## BURY GRAMMAR SCHOOL.

## (Represented on Head Masters' Conference.)

Boys of not less than 9 years of age are admitted after an Examination by the Head Master at the beginning of each Term. A Form of Application may be had at the School. A certificate is required, signed by the parent, showing that the boy has not been exposed to any risk of infection during the three weeks immediately preceding entrance to the School. The Fees are $£ 77 \mathrm{~s}$. per term; under II years of age E5 5s od.

These fees include School Games, Chemical and Physical Apparatus, Materials for Art Work and the Workshop, and all Stationery and Note Books : but not Printed Books or the School Cap.

All fees must be paid in advance.
Under the terms of the :" Barlow " bequest a reduction is made in the fees of boys whose parents reside in the County Borough of Bury.

A term's notice must be given in writing to the Head Master, or a term's fee must be paid in lieu of notice.

The Hours of Attendance are from 8-50 a.m. to 12-10 p.m., and from 2 p.m. to $4^{-15}$ p.m., on every day except Wednesday and Saturday, when there is no afternoon school: boys however are required to take part in organised games on Wednesday : only medical reasons can be accepted as an excuse.

Two Officers and nineteen Cadets attended their annual O.T.C. Camp, this year at Strensall, York. An advance party of one officer and three cadets went on the day previous to the arrival af the main contingents. The main party arrived at Strensall with baggage at about 3 p.m. on August 29th. The weather seemed none too certain as the Bury contingent, together with half a dozen larger ones, marched the mile and a half from Strensall Station to the camp.

Infectious diseases had brought the numbers at camp down to barely two-thirds and the Brigade consisted of three Battalions instead of four.

The first three days were spent in becoming acclimatised and in and in platoon engagements. On Saturday afternoon a visit to York was arranged and a fair number of the contingent spent the time on the river or viewing the walls and other objects of historic interest. On Monday morning there was a fire power demonstration-always a popular entertainment at camp. One of the new Bren Guns was on view. There was a R.A. Battery in action also, and a Tank demonstration.

On the Tuesday, there was a R.A.F. demonstration in which the planes swooped down on us to within a few yards of our heads while our job was to fire back and repel them. The whole was an exercise to accustom us to attack by air.

There was boxing and a sing-song every night and a band playing earlier in the evening and, while in some respects the weather was not all that it should have been, everyboby enjoyed the eight days under canvas, and came away feeling that a great deal had been learned

It might be as well to repeat here the rule that attendance at camp is a necessary condition for any promotion of a boy in the Corps.

As there were not duties enough for two officers with one contingent, 2nd Lieut. J. L. Bagshawe attended a promotion course which he duly passed.

## THE SCHOOL CAMP-COLWYN BAY.

Two Camps were held during the year. One week at Whitsuntide and nearly three weeks in August.

The Whitsun camp was one of the coldest and wettest we have ever experienced, but when the sun shone on the last two days, we were prepared to forget all about the discomfort of the beginning.

## THE DUKE OF YORK'S CAMP, 1936.

The Rev. R. Hyde rehearsed and introduced the turns and consequently became one of the best known figures in camp by the end of the week. This was the daily routine of camp for the remainder of the week.

On Tuesday afternoon our royal host, the Duke of York, visited us and stayed overnight until Wednesday afternoon. His Royal Highness followed the general routine of the camp, bathing with us and taking great interest in the games, and on leaving camp he said how thoroughly he had enjoyed his brief stay.

Friday night, being the last night in camp, was a special one, After an extra long entertainment which lasted until about II-30 p,m., the camp marched out to Southwold Common, where a huge camp-fire was lit, and the whole camp joined hands and sang "Auld Lang Syne." Then the night was ended by a strenuous pillow fight, after which many had to spend the night without pillows.

Early on Saturday morning we all departed for London, where we finally dispersed, leaving, I am sure, happy memories to 400 boys and their leaders, of their week's stay at this magnificent camp
