SUNS 98 SPURS 119 Regular Season Game 32 AT&T Center	SAN ANTONIO – The Suns (9-23) were on fire in the first half and led by six at the break, but the San Antonio Spurs (26-6) dominated the second half to pull away for a 119-98 win at AT&T Center. In the first half, the Suns shot 67.6 percent (25-of-37) from the field and 83.3 percent (5-of-6) from behind the arc, led by 12 points on 4-of-5 shooting from T.J. Warren . The Spurs were impressive from the field themselves in the first half, making 53.5 percent of their attempts to trail just 64-58 at intermission. The Suns struggled shooting in the third quarter, making just 6-of-21 attempts, as the Spurs outscored them 31-18 in the period to take a seven-point lead heading into the fourth. The fourth quarter mirrored the third as the Suns shot 5-of-16 from the field and were outscored 30-16 with the Spurs pulling away for a 21-point victory. San Antonio finished at 54.0 percent shooting for the game, outpacing the Suns’ 48.6 percent mark. LaMarcus Aldridge led the Spurs with 27 points as Kawhi Leonard did not play. Warren led the Suns with 23 points, including 10-of-10 from the free throw line. Brandon Knight added 14 points.

SUNS 115 ROCKETS 131 Regular Season Game 31 Toyota Center	HOUSTON – The Suns (9-22) never held a lead and the Houston Rockets (23-9) led by as many as 34 points before finishing with a 131-115 victory at Toyota Center. In the opening quarter, the Rockets shot 57.7 percent from the field and made four three-pointers while holding the Suns to 33.3 percent shooting to take a 39-23 lead after one. The Suns narrowed the margin to 14 points late in the first half, but the Rockets then went on a 10-0 run before leading by 26 at halftime. The 16-point final margin was as close as the Suns would get in the second half as the Rockets twice reached a lead of 34 points. James Harden led the Rockets with 32 points and 12 assists while Eric Gordon and Ryan Anderson each added 15 points. Eric Bledsoe led the Suns with 24 points and Brandon Knight added 21 points off the bench. Dragan Bender had the best game of his young career with 11 points, 13 rebounds, three steals, two assists and two blocks in 27 minutes. For the game, the Rockets shot 50.0 percent from the field and made 15 three-pointers on 43 attempts, while the Suns shot 42.6 percent from the field.

76ers 116 SUNS 123 Regular Season Game 30 Talking Stick Resort Arena	PHOENIX – The Suns (9-21) went on a shooting tear in the fourth quarter to complete a 14-point comeback for a 123-116 win over the Philadelphia 76ers (7-22) at Talking Stick Resort Arena. The Suns trailed 85-75 late in the third quarter before ending the period on a 6-0 run to make it an 85-81 game entering the fourth. In the fourth, the Suns made their first 12 field goal attempts, including four three-pointers, to eventually take their largest lead of the game at 116-102 with 2:00 remaining. In total, the Suns shot 13-of-16 from the field in the fourth quarter as they scored 42, their most in a period of the season. The Suns’ 123 points and 53.2 percent clip from the field were also season-highs as they outpaced Philadelphia’s 116 points and 50.6 percent mark. The Sixers led by as many as 14 points in the first half. The Suns opened the second half on a 16-2 run, but Philadelphia still retook a 10-point lead late in the third. Eric Bledsoe led the Suns with 24 points, a season-high 11 assists and a season-high three blocks as he scored 16 in the fourth quarter. Joel Embiid led the Sixers with 27 points and seven rebounds.

