Baptisia lactea (Raf.) Thieret

Prairie False Indigo




Family: Fabaceae

Synonyms: *Baptisia leucantha* T. & G., *Baptisia alba* (L.) Vent.

Description: Perennial herb to 1.5 m from thick horizontal root system. Usually much branched bearing conspicuous bunches of white flowers (sometimes with a tinge of purple) at the end of the main stem and lateral branches. Oblong, black seedpods to 4 cm long, narrowed to a short beak, on a stipe 8-12 mm long.

Flowering: May to July **Fruiting:** July to September

Similar Species: This is the only Ohio *Baptisia* with white flowers. The other Ohio species of this genus have yellow or blue flowers.



Total Range: USA: AL, AR, FL, GA, IA, IL, IN, KS, KY, LA, MD, MI, MN, MO, MS, NC, NE, NY, OH, OK, SC, TN, TX, VA, WI; CAN: ON.

Ohio Range: Adams, Brown, Clark, Clinton, Crawford, Defiance, Delaware, Erie, Fairfield, Franklin, Highland, Lucas, Madison, Marion, Medina, Pickaway, Pike, Ross, Wyandot.

Habitats: Prairies, barrens, other open habitats.

Threats: Overshading by woody species as a result of succession.

Conservation Potential: Probably excellent due to its variety of habitat and tolerance of disturbance. Steyermark (1963) states that it is easily grown from seed.

Inventory Guidelines: Mature flowering material is recommended for positive identification. Pictures are suitable for identification. Record the number of flowering/fruiting plants.

Comments: Deam (1940) states that this plant is infrequent in its habitat throughout Indiana and that usually only a few plants are found at a place.

A hybrid of this species with the frequent, yellow-flowered *Baptisia tinctoria* has been reported from Indiana (Larisey, 1940). This hybrid should be sought in northwestern Ohio.

Most current localities are located in Adams County. It should be sought throughout the western half of Ohio.
