Constitutional Measure No. 1	Senate Concurrent Resolution 4045, would eliminate the property tax exemption for land set aside for conservation or wildlife purposes unless otherwise provided by the legislative assembly.	Approved
Initiated Constitutional Measure No. 2	Would direct the legislative assembly to authorize the state to join a multi-state lottery for the benefit of the state.	Approved
Initiated Statutory Measure No. 3	Would create a Bank of North Dakota administered program providing for partial reimbursement of student loan payments for employed North Dakota residents under thirty years of age who have graduated from accredited post-secondary schools. This measure would also provide an income tax credit for employed North Dakota residents from twenty-one through twenty-nine years of age, for up to five years.	Rejected