TORONTO RAPTORS (22-9)

- The Suns and Raptors meet for the first of two meetings this season; the Raptors won the most recent contest as the two teams have split the season series in each of the past two seasons.
- Earl Watson made his head coaching debut against the Raptors in Phoenix on Feb. 2, 2016.
- The Suns won both meetings in 2013-14, 106-97 in Phoenix and 121-113 in Toronto.
- The Raptors swept the series 2-0 in 2012-13; Toronto's first two-game sweep against the Suns since 2003-04.
- Phoenix has won 18 of 23 games against the Raptors, but Toronto had won three straight after snapping a series-long 14-game streak by the Suns in 2011-12.
- The Raptors' three-game winning streak against the Suns was the longest by the franchise in series history.
- Phoenix has won nine of their last 12 at home in the series.
- The Suns have won nine of their last 11 road games against the Raptors. Toronto's last three home wins in the series are Jan. 4, 2004, Nov. 30, 2012 and Nov. 24, 2014.
- On March 31, 2006, Phoenix scored a series-high 140 points, which remains the most points ever scored at the Air Canada Centre.

LAST REGULAR SEASON MEETING

Raptors 104, Suns 97

2/2/16 at Talking Stick Resort Arena

PHOENIX – Earl Watson made his debut as interim head coach and the 17th head coach in Suns history but the Toronto Raptors built a big enough lead in the early stages of the fourth quarter to stave off a rally and come away with a 104-97 win at Talking Stick Resort Arena. After a first half that saw a seven-point Suns lead turn into a seven-point Raptors lead at halftime, Toronto led 71-60 with less than five minutes to go in the third period. The Suns then went on a 10-0 run to cut their deficit to just a point at 71-70 with 2:50 to play. The Raptors, however, closed the period on a 7-1 run and then built the lead to 14 points with 5:55 left in the game. The Suns rallied to trim the margin to five points at 99-94 with 1:59 left and, after each team exchanged empty possessions, defended well before DeMar DeRozan made a desperation three-pointer at the shot clock buzzer to go back up by eight. Five was as close as the Suns would get. Markieff Morris had his best game of the season with a season-high 30 points and his first double-double with 11 rebounds. Devin Booker added 27 points. Kyle Lowry led Toronto with 26 points.

UTAH JAZZ (19-13)

- The Jazz won the first of three meetings this season, losing a 23-point lead but holding on for a seven-point win on Dec. 6.
- The Jazz swept the Suns 4-0 last season. It marked the first sweep by the Jazz in the series since going 4-0 against the Suns during the 1999-2000 season.
- The Suns won the season series 2-1 in 2014-15 and the teams split their four meetings in 2013-14; the Suns won the first meeting of 2013-14 on Eric Bledsoe's game-winning three-pointer in the final second in just his second game with the team.
- Utah took three of four in the season series in 2012-13, including the final two meetings.
- The Suns and Jazz have split the last 24 meetings in the series 12-12. Phoenix had won seven consecutive games over the Jazz entering the season finale in 2011-12, which had been the Suns' longest win streak since March 3, 1982 – March 29, 1983 (7).
- The Suns have won seven of their last 11 home games in the series, and nine of their last 14 games at Talking Stick Resort Arena against Utah.
- Phoenix has won five of the last 13 meetings in Salt Lake City. Entering the 2011-12 season finale, Phoenix had won four-straight in Salt Lake City for the first time since five straight from Nov. 6, 1979-March 5, 1981, the first five series meetings in Utah after the club moved from New Orleans.
- In 2010-11, the Suns swept the series for the first time since 1982-83 and just the fourth time in series history, which dates back to 1974-75 (1979-80, 1980-81).

LAST REGULAR SEASON MEETING

Jazz 112, Suns 105

12/6/16 at Vivint Smart Home Arena

SALT LAKE CITY – The Suns (6-15) erased a 23-point deficit to tie the game in the fourth quarter but the Utah Jazz (14-9) held on for a victory in a game in which they never trailed, winning 112-105 at Vivint Smart Home Arena. The Jazz jumped out to a quick lead to open the game, scoring the game's first seven points and sprinting to a 33-19 lead after the first quarter. The Suns never got closer than eight in the second quarter as the Jazz held a 20-point lead at halftime. Utah took their largest lead at 92-69 with 2:03 left in the third quarter and led by 19 points entering the final frame. The Suns dominated the fourth, however, going on a 28-9 run to tie the game for the first time at 103-103 with 3:07 remaining. The bench came up huge for the Suns during the run as Brandon Knight scored eight points, Leandro Barbosa scored seven and Jared Dudley scored six over this stretch to draw the game even. The Jazz scored the next six points after the game was tied and held on for the seven-point win. Gordon Hayward scored a game-high 28 points and Rudy Gobert had a career-high 22 points. Devin Booker led the Suns with 21 points.

