- > Utah (4-3, 1-3 Pac-12) plays USC (4-3, 1-2 Pac-12) in Los Angeles on Saturday. Kickoff is 1:00 p.m. PT in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. The game will be televised on the Pac-12 Networks. Radio is ESPN700 AM. Satellite radio is Sirius 134/XM 192.
- > The Utes are off to a 1-3 Pac-12 start this year after 0-4 beginnings in their first two seasons. Utah's win was against then No. 5 Stanford on Oct. 12 in Salt Lake City. Utah is 0-1 in Pac-12 road games, losing at Arizona last week.
- > Utah is playing back-to-back road games for the first time this season.
- > Utah and USC have played two common opponents. Utah split against Utah State (won 30-26) and Arizona (lost 35-14), while USC beat both USU (17-14) and Arizona (38-31).
- > Utah's debut as a Pac-12 member was against USC in the Coliseum in 2011, a 23-14 loss. Trailing 17-14 with 11 seconds left in regulation, Utah had a chance to send the game into overtime, but Coleman Petersen's 41-yard field goal attempt was blocked and returned for a touchdown.
- > Utah is 3-8 all-time against USC and just one of those wins—in the 2001 Las Vegas Bowl—has come since 1916. More on the series on page 2.
- > USC has claimed 11 national championships, while Utah's best national finish was No. 2 (A.P.) in 2008. The Utes finished No. 4 in the A.P. poll in 2004.
- > Ute linebacker **Jared Norris** was a high school teammate of USC quarterback Cody Kessler at Centennial High School in Bakersfield, Calif. Both are now sophomore starters. Norris is one of 33 Californians on Utah's roster. See "Cali Connections" on page 2 for more.

UTAH-USC SERIES

Series Snapshot

The Utes trail USC 8-3 and their only win in Los Angeles—where they trail 5-1—was back in 1916. Utah's first-ever Pac-12 game was at USC in 2011—a 23-14 loss that went down to the last play. Before then, the Utes had not played in the Coliseum since 1948. The teams are 1-1 in bowl games, with USC winning the 1993 Freedom Bowl and Utah capturing the 2001 Las Vegas Bowl.

Utah jumped to a 14-0 lead but couldn't maintain the momentum against No. 13 USC in a 38-28 loss. Nate (Fakahafua) Orchard grabbed the ball from Matt Barkley on the game's second play and ran it in for a touchdown. On the very next series, USC fumbled on its own 13-yard line and the Utes scored on a Jon Hays-to-Kenneth Scott pass. After the Trojans took a 24-21 lead with 4:38 left in the first half, a Utah TD was nullified by a penalty and the Utes trailed the rest of the way.

Utah coaches from California include head coach **Kyle Whittingham**—who lived in Glendora through eighth grade before his family moved to Provo, Utah—cornerbacks coach **Sharrieff Shah** (Los Angeles), and graduate assistants **Nick Alaimalo** (Carson) and **Kelly Talavou** (Santa Ana).

TWO MINUTE DRILL

Freshman placekicker **Andy Philips** was named to the ESPN.com and SI.com Midseason All-America teams after making his first 11 field goal attempts to lead the nation. Phillips saw his streak end last week when he made 1-of-3 field goals (all from 40 yards or longer) against Arizona ... against Stanford ... The Utes are 3-9 overall against Pac-12 South division teams and 0-2 this season. Utah's win over then No. 5 Stanford on Oct. 12 improved its three-year record against the Pac-12 North to 5-5 ... Utah is 2-0 in day games and 2-3 in night games ... Utah won its only prior game on a grass surface this season against BYU in Provo, Utah ... Utah is outscoring its opponents in every quarter, led by a 25-point first half advantage (66-41) ... The Utes are 3-0 this season when they score first and when they lead at halftime ... Utah is 5-3 in games televised by the Pac-12 Networks in the two years of the network.

NATIONAL NOTABLES

Utah is tied for first in the nation in fewest fumbles lost with one ... Senior defensive end/linebacker **Trevor Reilly** is tied for the NCAA lead in fumble recoveries with three ... Junior **Dres Anderson** is tied for first in the country in receptions of 50 yards or longer with five, while the Utes rank third nationally with 10 plays of 50+ yards ... The Utes have won 49 consecutive games when leading at halftime, which is the second-longest streak in the country behind Oregon..

