You must write to BOM requesting administration of prescribed medicines otherwise you must administer it yourself or teach your son to self-medicate. Attendance and punctuality

The Inspectors were concerned that our Attendance was 'dis-improving' and that we need to look at it as a whole school. They maintain that if a child is **absent more than 2** days per month, on average, that this **is too much**. We acknowledge that children can get sick and therefore may be unavoidable. However, we would really appreciate a note to explain the absence as we have to record the reason given for the Department. Children with Journals have special slips that should be completed at the back.

The Department particularly want us to monitor the 'Monday and/or Friday' absences. We will personally be in touch with you early in the New Year if this pattern is emerging. Children frequently absent will be reported to the National Education Welfare Officer.

While we are always delighted to see your son at any time of the day, we would like him to be as punctual as possible. We are urged to monitor pupils who attend school LATE on a REGULAR basis. It is a very poor life skill and we wish to encourage good practises for life. Please encourage your son to attend daily and on time at 8.50, the latest. We acknowledge that sometimes children can be late but this should not be a usual occurrence.