SUNS 2016-17 NOTES

- The Suns conclude the **sixth** of **14** back-to-back sets this season, going **1-5** in the first game and **1-4** in the second game. The Suns' **14** games having played the previous day tie last season for the fewest on zero days rest in team history (prev. 16 in 1982-83, 2010-11).
- Over the last **15** games, the Suns are averaging **9.7** three-point makes on **36.5** 3FG% (7.1 per game on 31.5 3FG% in first 17).
- The Suns are averaging **107.0** points per game (**8th** in the NBA); they last averaged at least this many points in **2009-10** (110.2).
- The Suns rank **2nd** in the NBA in pace with **103.6** possessions per 48 minutes.
- The Suns rank in the NBA's top 11 in all four miscellaneous points categories, ranking **2nd** with an average of **18.5** fast break points, **5th** in with **46.1** points in the paint, **11th** with **13.6** second chance points and **2nd** with **18.8** points off turnovers.
- The Suns rank **3rd** in the NBA with **8.81** steals per game, the team's highest average since **2003-04** (9.0).
- The Suns rank **2nd** in the NBA with **26.1** free throw attempts per game, the team's highest average since **2008-09** (27.5).
- The Suns rank **9th** in the NBA with **45.0** rebounds per game, the team's highest average since **1990-91** (45.5).
- The Suns scored a season-high **42** points in the fourth quarter vs. Philadelphia on Dec. 23, making their first **12** field goal attempts, including **four** three-pointers. Overall the Suns shot 13-of-16 (81.3%) from the field in the period as their **42** points marked their most in a quarter since also scoring 42 in the fourth quarter at Chicago on Dec. 7, 2015.
- The Suns have already gone to OT **five** times through their first **25** games, their **most** OT games at this point in the season in franchise history and tied for **third-most** through **25** games in NBA history. Only the 2013-14 Washington Wizards and 2004-05 Los Angeles Clippers (six each) played in more OT games in a season's first **25** games. The Suns' franchise record for most OT games in an entire season is **nine** by the 2010-11 team (*Basketball-Reference*).
- The Suns have come through **in the clutch** thus far this season, shooting a combined **7-of-15** on field goal attempts to tie or take the lead in the final **30** seconds of regulation or overtime (**Bledsoe: 4-of-5**, **Booker: 2-of-7**, **Warren: 1-of-1**, **Tucker: 0-of-1**, **Barbosa: 0-of-1**).
- The Suns attempted an NBA regulation season-high **107** field goals vs. Brooklyn on Nov. 12. This marked the Suns' most field goal attempts in a non-overtime game since Dec. 4, 1990, at Chicago (*Basketball-Reference*).

BENDER AND CHRISS STEPPING UP

- **DRAGAN BENDER** (11, 10) and **MARQUESE CHRISS** (12, 13) have both scored in double figures in each of the Suns' last **two** games. They are just the fourth pair of teenage teammates to have consecutive games scoring **10+** points, joining Minnesota's **Zach LaVine** and **Andrew Wiggins** and Milwaukee's **Giannis Antetokounmpo** and **Jabari Parker** who all accomplished the feat in 2014-15, and Chicago's **TYSON CHANDLER** and **Eddy Curry** who did so in 2001-02 (*Basketball-Reference*).
- **DRAGAN BENDER** had career-highs of **11** points, **13** rebounds, **three** steals and tied highs with **two** assists and **two** blocks at Houston on Dec. 26 as he had his first career double-double. At **19** years, **39** days old, Bender became the youngest Suns player to ever record a double-double (prev. **DEVIN BOOKER** who had his first at 19 years, 68 days). Bender is the youngest player to have at least **13** rebounds in a game since **Andrew Bynum** (13 at 19 years, 23 days on Nov. 19, 2006). Since 1983-84, Bender is just the **fourth teenager** to record this stat line of at least **11** points, **13** rebounds, **three** steals and **two** blocks in a game, joining **Dwight Howard** (Dec. 7, 2005), **Tracy McGrady** (April 10, 1998) and **Kevin Garnett** (March 8, 1996) (*Basketball-Reference*).

