WHEN MAY APPLICATIONS BE FILED

The testing office accepts applications continuously and will notify and test applicants as needed. Do not submit your application to the State Personnel Board.

THE POSITION - General Description

The Associate Railroad Track Inspector under administrative direction conducts complex investigative and surveillance activities with respect to enforcement of the Federal Railroad Administration's Track Safety Standards. Incumbents make comprehensive track structure inspections and investigates adequacy of track maintenance methods and general railroad safety; makes recommendations of proper corrective action to be taken in order to bring railroad tracks into compliance with the Federal Track Safety Standards; audits Common Carrier railroad track maintenance records to determine adequacy of the track for the prescribed speeds in accordance with the Federal Track Safety Standards; interprets and confirms results of surveys carried out by track geometry cars and conducts investigations of railroad accidents; assists in the preparation of reports and exhibits, and does other job-related work as required.

Although the California Public Utilities Commission does not specifically test for physical ability in this exam, candidates must be aware that the position requires the ability to walk long distances, to withstand extreme temperatures for extended periods of time, and to climb onto or otherwise access potentially dangerous equipment during inspections.

JOB LOCATION

This Exam covers positions located in Los Angeles, Sacramento and San Francisco, CA.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION - MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

NOTE: All applicants must meet the education and/or experience requirements for this examination by the cut off date established by the testing office.

Qualifying experience may be combined on a proportionate basis if the requirements stated below include more than one pattern and are distinguished as "Either" I, "or" III, "or" III, etc. For example, candidates who possess qualifying experience amounting to 50% of the required time in Pattern I, and additional experience amounting to 50% of the required time in Pattern II, may be admitted to an examination as meeting 100% of the overall experience requirement.

Certification: Completion of a training program prescribed by the Federal Railroad Administration in railroad track inspection; and

Either I

One year of experience in the California state service performing the duties of an Assistant Railroad Track Inspector, Public Utilities Commission.

Or II

Three years of experience as a State or Federal Railroad Inspector engaged primarily in the inspection of track.

<u>Or III</u>

Six years of progressively responsible experience in railroad track construction and maintenance at a level of responsibility equivalent to an assistant roadmaster, roadmaster, assistant division engineer, or track supervisor.

(A Bachelor's Degree in Engineering or a related technical specialization may be substituted for three of the six years of the required experience under Pattern III above.)

EXAMINATION INFORMATION

This examination will consist of a written exercise weighted 100%. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70% must be attained in the examination process. Candidates who do not appear for their scheduled examination will be withdrawn from the examination process.

The PUC reserves the right to modify the selection process as necessary to conform to administrative or business necessity.

WRITTEN EXERCISE - WEIGHTED 100%

The written exercise may include the following:

Knowledge of:

- 1. Proper corrective action to be taken in order to bring track into compliance with the Federal Track Safety Standards.
- 2. Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) regulations.

Ability to:

- 1. Pay close attention to detail and analyze situations accurately based on what you observe (e.g., during a site inspection)
- 2. Maintain the confidence and cooperation of those contacted during the course of work.
- 3. Develop and maintain positive relationships with subordinates, peers, supervisors, and other CPUC personnel.
- 4. Conduct interviews in a way that yields valid and detailed information.
- 5. Write clear, complete and concise reports of all assignments and investigations performed.
- 6. Determine the best approach to solve safety problems and to gain compliance with State and Federal safety standards.
- 7. Prepare written documents (i.e., correspondence, reports, FRA forms State forms, PUC forms, etc.).
- 8. Operate computer programs such as Word, Excel, Power Point, etc.
- 9. Utilize a variety of methods during an accident investigation to gather data, including surveillance, interviews, photo documentation, inspection and records review.
- 10. Conduct root cause analysis of accidents to determine the source(s) of problems.
- 11. Contribute as the member of a group or team effort and keep others informed of project progress and changes (e.g., co-authoring a workshop report, drafting a memo, etc.).
- 12. Discuss issues with others to work toward a fair agreement (e.g., working with a co-worker to determine root cause of accident, course of corrective action, etc.).
- 13. Determine the best method of obtaining compliance with Federal track standards on all railroad lines in an assigned territory.
- 14. Prioritize tasks and manage work time effectively and efficiently.
- 15. Analyze data and perform research work to locate and identify problems.
- 16. Study, assimilate, and apply a series of steps, rules or guidelines in completing tasks.
- 17. Express technical information in written form (e.g., translate technical or other complex material into a common everyday language.)
- 18. Clearly narrate in written form the specifics of a violation and/or accident investigation.
- 19. Reason logically and creatively, while utilizing a variety of analytical approaches to resolve regulatory problems.
- 20. Propose solutions by developing and evaluating possible actions and alternatives to address problems.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

A candidate may only test once in a 12 month period. A list of eligible candidates will be established for the California Public Utilities Commission. Names of successful candidates will be merged onto the dated list in order of final scores, regardless of date. Eligibility expires 12 months after it is established; candidates may then retest to reestablish eligibility.

Veterans' Preference: Will be awarded in this examination, pursuant to Government Code Section 18973.1, effective January 1, 2014, as follows:

- 1. Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for veterans' preference.
- 2. An entrance examination is defined, under the law, as any open competitive examination.
- 3. Veterans' Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Applications are available at the State Personnel Board office, local offices of the Employment Development Department, and in Human Resources of the California Public Utilities Commission.

If meeting the requirements stated above, you may take this competitive examination. Possession of the entrance requirements does not ensure a place on the eligible list. All candidates passing the examination will be ranked according to scores.

The California Public Utilities Commission reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs and service of the Commission. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service law and rules and all competitors will be notified.

Examination Locations: Examinations are typically scheduled in San Francisco. However, there are instances when examinations are given in such places in California as the number of candidates and conditions warrant.

General Qualifications: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and ability to work cooperatively with others; and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required.

Interview Scope: If an interview is conducted, in addition to the scope described on this bulletin, the panel may consider education, experience, personal development, personal traits, and fitness. In appraising experience, more weight will be given to the breadth of pertinent experience and evidence of the candidate's ability to accept and fulfill increasing responsibilities than to the length of the candidate's experience. Evaluation of a candidate's personal development will include consideration of own training needs; plans for self-development; and the progress the candidate has made towards self-development.
