POTAMOGETON GRAMINEUS L. Grass-like Pondweed

- FAMILY: Potamogetonaceae
- HABIT: Submersed and floating-leaved aquatic with slender stem, being highly variable in response to environmental change; flowering July- September; fruiting August-October.
- SIMILAR SPECIES: The distinction between *P. illinoensis* and larger-leaved specimens of *P. gramineus* is often arbitrary, particularly in the absence of fruit and floating leaves. Ordinarily, smaller stipules and more slender submersed leaves will distinguish *P. gramineus*.
- TOTAL RANGE: Highly variable circumboreal sp., in America extending s. to NY, IA, and CA.
- STATE RANGE (as of 2008): There are post-1980 records from Seneca and Summit counties. There are pre-1980 records from Lucas County.
- HABITAT: Deep or shallow waters of lakes, ponds, and streams; occasionally plants with "floating" leaves occur stranded on wet shores.
- HAZARDS: Unknown, but perhaps mechanical disturbance.
- RECOVERY POTENTIAL: Probably poor, owing to the species' restricted occurrence in Ohio.
- INVENTORY GUIDELINES: Every effort should be made to obtain fruiting specimens; however, in the absence of fertile material, sterile specimens should be collected.
- COMMENTS: This species is easily overlooked and/or misidentified. It should be sought throughout the northern half of the state.
 - Hybrids involving *Potamogeton gramineus* have been frequently reported. These hybrids only add to the difficulty of correctly identifying the Ohio material.
