I would again thank Ian for all his help and advice in managing the Individuals with me. Was the picture above my first mistake? Of course not, offering to run the Individuals was that.





He also has a first class degree from Nottingham University, in Management Studies. He was recruited as a National team coach with the Olympic Performance programme and was selected for the UK Sport 'Elite Coach Programme' in 2007.

Alex is currently Head Coach of the Grantham College Table Tennis Academy and Curriculum Manager for Academies and Recreational Sport. As an ETTA Level 3 coach Alex has been working with the national team for three years and is head coach at the East Midlands high performance centre which is based at the college.

This season he returned to playing on the British circuit after a break of almost 20 years.

With him tonight is his wife Nicola (nee Deaton).

Nicola is former 5 times English women's senior champion and England ladies number one for 5 consecutive years. However, Nicola wasn't just successful as a senior player she was also



Long Wait Over for England

Paul Drinkhall Crowned Champion in Spain

Impressive at the London 2012 Olympic Games, where he reached the fourth round of the Men's Singles event, England's Paul Drinkhall struck gold in Almeria on the evening of Sunday 6th April.

Occupying the no.22 seeded position in the draw, emerged the somewhat surprise winner of the Men's Singles event at the GAC Group 2014 ITTF World Tour Spanish Open.

At the final hurdle he overcame Japan's Masataka Morizono, the no.5 seed in six games (11-7, 11-9, 6-11, 11-5, 6-11, 11-8) to claim the title.

Motivation Increases

"Motivation increases when you open the window in the morning and see the sun shining", said Paul Drinkhall who was delighted with the high level of organisation in Almeria.

"I will play more international tournaments", he added. "I want to raise my level so in 2016 I can relive the wonderful experience of the London Olympic Games."

Second Englishman

Success means Paul Drinkhall becomes only the second Englishman to win an ITTF World Tour Men's Singles title; the other is Carl Prean, he won in the Brazilian city of Rio de Janeiro in 1996, the very first year of the programme.



BDTTA LEAGUE REVIEW

The past season, the eighth in which I have officiated, can best be described as like the "Curate's Egg", good in parts. The number of clubs went down from 12 to 11 this season as Bransgore was subsumed within the Merton club while the number of teams initially reduced from 63 to 60, the Premier reducing from 10 to 6 teams. Bmth Sports D withdrew from Div 1 before the season got underway and the players were reregistered in some of the club's other teams. Bmth Sports K withdrew from Div 3 halfway through the season following insurmountable difficulties, bringing the final number of teams down to 58. The Bmth Sports K results were expunded from the league tables and player averages from Week 13, and the players were re-housed in other Bmth Sports teams. The twoway league system continued for the third season running for all but the Premier where the teams had to play each other four times and also twice in a row (see below).

Premier/League Format

The general consensus from those involved is that six teams are far too few for the Premier, that playing each other four times is far too many, and playing the same team twice in a row wasn't very popular (especially when you had just been walloped by Bmth Sports A!). The Executive Committee were faced with a dilemma when constructing the league as three Premier teams withdrew from the league to join a "super league". When preparing the fixtures, which included the six-team Premier league, the constraints of teams' shared venues and home nights resulted in a fixture list which was recognised as far from ideal, but was unfortunately the only one that met all the clubs' requests. Gordon wrote to all Club Secretaries back in February this year to seek their yiews with regard to the formation of the league for the next playing season 2014/15, including the Premier of course, and the very welcome and constructive feedback will be considered by the committee. It's not too late to express your views if you have not done so already!

League Programme

Notwithstanding the impact of the withdrawn teams, the league programme ran fairly smoothly with mercifully no disruption due to bad weather this winter. The Easter Bank Holidays providentially occurred after the league ended this season, so no problems there. There were 7 unplayed fixtures compared to 5 last season, and the number of teams fielding only 2 players went down from 35 incidents last season to 21 this season. This reflects a marvellous effort on the part of the team captains to try to put out a full side every week, and I thank each and every one of them for their fantastic support once again this season. However, seeing some of the reasons for 2-player teams this season, there is still room for improvement, so let's all try to get it down to the "teens" next season!

