Illinois' state government began fiscal year 2016 without a comprehensive state budget. As the stalemate in the State Capitol over the budget continues, here are some key facts:

- TRS Benefit Payments The System's top priority is to ensure all benefits continue to be paid. Since all benefits are funded by the TRS trust fund not state government the System does not need legislative approval to pay any benefits. On July 7 a Cook County Circuit Court ordered Comptroller Leslie Geissler Munger to pay all pensions, even if no state budget is in place. TRS will inform you if this situation changes.
- TRS Member Services and Staff TRS does not expect any interruption in services to members. Under the July 7 court order, TRS operations and staff salaries will be paid. TRS will inform you if this situation changes.
- The FY 2016 Education Budget The state's \$7 billion K-12 education budget for FY 2016, approved in June, authorizes the state's annual contribution to TRS of \$3.7 billion, as well as the annual contribution to the Teachers' Retirement Insurance Program, which is \$108.3 million.