BOOK REVIEW

- Over the last **six** games, **DEVIN BOOKER** is averaging **20.7** points and has done much of his damage in the second half, averaging **12.7** points on **47.4** FG% and **50.0** 3FG% in the second halves of those games.
- **DEVIN BOOKER** (born Oct. 30, 1996) ranks **t-37th** in the NBA with **18.8** points per game; no NBA player younger than him is averaging as many as **9.0** this season. Only **18** qualified NBA players age 20-or-younger have ever averaged at least **18** points in a season (most recently **Karl-Anthony Towns** last season) (*Basketball-Reference*).
- Averaging **18.8** points in this his second NBA season, **DEVIN BOOKER** has the highest scoring average by a Suns sophomore since **Amar'e Stoudemire** averaged **20.6** points in 2003-04. Booker already has **five** 30-point games this season, most by a Suns player in his second NBA season since **Kevin Johnson** (10) in 1988-89. Only **Walter Davis** (15 in 1978-79), **Charlie Scott** (20 in 1972-73) and **Connie Hawkins** (six in 1970-71) also had at least **five** 30-points in their second NBA season while playing for the Suns.
- **DEVIN BOOKER** had his **11th** 30-point game in his **102nd** career game on Dec. 17; only Suns all-time leading scorer **Walter Davis** (23) had more as a Sun through his first **102**. Since 2004-05, only **Blake Griffin** (70), **Kyrie Irving** (88), **Stephen Curry** (98) and **Kevin Durant** (101) have reached **11** 30-point outings in fewer games (*Basketball-Reference*).
- **DEVIN BOOKER** followed up his then career-high **38** points at New Orleans on Nov. 4 with a new career-high **39** points at Los Angeles on Nov. 6 to become the **youngest player in NBA history to record back-to-back games with at least 38 points**. Booker, doing so at 20 years, 5 and 7 days old, accomplished the feat over 300 days younger than the previous holder, **Bernard King**, who scored 39 then 41 points in two straight for the New Jersey Nets from Nov. 2-4, 1977, at ages of 20 years, 333 and 335 days (*Basketball-Reference*).

BLEDSOE FOR THE WIN

- Against Philadelphia on Dec. 23, **ERIC BLEDSOE** had **24** points (16 in the fourth) and season-highs of **11** assists and **three** blocks. Since 1983-84, Bledsoe is the first Suns player to record **24+** points, **11+** assists and **3+** blocks in a game, and he became the first NBA player to do so since **DeMarcus Cousins** had 24, 13 and three for Sacramento on April 3, 2015. Bledsoe, Cousins, **LeBron James**, **Kevin Durant**, **Dwyane Wade** and **Vince Carter** are the only active players to record such a game (*Basketball-Reference*).
- **ERIC BLEDSOE** is one of **five** NBA players averaging at least **19** points, **five** rebounds and **five** assists (**James Harden**, **LeBron James**, **Russell Westbrook**, **Giannis Antetokounmpo**). The last qualified Suns player to average at least **19/5/5** in a season was **Charles Barkley** in his NBA MVP season of 1992-93. There have been only three other instances of a Sun doing so: **Jeff Hornacek** in 1991-92, **Alvan Adams** in 1975-76, **Gail Goodrich** in 1968-69 (each of these three was the player's first All-Star season).

