A LOOK BACK AT 2015-16

A SEASON TO REMEMBER



Bucknell traveled to play national power Notre Dame in the second game of the season on Nov. 15. The Bison played the third-ranked Irish in front of over 9,000 fans at Purcell Pavilion. Legendary coach Muffett McGraw recorded her 700th career win.



Facing uncertainty after numerous injuries led to a 6-5 record in non-conference play, Bucknell rolled to a 79-69 win over Army West Point at Sojka Pavilion on Jan. 2. The Bison tied their single-game record with 12 3-pointers and were led by 22 points from Claire DeBoer.



Bucknell improved to 5-0 in league play with a 17-point comeback in the fourth quarter on its way to an 80-77 overtime win over Lehigh on Jan. 13. Kaitlyn Slagus hit a 3-pointer to tie it with seconds left in regulation, and Kyi English hit a go-ahead trey in the closing seconds of OT.



The Bison improved to 8-0 in the Patriot League with a 74-56 win over Boston University at Sojka Pavilion on Jan. 23. It was the program's best start in league play in program history, eclipsing the 7-0 start by the 1999-2000 team.



Claire DeBoer scored 12 points in a 79-60 win over Colgate at Sojka Pavilion on Feb. 13, becoming the 22nd player in program history to eclipse the 1,000-point plateau for her career. She finished her junior season with 1,151 career points.



Bucknell closed the regular season with a 68-59 win at Lafayette on March 2, clinching a share of the Patriot League regular season title with a 17-1 record against conference opponents. It was the program's first regular season title since 2007.



Bucknell defeated American 73-65 in the quarterfinal round of the Patriot League Tournament at Sojka Pavilion on March 7. It was the Bison's program-record 10th straight win and advanced them to the semifinal round for the first time since 2013.



Kaitlyn Slagus was voted the Patriot League Rookie of the Year, Aaron Roussell was the Coach of the Year, and Claire DeBoer and Jacquie Klotz were voted to the All-PL First Team. Slagus was joined on the All-Rookie Team by Kyi English.



The Bison went on the road to beat Akron 74-70 in the first round of the WNIT on March 17. It was the first win in a national postseason tournament in program history and the first win in the WNIT in Patriot League history.

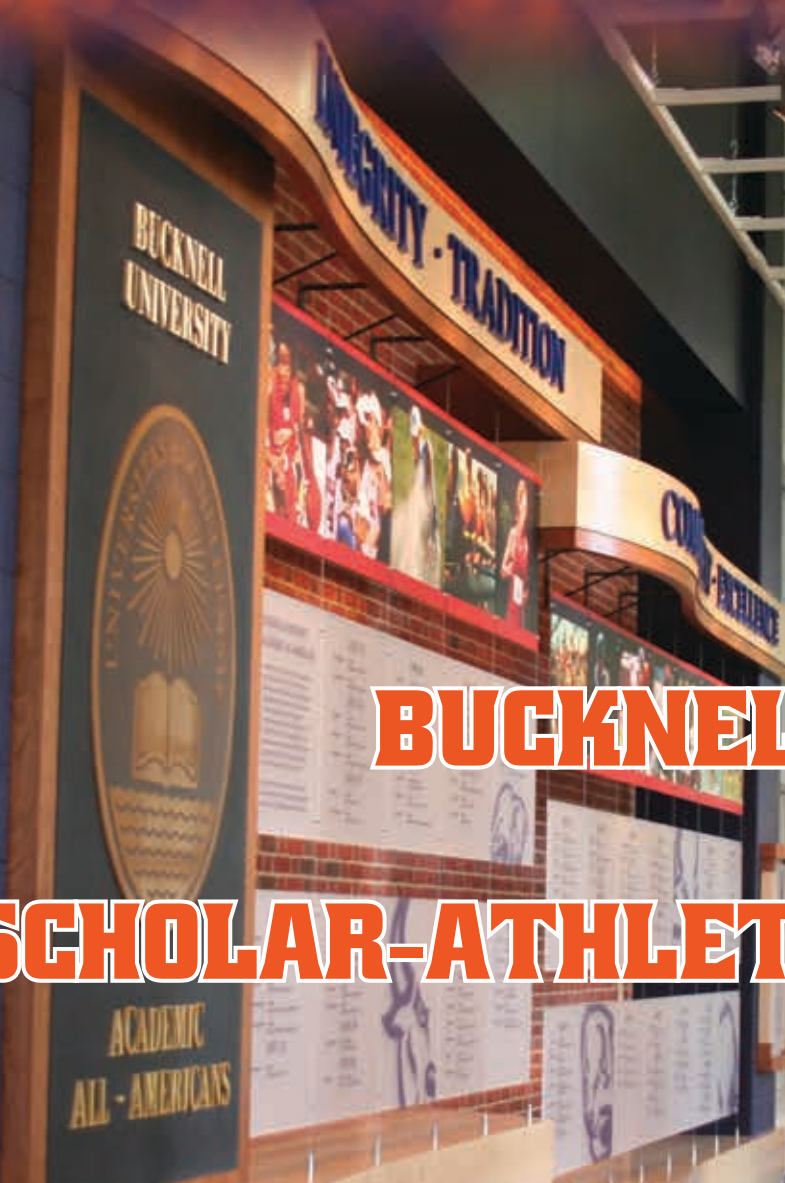

NCAA POST-GRADUATE

SCHOLARSHIP

K.C. Vlah, a 1996 Bucknell graduate and former three-time captain for the Bison, was a recipient of the prestigious NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship. The scholarship is a national award given annually to 10 women



who show interest in pursuing a career in intercollegiate athletics. Vlah deferred the scholarship for a year, and returned to her alma mater in 1997-98 to pursue her master's degree while serving as a graduate assistant with the basketball program.

A member of the first-ever regular-season Patriot League championship team, Vlah finished her career with 312 steals, just four shy of the Bucknell record. She ranks 10th in school history in career assists with 268 and totaled 750 career points.

PATRIOT LEAGUE SCHOLAR-ATHLETE



Lori Houck, a graduate of the Class of 2000 and member of the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame, ended a brilliant career for the Bison by earning the Patriot League's Women's Basketball Scholar-Athlete Award and adding the overall Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award. She became the first Bucknell women's basketball player to earn the award in her sport and the first Bucknell female ever to win the Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award.

Houck was a four-year starter who averaged 15.8 points per game as a senior, leading the Bison into the Patriot League championship game for the first time in the League's 10-year history.

Her greatest accomplishments, however, were in the classroom where she graduated with a 3.60 cumulative grade-point average as an accounting and mathematics major.

BUCKNELL A LEADER IN SALARY POTENTIAL AMONG U.S. LIBERAL ARTS COLLEGES

Graduates of Bucknell University have among the highest earning potential in the nation, a research survey revealed in 2010. The 2010 Education and Salary Report, prepared and released by Seattle-based PayScale Inc., named Bucknell graduates No. 3 among top U.S. liberal arts colleges by salary potential.

The top liberal arts college category showed that the starting median salary for Bucknell graduates was \$55,800, while the mid-career median salary was \$115,000.

- In 2007, The Washington Monthly ranked Bucknell No. 7 among the best liberal arts colleges in the country when it comes to fostering research and promoting an ethic of service and social mobility.
- In 2008, the Peace Corps listed Bucknell at No. 6 on its top 25 list of small colleges and universities producing Peace Corps Volunteers.
- In 2008, Kiplinger's Personal Finance magazine rated Bucknell as the 11th best value in private liberal arts colleges.

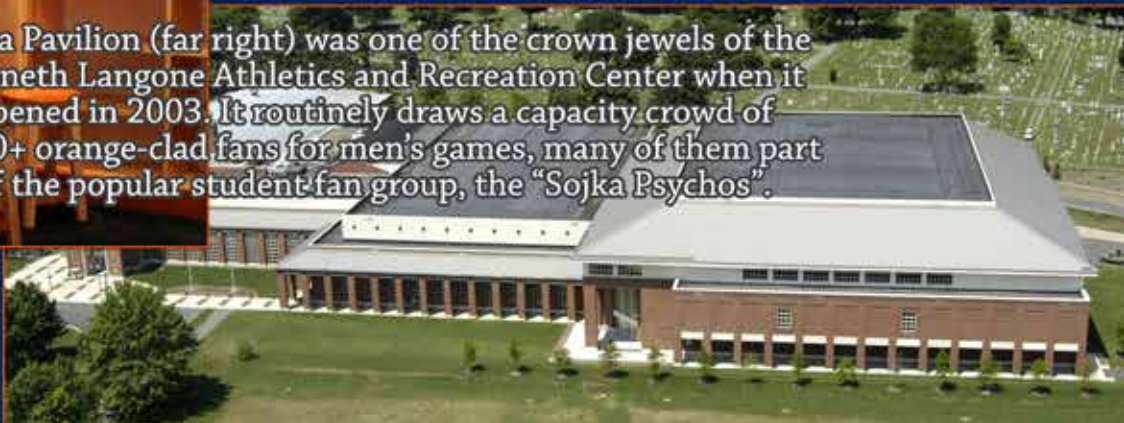
THE HOME OF BISON BASKETBALL

One of the most integral components of the success of Bucknell's department of athletics and recreation is the strength and conditioning area. The strength and conditioning staff has a 16,000-square-foot center available at its disposal. The entire fitness center consists of two distinct areas. The first is the Krebs Fitness Center, which contains state-of-the-art cardiovascular and strength equipment. This part of the facility is available for use by students, faculty and staff, as well as student-athletes. The generous hours make it easily accessible and a great place for a workout. The second part of the facility is the Berger Strength Training Center, which sits on the former site of Freas-Rooke Pool, and is used for instructional free-weight training and varsity workouts. A portion of the Berger Training Center is a dedicated workout space for only varsity student-athletes under the supervision of a strength and conditioning staff member.