LEADERS OF THE PAC

Utah leads the Pac-12 in sacks (22) and sack average (3.14), ranking 11th in the nation ... Utah is tied for first in the league in red zone offense (91.7%, 22-24) and ranks 14th nationally ... Sophomore punter **Tom Hackett** leads the Pac-12 in punt average (43.8 yards), punts of 50+ yards (10) and punts inside the 20-yard line (17) ... Junior **Dres Anderson** leads the Pac-12 in yards per reception (20.03).

IN THE HUDDLE

Starting offensive linemen Jeremiah Poutasi, Jeremiah Tofaeono, Vyncent Jones, Junior Salt and Siaosi Aiono have played every offensive snap for the past five games ... Eight true freshmen have played: DE/LB Pita Taumoepenu, SN Chase Dominguez, DT Sam Tevi, LB Uaea Masina, DB Hipolito Corporan, TE Siale Fakailoatonga, WR Dominque Hatfield and RB Marcus Sanders-Williams. Dominguez is the only starter.

OUTSIDE THE LINES

The **Kyle Whittingham** radio show is Tuesday at 6 p.m. on ESPN700. It will be broadcast live from Harmon's City Creek and is free to the public ... Utah's marching band and spirit squads are making their second road trip of the season. They also went to Arizona last week.

CAPACITY CROWDS

Utah has 23-straight sellouts in Rice-Eccles Stadium extending back to the season-opener against Pittsburgh in 2010. Of the sellouts, 20 were played before standing-room only crowds that exceeded Rice-Eccles Stadium's 45,017-seat capacity. For the sixth-consecutive season, all 32,000 allotted season tickets were sold to Utah's home football games. Some bleacher seats and standing room tickets remain for Utah's two remaining home games against Arizona State and Colorado.

LAST WEEK

A slow start and a late Arizona touchdown contributed to a 35-24 loss to the Wildcats in Tucson. Quarterback **Travis Wilson** went to the sidelines with a hand injury late in the second quarter and backup **Adam Schulz** directed Utah to three scoring drives (two touchdowns and a field goal). The Wildcats jumped on Utah for a 20-7 halftime lead only to get shut out in the third quarter while Utah was countering with 14 points. Schulz' 55-yard flea flicker to **Sean Fitzgerald** put Utah up 21-20 with 9:08 left in the third stanza for Utah's first and only lead of the game. Schulz finished 12-of-23 passing for 142 yards and his first career touchdown. **Trevor Reilly** and **Jared Norris** both had a team-high 14 tackles and Reilly had two sacks, three tackles for loss and a fumble recovery.

UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

Utah's all-time football record is 633-437-31. The Utes are 386-181-16 at home (68-24 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 227-240-12 in road games and 19-17-3 in games played at neutral sites.

WHITTINGHAM FILE

Ninth-year Utah head coach Kyle Whittingham, the 2008 National Coach of the Year, has won nearly 70-percent of his games. His 75-35 overall record includes seven bowl victories and his teams have played in a bowl game every year but one since he took the helm in December of 2004. Utah has registered three 10-win seasons under Whittingham, including a 13-0 mark in 2008 that culminated with a 31-17 win over Alabama in the Sugar Bowl and a No. 2 national ranking. Whittingham is 2-0 in BCS bowl games, having served as the co-head coach of Utah's victorious 2005 Fiesta Bowl team, and his overall bowl record is 7-1. The 2013 season marks Whittingham's 20th anniversary on the Utah coaching staff. He has participated in 160 wins—more than any coach in Utah history—and 13 bowl games (winning 11). After one season as the defensive line coach in 1994, he spent the next decade as the Utes' defensive coordinator (1995-2004). He was elevated to head coach following an undefeated season in 2004, when Utah earned a No. 4 final national ranking. From 1999-2009, Utah won nine consecutive bowl games to tie for the secondlongest bowl win streak in NCAA history. Whittingham was the defensive coordinator for the first three games of the streak, the co-head coach for the 2005 Fiesta Bowl win (2004 season) and the head coach for the five bowl victories from 2005-09. The Utes also won a bowl game under Whittingham in 2011—the first postseason win by the Pac-12 Conference in its inaugural year as a 12-member league. For more on Whittingham, see sidebar on page 2.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