- On field goal attempts to take the lead in the final 30 seconds of the fourth quarter or overtime, **ERIC BLEDSOE** has made **4-of-5** this season. His **four** makes are most in the NBA with only two other players having made as many as **two** go-ahead shots in the final 30 seconds (**Marc Gasol** and **Carmelo Anthony**) (*Basketball-Reference*). Bledsoe's four makes in such situations are: a reverse layup to put the Suns up one with :30.0 left in OT in a win vs. New York on Dec. 13; a buzzer-beating three to give the Suns an OT win vs. Portland on Nov. 2; a layup to put the Suns up two with :01.1 left in regulation in that same game on Nov. 2; and a layup with :19.8 left in OT to go up one in an eventual loss at Oklahoma City on Oct. 28.
- ERIC BLEDSOE** scored **30+** points in a career-long **three** straight games from Dec. 9-13, the longest streak by a Suns player since **Amar'e Stoudemire** did so in three straight in March 2010. Bledsoe also exceeded **eight** assists in each of those **three** games; the last Suns player with **three** straight games of **30+** points and **8+** assists was **Jason Kidd** in **three** straight in March 2001. Bledsoe, **Russell Westbrook** and **James Harden** are the only players to have **30/8** in at least **three** consecutive games this season (*Basketball-Reference*). Bledsoe is averaging **22.3** points and **6.1** assists in the **10** games since his streak started on Dec. 9.
- ERIC BLEDSOE** had a five-game streak (Nov. 19-27) with **15+** points, **5+** assists and **5+** rebounds included in this stretch which was the longest such streak by a Suns player since **Jason Kidd** did so in six straight in 2000.

BLD & BOOK

- ERIC BLEDSOE** and **DEVIN BOOKER** each have **five** 30-point games this season with Booker reaching his fifth in the team's **27th** game on Dec. 17 at OKC. The last time Suns teammates each reached **five** 30-point games this early into a season was in **1985-86** when **Walter Davis** and **Larry Nance** each had **five** through **27** games.

CHANDLER SHOWING NO SIGNS OF SLOWING DOWN

- In his **16th** pro season, **TYSON CHANDLER** is currently averaging **11.2** rebounds. The only players in NBA history to previously average double-digit rebounds in their 16th season or later are **Charles Barkley** (10.5 in just 20 games) with Houston in his 16th season of 1999-2000 and **Moses Malone** (10.0 in 81 games) with Atlanta in his 16th overall season (14th NBA) of 1989-90 (*Basketball-Reference*).
- At **34** years old, **TYSON CHANDLER** ranks **9th** in the NBA by averaging **11.2** rebounds. The only players to ever average at least **11** rebounds in a season when 34 or older have been **Pau Gasol** (twice), **Marcus Camby** (twice), **Dikembe Mutombo**, **Dennis Rodman** (five times), **Charles Barkley** (twice), **Robert Parish**, **Elvin Hayes**, **Wilt Chamberlain** (three times) and **Bill Russell**. Seven of those nine players are Hall of Famers and Gasol is sure to join them when he is eligible (*Basketball-Reference*).
- TYSON CHANDLER** is averaging **11.2** rebounds this season. No Suns player has averaged this many since **Shawn Marion** (11.8) in **2005-06**. Chandler has **13** games with at least **10** boards, **six** with at least **15** and **two** with at least **20** thus far this season.
- Before 2016, no Suns player had ever had back-to-back games with **20+** rebounds. **TYSON CHANDLER** has now done so twice this year. Chandler had a season-high **23** rebounds vs. New York on Dec. 13, after snagging **21** boards vs. New Orleans on Dec. 11. With consecutive games grabbing **20+** rebounds, Chandler duplicates his feat as the lone player in Suns franchise history to accomplish, initially doing so in two straight games from Jan. 21-23 last season.

TONY BUCKETS' HOT START

- T.J. WARREN** is averaging **16.0** points and has scored at least **20** points on **six** occasions through **19** games this season (including a career-high 30 at Oklahoma City on Oct. 28) after only doing so three times in his career entering the season.

