Frequently Asked Questions

What Can SNAPET Offer Me?

At no cost to you, the program can provide opportunities that, depending on locality, can help with:

- Job Search
- Job Readiness
- Vocational Training
- Education
- Work Experience
- Transportation and other work related costs
- Referrals to other community services

How Do I Enroll?

First, you meet with a staff person to talk about what your goals are and determine what you need to help you reach these goals. A Plan of Participation is completed to provide structure and guide you towards your goals. The SNAPET worker and you work together in designing a program that will help you get to the ultimate goal, employment.

Can I Lose My SNAP Benefits?

SNAPET is a voluntary program; therefore, you do not have to participate. Not participating in SNAPET will not reduce the amount of SNAP benefits or the amount of time you are entitled to these benefits. However, participating in SNAPET might increase the number of benefit months. Although not complying with SNAPET requirements does not directly cause your SNAP benefits to be terminated, your SNAPET case can be closed and the ability to receive help with transportation and other supportive services will end.