The Bucknell University Department of Athletics and Recreation prides itself on setting the standard of excellence when it comes to success both on the playing fields and in the classroom. With 18 Patriot League Presidents' Cups in 26 years, national leadership in graduation rates in 2015, 129 Academic All-Americans since 1970 and 139 Patriot League Scholar-Athletes in 25 years, Bucknell is clearly at the head of the class in terms of upholding the scholar-athlete model.

The 2003 addition of the Kenneth G. Langone Athletics and Recreation Center, one of the finest collegiate athletics and recreation venues of its kind, ensures the continuation of that success.

The facility enhances each of Bucknell's 27 varsity programs and greatly expands the scope of its growing intramural and recreational sports offerings. A visually appealing structure located along Moore Avenue on the "downhill" side of campus, the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center was designed to reach out to all members of the campus community, including the student body, varsity student-athletes, faculty, staff and alumni.

Three primary venues lie within the facility: the Arthur D. Kinney Jr. Natatorium, the 4,000-seat Gary A. Sojka Pavilion and the Krebs Family Fitness Center. Other features include a new location for the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame, a display of Bucknell's Congressional Medal of Honor recipients, a sports medicine and athletic training suite, classrooms, modern offices for coaches and staff and increased locker room space for varsity and recreational athletes.

The facility is named in honor of Ken Langone, a 1957 Bucknell graduate who, along with his wife Elaine, pledged \$11 million toward the center's construction. Langone was a member of the university Board of Trustees from 1980 to 1996.

One of the special qualities of the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center is the manner in which it supplements the pre-existing facilities. The new construction surrounds Gerhard Fieldhouse and historic Davis Gymnasium, which has been restored as a competition venue for the Bison volleyball and wrestling teams, as well as intramural, recreation and other varsity practice activities.

As Bucknell continues to strive toward its mission of setting the standard of excellence in college athletics, the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center is the centerpiece in an already impressive cache of athletics facilities that includes the 13,100-seat Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium and its FieldTurf and 8-lane track surface; the scenic Bucknell Golf Club; Depew Field, the home of the Bison baseball team; and the spacious West Fields Complex, which encompasses Depew Field (baseball), Becker Field (softball) and the adjoining Graham Field (Astroturf for field hockey and women's lacrosse) and Emmitt Field (natural grass for soccer) at Holmes Stadium that now features a new stadium/press box facility. In June 2015, construction began on the Graham Building adjacent to Sojka Pavilion, which will house a new student health center as well as training facility for the varsity wrestling team.

A closer look behind the walls of the Kenneth G. Langone Athletics and Recreation Center:

RAMER SCHAFFNER MEMORIAL HALL

Ramer Schaffner Memorial Hall greets guests as they enter the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center. The entry hall features the busts of 2nd Lt. George H. Ramer and 1st Lt. Dwite H. Schaffner, Bucknell's Congressional Medal of Honor recipients, and provides access to Gerhard Fieldhouse and the Krebs Family Fitness Center on the ground level. Guests may proceed to the second level to enter Davis Gym, administrative offices and the Hall of Fame, which celebrates Bucknell's Patriot League championships and other notable feats.

KREBS FITNESS CENTER

Promoting lifetime wellness, the Krebs Family Fitness Center contains state-of-the-art cardiovascular and strength conditioning equipment, all of which was replaced in 2014. The 16,000-square-foot center includes over 175 positions for equipment within three distinct areas. The first-level cardiovascular and pin-select equipment is open for student, faculty and staff use at all times. Directly above, the mezzanine also contains cardio equipment, with scenic views of the campus and natatorium.

The third area, the Berger Family Weight Room, sits on the former site of Freas-Rooke Pool, and is used for instructional free-weight training and varsity workouts.

KINNEY NATATORIUM

Kinney Natatorium features a 50-meter by 25-yard Olympic class pool, which accommodates four varsity programs — men's and women's swimming and diving and men's and women's water polo — while enhancing the recreational aquatics opportunities for the Bucknell community. The pool itself features two moveable bulkheads, allowing for multiple team practices and recreational swimming to occur simultaneously.

Natatorium amenities include seating for 500 spectators, restrooms, separated varsity and visiting team locker rooms, a poolside classroom, sauna, steam room and concession stands.

Kinney Natatorium has played host to several major events, most notably the 2005 NCAA Men's Water Polo Championship. The facility has also served as host of the 2003, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2011, 2013 and 2015 Patriot League Swimming and Diving Championships, the 2004 Eastern Women's Water Polo Championship and an exhibition game against the U.S. women's water polo national team, drawing rave reviews at each. Beginning in the spring of 2005, the Pennsylvania state swimming championships moved to Kinney Natatorium.

The facility has proved to be quite a home pool advantage for Bucknell, which became the first institution in league history to capture both the men's and women's swimming and diving championships in the same season in 2003. A total of 20 meet records and 16 league marks fell that weekend.

SOJKA PAVILION

Sojka Pavilion provides the Bison men's and women's basketball programs with one of the finest arenas in the East. A "first-class" venue capable of seating 4,000 spectators for sporting and other campus events, the pavilion has walk-down access to all seats and unobstructed views of the playing surface or concert stage for all spectators. The seating bowl features approximately 1,500 fixed seats and 2,500 retractable seats, enabling an "expandable" open floor area with sufficient space for three basketball courts for recreational activities and varsity practices. The spacious upper-level concourse includes two concession areas, restrooms, handicapped seating and several suites that overlook the floor.

Behind the scenes, on the floor level, Sojka Pavilion provides a green room for performance acts and other functions, a catering kitchen for special events, ticket windows, locker room space for home and visiting teams and officials, and a loading dock capable of accommodating team buses and production trucks for televised events.

Dozens of nationally televised basketball games have been aired from Sojka Pavilion, including the 2006, 2011, 2012 and 2013 Patriot League championship games. The 2005 Bucknell-Villanova men's basketball game drew a school-record crowd of 4,433.

Two significant upgrades to Sojka Pavilion were added in time for the 2016-17 season. Fans entering the arena will do so through the Charlie Woollum Lobby. Named in honor of Bucknell's Hall-of-Fame men's basketball coach, the new lobby celebrates the history of the Bison basketball programs. Most noticeable is the large video wall that features team features and live events.

Another enhancement is the replacement of the video display board inside Sojka Pavilion. The new high-definition board, which measures 12 feet high by 20 feet wide, is located on the north façade of Sojka Pavilion and will supplant the original video board that had been in place since the facility opened in 2003. The new display will help enhance the fan experience by providing live and packaged video, replays, statistics, contests and other entertainment.



Whether it is the varsity student-athlete, the intramurals participant or the fitness buff looking for a nice workout, members of the Bucknell community benefit from a wide array of first-class athletics facilities. The completion of the **Kenneth Langone Athletics & Recreation Center** in 2003 highlighted a facilities boon at Bucknell. **Sojka Pavilion**, **Kinney Natatorium** and the **Krebs Family Fitness Center** are the centerpieces of the sparkling new indoor facility, nicely complementing the renovated **Davis Gym** and **Gerhard Fieldhouse**, all of which lie under the same roof. **Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium** is the largest of the outdoor facilities, with 13,100 seats surrounding the FieldTurf playing surface and 8-lane track. **Holmes Stadium**, completed in 2007, is an impressive covered grandstand featuring all chair-back seating, along with the accompanying support facilities (locker rooms, athletic training room, press box, concession/merchandise stand, etc.) that service both **Emmitt Field** (natural grass for soccer) and **Graham Field** (AstroTurf for field hockey and women's lacrosse). The next phase of the West Fields improvement project includes significant upgrades for baseball and softball. Both diamonds recently received new playing surfaces. FieldTurf at **Depew Field** (baseball) was laid in time for the start of the 2010 season, while new sod was recently installed in the outfield of **Becker Field** (softball). Both facilities also now have new dugouts, fencing and scoreboards, as well as a brick entry plaza, and fundraising continues for the final phase: new grandstands and press boxes for both venues. Also located on the western end of campus are numerous grass fields for intramurals and recreation, as well as Bucknell's own highly regarded 18-hole golf course, the **Bucknell Golf Club**. Just completed in 2011 on the BGC property is the new indoor/outdoor **Bachman Golf Center**, which provides a year-round training center for the Bison golf teams. The Bison rowing team has its own **Boathouse** located about 10 miles south of campus, along the scenic Susquehanna River. That is the only athletics facility that is not located within a short walk from the center of campus, but the rowing team now has its own **erg room** next to Davis Gym. Completed in 2016 adjacent to Sojka Pavilion, the **Graham Building** is home to a new student health center and a state-of-the-art training center for the Bison wrestling team. The quality and location of these venues makes Bucknell one of the most sports-friendly campuses in the nation.