- > Sophomore **Travis Wilson** is 4-3 this season and 7-7 in his career as the starter. Wilson has played in all 19 games since his true freshman season in 2012 and has started the last 16. He left the Arizona game late in the first half with a hand injury.
- > Utah does not release status reports on injuries unless they are season ending. Should he be needed, Wilson's backup is sophomore **Adam Schulz** (pronounced Schultz), who played the second half against Arizona last week.
- > **Wilson** ranks 25th in the nation in total offense per game (279.3), averaging 236.4 yards passing and 42.9 yards rushing.
- > Other top 30 national rankings place **Wilson** third in pass plays of 50 yards or longer (7), 20th in points responsible for per game (16.3) and 28th in passing yards per completion (13.57).
- > **Wilson** has completed 60.4 percent of his passes (122-of-202) for 1,655 yards and 14 touchdowns (12 INT).
- > **Wilson** is also Utah's second-leading rusher with 52 carries for 300 yards (5.8 average) and five TDs. He is 14th in the conference in rushing yards per game (42.9).
- > Wilson threw for at least 200 yards in the first six games before exiting the Arizona game with just 15 yards passing. Wilson's seasonhigh game was 302 yards vs. Utah State and his career high is 311 yards against Arizona in 2012.
- > **Wilson** has eight career 200-yard passing games and two 300-yard games.
- > Wilson's 142 rushing yards vs. Oregon State is the second-most in a game by a Utah quarterback and the most since 1979. Wilson, who also passed for 279 yards in the overtime loss to the Beavers, totaled three rushing touchdowns and two passing TDs.
- > **Wilson's** career passing numbers are 250-of-406 (61.5%) for 2,966 yards and 21 touchdowns (18 interceptions).
- > **Wilson** was named the *Athlon Sports* National Offensive Player of the Week and Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 23 after leading Utah to victory over BYU by completing 24-of-35 passes for 273 yards and two touchdowns with no interceptions.
- > **Schulz** played the final possession of the first half and the entire second half against Arizona last week when Wilson was sidelined. Schulz directed three scoring drives, including two touchdowns and a field goal. - > **Schulz** completed his first six passes against Arizona and finished 12-of-23 with a touchdown and no interceptions for a career-high 142 yards.
- > **Schulz**, a one-time walk-on who was awarded a scholarship last spring, has played in two games this season and three games in his career.
- > In two appearances this season against Weber State and Arizona, **Schulz** has completed 15-of-28 passes (53.6%) for 168 yards and one touchdown (no interceptions). He has also rushed 10 times for 37 yards.

- > Sophomore **Bubba Poole** leads Utah in carries (97), net yards (476) and rushing yards per game (68.0). Poole, in his first season playing after redshirting as a JC transfer last season, won the starting job in game three.
- > **Poole** ranks eighth in the Pac-12 in rushing yards (476) and rushing yards per game (68.0).
- > **Poole** has a two 100-yard games: 117 yards vs. OSU and 111 yards vs. Stanford. He had 96 yards against BYU.
- > **Poole** is second on the team in receptions (26) and third in receiving yards (223). He had a career-high 75 receiving yards against Stanford.
- > **Poole** leads Utah and ranks 11th in the Pac-12 in all-purpose yards per game (117.0), which includes 476 rushing yards, 223 receiving yards, 82 yards in punt returns and 38 yards in kickoff returns.
- > Along with Poole, three others see frequent action: junior **Lucky Radley** (30 rushes, 219 yards, 7.3 average, 2 TD), senior **Kelvin York** (46 carries, 177 yards, 3.8 average, 2 TD) and senior **Karl Williams** (14 rushes, 49 yards, 3.5 average, 1 TD).
- > York has two starts and Williams has started with Poole in the last two games against Stanford and Arizona.
- > **Radley** netted a career-high 111 yards against Weber State. He had a career-long 37-yard rush against Arizona.
- > Williams has eight receptions for 28 yards and two touchdowns, while **Radley** has five catches for 44 yards and a touchdown.

RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

- > Junior **Dres Anderson** leads the Pac-12 in yards per reception (20.03) and leads Utah in receptions (31), receiving yards (621), yards per game (88.7) and touchdown catches (5).
- > **Anderson** is tied for the national lead in receptions of 50 yards or longer with five.
- > **Anderson** ranks 32nd in the nation and sixth in the Pac-12 in receiving yards per game (88.7). He is also sixth in the Pac-12 in touchdown catches (5).
- > **Anderson** led Utah a year ago with 365 yards in 12 games—a figure he surpassed in the fourth game of this season.
- > **Anderson's** four 100-yard games (all this season) came in consecutive games: 103 vs. Weber State, 101 vs. Oregon State, 141 vs. BYU and 106 vs. UCLA. He is the first Ute to record four 100-yard games in a season since 2009 when David Reed, now with the Indianapolis Colts, had five.