LEAGUE TABLES

Once again, many of the promotional and relegation issues were sorted well before the end of the season, but there were still some that went right down to the wire in the final week. The Divs 1, 3 & 5 titles had to wait, mathematically at least, for the final week as did relegation spots in Divs 1, 2 & 3. Div 4 saw New Milton H & J slug it out in the final week to see who came bottom. Here follow the divisional league tables along with a brief report on some of the highs and lows.

Premier

Congratulations to Bmth Sports A (Nathan Bingham, Zac Dowling, Steve Foster, Finn Morgan-Bayliss, Hugo Pang & Jamie Trevillion) who once again occupied the top slot throughout the entire season and won the league by a country mile. They even went one better than last season by winning all of their matches, the only team in the entire league to do so. Congratulations to Steve who didn't drop a match all season and to Jamie and Nathan who dropped just the one.

The gap between winner and runner up was much more

pronounced this season reflecting the four-way structure in which the B team of Brian Burn, Tony Clayton, Sanja Clements, Brian Garraway & Barry Hill (last season's E team) lost their four mutual encounters whereas they only met twice last season. Down at the other end, Winton YMCA A came second from bottom having been promoted from Div 1 last season as runners-up. Bmth Sports C came bottom by some distance but their cause wasn't helped by having to concede two of their matches and being penalised 8 points.

Div 1

The Winton YMCA club fared much better in the second tier as their C and B teams came top and runners-up respectively, SO well done to them. The В team (Darren Bellis. Richard Davies, Sean McLean & Tom Stride) made



most of the running until Week 17 when the C team (Max De Kment, Steve Davies, Adam Elcock, Linda Hales & Alan Henwood) swapped places at the top and remained there for the duration. Going into the final week it was still mathematically possible for the Bees to dislodge Max & Co from the top as there were only three points between them. However, the C's put paid to any such notion by hammering Bmth Sports E 9-1. The Winton B team only just managed to avoid promotion to the highest echelon last season having come third, so they must now just bow to the inevitable.

Bmth Sports withdrew their D team from Div 1 before the league programme had got underway and the players were re-housed amongst their other teams in the league.

Merton B and C were third from bottom and second from bottom respectively going into the final week and they both needed at least a draw to ensure survival as they had a game in hand over Lynwood B. The C's did the minimum required by drawing with Broadstone A, and the Bees got three points from their 6-4 win over Winton YMCA B, to send Lynwood B through the trapdoor along with their A team who came bottom.

Div 2

It was a case of so near so far for New Milton E (Andrew, Peter & Simon Daish, Frank Handy, Bobo Jiang & Gerard Redman) as they occupied top spot for most of the season, but they actually ended up fourth just below their in-form C team (Dave Cuddon, Malcolm Floyd, Svet Ignatov and Matt Winter). Bmth Sports F (Colin Bryson, Dave Law, Simon Marriner, Greg McLaughlin & Ken Parradine) took over the top spot in Week 19 and there they stayed, with Merton E (Mick Anderson, Jon Ferguson, Alan Russell & John Russell) just three points behind them at the end.

Going into the final week, Lynwood C were already doomed, not helped by the fact that they had conceded two of their matches and were penalised by 8 points. It was then a matter of which one of Bmth Sports G (27 points), Merton D (25 points) and Merton F (24 points) joined them on the plank. The potentially internecine derby between Merton D and F resulted in the D's reversing their first round 4-6 defeat to wave goodbye to Blakey &Co.

What a rising young star Ringwood A have in 15 year old Jacob Elliott who only dropped one of his 30 games this season. This sole defeat came at the hands of Greg McLaughlin (Bmth Sports F) in Week 7, but Jacob couldn't get his revenge because he didn't play in the return match. Watch out next season Greg if you both end up in the same division! New Cuddon Milton's Dave



somehow avoided Jacob in the league but meet they did in the final of the Div 2 Individuals when Jacob confidently took the title.

Div 3

Bmth Sports withdrew their K team who had played up until Week 11, and their results were expunged from the league results (Week 13) which had a minimal impact on the placings. The K team players were reallocated to other teams in the club.