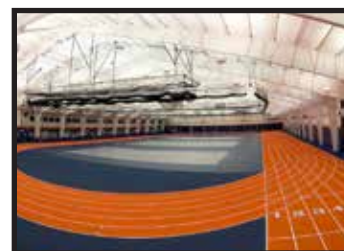

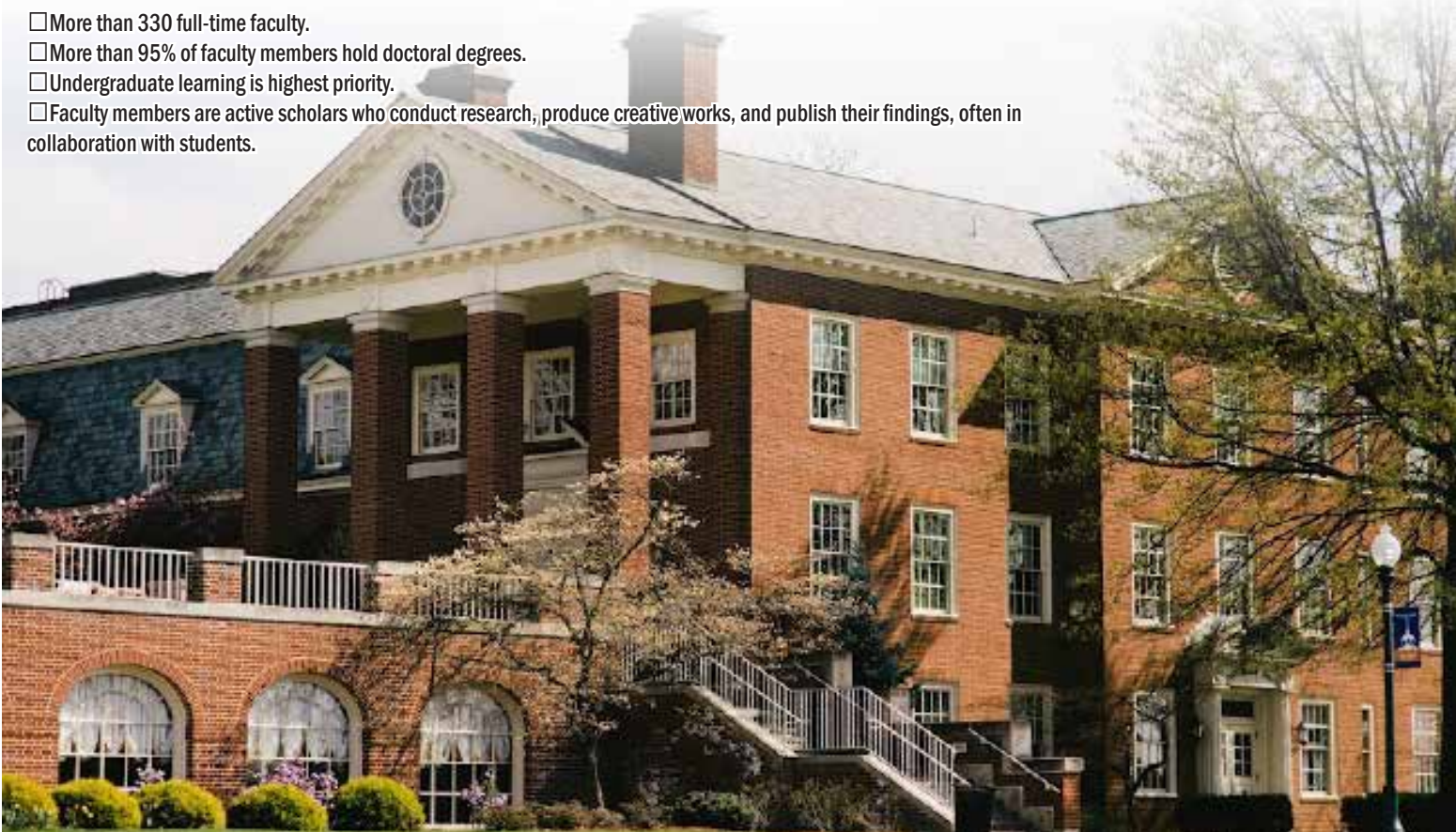

"ONE OF THE BEST SMALL TOWNS IN AMERICA"

Bucknell's hilltop campus slopes into Victorian Lewisburg, population roughly 6,000, a town in which historic preservationists have influence. Lewisburg enjoys ornamental vanities that are not part of modern architecture. Gingerbread porches, carved wooden doors and three-globed street lights that make this town memorable.

Historical roots are important in Lewisburg. The town celebrates the holidays with the annual Victorian Holiday Parade and exhibits at the Packwood House Museum and the Slifer House Museum. Its many historical sites include an Underground Railroad station. A weekly market brings Amish farmers to town in horse-drawn wagons.

Lewisburg is ranked 15th in the nation in the book, *The 100 Best Small Towns in America*, written by Norman Crampton. The town earned this ranking by scoring high in areas such as the number of physicians per 100,000, the percentage of college-educated residents, the lowest number of serious crimes, and its location near state parks as well as being host to an institution of higher learning.

The borough of Lewisburg began its early life as "Derrstown" named for its settler, landowner, and miller Ludwig Derr. While the date remains obscure, the historians point out that in English, the German name for Ludwig is Lewis.

The town's growth from 1785 until well into the 19th century was slow due to the lack of transportation, until a ferry was built to carry wagons across the Susquehanna River and a canal was completed in 1833. Lewisburg, surveyed in 1769, was not officially founded by Ludwig Derr until 1785. The borough was incorporated on March 31, 1812. Located on the Susquehanna, it has benefited with every development in transportation: turnpike, canal, railroad and now, highways.

Enhanced by the chartering of Bucknell University on February 5, 1846, and the seating of the county government on October 9, 1855, the community expanded its development past Fifth Street to what is now Route 15. Most of the builders of this community are protected through historic district regulation.

In addition to Bucknell, the Lewisburg Federal Prison System and Evangelical Community Hospital enhance the area's financial stability.

Education has always played a primary part in Lewisburg's social society. As early as 1790 the basics were taught in private homes. In 1805 the "Log Cabin Academy" was built. In 1835 three new schools were added, while the present system consists of two elementary schools, a middle school — which was recently named the top middle school in the state — and a high school. Sixty-five percent of Lewisburg's high school graduates go on to college.

GETTING TO BUCKNELL

Sojka Pavilion is located on Moore Avenue about 1/4 mile from the entrance to the Bucknell campus on U.S. Route 15, about seven miles south of Interstate 80. From New York City or Ohio, take I-80 to Route 15 South (Exit 210). Turn left into campus at the 11th traffic light (first light after PA Rt. 45).

From additional locations:

From Philadelphia — Take the Northeast Extension of the Pennsylvania Turnpike (I-476) North to Interstate 80 (Exit 95), and follow the directions above.

From Baltimore — Take Interstate 83 North and pick up Route 15 North just south of Harrisburg. Follow Route 15 for approximately 60 miles. Approximately seven miles after passing through Selingsgrove you will crest a hill with a flashing traffic light warning signal, and the stadium will appear on your right. At the traffic light at the bottom of the hill turn right into campus.

From Pittsburgh — Take US Route 22 East to 220 North (I-99). Continue until reaching Interstate 80 East, and then take that to Route 15 South (Exit 210). At the 11th traffic light make a left into campus.

From Washington D.C. and South — Take I-495 to I-270 North and pick up Route 15 North near Frederick. Follow Route 15 all the way to Bucknell.

2016-17 BISON



BISON LOOK FOR STRONG SEQUEL TO RECORD-BREAKING SEASON

The 2015-16 women's basketball season was one for the record books in the Patriot League, with Bucknell and Army West Point each going 17-1 in the conference while splitting the regular season title. One team finishing with that mark against conference opponents is rare enough, but two was unprecedented. So when Bucknell head coach Aaron Roussell says he would be shocked to see any team be able to do that this year, including his own, he obviously means no disrespect.

"I could make a list of about six or seven teams right now that have a legitimate chance of winning the league," said Roussell, the reigning Patriot League Coach of the Year. "The league usually has a lot of parity, which is what makes last year so exceptional. To have two teams go 17-1 isn't normal."

With all of that being said, if by some chance a team does dominate the league in similar fashion, Bucknell has the most returning pieces to make it happen. The Bison have the only returning First Team All-Patriot League selection in senior forward Claire DeBoer, the Patriot League Rookie of the Year in sophomore forward Kaitlyn Slagus, and an All-Rookie Team member in sophomore guard Kyi English that stepped in as the starting point guard midway through the season and played with confidence far beyond that of a freshman.

That trio is joined by a pair of seniors in forward Sune Swart and guard Megan McGurk, both of whom will share captain duties with DeBoer. Swart, who Roussell has said improved more from her freshman to senior seasons than any other player he has seen, made a huge impact off the bench for the Bison last season, while McGurk will be returning from an injury that cost her the final 19 games last year.

