SPERMACOCE GLABRA Michx. Smooth buttonweed

FAMILY: Rubiaceae

HABIT: Spreading to decumbent herbaceous perennial, 2-6 dm.; flowering July-September.

SIMILAR SPECIES: May be confused with Diodia virginiana but has many more and smaller flowers in the axils.

TOTAL RANGE: S. OH to S. MO, s. to FL and TX.

STATE RANGE: There are post-1950 collections from 6 counties in the Ohio River Valley: Adams, Clermont, Hamilton, Lawrence, Scioto, and Washington. There is a pre-1950 specimen from Fairfield County.

STATE STATUS: 1980 to present: Potentially Threatened.

HABITAT: Swamps, wet woods and openings; in Ohio found mostly on muddy shores and low banks of the Ohio River.

HAZARDS: Sudden changes in water level, overshading by woody species in later successional stages.

RECOVERY POTENTIAL: Unknown; probably good due to perennial habit.

INVENTORY GUIDELINES: Collect mature flowering material.

COMMENTS: Populations of this species fluctuate greatly from year to year, presumably in relation to changes in water level in the Ohio River.