The Div 3 title wasn't mathematically settled until the final week but topmost Bmth Sports J (Matt Broadhead, Bill Broome, Tom Hickman, J-D Marshall & Jon Tennant) had to bide their time as they had a bye. Ringwood B (Rod Bryden, Mike Davies, Jamie Hall,

Dave Nicholls & Julian Preston) needed to beat Bmth Sports L by at least 8-2 to take the title, but Bourne looked after their own and took а point off the pretenders who had to settle for second place. 14 year old Jamie Hall is another of Ringwood's rising young stars and, like Jacob Elliott in the division above, he only lost one of his matches.

Breamore were also within a shout of a promotion slot and beat bottom-dwellers Bmth Sports H 6-4 in the final week, but Ringwood B did la meme-chose to Bmth Sports L to secure second place. Despite just missing out on promotion, the "Batniks" deserve a special mention in despatches as this was their first season in Div 3 having won the Div 4 title last season. They joined the league in the 2009/2010 season and came Div 5 runners-up in their first ever season. They reached the fourth spot in Div 4 for the next two seasons and sewed up the title last year.

At the other end of the division, the bottom three placings were not decided until the final week. Bmth Sports H were definitely doomed any which way but the New Milton G and F teams had to slug it out for survival in their local derby. The resulting draw was good enough for the Gees who nudged their Milton club mates through the trap door along with Bmth Sports H who came bottom.

Div 3 was the eventual home of the league's most "travelled" player, Bill Broome from Bmth Sports. Bill was originally registered in the D team in Div 1, but following their withdrawal from the league Bill was re-registered for the N team (Div 4) but never actually played there. He played up in Div 3 for the K team but those results were scratched following their withdrawal from the league halfway through the season. Finally Bill moved to the J team for whom his twenty three wins out of twenty three games helped secure the title.

Div 4

Bmth Sports M (Ross Campbell, Andre Coppard, Gavin Coppard & Jake Simpson) took over the top spot in Week 9 and reigned supreme from then on. Nimrods A (Chris Austin, Nick Dobbs, Dave Eaton & Barry Ross) and B (Keith Brindle, Ken Burrage, Dave Grant & Phil Vials) gave the Bourne a good run for their money but Nimrod A came runners-up.

Going into the final week, the New Milton H and J teams were already doomed, so their local derby match simply determined who would end up bottom and second from bottom of the pile. The Jays lost so they remained bottom, which was particularly disappointing for them as this was essentially the same team who were promoted from Div 5 only last season.

It was neck and neck at the top between Bmth Sports R (Tom Collins, Moon Lau, Josh Moore, Jim Simmonds & Robin Thomas)



and Nimrod C (Ron Bright, Chris Courage, Mike Melaniphy & Jim Vials) but Bmth reclaimed top spot in Week 19 and kept their hands firmly on the title. In theory at least, Nimrod could have snuck the title at the death, but Bourne disabused them of such a notion by taking maximum points from their final match against Shamrock C.

At the opposite end, full credit to Winton YMCA G (Ali Feltham, Sam Frankish, Keith Lamb & Pam New) and New Milton L (Sibyl Bartlett, Richard Brockbank, Richard Clampin,

Billy Collinge, Andrew & Dominic Stainton and Sue Wootton-Freeman) who just kept plugging away, week in week out despite winning only one match each, and getting hammered some weeks. I hope that they can be take inspiration from teams such as Bmth Sports M (Coppards & Co) who struggled similarly a few years back, but now look at them, top of Div 4!

UNREGISTERED PLAYERS

On a number of occasions, teams have fielded players who weren't registered with the league, and in one case not even affiliated to the ETTA. It is appreciated that this is done with good intent in order to "make up the numbers" and of course the games were disallowed. In the past the committee balanced up that the team not in default would at least get a game versus the possibility of the extra game impacting unfairly on the result. The committee decided that the fairest thing would be not to field the ineligible player, which is covered in the BDTTA rules 14.1 and 21.

ETTA Membership

Just a gentle reminder that the ETTA Membership Year runs from 1st August to 31st July each year. This caught a few people out last season as they thought that they had up to 15th November to renew as in previous years. To be eligible to play in the 2014/2015 season you must have renewed your ETTA membership prior to playing, and the committee would be grateful if this could be done as soon as possible. Also, just to correct another misunderstanding, players must be affiliated to the ETTA before they can even be <u>registered</u> with a local league, let alone play for a local league.