- > Fitzgerald had a career-high 87 yards and two touchdowns against Weber State.
- > **Anthony Denham** ranks fourth in catches (17) and fourth in receiving yards (222).
- > **Denham** has one 100-yard game this season and in his career (113 vs. Utah State).

TIGHT END NOTEBOOK

- > Utah has not started a tight end since losing junior **Jake Murphy** for the season. Murphy, who was on the John Mackey watch list, broke his wrist against UCLA on Oct. 3.
- > **Murphy** was fourth on the team in receiving yards (179) and fifth in receptions (10) when his season came to an end in game five.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

- > Linemen have been credited with 16 of Utah's Pac-12 leading 22 sacks this season, including seven against Weber State—Utah's most in a game since eight sacks against Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl.
- > Utah has three all-conference candidates in its front four: senior end **Trevor Reilly**, who is on the Butkus Award Watch list, senior tackle **Tenny Palepoi** and junior end **Nate Orchard**.
- > **Reilly** is considered primarily a defensive end, although he also plays line-backer depending on Utah's defensive alignment. He has played both positions in all six games with four starts at defensive end (Weber State, BYU, UCLA and Stanford) and three starts at linebacker (USU, OSU and Arizona).
- > **Reilly** leads Utah in tackles with 58, including a team-high 38 solo tackles. He also led Utah in tackles a year ago with 69.
- > **Reilly** had a career-high 14 tackles against Arizona. He has been in double-digit tackles twice this season, including an 11-tackle performance against UCLA, and has led Utah in tackles twice (Arizona and Stanford).
- > **Reilly** is sixth in the Pac-12 in tackles per game (8.3) and ranks third in the league in solo tackles (38).
- > **Reilly** leads Utah in tackles for loss (8.5) and is tied for the team lead in sacks (3.5). He is seventh in the Pac-12 in TFL per game (1.21) while ranking ninth in the league in sacks per game (0.50).
- > Reilly also has two pass breakups and a forced fumble.
- > **Reilly** has 29.5 career tackles for loss for 164 yards. The 164 negative yards ranks fifth in school history.
- > **Reilly** has 15.0 career sacks for 111 yards. The 111 negative yards ranks fifth in school history.
- > **Reilly** is tied for the NCAA lead in fumble recoveries with three. He is tied for first in the Pac-12 and seventh in the NCAA in fumble recoveries per game (0.43).
- > **Reilly's** six career fumble recoveries is tied for the fourth most in school history and he ranks second all-time in forced fumbles with eight (one shy of the school record held by current NFL Pro Bowl safety Eric Weddle).
- > **Orchard** is tied for fourth in the NCAA and is second in the Pac-12 in forced fumbles (3). He is tied for ninth nationally and third in the league in forced fumbles per game (0.43). He also has a fumble recovery.
- > **Orchard** has five career forced fumbles, which is tied for the fifth most in school history.
- > **Orchard** is tied for the team lead in sacks (3.5) and is second on the team in tackles for loss (7.0). He is tied for ninth in the Pac-12 in sacks per game (0.50).
- > **Orchard's** 32 season tackles includes a career-high nine tackles against UCLA. He also has a pass breakup.
- > **Orchard** was the *Athlon Sports* National Defensive Player of the Week for his part in Utah's upset win over No. 5 Stanford on Oct. 12, when he recorded two sacks, forced two fumbles and had five total tackles. > **Palepoi** is fourth on the team in sacks (2.5) and has 4.0 tackles for loss.
- > **Palepoi** has 30 total tackles. He led Utah in tackles against Weber State with eight, all in one half of play.
- > Senior tackle **LT Tuipulotu** has played in all seven games with six starts. He has 23 tackles with one TFL, including a half sack.
- > Redshirt freshman end **Hunter Dimick**, who has played in all seven games with three starts (USU, OSU, Arizona), has 21 tackles with 1.5 TFL (1 sack). He had a career-high eight tackles against Oregon State.
- > Upperclass substitutes on the defensive line are junior tackle **Sese Ianu** (7 tackles), senior end **Thretton Palamo** (10 tackles, 0.5 sack), senior tackle **Latu Heimuli** (6 tackles, 1 sack) and sophomore tackle **Viliseni Fauonuku** (1 start, 7 tackles, 1.0 sack). Fauonuku has missed four games with injury (USU, OSU, Stanford and Arizona).
- > Two true freshmen have played and are in this week's two deep: tackle **Sam Tevi** (9 tackles, 2 TFL, 1 sack) and end/linebacker **Pita Taumoepenu** (6 tackles, 2 TFL, 1 sack).

