and defending Horizon League Tournament champion Detroit in the regular season finale on Saturday, March 2.

The Flames will satisfy the home-and-home series with Loyola on Saturday, Feb. 16 at Gentile Arena, in the Horizon League "Game of the Week."

ESPN Chicago to Serve as Broadcast Home for UIC Basketball