All of those players, as well as numerous others that return for Bucknell, were good enough for the other schools in the league to make the Bison the overwhelming favorite to win the conference. In a preseason poll of the league's coaches and sports information directors, the Bison received 16 of a possible 18 first-place votes. Lehigh, Holy Cross, American, and Navy picked up one first-place vote apiece. Voters were restricted from picking their own team.

"I think we have gotten to a point with this program that that's the unstated

goal every year,” said Bucknell head coach Aaron Roussell about competing for a league title. “That’s why the players that are here came here is that they want to be a part of a team that can win a championship. But when the season tips off we aren’t thinking about that. We are thinking about playing well, improving, holding ourselves accountable and playing at a high level. If we do that the wins will come.”

That will start with DeBoer, who was named the Patriot League Preseason Player of the Year. If that prediction comes true, she would become the program’s first Player of the Year since Hope Foster in 2007. DeBoer is one of the most versatile players in the conference and will give Bucknell numerous lineup options with her ability to play anywhere on the floor.

DeBoer averaged 15.7 points and 6.9 rebounds last season. The rebounding numbers don’t tell the full story of the work she does on the boards, oftentimes boxing out the other team’s top rebounder and allowing another Bison player to come in and get the board. She enters her senior season ranked 17th in program history with 1,151 career points.

“She’s the best post player in the league, but if we made her a guard she would probably be one of the best guards in the league,” Roussell said. “We have a lot of really good post players, so if we want to get more of them on the court at the same time, it’s nice knowing we have the ability to move Claire around a little bit and she has the versatility to succeed.”

The Bison are loaded in the frontcourt with the emergence of Slagus during the conference slate last season. She scored 17 of her season-high 21 points in the second half of a win over Navy in the league opener and went on to average 10.9 points and 5.6 rebounds in 18 league games. Swart came off the bench, but played about the same amount of minutes as Slagus while averaging 5.7 points and 4.0 rebounds. A high-energy player, Swart was the catalyst in a comeback from 17 points down in an overtime win against Lehigh, and again in a 74-70 win at Akron in the first round of the WNIT. She posted her first career double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds against the Zips to help the Bison record their first every victory in a national postseason tournament.

Providing depth in the frontcourt for the Bison will be junior Catherine Romaine, who will get a chance to play in her home state twice this season in games against North Carolina and Elon, and freshman MK Moore. Sophomore Maegan Mikkelsen suffered a season-ending injury last year and is still working hard to get back on the court.

Bucknell will receive a huge lift with the return of McGurk to the lineup to start this season. The senior started the first 74 games of her career before going down with a season-ending Achilles injury last year. Now, after English gained valuable experience in McGurk’s place last season, the Bison have a pair of point guards that can play with or without the ball, and Roussell is excited to be able to put both on the floor at the same time.

“It was pretty devastating for the team when she went down with a season-ending injury, but the silver lining was that it gave the opportunity for Kyi to step and really gain some experience,” said Roussell, who lauded the work McGurk put in to recover from the injury. “Now this year we have two point guards that I wouldn’t trade for anyone in the league.”

English went on to make the Patriot League All-Rookie Team and then added a spot on the All-Tournament Team after scoring 20 points in a quarterfinal win over American and 13 points in a semifinal loss to Loyola (Md.).

At one point last season, both McGurk and English were out with injuries, giving another freshman the chance to step in and make an impact. Kate Walker, a 6-0 guard, made four starts. She earned Patriot League Rookie of the Week honors after averaging 13.0 points and 5.0 rebounds in wins over American and Holy Cross. Rachel Dumiak also saw a decent amount of minutes as a freshman and figures to see more during her sophomore year.

Additionally, the Bison will get another injured guard back on the floor with the return of Carly Richardson after missing her entire sophomore season. She showed signs of her offensive ability as a freshman, including 10 points in her collegiate debut, a 53-52 win over Bowling Green.

Joining the returning players on the roster this season are three freshmen. Unfortunately, 6-3 forward Ellie Mack will miss her rookie year because of an offseason injury, but 5-8 guard Gia Hayes and 6-5 forward MK Moore are ready

to step on the floor when called upon.

Thanks to the most difficult non-conference schedule of the Roussell era, Bucknell figures to be well prepared once the league schedule starts with a home game against Navy on Dec. 30. The Bison have a five-game stretch of games against teams that qualified for national postseason tournaments last season when they play Elon (WNIT), Drexel (WNIT), Akron (WNIT), Rutgers (WNIT), and St. Bonaventure (NCAA).

Rutgers is just one of two big-time programs led by legendary coaches on the Bucknell schedule this season. The Scarlet Knights are coached by C. Vivian Stringer, who ranks fifth on the all-time Division I women’s coaches victories list with a career record of 971-366. The Bison will also play North Carolina, which is coached by Sylvia Hatchell. She ranks third on the all-time wins list with a record of 975-358.

“We like getting a couple of the BCS teams in there to give our players the experience of going to play at a big-time university. Playing two powerhouses in Rutgers and North Carolina is a cool thing. Those are two of the top programs in women’s basketball history and have two of the top five winningest coaches in NCAA history,” Roussell said. “But just as important to us was scheduling some of the top mid-major programs out there, because that’s how we want to see ourselves, as one of the top mid-major teams in the country. We want to go out and test ourselves and show what we can do against teams of that caliber.”

Roussell believes his team is up for the task of the tough schedule in large part due to the leadership of his three seniors.

“They do everything right,” Roussell said. “It’s a group that has been special because of the impact they have had with this program, not just with the success they have had, but with how hard they have worked and how they have treated their teammates. Those are the kinds of things that have a long-lasting impact on a program.

While a repeat of the 17-1 conference record seems improbable, Roussell is confident his team will be where they need to be at season’s end.

“I expect us to be a better team this year, but that may not be apparent early in the season. We have some younger players we are going to need to rely on and a couple of players working their way back from injuries. But I really believe that end of the season we are going to be really good.”

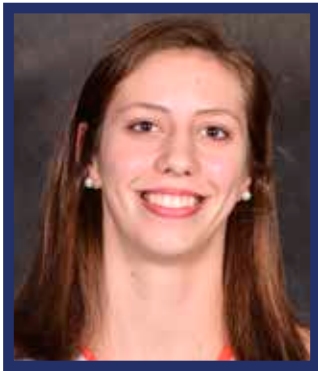

AARON ROUSSELL

Head Coach • Fifth Season at Bucknell • Iowa '01

Aaron Roussell has improved Bucknell's record in each of his four seasons at the helm of the Bison women's basketball squad, culminating with a school-record 25-win season in 2015-16.

The Bison struggled to a 5-25 season in the year prior to Roussell's arrival, but in his first four campaigns the team has won 15, 16, 18 and 25 games.

This past season was simply one of the best in the 43-year history of the program. Despite a rash of significant injuries that left the team severely shorthanded for much of the year, the Bison posted a 17-1 Patriot League record, good for a share of the regular-season championship with Army West Point.

Roussell was named Patriot League Coach of the Year at season's end. Even though his team was upset in the Patriot League Tournament semifinals, the Bison bounced back to defeat Akron 74-70 for the first Women's National Invitation Tournament victory by any Patriot League team. Bucknell played Michigan to an even game into the fourth quarter before the Wolverines prevailed in the second round.

The turnaround was immediate for Bucknell under Roussell. He lifted the Bison from a five-win outing in 2011-12 to a 15-16 overall record and a 5-9 mark in Patriot League action during his debut season. His 15 wins set a Bucknell women's basketball record for victories in a coach's rookie season, and his work with the Bison was recognized nationally, as he was named a finalist for the WBCA Spalding Maggie Dixon Division I Rookie Coach of the Year award.

Bucknell's ascent continued in Roussell's second season at the helm, as the Bison finished 16-14 overall, 11-7 in the Patriot League and 10-4 at Sojka Pavilion. Bucknell earned the No. 4 seed for the Patriot League Tournament and hosted a quarterfinal game in Sojka for the first time. The Bison then went on to accept a bid to the Women's Basketball Invitational postseason tournament for the first time.

Bucknell's improvement mirrored that of the conference as a whole in 2014-15, but the Bison were again able to finish in the top half of the league standings and grabbed the No. 4 seed for the conference tournament for the second consecutive year. The team finished 18-12, the program's highest win total in eight years, and was above .500 at 10-8 in one of the most competitive seasons from top to bottom in league history.

Much of the Bison's success during Roussell's tenure has been a result of his ability to quickly develop talent and meld it with the team's veteran players. They have won three straight Patriot League Rookie of the Year awards, with Claire DeBoer receiving the honor in 2014, Jacquie Klotz in 2015 and Kaitlyn Slagus in 2016.

At the same time that the freshmen were winning awards, Bucknell's veteran players were being recognized alongside the best players in the league. Shelby Romine was a First Team All-Patriot League selection in 2014, and Audrey Dotson landed a spot on the First Team in 2015. DeBoer and Klotz were both honored in 2016. In all, the Bison have had seven all-conference players in Roussell's four seasons, while another five were voted to the All-Rookie squad.

