High School Students Learn to Plan for Financial Future

The Office of State Treasurer Denise L. Nappier, the State Department of Education and the University of Hartford held the first Connecticut Youth Financial Education Conference on Thursday, May 19, 2005 which was made possible by generous support from Bank of America. The half-day Conference which was organized by Junior Achievement of Southwestern New England brought together approximately 250 high school juniors and seniors from around the state to learn about money management, budgeting, responsible use of credit and savings and investment strategies.

"Young adults should possess one of the most fundamental skills to economic survival - a basic understanding of personal financial management," Nappier said. "The urgency for personal finance instruction has never been greater."

The conference built on the 2003 Summit on Youth Financial Education, held by the Treasurer's Office, Fleet Bank and Jump\$tart Coalition for Personal Financial Literacy. The 2003 Summit brought together personal finance teachers and administrators, finance professionals, business leaders, policy makers, state agencies and community-based organizations in an effort to asses the status of personal financial education for Connecticut youth.

Bankruptcy filings for individuals 18-25 years of age have been at an all time high, representing a ten-fold increase in the last five years, and a recent study by the Jump\$tart Coalition revealed a failing score, indicating that the majority of America's young adults are ill prepared to make critical financial decisions affecting their lives.

"Junior Achievement is committed to helping our young people learn to manage their money responsibly," said Lou Golden, president of Junior Achievement of Southwest New England. "It is gratifying that so many students and schools are participating in this conference."

The Treasurer's Office, Bank of America and Junior Achievement of Southwestern CT have been working in partnership with public, private and community based organizations to develop and provide financial education programs for Connecticut residents.