BENCH SQUAD

- The Suns rank **4th** in the NBA with **40.5** points per game off the bench; they are averaging **44.1** points in wins and **39.0** in losses.
- BRANDON KNIGHT** is **8th** in the NBA among players to make a majority of their appearances off the bench with **13.3** points per game.
- JARED DUDLEY** ranks **7th** in the NBA, shooting **44.4** percent from three-point range. No qualified Suns player has shot this high from long range for a season since Dudley shot 45.8 percent in **2009-10**.
- In **22** games off the bench, **JARED DUDLEY** is averaging **8.8** points and **1.6** three-pointers after averaging 6.4 points and 1.1 three-pointers in seven games as a starter.
- LEANDRO BARBOSA** (whose **4,595** career points off the bench as a Sun are most by any player in team history since at least 1983-84) has scored in double-digits in **five** of the last **12** games, averaging **8.1** points while shooting **50.6** percent from the field and **50.0** percent from behind the three-point arc over this **12-game** stretch.
- TYLER ULIS** ranks **5th** among NBA rookies with **0.84** steals per game. Ulis had **four** steals in **two** straight games (Nov. 18-19); he is the first Suns rookie with at least **four** steals in back-to-back games since **LEANDRO BARBOSA** did so in **two** straight from April 11-13, 2004.
- ALAN WILLIAMS** recorded his **third** career double-double in his **15th** career appearance, joining **Amar'e Stoudemire** (3) and **Armon Gilliam** (3) as the only Suns with at least **three** double-doubles in their first **15** career games since 1983 (*Basketball-Reference*).
- The Suns scored a **still** NBA season-high **78** bench points at Indiana on Nov. 18; according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, this is the most points scored by the Suns' bench since they totaled **78** on Jan. 17, 1995, vs. Denver. **Five** different Suns reserves scored **10+** points for the first time by the team since April 18, 2001, at Utah.
- BRANDON KNIGHT** recorded the NBA's **first** 30-point game off the bench of the season with **32** points in 28 minutes at Denver on Nov. 16. Knight became the first Suns player to score at least **32** points while playing **28** minutes or fewer since **Cedric Ceballos** had 32 points in 23 minutes vs. Denver on Nov. 10, 1990 (*Basketball-Reference*).

TWO OF THE LEAGUE'S TOP YOUNG SCORERS

- **T.J. WARREN** ranks **5th** in the 2014 NBA Draft class with **16.0** points per game this season (behind Wiggins, LaVine, Parker, Embiid) and **DEVIN BOOKER** ranks **3rd** in the 2015 NBA Draft class with **18.8** points per game (behind Towns, Porzingis).
- **DEVIN BOOKER (18.8** at age 20) and **T.J. WARREN (16.0** at age 23) are each averaging **15+** points; the only other times the Suns have had two players 23 or younger do so was in **2003-04** and **2004-05** with **Amar'e Stoudemire** and **Joe Johnson**, **1977-78** with **Alvan Adams** and **Walter Davis**, and **1971-72** with **Charlie Scott** and **Neal Walk**.

EXCEL-LEN-T

- In the last **22** games, **ALEX LEN** is averaging **8.7** points (**55.1** FG%), **7.4** rebounds and **1.8** blocks with **six** double-doubles, **eight** games with 10+ boards and **12** with multiple blocks. Len had a career-long **seven-game** multi-block streak that matched **Jermaine O'Neal**, **Marcin Gortat**, **Channing Frye** and **Shaquille O'Neal** for the longest by a Sun since **Amar'e Stoudemire** (nine straight) in 2008.
- **ALEX LEN** had **14** points, **13** rebounds and a season-high **five** blocks at the L.A. Lakers on Dec. 9. The performance was Len's **fourth** career game with a double-double and 5+ blocks; since 1983-84, only **Shawn Marion** (12), **Larry Nance** (12) and **Mark West** (5) have more such games as a Sun (*Basketball-Reference*).