Prior to his time in Lewisburg, Roussell spent eight years as the head coach at the University of Chicago, where he compiled a 161-50 (.763) record, including a 52-5 mark with a 43-game regular-season winning streak over his last two seasons with the program. Roussell logged the most victories and highest winning percentage of any women's basketball coach in Chicago's 41-year history, while guiding the Maroons to their only three University Athletic Association outright championships. Two of those came in his final two years in Chicago, both on perfect 14-0 league records. Roussell's teams also made four NCAA Division III Tournament appearances during his tenure, advancing to the Elite Eight once and to the Sweet Sixteen on three occasions.

In addition to their success on the hardwood, Roussell's teams at the University of Chicago, one of the most prestigious academic institutions in the nation, also excelled in the classroom. His 2010-11 team combined for a 3.36 grade-point average and, at the culmination of the 2011-12 season, Taylor Simpson was awarded the Jostens Trophy, given to the most outstanding Division III women's basketball student-athlete and determined by basketball ability, academic success and community service.

Prior to Roussell's arrival at Chicago in September of 2004, the Maroons had never appeared in the national rankings, but they were listed in the ESPN/WBCA and D3hoops.com top-25 polls in each of the last seven years under his tutelage. The program was ranked No. 1 in the nation in the ESPN/WBCA Coaches' Poll in 2006-07, and in 2011-12, his last season with the program, the team was ranked No. 2 for most of the campaign. Roussell was named the UAA Coach of the Year in 2008, 2011 and 2012, and he was selected as the WBCA Regional Coach of the Year in 2011 and 2012.

Roussell coached six of the ten 1,000-point scorers in program history while at Chicago, mentored 15 different all-conference performers in eight seasons and had players earn All-America honors in 2005, 2011 and 2012. His teams posted a higher victory total than the previous season in seven of his eight years at the helm of the program.

In addition to his coaching duties, Roussell was an assistant professor at Chicago and taught four credits of activities classes per year. He was also a member of the athletic department's promotions team and personnel committee, and he served on the university's Community Service and Student Leadership awards committees.

A 2001 graduate of the University of Iowa, Roussell double-majored in journalism/mass communications and political science. In 2002 he began a two-year stint as a graduate assistant women's basketball coach at Minnesota State, completing a master's degree in sports administration while honing his coaching skills.

His first coaching experience came at the high school level, as he served as the boys' varsity assistant coach and head JV coach at Breck High School in Minneapolis, Minn. for the 2001-02 season.

Roussell and his wife, Molly, have a six-year-old son, Riley, and a two-year old daughter, Kelsey.

MIKE LANE

Assistant Coach • Fifth Season at Bucknell • Notre Dame '93

Mike Lane begins his fifth season as an assistant coach with the Bucknell women's basketball program in the fall of 2016. Lane, a former assistant under head coach Aaron Roussell at the University of Chicago, is responsible for all of the program's scheduling and works primarily with the post players.

The Bison post players have achieved notable success since Lane's arrival to Lewisburg prior to the 2012-13 season. He has mentored two players – Audrey Dotson and Claire DeBoer – to a combined four All-Patriot League honors, one Patriot League Rookie of the Year award and most recently a second Preseason All-Patriot League nod for DeBoer. Additionally, he guided Kaitlyn Slagus to a Patriot League

Rookie of the Year award in 2016.

In his first year at Bucknell, Lane mentored Lindsay Horbatuck to an outstanding senior season. Horbatuck led the league and ranked 30th nationally with 10.5 rebounds per game.

Bucknell's frontcourt has proven to be all-around complete players under Lane's direction. Dotson scored 1,241 points, pulled down 630 rebounds, had 113 blocks and shot 80 percent from the line over her final three seasons. DeBoer, entering her senior season, already has 1,151 points and 656 rebounds while shooting 73 percent from the line.

After serving under Roussell at Chicago and helping the Maroons to some of the most successful seasons in school history, Lane directed Division III Dominican University to impressive heights during his five years as head coach and athletics facilities manager with the Stars. The 2011 Northern Athletics Conference Coach of the Year, Lane led Dominican to its first-ever NAC South Division title, as well as its first NAC conference tournament appearance. During the 2011-12 season, the Stars advanced to the conference championship, another first for the program, finishing with a 19-9 overall record and a 13-4 mark in the NAC.

Under Lane's tutelage, Dominican either set or tied the school's NCAA-era record for wins in a single season three times, most recently in 2010-11 when the team finished 20-7. That same year, the Stars also broke a program record with 216 three-point field goals, giving them the seventh-best mark in NCAA Division III ranks, and also shattered school marks in scoring average (74.1), field goal percentage (.437) and assists (14.8/game). Dominican also ranked sixth nationally in three-point field goal percentage during the 2010-11 campaign, coming in at better than 37 percent.

A native of South Windsor, Conn., Lane is a 1993 graduate of Notre Dame where he earned his degree in business administration with a concentration in marketing. He and his wife, Jill, have a 10-year old son, Oliver, and an eight-year old daughter, Sheahan.

CARISSA THIELBAR

Assistant Coach • Second Season at Bucknell • Wisconsin-Superior '09

Carissa Thielbar is set to begin her second season as an assistant coach at Bucknell. In her previous six seasons of collegiate coaching, Thielbar went to the NCAA Tournament five times as an assistant on teams in Division I, II and III, including one year working on Aaron Roussell's staff at the University of Chicago.

Thielbar's primary responsibilities are with the team's guard/perimeter players. In her first season, she helped guide freshman Kyi English to a spot on the Patriot League All-Rookie Team and the Patriot League All-Tournament Team. Additionally, the 2015-16 team smashed the program's single-season record with 202 3-pointers.

Thielbar arrived at Bucknell after spending the previous four years at South Dakota State, one as a graduate assistant and the last three as a full-time assistant coach. The Jackrabbits made the NCAA Tournament in three of those four seasons and reached the final four of the WNIT in the other. Thielbar was in charge of the development of the team's point guards, while also holding recruiting and scouting responsibilities. During her time there, the Jackrabbits posted a 99-36 record, including an amazing 53-9 mark in the Summit League, and won three conference regular season titles and three league tournament titles.

Prior to South Dakota State, Thielbar was a graduate assistant coach at Wayne State College, where she helped guide the team to a 26-4 record and the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference title. The Wildcats were ranked as high as sixth in the nation and qualified for the NCAA Division II Tournament. That came just one year after Thielbar went to the NCAA Division III Tournament as an assistant coach at the University of Chicago.

Thielbar received a master's degree in sport and recreation studies from South Dakota State in 2013. She finished a bachelor's degree in sociology at the University of Wisconsin-Superior in 2009. While at Wisconsin-Superior, she was a three-year member of the women's basketball team and averaged more than 10 points per game during her career.

Martina Wood is set to begin her second season as an assistant coach with the Bucknell women's basketball team. She joined the Bison after spending two seasons as a graduate assistant at Kansas while earning a master's degree in communication studies.

With her coaching duties involving the post players, Wood helped guide junior Claire DeBoer to a First Team All-Patriot League selection, and freshman Kaitlyn Slagus to 2016 Patriot League Rookie of the Year honors in her first season as an assistant with the Bison.

During her two seasons with the Kansas women's basketball team, Wood had numerous duties including work during practice and workouts, scouting and academic progress. The Jayhawks won 28 games over those two seasons, including 11 in the highly competitive Big 12, and totaled six All-Big 12 selections. Included in those honorees was Chelsea Gardner, a two-time All-America Honorable Mention and second round draft pick of the WNBA's Indiana Fever.

Wood was a five-year player, including one redshirt season, at North Carolina, where she earned a bachelor's degree in communication studies in 2010. She saw significant time for the national power Tar Heels, playing in 93 games, including nine as a starter. She was on back-to-back Final Four teams, helped win three Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) championships, and played against Bucknell in the NCAA Tournament First Round in 2008.

Bucknell's athletic training staff, headed by Mark Keppler, provides outstanding medical care for each of Bucknell's student-athletes. Keppler and his staff recently moved into a brand new, state-of-the-art athletic training room as part of the Kenneth G. Langone Athletics and Recreation Center design. There is also a fully-equipped athletic training facility in Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium, adjacent to the football team locker room, and satellite training rooms at Sojka Pavilion and West Fields. The philosophy of the Bucknell sports medicine team is a commitment to providing the best care for Bison student-athletes. Its injury and rehab protocols are developed to help decrease athletics-related injuries, increase injury recovery time, and combine strength and flexibility, endurance and sport-specific functional activities.

Every injured Bucknell student-athlete is attended by an athletic trainer at the time the injury occurs. Each of Bucknell's professional staff trainers are state and nationally certified, and they are assisted on-site by a quality team of student athletic trainers. Athletes sustaining serious injuries requiring immediate attention in a hospital setting are sent to the emergency room of the Evangelical Community Hospital, located just two miles from the Bucknell campus.

Associate Athletics Director Mark Keppler, now in his 31st year as Bucknell's head athletic trainer, oversees Bucknell's athletic training and sports medicine program. Keppler coordinates the work of seven professional staff members and a dedicated group of student assistants.

The head trainer at Carnegie Mellon University for 11 years before coming to Bucknell, Keppler is a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association and is both state- and nationally-certified.

From 1982-84 he served as president of the Pennsylvania Athletic Training Society, and from 1984-97 he served with the Athletic Training Advisory Commission to the State Board of Physical Therapy. He is currently the Convention Chair for PATS and was inducted into that organization's Hall of Fame in June 2006.

