

Suggested Management

Clear Lake is noted for the quality of its togue fishery. The lake contains a large volume of cold, well-oxygenated water throughout the summer. Water below the 50-foot level is low in oxygen in late summer. Water quality conditions for coldwater fishes are considered good.

Extensive rocky shoals provide excellent spawning areas for togue. A sizable whitefish population is the principal food of the togue in Clear Lake.
