

# The chubby T.A.R.D.I.S. ornament/little plushie

o = garter stitch  
 v = stockinette  
 p = pick up stitches  
 I = I-cord

Top - where the light boxes are - you attach the I-cord blinker and hanging loop

You should make 28 rows of garter stitch so it looks like you have 14 bumpy lines. Same goes for the bottom portion.

Option to make the top windows with white yarn, or sew over later

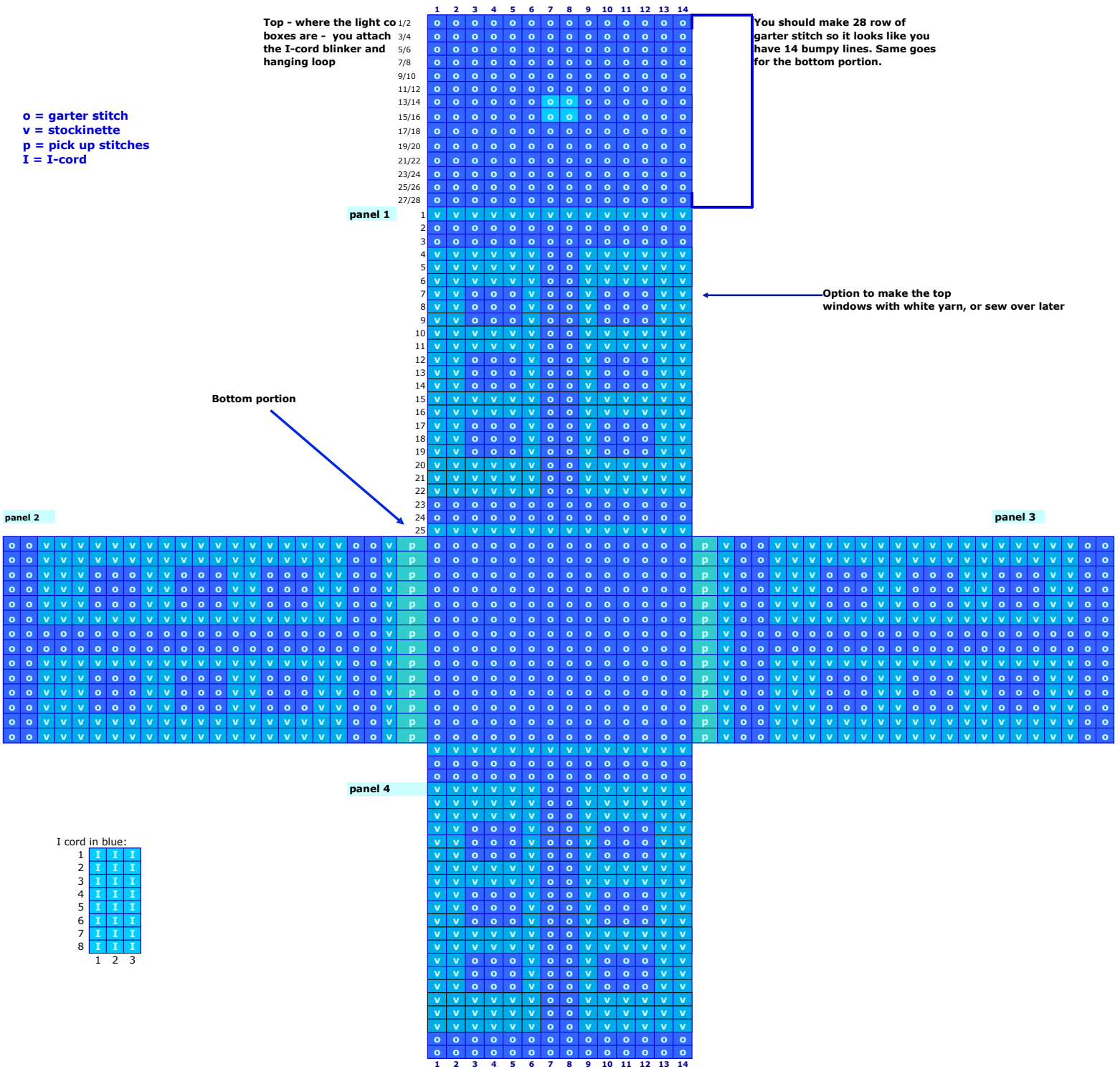

## chubby T.A.R.D.I.S. pattern directions:

knit with lamb's pride worsted 'boy blue' on US 6 needles.

The different colors in the chart are to show differentiation of stitches.

hello sweeties! this is a very very basic pattern, that can be a simple ornament or just a fun plushie. someone with much better pattern skills than me can modify this to into something wonderful.

See the chart below, but basically, you're alternating between the bumps of garter and the v-stitches of stockinette, to create the look of the box and the "windows". knit the knits and purl the purls making sure the bumps are facing out.

For the order to knit, start with panel 1, through to the bottom portion, continuing onto panel 4, all as one piece. Then for panels 2 and 3 pick up 14 stitches on the sides of the bottom where indicated.

Allons-y! To start, cast on 14 stitches. Knit 28 rows for the top of the box, then continue on the chart into panel 1. The Stockinette rows indicate where the "fold" is going to be for each panel, for a better bend when assembling.

Once all the panels are done, sew it all together besides the top and fill it with stuffing and sew it shut. Chubs T.A.R.D.I.S desperately wants to be more of a round shape vs. a square, so to make it more square-ish, once stuffed thread the yarn through the middle back and forth, each time pulling it a bit to your satisfaction to reign it in a bit.

Lastly, make an i-cord for the top blinker on the box- I made mine quite short, so a ornament hook could hang from it, but you could make it longer to hang from the tree also.

I chose to sew white yarn over the tardis once it was stuffed and sewn shut. In hindsight, I think I would have knitted the top 'windows' of the tardis white, but it was an xmas gift and I was in a hurry. Either way could work.

Please note this pattern is made to be a fun fan item - and in no way should be sold and is offered for free. No profit is being made on this, nor do I grant permission for any profit to be made on this or any modifications of this pattern. There's many ways you could make this pattern snazzier, have at it! (extra points for knitting a tiny centurian for it as well).
