CORNUS CANADENSIS L. Bunchberry

- FAMILY: Cornaceae.
- HABIT: Creeping, perennial subterranean rhizome with herbaceous stems 0.5-3 dm. high; flowering May-July; fruiting July-October.
- SIMILAR SPECIES: *Cornus canadensis* is not similar to any other member of the genus in Ohio. However, in a vegetative state its clusters of whorled leaves might be confused with non-flowering material of Indian Cucumber, *(Medeola virginiana)*, or Whorled Pogonia (*Isotria verticillata*).
- TOTAL RANGE: Greenland to AK and e. Asia, s. to NJ, PA, IN, and MN, and in the mountains to MD, WV, VA, and CA.
- STATE RANGE (as of 2008): Post-1980 records are from Ashtabula, Geauga, Portage, and Williams counties. Pre-1980 records are from Cuyahoga, Franklin, Hocking, Lake, Licking, Stark, and Summit counties.
- HABITAT: Moist acidic woods and bogs. According to Braun (1950), it is an indicator of the hemlock-white pine-northern hardwood forest and its outlying areas.
- HAZARDS: Browsing by deer; digging by wildflower enthusiasts; opening of the canopy.
- RECOVERY POTENTIAL: Presumed poor due to the limited habitat in Ohio.
- INVENTORY GUIDELINES: Avoid over-collecting. If collecting is essential, then care should be taken not to uproot the buried rhizome. Flowering or fruiting material is necessary for identification.
- COMMENTS: The general range of this species may be accurately known in Ohio. Additional localities should be sought throughout northeastern Ohio.
 - According to Terri (1968), unusually cold winters prohibit flowering.
