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4	MR. DAVIS: This meeting of the Lands Commission
5	will come to order.
6	Can I have a motion to confirm the
7	meetings of May 26?
8	MS. PARKER: I'll offer the motion.
9	MR. DAVIS: All right. Without objection the
10	meetings are adopted the minutes are adopted.
11	MR. HIGHT: Okay. Mr. Chairman, we have seven
12	items before you today, and they're all basically on
13	the consent calendar.
14	The one that is is most significant is
15	Item No. 3, which is MTC Stanton Ranch, which is the
16	reason for this special meeting because of windows that
17	they had to meet with Fish and Wildlife. And what it
18	is, they propose to do some rip-rap not rip-rap
19	bank restoration in lieu of rip-rap which will be tree
20	banks, tree dead trees trying to create a natural
21	environment in lieu of rock and and it's kind of an
22	experimental thing, and all of the wildlife life
23	agencies are behind this and looking very favorably to
24	see whether this works. And if it does, then, I think,
25	we can eliminate a lot of rock rip-rap in other parts

1 of the state.

2 And other than that, there is --3 basically, everything is --4 MR. DAVIS: And what was the time pressure 5 that --6 MR. HIGHT: They had to --7 MR. DAVIS: -- caused this meeting? 8 MR. HIGHT: They had to start the construction this week because of Fish and -- not Fish and Wildlife, 9 10 but --11 MS. PARKER: Fish and Game. 12 MR. HIGHT: -- Fish and Game window on some species, and I, quite frankly, don't know which it was. 13 14 And other than that, everything else is --15 is noncontroversial. We can go through them item by 16 item, or we can just take them as a whole. 17 MR. DAVIS: Do any of the members have any 18 questions on the consent calendar? 19 MS. PARKER: I don't. I was telling Bob earlier 20 that I think we discussed this Stanton Ranch issue in 21 the Wildlife Conservation Board, and I think the idea 22 of them trying to do something with starting repairing 23 those two rather than the approach in the past -- it 24 makes a lot of sense, so I have no problem. 25 MR. DAVIS: Is there a motion to approve the

1 consent calendar? 2 MS. PARKER: Make a motion to approve the consent 3 calendar. 4 MR. DAVIS: All right. Any objection from the 5 public? 6 (No audible response.) 7 MR. DAVIS: Hearing none, motion is approved. 8 Passes unanimously. 9 MR. HIGHT: And that's all the items --10 MR. DAVIS: The executive officer's report? 11 MR. HIGHT: I have none. 12 MR. DAVIS: You have none. Okay. 13 How was our -- our conference --14 So if there's no further business, then we 15 will adjourn this meeting of the Lands Commission. 16 MR. HIGHT: Okay.
