Background:

Macx got involved with nordic sports at his local Canmore Nordic Ski Club where he participated in a Jack Rabbits cross-country ski program. He was first introduced to summer biathlon in 2005, and competed in both cross-country skiing and biathlon for the next six years until he was accepted into the Biathlon Alberta Training Centre where he trained for two years before joining the Canadian National team and working his way up the ranks, till reaching the Eh! Team in 2016. Celebrating a career-best 10th-place finish on the World Cup in 2015-16, Macx's development into an elite athlete has been steady.

He made his debut at the elite World Championships in 2016, and represented Canada at three Youth and Junior World Biathlon Championships with his best finish being a 19th place showing in youth racing, and an 8th in juniors. Macx was the 2013 Canadian and North American Champion for sprint, pursuit and in the mass start competitions. During his spare time, Macx enjoys alpine touring, and extreme tobogganing. He also enjoys staying in backcountry huts, and downhill skiing. When training permits, Macx spends his summer doing long mountain runs, and mountain biking. He also enjoys backpacking through the mountains, plays the piano, hacky sack, and slacklining. He attends Athabasca University through distance learning, and is a volunteer coach with his local Canmore Nordic Ski Club.