PRESS REPORTING

In the early part of the season I noticed that although I continued to submit the Results & League Tables to the Bournemouth Echo, they weren't being published. Having established that there was a change of Sports Editor, I sweet-talked the new incumbent and the reports are appearing much more regularly, including Times & Directory results.

I also submit press reports which appear regularly in the New Milton Advertiser and Lymington Times which although covering the New Milton Club also promotes the Bournemouth & District League. INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Doug Crossley Memorial Finals Night was held for the first time at the Grange School Sports Hall, Christchurch. The evening of table tennis was very well supported, enjoyable with a good atmosphere, with Hannah McErlane (Bmth Sports) winning two titles and being runner-up in one, Max De Kment (Winton) and Kai Masters (Bmth Sports) both winning one title each and being runner-up in two and Matthew Stanfield (Bmth Sports) unfortunately being runner-up in all his three finals – a star of the future.



There were one or two surprise results with Becky Kuzu (Bmth Sports) beating Hannah McErlane in the Ladies Singles in a close fought match 3-2. After Becky took a 2-0 lead, Hannah pulled the match back to 2-2. However, regained Becky the initiative with some excellent blocking to Hannah's topspin drives and won the fifth set 11-5. After four consecutive years of winning the Veteran 70+ title since its inception,

Danny Allen (Merton) lost to Tony Nixon (Ringwood) 1-3.

There were some outstanding matches – Division 5 final between Adam Garraway (Bmth Sports) and Matthew Stanfield with Matthew taking a 2-0 lead only for Adam to even the match at 2-2 winning the fourth set 12-10. The fifth set was very close with both players attacking whenever possible, however, Adam won the set 11-8 and the match 3-2. We have already mentioned the Ladies Singles. The Division 1 final between Richard Davies (Winton) and Max De Kment with Richard taking the first set 11-7, Max winning the next two sets 11-6 and 11-9, and with both players playing their attacking topspin shots



Richard finally overcoming a determined Max 11-6 11-5 and therefore winning the match 3-2.

The Premier final between Stephen Foster (Bmth Sports) and Nathan Bingham (Bmth Sports) was of exceptionally high standard from two top players playing an attacking and counter attacking match. Stephen took a 2-0 lead with Nathan pulling it back to 2-2 winning the fourth set 14-12 with Stephen having a number of match points. The fifth set was very close and could have gone either way with both players endeavouring to get their topspin attack in quickly. However, Stephen eventually won the set 11-9 and the match 3-2 (getting his revenge over Nathan who beat him in the Group matches) – a really enjoyable match to watch.



Another highlight of the night was the Division 3 match between John Tennant (Bmth Sports) and Nick Dibben (Breamore). Both players with over an 86% league average were evenly matched (although Nick had beaten John twice in the league). John took a 2-0 lead with a number of attacking backhand drives (although in the second set Nick was 8-4 and 10-8 up before losing it 16-14). 

In 1955 he was picked to play for Poole Town FC and he also started playing cricket. At 18 he was called up to serve his National Service in the Royal Air Force, he was stationed at St Athens in South Wales. There wasn't much square bashing though; he spent his time playing football for the RAF team!

When the two years of National Service were finished he returned to work at Christopher Hill Ltd and this is where he met Mary and later they were married and started a family. In the meantime he changed his job and began working for the concrete manufacturers, W.S Try Ltd. 

Local sports enthusiast and RAF war veteran Douglas Crossley died suddenly at home on Saturday, September 21, aged 89.

Born in Winn Road, Southampton, on May 9, 1924, Mr Crossley's life-long interest in sport was encouraged by his father, who took him to watch cricket and football matches – including occasional trips to Lords and Arsenal FC in the 1930s.

Doug became an ardent supporter of Hampshire Cricket Club and Southampton FC, still attending matches until last year.

After a short time at boarding school, he attended the Collegiate School in Westbourne, and in 1943 he joined the RAF, where he served as a compass adjuster in the Far East and India. He keenly attended many 684 Squadron reunions in the special years that followed. When he was demobbed Mr Crossley worked at Bournemouth & Boscombe Athletic FC as club secretary, but most of his 30-year working life was spent as an office manager for Drakes shop fitters in Pokesdown.

He lived in Arnewood Road in Southbourne, and was a founder member and long-term chairman of Lynwood Tennis and Table Tennis Club in the 1950s, where he met his wife Sylvia.