Keppler is a 1973 graduate of Florida State University and holds a master's degree from the University of Pittsburgh.

After working with the football program for his first three years at Bucknell, Keppler moved to the fieldhouse training room to coordinate the athletic training office for the entire athletic department. In the fall of 1999, he once again took over as the primary football trainer, in addition to running the athletic training office. Keppler also serves as the primary athletic trainer for spring football, and supervises off-season rehabilitation programs for any injured Bison football players.

Keppler and his wife, Wanda, reside in Lewisburg and are the parents of daughters Sarah and Reta.

Geisinger Health System is an integrated, physician-led healthcare services organization that serves more than two million residents throughout central and northeastern Pennsylvania. It includes a 650-member multi-specialty physician practice, a tertiary/quaternary medical center and an acute-care community hospital, adult and pediatric trauma centers, a nationally acclaimed alcohol and chemical dependency treatment center, heart and cancer institutes, a neurosciences program, two research centers, 41 community practice offices and one of the largest not-for-profit rural HMOs in the country.

In addition to meeting the on-campus needs of the Bucknell student-athletes, Geisinger has just opened a comprehensive, multi-disciplinary sports medicine facility at Geisinger Medical Center Outpatient Surgery Center—Woodbine Lane (off Route 11, Danville). This one-stop complex features an open MRI for on-site diagnostics, a therapy pool and facilities for athlete rehabilitation. 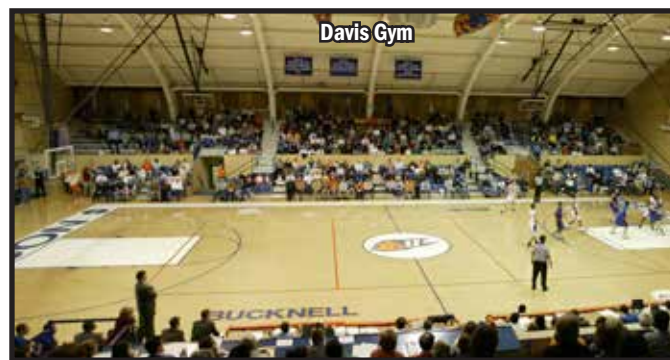

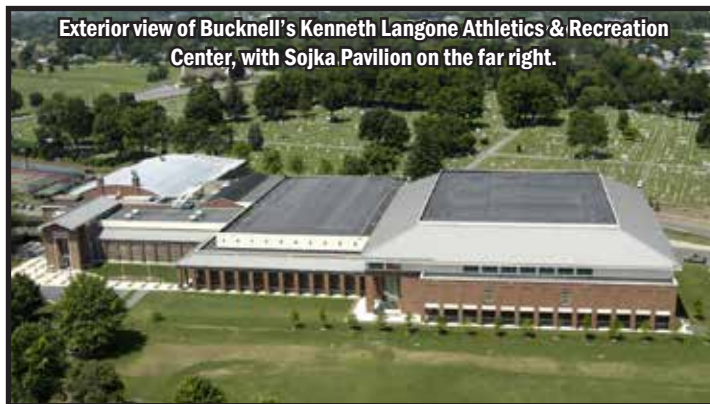

The Patriot League, which was founded on the principles of admitting athletes who are academically representative of their class, is in its third decade of academic and athletic achievement. Participation in athletics at Patriot League institutions is viewed as an important component of a well-rounded education.

The Patriot League began as a successful Division I-AA (now called Football Championship Sub-division) football conference in 1986. Full League members include American, Army, Boston University, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh, Loyola Maryland and Navy. Associate members include Fordham in football, Massachusetts Institute of Technology in women's rowing and Georgetown in both football and women's rowing.

These member institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation. Alumni from Patriot League colleges and universities have played a leadership role in the shaping of our country.

In the classroom, the Patriot League's full-

member institutions, individually and collectively, consistently rank among the top Division I programs in the NCAA Graduation Rates Report. Since 1998, the Patriot League has ranked first among all Division I conferences offering scholarships in student-athlete graduation rates according to the NCAA Graduation Rates report. The League finished at the top spot with 96 percent of its teams reporting a graduation rate of 85 percent or higher in the most recent data. In addition, 90 Patriot League teams earned NCAA Academic Performance Program Public Recognition Awards after posting academic progress rate scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports.

League members have also distinguished themselves on the field of play. The Patriot League sponsors championship competition in 24 sports (11 for men; 13 for women). Championship teams from 15 sports are guaranteed advancement into NCAA post-season competition: baseball, men and women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's golf, men and women's lacrosse, rowing, men and women's soccer, softball, men and women's tennis and volleyball.

Along the timeline of Patriot League history about three-quarters of the Patriot League's Scholar-Athletes of the Year also received All-Patriot League status for their exemplary athletic performance. In the Patriot League's history, more than 200 student-athletes have been recognized as CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, while more than 12,000 have qualified for the League's Academic Honor Roll. More than 30 student-athletes have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Additionally, Patriot League student-athletes have earned Fulbright Scholarships, Rhodes Scholarships, Marshall Scholarships and NACDA/Disney Scholarships.

The 2001-02 Bucknell women's basketball team was the first in program history to advance to the NCAA Tournament. After going 18-9 during the regular season, the second-seeded Bison swept through the Patriot League Tournament, which featured an 88-74 defeat of top-seeded Holy Cross on its home court in Worcester, Mass.

Bucknell, which finished with a program-record 21 wins, earned the 15th seed in the East Region and squared off against second-seeded Baylor in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Waco, Texas. Playing on Baylor's home court, the Ferrell Center, the Bison trailed just 23-17 with 11 minutes left in the first half, but ended up falling to the Bears 80-56. Molly Creamer led the way for Bucknell with 18 points, while Desire Almind added 14.

The 2007-08 squad followed in their predecessors' footsteps and became the program's second team to reach the NCAA Tournament. After finishing the regular season with a 13-15 record, the Bison made an improbable run through the Patriot League Tournament. The fifth-seeded Bison upset No. 4 Army and No. 1 American in the first two rounds. The final victory against second-seeded Holy Cross on its home court clinched an NCAA Tournament berth for Bucknell.

The Bison earned the 16th seed and the opportunity to face North Carolina. Unable to pull off its fourth consecutive postseason upset, Bucknell fell in the first round, 85-50. Lauren Schober led the Bison in scoring with 13 points, while Hope Foster grabbed a team-high eight rebounds.

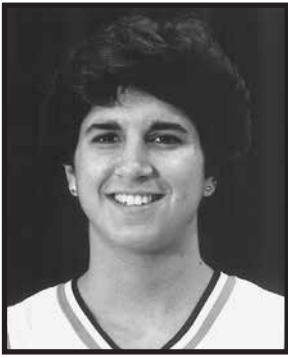

12 Jennifer Walz 5-8 / Guard Murray Hill, N.J. Governor Livingston

Jennifer Walz's jersey was retired prior to Bucknell's game against Drexel on Jan. 20, 1990...

During her four years at Bucknell, Jennifer Walz compiled one of the finest records of any student-athlete, on or off the court, in Bucknell athletics history, and her accomplishments in athletics took her to national prominence.

In January 1985, Walz was a senior at Governor Livingston High School in Berkeley Heights, N.J., about to lead her team to a state championship. She also had a major decision to make as several colleges expressed interest in her. Walz's decision to attend Bucknell centered around academics and her potential role on the team. She knew that Bucknell had the immediate need for someone of her talent, and a coach that would give her the playing time to develop her skills. By the time she graduated, Walz had set and reset a number of Bucknell and East Coast Conference records, and achieved numerous honors.

Walz proved herself early in her career. She immediately assumed a starting position her freshman year and remained there throughout her tenure as a Bison. She averaged 15.0 points per game and shot better than 72 percent from the free throw line as a rookie. Walz demonstrated her ability that year against Towson State when, in overtime with 18 seconds remaining and Bucknell trailing 86-84, she dribbled the ball down court and made an eight-foot jumper and drew a foul. She made the ensuing free throw as the Bison defeated Towson State, 87-86, for the first time in three years.

The pressure was on Walz following her impressive freshman campaign. She and her abilities were public knowledge, and Bucknell's women's basketball program was on the rise. In Walz's sophomore year (1986-87), the Bison rallied for their first-ever winning season, posting a 17-11 record. In the process, Walz set the first of her many records. She thrived on competition and always wanted the ball in tight situations as she averaged 20.8 points, 4.4 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.1 steals per

game that year.

Head coach Lori Howard had built a balanced scoring attack by Walz's junior year. Competitors realized Walz would still be a threat though, and kept the pressure on her. Walz was forced to create more open situations for herself, as she improved her passing and ball-handling skills.

By her senior year, offensive plays and scoring came naturally to Walz. She collected her points with a deadly outside shot or a drive to the hoop, where she was often fouled. At the close of the season, Walz was the ultimate all-around player and was rewarded for her efforts by being named ECC Player of the Year after averaging a career-high 22.1 points per game.

To cap her basketball career, on April 2, 1989, Walz appeared in a segment of "The NCAA Final Four Show" on ABC-TV. She and Alec Kessler, of the University of Georgia, were honored for academic excellence by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association.

In her four years at Bucknell, Walz set the tone for future athletes in general, but especially for female basketball players.

The Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame was established in 1979 to honor the very best in the history of Bucknell athletics. Six new members were inducted in the fall of this year as members of the Class of 2016. Former women's basketball player Vicki Quimby Nigrini is a member of that class and the program's newest honoree. Two hundred fifty-one outstanding student-athletes, coaches, administrators and friends of Bucknell are now honored, and their contributions to Bucknell Athletics are forever preserved in the Hall.

Barbara Castens-Seidell '79 joined her classmate, Karin Wegener Knisely '79, as the first women to be inducted into the Bucknell Hall of Fame in 1985. Both women set records in basketball, field hockey and lacrosse, and excelled academically as well.



Castens-Seidell was a basketball and field hockey co-captain as well as a member of the lacrosse team. In basketball she held records for season (18.7) and career (15.0) rebounding average. She is also ranked sixth on the all-time scoring list with a career-average of 12.8. She was drafted by the Houston Angels of the Women's Professional Basketball League.

Named Bucknell's Outstanding Multiple Sport Athlete in her class, Castens-Seidell graduated with honors as a geology major, going on to Johns Hopkins University to get her PhD.

Karin Wegener Knisely '79 was the first person in 40 years to be captain of three sports at Bucknell - field hockey, basketball and lacrosse. In field hockey she holds numerous school records, including goals in



a career (55) and goals in a season (21 in 1979). In her basketball career, she averaged 10.8 ppg and 7.2 rpg, with her latter figure placing her second in Bucknell history at the time of her graduation.

As well as being an outstanding student-athlete, Knisely was a Dean's List member six times as a biology major, and received the outstanding senior athlete award from the Bison Club. Upon graduation from Bucknell she earned a master of science degree from the University of New Hampshire, and was the recipient of a Fulbright Scholarship for research in freshwater biology at the University of Konstanz in Germany.

Jill Henry-Feeney '81, a member of the Hall of Fame



Class of 1993, became the third Bison in history to serve as a captain in three sports - basketball, field hockey and softball. A transfer from Union College, she became a three-year starter in all three sports, leading the basketball team in scoring in her junior and senior years. Her 9.6 career rebounding average still ranks second on Bucknell's all-time list. In 1979, she played sweeper on the field hockey team that placed seventh in the AIAW Division I national tournament, and batted .286 as a pitcher and catcher in softball. Henry was the school's first Academic All-American in women's basketball. She graduated magna cum laude and was elected to Phi Beta Kappa.

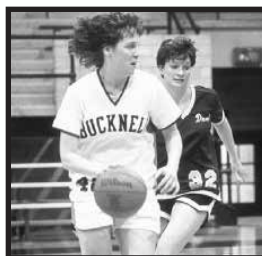
Stacey Spitko-Reeder '88 was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1995. Spitko was a starter in every basketball game of her career (111) and all but two softball games. She is the 11th-leading scorer of all-time at Bucknell with 1,220 points and the all-time assist leader with an East Coast Conference record of 661. Spitko led the ECC in assists for three straight years and earned Second Team Academic All-America honors. In softball, Spitko set 14 school records and received All-ECC recognition as an outfielder in 1988. She also won the ECC Scholar-Athlete and was named an Academic All-American in 1987 and 1988.



Ann Kirwin Anderson '87 is a member of the Hall's Class of 1998. Kirwin was a four-year basketball letterwinner and a co-captain of the team in her junior and senior years. She was the first woman to score 1,000 points in her basketball career at Bucknell.

The school record holder at graduation with 1,343 points, Kirwin also formerly held four other school records. She still ranks on Bucknell's all-time scoring list, and is in the top five in four other career statistical categories. In 1986 she was named to the American Women's Sports Federation All-America second team, the All-Northeast Region first team and the All-East Coast Conference second team.

Kirwin was also selected to the Academic All-America Second Team in both 1986 and 1987, was the ECC Scholar-Athlete in women's basketball in 1986, and was the co-winner of the Christy Mathewson Award as Bucknell's outstanding senior athlete in 1987.



Jennifer Walz Lapioli '89 is a member of the Hall's Class of 1999. Walz was a four-year basketball letterwinner and a co-captain of the team in her junior year. She was the first woman to score 2,000 points in her basketball career at Bucknell.

More significantly, Walz is the only Bucknell athlete to have been selected to the Academic All-America First Team three consecutive years. She brought national attention to Bucknell with her selection by the United States Basketball Writers Association as their Outstanding Scholar-Athlete in 1988-89.



Walz was a three-time All-East Coast Conference selection, and in 1988-89 was chosen as the conference's Player of the Year. Until Molly Creamer surpassed her in 2002-03, she continued to hold the school record in points scored in a career. During her senior year she set records with 619 points and a 22.1 points-per-game average that were both later surpassed by Creamer. In addition, Walz set the ECC career scoring record during her tenure at Bucknell.

Walz was the first Bison women's basketball player to have her jersey retired. It currently adorns the east wall of the concourse in Sojka Pavilion.

Lynne Walshaw '89 is a member of the Hall's Class of 2000. Walshaw was an All-ECC selection in both basketball and softball during her career at Bucknell.



In the gymnasium, she scored 1,209 points and grabbed 678 rebounds, and still holds the Bucknell single-season record for field goal percentage. A tenacious defensive player, Walshaw also holds the Bucknell all-time record for steals with 316.

Margaret Philleo Ricci '79 is a member of the Hall's Class of 2002. Philleo Ricci was one of Bucknell's top woman athletes of her era, competing in field hockey, basketball and lacrosse.



Philleo Ricci was a three-year member of the women's basketball team and received the Scholar Athlete Award in 1979.

In field hockey, she was selected to the Susquehanna All-Star Team three straight years. She played on the Mideast Regional tournament team all four years at Bucknell and was selected to the all-mideast second team.

As a member of the lacrosse squad, Philleo Ricci was named to the All-Central Pennsylvania second-team.

Lisa Fink Povsic '93 entered the Hall of Fame in the fall of 2003. Fink is one of Bucknell's top female athletes and arguably the top softball player in school history. Also a member of the basketball team, Fink was a rare first-ballot Hall of Famer.



A four-time All-Patriot League selection in softball, Fink batted .440 during her senior year and earned Patriot League Player of the Year and First Team Academic All-America honors.

An NCAA Woman of the Year nominee in 1993, Fink graduated with Bucknell career records for hits (185), RBI (90), home runs (12), triples (13), runs (146) and stolen bases (90), and she broke 10 other single-season records. She owned a .378 career batting average and never hit below .344 in her career.

As a senior, the South Williamsport, Pa., native helped the Bison to a 27-8 record, the best winning percentage in school history. The winner of the Margaret L. Bryan Award as Bucknell's top senior two-sport athlete in 1993, Fink was also an outstanding guard and one of the top defenders on the Bison women's basketball squad. She earned three varsity letters in basketball in addition to her four on the diamond.

Molly Creamer '03 was elected to the Hall of Fame in her first year of eligibility (2013), and she was a unanimous choice among the voting committee. Many consider Creamer to be the premier player in Bucknell and Patriot League women's basketball history. She was a three-time Patriot League Player of the Year and three-time PL scoring leader. Following her senior campaign in which she averaged a whopping 27.1 points per game, Creamer was picked as a Kodak/WBCA and Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American.



In four years Creamer scored 2,462 career points (21.0 ppg) to set Bucknell and Patriot League records, and she also ranked No. 2 in program history in assists with 593. She became only the second woman in NCAA history to lead her conference in both scoring and assists three straight years. Creamer also set school and league career records for field goals made (823) and attempted (1889), free throws made (621) and attempted (740) and free-throw percentage (.839). She owns the Bucknell record for made 3-pointers (195), and her 27.1 points per game as a senior also shattered school and league standards.

Creamer broke school and league records with an incredible 44-point game at Lafayette. She was the Most Valuable Player of the 2002 Patriot League Tournament, as she helped Bucknell win the title and advance to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history.

Following graduation Creamer became a first-round draft pick of the WNBA's New York Liberty.

Lori Houck Steigerwald '00 was a four-time All-Patriot League guard and one of the all-time leading scorers for the Bison women's basketball team. She graduated with 1,447 career points, a total that ranked second in program history at the time of her graduation and now ranks fifth. She also ranked second at the time and fifth currently in assists with 336. Houck was captain of the team as a senior in 1999-2000, when the Bison advanced to the Patriot League Championship game. That year she also earned the Patriot League Women's Basketball Scholar-Athlete Award and then the overall Patriot League Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year at the conclusion of the school year.



Desire Almind '04 was a three-time All-Patriot League forward with the Bison women's basketball team. She had a magnificent senior year, when she averaged 17.3 points per game and ranked second nationally in rebounding at 13.1 per contest. Almind broke Bucknell and Patriot League rebounding records with 390 that season, and she also produced a school-record 19 double-doubles.



Almind graduated with 1,581 points and 873 rebounds, both of which ranked third in Bucknell history at the time. She currently ranks third in points and fourth in rebounds. She also ranks fourth in career scoring average (14.5), fourth in blocked shots (108) and sixth in steals (213).

Almind was named Patriot League Rookie of the Year in 2000-01, and a year later she helped lead the Bison to their very first Patriot League championship and NCAA Tournament appearance. Almind scored 15 points in the league title game at Holy Cross.