SMALL SAMPLE SIZE FUN!

- **ALAN WILLIAMS** has totaled **87** rebounds in **179** career minutes played. Among all players to ever have played at least 50 total minutes, Williams has the **third-highest rebounds per 36 minutes in NBA history**, behind two legends who totaled *slightly* more than 179 minutes (*Basketball-Reference*):

- **DEVIN BOOKER**, at 19 years and 162 days old, became the **fourth-youngest** player in NBA history to reach **1,000** career points on April 9 of last season. The only three players to reach **1,000** career points younger are **LeBron James**, **Kobe Bryant** and **Kevin Durant**.

YOUNGEST STARTING LINEUP IN SUNS HISTORY; 4TH-YOUNGEST ROSTER IN THE LEAGUE

- According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, at Portland on Nov. 8, the Suns started their youngest lineup in team history in **MARQUESE CHRISS** (19 years, 129 days); **DEVIN BOOKER** (20, 9); **T.J. WARREN** (23, 64); **ALEX LEN** (23, 145); **ERIC BLEDSOE** (26, 335) combining for an average age of **22** years, **210** days. The previous youngest was an average of **22** years, **284** days on Jan. 13, 2004 vs. Denver (**LEANDRO BARBOSA**, **Amar'e Stoudemire**, **Joe Johnson**, **Donnell Harvey**, **Shawn Marion**).
- Overall, the Suns' 2016-17 opening night roster has an average age of **25.16** years (as of opening night), which is **fourth-youngest** in the NBA behind only Philadelphia (24.18), Portland (24.95) and Toronto (25.04). Despite the youth in age, the Suns' opening night roster holds an average of **4.35** seasons of NBA experience, which is **13th-fewest** in the league.

TEEN SPIRIT

- The Suns made NBA history on Oct. 26 as they had **three** teenagers (**DEVIN BOOKER**, **MARQUESE CHRISS**, **DRAGAN BENDER**) see action, becoming the **first team ever** to have three teenagers appear in the same game (a feat they duplicated on Oct. 28 and again on Nov. 19 with **DERRICK JONES JR.** making his NBA debut and replacing Booker as the third teenager).
- In the season opener on Oct. 26, **DRAGAN BENDER** scored **10** points (4-5 FG, 2-3 3FG) while still just **18** years old. Bender joined **DEVIN BOOKER** (14 points in last season's opener) as **two** of just **four** 18-year-olds to score in double figures in a season opener in NBA history. The two Suns are in elite company as the only other two 18-year-olds to do so are **LeBron James** and **Dwight Howard**. Since 2006-07, Bender, Booker and **Giannis Antetokounmpo** (twice in 2013-14) are the only 18-year-olds to score in double figures in any game, season opener or otherwise (*Basketball-Reference*).
- On the Suns' opening night roster, **four** of the players on the 15-man roster are teenagers as of the season opener: **DRAGAN BENDER**, **DEVIN BOOKER**, **MARQUESE CHRISS** and **DERRICK JONES JR.** The Suns are the **first team in NBA history** with four teenagers on their regular season roster; in fact, no team has ever had as many as three teenagers play for them in a season. There have been **12** previous occurrences of NBA teams having **two** teenaged players appear in a season, not counting this season's Suns, Lakers (**Brandon Ingram**, **Ivica Zubac**) and Nuggets (**Malik Beasley**, **Jamal Murray**) who have multiple teens on opening-night rosters. Among those 12 previous teams are the 2001-02 Chicago Bulls, who had current Suns center and then 19-year-old **TYSON CHANDLER**, as well as **Eddy Curry**.