LINEBACKER NOTEBOOK

- > Hybrid defender **Trevor Reilly** starts at both defensive end and linebacker, depending on Utah's defensive alignment. See Defensive Line Notebook for more on Reilly.
- > Sophomores **Jared Norris** and **Jason Whittingham** start and play interchangeably at mac and rover linebacker.
- > **Norris** is second on the team in tackles with 56 stops and has 4.5 TFL, two sacks, two pass breakups and a forced fumble.
- > **Norris** is tied for seventh in the Pac-12 in tackles per game (8.0).
- > Norris had a career-high 14 tackles against Arizona to tie for Utah's tackle lead. It was his second double-digit tackle performance of the season. His 12 tackles against UCLA included 2.5 TFL and two sacks.
- > **Norris** has led Utah in tackles in three games (BYU, UCLA and Arizona).
- > Whittingham leads Utah in tackles per game (8.2) and has 41 total tackles (2.0 TFL) and a pass breakup.
- > Whittingham has played and started in the last five games after missing the first two games with an injury and does not yet meet the minimum percentage of games played to qualify for the Pac-12 rankings. If he did, he would rank seventh in the league in tackles per game (8.2)
- > **Whittingham** has totaled a career-high 10 tackles twice (UCLA and Arizona).
- > Junior **Jacoby Hale** has played in four games with one start. He has missed the last three games with an injury.
- > **Hale** is third on the team with 3.0 sacks (0.75 per game).
- > **Hale's** 13 total tackles includes four tackles for loss. He also has a pass breakup.
- > Junior **V.J. Fehoko** has one start and 16 tackles.
- > Sophomore **LT Filiaga**, who had moved to defensive end, is on the depth chart at linebacker (where he saw action last week at Arizona) for a second-straight week. The move is considered temporary.

SECONDARY NOTEBOOK

- > Junior free safety **Eric Rowe** has played in and started 30 games since his true freshman season, when he was named a Freshman All-American.
- > **Rowe** is tied for second in the Pac-12 in pass breakups with six and is tied for ninth in the league in passes defended per game (0.86). He has 20 career pass breakups.
- > **Rowe's** 46 tackles ranks third on the team.
- > Rowe has been in double-digit tackles twice, with 10 tackles against Utah State and Arizona. He has five career double-digit tackle games.
- > Senior **Michael Walker** has started all seven games at strong safety and is fourth on the team with 41 tackles. He has 1.5 TFL, an interception and four pass breakups.
- > Senior **Keith McGill** has started all seven games at corner in his first year at the position (he played safety in five games in 2011, with one start, before missing the rest of that season and all of 2012 with injuries). He has 21 tackles.
- > McGill leads the Pac-12 in pass breakups (7) and is third in the league in passes defended (8). He is fourth in the conference in passes defended per game (1.14).
- > McGill has one interception this season and in his career, which he returned 19 yards for a touchdown against UCLA. > JC transfer **Davion Orphey** has played in all seven games with five starts. He has 20 tackles and two pass breakups.
- > Freshman **Reginald Porter** has played in all seven games with two starts at corner. He has 10 tackles and a pass breakup.
- > Starting nickel **Mike Honeycutt** (4 starts) has 13 total tackles, two TFL and a sack. He scored a touchdown on a fumble recovery while playing on special teams against Weber State.
- > Redshirt freshman nickel back **Justin Thomas** has played in every game, with one start. He has five tackles and a pass breakup.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

