Peru has been invited to send a team of choss players to Dubrovnik to participate in a choss tournament there. 3. The invitation to Peruvian choss players was extended by Dr. Potar Trifunovic, who was recently in Lime. Source reports that Trifunovic is a well-known Yugoslav chess player who has spent several months in Argentina and Uruguay. If the Poruvian chess players accopt Trifunovic's invitation, the Yugoslav government will reportedly pay for the travel expenses of the team. On the other hand, the projected visit of the Yugoslav football team to Lima would be financed by the Poruvians. it is the new policy of the Yugoslav government and the Legation in Buenos Ares to attempt to better relations with Poru, and probably other Latin American countries, by bringing persons of the two countries together in cultural activities.