SHAZAM! THE SUNS RING OF HONOR TO ADD NO. 15

- During the Suns' season opener on Oct. 26, it was announced that on March 3 of this season "The Voice of the Suns" **AL MCCOY** will become the **15th** person inducted into the Suns Ring of Honor. McCoy, who began serving as the play-by-play voice of the Suns on Sept. 27, 1972, is now in his **45th** season calling the Suns, the longest tenured NBA broadcaster of all-time. In addition to his upcoming Ring of Honor induction, McCoy won the 18th Annual Curt Gowdy Media Award from the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2007 and was honored with the dedication of the Al McCoy Media Center in Talking Stick Resort Arena, also in 2007.

NBA GLOBAL GAMES MEXICO CITY 2017

- The Suns will make NBA history by playing **two** games in Mexico City, against Dallas on Jan. 12 and San Antonio on Jan. 14, as the games will mark the first time the NBA hosts two regular season games in Mexico in the same season.
- The NBA is celebrating the **25th** anniversary of its first game in Mexico, and following NBA Global Games Mexico City 2017, the league will have staged **24** games in Mexico since **1992**.
- The Suns have previously played **two** regular season games outside the United States and Canada, playing the first **two regular season** games outside of North America for any major American sport when they opened the **1990-91** season with **two** games against Utah in Tokyo, Japan. The Suns won the first meeting 119-96 on Nov. 2, 1990, behind 38 points and 10 rebounds from **Tom Chambers**. The Jazz won the second game on Nov. 3, 1990, by a score of 102-101.

2016-17 SCHEDULE NOTES

- The Suns have a season-long **five-game** homestand from March 2-9. Phoenix ends the season with **13** of its final **22** games at home, including **four** of the final **five**.
- The Suns' longest road trip of the season is **six** games, doing so on two occasions, from Nov. 13-23 and March 19-28.
- Of the Suns' **39** home games, **17** will be played from Friday through Sunday.
- The Suns are scheduled to appear on national TV **11** times: **Two** games on TNT, **two** games on ESPN and **seven** games on NBA TV.

THE BLED SHOW

- ERIC BLEDSOE** averaged **20.4** points, **6.1** assists, **4.0** rebounds and **2.0** steals in **31** games last season; though he did not play enough games to qualify for the NBA leaderboard, he joined 2016 All-Stars **Stephen Curry**, **Russell Westbrook** and **Kyle Lowry** as the only players in the league to average at least 20/6/4/2 (*Basketball-Reference*).

GOOD KNIGHT

- BRANDON KNIGHT** holds career averages of **15.9** points, **4.6** assists, **3.5** rebounds and **1.8** three-pointers through five NBA seasons entering 2016-17. The only players in NBA history to have career averages of at least these amounts are Knight, **Stephen Curry**, **James Harden**, **Damian Lillard** and **Gilbert Arenas** (*Basketball-Reference*).

TUCKER IN ALL-STAR COMPANY

- P.J. TUCKER** finished last season with **512** rebounds, **177** assists and **106** steals; the only other players in the NBA with at least these totals in these three categories were 2016 NBA All-Stars **Russell Westbrook**, **Draymond Green**, **Paul Millsap** and **Paul George**.
- P.J. TUCKER** has totaled **500+** rebounds and **100+** steals in each of the past **three** seasons. Tucker and **Paul Millsap** are the only **two** players in the NBA to have at least 500 boards and 100 thefts in each season since 2013-14.

WELCOME HOME, JARED AND LEANDRO

- Since **1983-84** (as far back as such data is available), **LEANDRO BARBOSA** leads all Suns played in career points off the bench by totaling **4,406** points as a reserve in his time with the Suns entering this season (*Basketball-Reference*).
- JARED DUDLEY** is one of **three** players to have shot **38** percent or better from three-point range in at least **seven** of the past **eight** seasons since 2008-09 (min. 50 3FG) with the only other two being **Stephen Curry** and **Kyle Korver**.

- Named interim head coach on Feb. 1, becoming the 17th head coach in Suns history. Retained as head coach on April 19.
- Joined the Suns as an assistant coach in the summer of 2015 after one season as an assistant coach for the Austin Spurs of the D-League.