Vicki Quimby Nigrini '02 is one of the finest post players in Bucknell women's basketball history. She was a four-time All-Patriot League selection, twice earning First Team honors. As a senior in 2002, Quimby captained Bucknell's first-ever NCAA Tournament Team.



Quimby led the Bison in rebounding three times and graduated as Bucknell's all-time leading rebounder (902, which today ranks second to Hope Foster). Quimby also graduated with 1,570 career points, which ranked No. 2 at the time and is fourth today, and she also ranks fourth in steals (231), fourth in free throws made (380) and attempted (585) and fifth in scoring average (13.5). Last year, she earned a spot on the Patriot League 25th Anniversary Team.

BUCKNELL RETIRED JERSEYS

The Bucknell women's basketball program has retired the jerseys of two standout players, Molly Creamer and Jennifer Walz. The only two Bison in the 36-year history of the program to tally 2,000 career points, Walz's No. 12 and Creamer's No. 23 hang from the wall of Sojka Pavilion. Rather than retire numbers, Bucknell retires the jerseys of all-time great players. For more on Walz and Creamer, turn to pages 95 and 96.

The Plan for Bucknell was unanimously approved by the Board of Trustees on April 29, 2006, having previously been approved by the students and faculty. We have begun implementing it and are determined to make it a reality over the next decade. BUCKNELL'S 17TH PRESIDENT

DR. JOHN C. BRAVMAN

John Bravman, a highly respected academic leader and distinguished professor of engineering, became the 17th president of Bucknell University on July 1, 2010. His longtime dedication to undergraduate liberal arts education at the highest level has set an innovative and dynamic tone for his presidency.

In his first five years at the University, John has steadily built a foundation of support with Bucknellians around the world. In October 2012, Bucknell launched the public phase of the largest comprehensive campaign in its history, with a goal of raising half a billion dollars for strategic University initiatives. As of November 2015, the WE DO Campaign for Bucknell University had raised \$365 million.

John's leadership has also helped foster an unprecedented period of expansion and improvement to University facilities. During John's first year in office, the University broke ground on infrastructure for Academic West, Bucknell's first new academic building in nearly a decade, which opened in August 2013. In August 2015, Bucknell opened a new residential quad, the South Campus Apartments, reaffirming the University's commitment to an immersive residential learning environment. And under John's leadership, the University will establish a third college — the College of Management — in July 2017, positioning Bucknell to offer a truly distinct, interdisciplinary undergraduate experience.

Off campus, John continues to strengthen ties between the University and the region. Since his arrival, Bucknell has renovated several properties in downtown Lewisburg, including the Campus Theatre, the Post Office Building and the DeWitt Building, which is home to the University's Entrepreneurs Incubator, Small Business Development Center and Downtown Art Gallery. The Greater Susquehanna Valley United Way named Bucknell



its 2014 Business of the Year.

In his earliest months at Bucknell, John initiated an in-depth examination of the quality of student life by creating the Campus Climate Task Force. This group of faculty and staff assessed student views and actions related to personal responsibility and recommended ways to improve the University experience for all students. In 2014, the President's Diversity Council created a five-year Diversity Plan to underscore Bucknell's commitment to diversity as a core institutional and educational value.

Prior to joining Bucknell, John spent 35 years at Stanford University, where he led the undergraduate program as the vice provost for undergraduate education. He played a critical role in Stanford's Campaign for Undergraduate Education, which raised more than \$1.1 billion. In recognition of his accomplishments, Stanford awarded him the university's highest honors for both teaching (1989) and lifetime service (2010).

Born in 1957, John grew up in New York City and on Long Island. He completed his bachelor's, master's and doctoral degree in materials science and engineering at Stanford. He has published more than 160 peer-reviewed articles and has been cited in nearly 4,000 publications by scientists and engineers around the world. A tenured professor of electrical engineering, John has taught primarily in the fields of materials structure and analysis, thin-film mechanical phenomena, microelectronic reliability and high-temperature superconductivity. He recently patented two coatings that may make coronary stents safer for heart-disease patients.

John is married to Professor Wendelin Wright, who holds a joint appointment in the mechanical and chemical engineering departments at Bucknell. They have two young sons, Cole and Cooper. He has two older sons, Christopher and Matthew.

JOHN P. HARDT

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS & RECREATION

At the helm of a proud and flourishing Bison athletics program is director of athletics and recreation John Hardt, who is now in his 17th year at Bucknell and his 31st year in athletics administration. Hardt administers a broad-based sports program with a proud and successful history.

Since his arrival, Hardt has orchestrated one of the nation's most assertive facilities overhauls, built and maintained relationships with major donors, restructured the athletics administration in order to help Bucknell stay ahead of the curve in the fast-paced world of Division I athletics and built upon Bucknell's long-standing tradition of scholar-athlete excellence.

Hardt is privileged to oversee a varsity athletics program that has long been at the head of the class in the Patriot League, both on the playing fields and in the classroom. From Presidents' Cups to Academic All-Americans to the nation's best graduation rate, Bison Athletics carries a proud heritage.

While building on Bucknell's athletic and academic excellence is paramount, Hardt has also incorporated progressive ideas in the area of external relations. Initiatives such as increased online video programming, a new graphics identity package, an informative and visually appealing athletics website and a revamped Bison Club all serve to bring Bison Athletics into the homes of its supporters.

During his productive tenure at Bucknell, Hardt has overseen continual growth in Bison Club donations, with receipts now annually topping \$2.5 million, and he has seen the program benefit from several major gifts. While the Kenneth G. Langone Athletics and Recreation Center is the crown jewel of a successful university fundraising campaign, other significant offerings include a \$7.6 million donation from William Graham — one of the largest in university history — which was directed toward women's athletics and the successful restoration of wrestling to varsity status. Graham Field, the AstroTurf venue at the West Fields, was also a result of that gift.

Other major facilities projects completed in the last five years include the Bachman Golf Center for the men's and women's varsity golf teams, a new Erg Room for the Bison rowing team, and new competition squash courts in Gerhard Fieldhouse. In 2016, the finishing touches were put on the Graham Building, a facility that houses the Bucknell Student Health Center along with state-of-the-art training and practice facilities for the Bison wrestling team.

Hardt has also initiated landmark deals in the area of apparel (adidas), marketing (Bucknell Sports Properties) and sports medicine (Geisinger Sports Medicine).

While much has been achieved in the last 16 years, Hardt's vision for Bison Athletics carries well into the future. Working with campus and department leadership, he has developed a long-range plan for Bucknell Athletics that meshes with the University's strategic plan. Hardt's plan focuses on future facilities upgrades, places



an emphasis on diversity and gender equity, and promises the continued commitment to a student-centered athletics and recreation program that adheres to the student-athlete ideal.

In the fall of 2011, Hardt announced the launching of the Bucknell Bison Leadership Academy, a program designed identify, develop, challenge and support student-athletes and coaches in their continual quest to become leaders in academics, in athletics and in life. The innovative program was rebranded in 2016 as the Bucknell Athletics Leadership Institute and placed under the direction of a full-time coordinator for the first time.

Hardt, who received the Gen. Robert R. Neyland Outstanding Athletic Director Award in March 2008 the All-American Football Foundation's 91st Banquet of Champions, also remains very active in athletics governance at the national level. In 2006-07 he served as chair of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Committee, he recently completed a four-year term on the Division I Baseball Committee, and in 2012 he earned a prestigious post on the NCAA Division I Leadership Council. He is also in his third year as a member of the Division I Men's Lacrosse Committee.

Hardt began his tenure at Bucknell on February 15, 2000, after serving four years as associate director of athletics at Michigan State University. While there, Hardt supervised the sports medicine staff, strength and conditioning, equipment operations, computing and tech services and NCAA/Big Ten rules compliance. In addition, he handled legal and contractual issues for the department.

Prior to his tenure at MSU, Hardt spent five years at Syracuse University as director of athletic compliance and four years with the NCAA's national office as a compliance representative.

A native Iowan, Hardt is a 1984 honors graduate of the University of Iowa, and he was a member of the Hawkeyes' 1982 Rose Bowl football team. He later earned his law degree from Iowa and is a doctoral candidate in Iowa's College of Education.

There are two courtside locations for electronic media in Sojka Pavilion, one of which is reserved for the Bison Sports Network. The remaining spot will be reserved for the "official" station of the visiting team, as designated by that institution's athletic communications office. If there are more than two electronic media organizations broadcasting the game, then at least one broadcast crew may have to work from an auxiliary position, space permitting.

Permission to broadcast games is granted through the

Bucknell Office of Athletic Communications, and arrangements for use of a phone line should be made at least one week prior to a game. Bucknell reserves the right to deny any access to organizations giving less than one week's notice of intent to broadcast.

Bucknell provides regular phone lines. ALL long distance calls must be made using a credit card, or placed to a toll-free number.

PHOTOGRAPHY POLICY

Photo credentials are issued only to accredited photographers on assignment. Per NCAA rules, photographers are not permitted behind the team bench areas.

Requests for players will be taken by a member of the Athletic Communications staff at the final media timeout of the second half. Following the press conferences, additional players may be made available for interview upon request. The Bucknell locker room is closed to all members of the media