- > 24-year-old redshirt freshman kicker **Andy Phillips** is a former five-year member of the U.S. Ski Team (2007-11) and had never played in a football game at any level prior to this season. He played soccer as a freshman in high school.
- > **Phillips** was named to the ESPN.com and SI.com Midseason All-America teams.
- > **Phillips** started his career 11-for-11 in field goals through Utah's first six games before going 1-for-3 against Arizona on a trio of 40- yard and longer field goal attempts.
- > **Phillips** is 12-of-14 (85.7%) in field goals this season and is 30-of-30 in PATs. He is third in the Pac-12 in field goals made and fourth in field goal percentage.
- > **Phillips** is 5-for-7 in field goals from 40 yards and out, with makes of 48, 45, 44 (twice) and 41 yards. His misses were from 40 and 42 yards, both against Arizona.
- > **Phillips** is second in the Pac-12 in kick-scoring points with 66 and his 9.4 points per game is tied for fifth in the Pac-12 and 19th in the nation. His 66 points leads the Utes.
- > **Phillips** has successfully executed 2-of-2 onside kicks that were recovered by his teammates (vs. Utah State and UCLA).
- > **Phillips** set a school record for PATs against Weber State, making 10-of-10.
- > Phillips was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week against Stanford, making 2-of-2 field goals including a career-long 48-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to give Utah a 27-14 lead. He also made a 23-yard field goal in the third quarter and all three PATs.
- > **Phillips** has 37 kickoffs with nine touchbacks and is averaging 61.7 yards per kickoff.
- > As a team, Utah has kicked off 46 times with 13 touchbacks.
- > Sophomore punter **Tom Hackett** leads the Pac-12 and ranks 19th in the nation, averaging 43.8 yards on 40 punts (1,752 yards).
- > **Hackett** has a Pac-12 high 10 punts of 50+ yards (long of 61).
- > **Hackett** leads the Pac-12 lead in punts inside the 20 (17) and has placed 42.5% of his punts (17-of-40) inside the 20-yard line, including five inside the 10.
- > **Hackett** has placed 32 of his 65 career punts inside the 20-yard line (12 inside the 10- and six inside the 5-yard line). He has just four touchbacks in his career.
- > Hackett's 11 punts vs. BYU tied the second-most in school single-game history, while his 486 yards against the Cougars ranks second all-time in a game.
- > True freshman long snapper **Chase Dominguez** has performed all 83 snaps without a mistake. He recovered a fumble on a kickoff return that would lead to a Utah touchdown against Arizona.
- > **Geoffrey Norwood** is sixth in the Pac-12 in punt return average (7.4) with 16 returns for 119 yards.
- > **Delshawn McClellon** leads Utah's kickoff returners with nine runbacks for 195 yards (21.7 average), although **Dres Anderson** (1 return, 29 yards) and **Bubba Poole** (2 returns, 38 yards, 19.0 average) are the current starters.
- > **Daniel Nielsen** blocked a PAT against Arizona, Utah's first blocked kick of the season.

HEAD COACH KYLE WHITTINGHAM SAYS

"We got off to a slow start in our game against Arizona, and although we played much better in the second half, it wasn't enough to pull out the victory. We are facing one of the most storied programs in the country this Saturday in USC and we fully anticipate that our players will bounce back and be ready to play the full 60 minutes vs. the Trojans."

Second-year cornerbacks coach **Sharrieff Shah** was a trial attorney in Salt Lake City from 2001 until 2012, when he joined the Ute football staff ... Utah has four alumni coaches: **Brian Johnson**, co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks; **Shah**, cornerbacks; **Jay Hill**, tight ends/special teams coordinator; and **Morgan Scalley**, safeties.

Senior DE/LB Trevor Reilly played all last season with a torn ACL suffered the spring prior. Reilly's baby daughter Shayn is undergoing treatment for kidney cancer ... Freshman kicker Andy Phillips had never played in a football game at any level prior to this season. He is a former five-year member of the U.S. Ski Team (2007-11) ... Jared Norris attended a pro skateboarding camp (Camp Woodward), and at 6-1, 230 pounds, was the biggest skateboarder ever to attend ... Jeremiah Poutasi asks to officially be called Jeremiah, but is Cedrik or CJ to his coaches and teammates ... Junior Salt played a role in the rugby-themed movie Forever Strong.

Tight end **Jake Murphy** is the son of six-time National League all-star Dale Murphy ... Receiver **Dres Anderson's** father Willie "Flipper" Anderson had a 10-year NFL career for four teams after playing collegiately for UCLA ... Walk-on linebacker Alex Whittingham is the son of head coach Kyle Whittingham. Defensive end Jason Whittingham is Kyle Whittingham's nephew. Jason's father Cary played for BYU and the L.A. Rams (in 1987) ... Center **Vyncent Jones'** father Wayne played a year with the Minnesota Vikings (in 1987). He played for Utah from 1978-81 ... Freshman Filipo Mokofisi's father of the same name starred for Utah from 1982-85 before being selected by New Orleans in the eighth round of the 1986 NFL Draft ...
