CLINTON MAINTAINS LEAD IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

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
DURHAM, NH – Hillary Clinton continues to lead Donald Trump in New Hampshire but both candidates are very unpopular in the state. A majority of Granite State voters, including a third of Trump voters, believe Clinton will win the presidential election.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Nine hundred and seven (907) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between October 11 and October 17, 2016. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.3 percent. Included were seven hundred and seventy (770) likely 2016 general election voters (MSE = +/- 3.5%).

2016 U.S. Presidential Election

With just three weeks until the election, most New Hampshire voters have decided on who they will vote for in November. Currently, 71% of likely voters say they have definitely decided who to support and 14% are leaning towards someone. However, 15% are still trying to decide.

Democrats are more likely to have decided whom they are voting for than Republicans – 81% of Democrats say they have definitely decided whom they will vote for compared to only 65% of Republicans.






2016 Presidential Election

If the 2016 presidential election was held today, 48% of likely New Hampshire voters say they would vote for Hillary Clinton, 33% would vote for Donald Trump, 7% would vote for Gary Johnson, 2% would vote for Jill Stein, 4% say they would vote for another candidate, and 5% are undecided.

When undecided voters are asked which way they are leaning it becomes 49% for Clinton, 34% for Trump, 8% for Johnson, 2% for Stein, 5% for someone else, and 3% undecided.




Clinton is currently doing better among Democrats (87%) than Trump is doing among Republicans (75%) and Clinton has a slight edge among Independents (36% for Clinton, 24% for Trump, 22% for Johnson). Clinton has a large lead among women (57%-30%) and is now deadlocked with Trump among men (40%-38% Clinton). While Trump leads among voters with a high school education or less (47%-32%), Clinton enjoys leads among voters with a college degree (47%-30%) and those who have completed postgraduate work (72%-21%). Trump is getting the support of 88% of voters who say they voted for him in the New Hampshire primary, and he also does well among Rubio voters (85%) and Cruz voters (74%). Trump is not doing as well among Fiorina voters (65%), Christie voters (64%), Carson voters (51%) or Bush voters (42%), and does poorly among Kasich voters (17%). Clinton has the support of nearly all (99%) of her supporters in the primary as well as 79% of Sanders voters.




Favorability of 2016 Presidential Candidates

Democratic nominee Hillary Clinton remains unpopular among New Hampshire voters. Currently 43% have a favorable opinion of Clinton, 53% have an unfavorable opinion of her, and 4% are neutral. Clinton's net favorability is -10%, up from -22% in July. Clinton is very popular among Democrats (+71%) but very unpopular among Independents (-52%) and Republicans (-94%).



Republican nominee and New Hampshire Primary winner Donald Trump is even less popular. Only 26% of likely New Hampshire voters have a favorable opinion of Trump, 69% have an unfavorable opinion, and 4% are neutral. Trump's net favorability is -43%, down from -29% in July. Trump is only somewhat unpopular among Republicans (+24%), and is very unpopular among Independents (-51%), and Democrats (-95%).



One Word To Describe Clinton/Trump

Likely voters were asked to say the one word that comes to mind when they think of Clinton or Trump, and in an election with two unpopular nominees and intense rhetoric, many responses were unsurprisingly negative. When asked for one word about Clinton, 22% said dishonest/liar, 8% said experience, 7% said corrupt/crooked, 5% said crook/criminal, 4% said qualified, 4% said intelligent/knowledgeable, 3% said deceitful/deceptive, and 3% said capable. When asked for one word about Trump, 12% used a derogatory term, 7% said businessman, 5% said arrogant, 4% said crazy, 4% said ego/narcissist, 4% said bad/awful, 3% said disgusting, and 2% said success.









Former New Mexico Governor and Libertarian Party nominee Gary Johnson has become more well-known but is increasingly unpopular – currently 18% have a favorable opinion of Johnson, 38% have an unfavorable opinion, 11% are neutral, and 33% don't know enough about him to say. Johnson's net favorability is -20%, down from +2% in July. Johnson is unpopular among Democrats (-29%) and Republicans (-19%), while Independents are divided (+1%).



Green Party nominee Jill Stein is also becoming better known but also becoming more unpopular – 12% of likely voters have a favorable opinion of Stein, 29% have an unfavorable opinion, 9% are neutral, and 50% don't know enough about her to say. Stein's net favorability is -17%, down from -3% in July. Stein is somewhat unpopular among Democrats (-5%), and unpopular among Independents (-16%) and Republicans (-35%).




Very few New Hampshire voters have an opinion on American Delta Party candidate Rocky De La Fuente – currently 1% have a favorable opinion, 6% have an unfavorable opinion, 8% are neutral, and 85% don't know enough about him to say.



Who Will Win Presidential Election?


Seven in ten New Hampshire likely voters (70%) think that Hillary Clinton will win the presidential election, just 19% think Trump will win, and 11% are unsure. While nearly all Clinton voters (94%) believe that she will win, only half of Trump voters (49%) think he will win, while another third (33%) think Clinton will win.



Presidential Candidate Characteristics

A majority of likely voters (62%) say Clinton has the right experience to be president, compared to only 18% for Trump. Half of likely voters (51%) think Clinton would best handle immigration policies (35% chose Trump), while a plurality say Clinton (48%) can best handle ISIS (36% chose Trump). Voters are more divided on who can best handle the economy – 45% chose Clinton and 42% chose Trump.

A slight majority of likely voters (52%) say Clinton is the better role model for children compared to just 10% for Trump. Two in five (40%) chose Clinton as the most likeable compared to just 21% for Trump. Voters are divided on which candidate is the least honest – 48% say Trump is while 47% say Clinton is.



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center and funded by WMUR-TV, Manchester, NH. Nine hundred and seven (907) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between October 11 and October 17, 2016. If a household included more than one adult, the adult who had the most recent birthday was selected to be interviewed.

The margin of sampling error is +/- 3.3 percent for the entire sample. Included were seven hundred seventy (770) likely 2016 general election voters (MSE +/- 3.5%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.1%.

The random sample used in the WMUR Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
