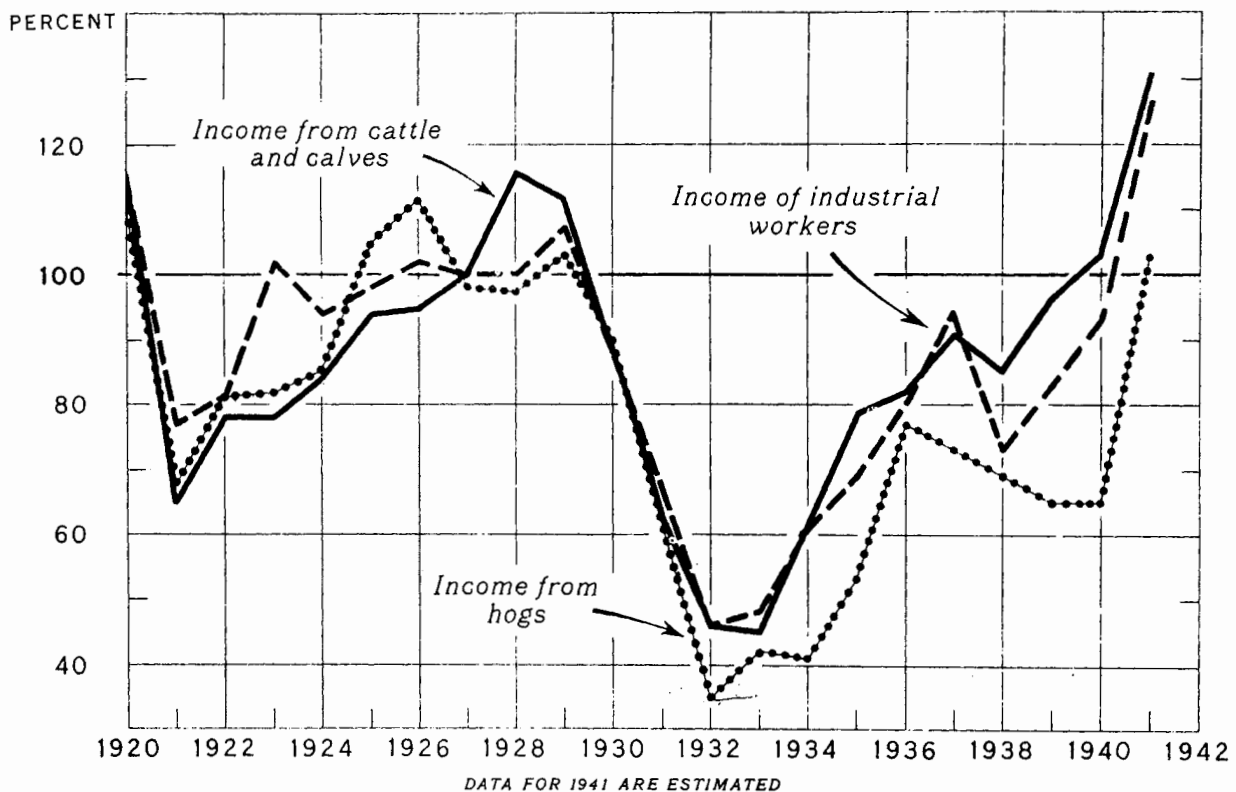

THE MARKED INCREASE IN THE INCOME OF INDUSTRIAL WORKERS IN 1941 WAS ACCOMPANIED BY A ROUGHLY CORRESPONDING INCREASE IN THE CASH FARM INCOME FROM MEAT ANIMALS. INCOME FROM CATTLE AND CALVES WAS THE HIGHEST SINCE 1919 AND INCOME FROM HOGS EXCEEDED ALL YEARS SINCE 1920 EXCEPT 1926. INCOME FROM SHEEP AND LAMBS IN 1941 WAS THE HIGHEST ON RECORD.

THE FARM INCOME SITUATION

Summary

Cash income from farm marketings and Government payments in December amounted to 1,230 million dollars compared with 1,301 million dollars in November (revised estimate) and 842 million dollars in December last year. Government payments in December totaled 83 million dollars compared with 68 million dollars in November and 70 million dollars in December 1940. Sales of several major farm products were larger than usual in December and prices averaged 6 percent higher than in November. As a result, income from farm marketings declined much less than usual from November to December. Income from wheat, corn, rice, cotton, tobacco, cattle, hogs, and eggs was much higher than usual in December, and income from many other farm products was up after seasonal adjustment, so that the seasonally adjusted index of income from farm marketings increased from 112.5 percent of the 1924-29 average in November to 134.0 percent in December.

Because of the unusually high level of marketings in December, cash income from farm marketings for the 12 months of 1941 exceeded earlier expectations and amounted to 11,121 million dollars. This is nearly 34 percent higher than income received from farm marketings in 1940 and with the exception of 1929 is the highest for any calendar year since 1920. Income from crops of 4,735 million dollars is still somewhat below the average income from crops during the years 1924-29, but the returns from livestock and livestock products of 6,386 million dollars are the highest for any year since 1919. Government payments during 1941 totaled 585 million dollars compared with 766 million dollars in 1940. Income including Government payments totaled 11,706 million dollars, more than in any previous year since 1920.

Favorable weather for agricultural production, together with rising prices, resulted in the largest volume of agricultural marketings in December for any December on record. Quantities of wheat, cotton, and corn placed under loan were large, and marketings of these crops during December were larger than usual. Sales of tobacco and rice also were sharply higher than usual, and prices were nearly twice as high as in December 1940. Because of the large income from these crops, and the relatively large returns from soybeans, peanuts, citrus fruits, and apples, the seasonally adjusted index of income from crops advanced from 101.5 percent of the 1924-29 average in November to 124.5 percent in December. Marketings of meat animals also were unusually large in December as the continued heavy movement of feeder cattle from the Range States was accompanied by relatively heavy slaughter, and the increase in marketings of hogs was also much greater than usual from November to December. As a result of these heavy marketings and rising prices, the seasonally adjusted index of income from meat animals increased from 122.5 to 154.0. The index for poultry and eggs increased from 106.5 to 132.0 as a record output of eggs was accompanied by a smaller than usual decline in egg prices.

Outlook is for Sharp Increase
in Farm Income in Early Months of 1942

Market prices for several important farm products have continued to advance since mid-December, and indications are that farm marketings continued at relatively high levels into January. Thus it is probable that income in January will be sharply higher than in January last year, but it is doubtful that the seasonally adjusted index of income can continue at the high levels attained in December. Sales of Burley tobacco usually reach their peak in January but sales of this crop were unusually large in December last year, leaving a much smaller than usual proportion of the crop to be carried over into 1942, and all of the flue-cured tobacco crop was sold in the calendar year 1941. The proportion of the 1941 cotton crop which was marketed or placed under loan before the end of the calendar year was much larger than in the case of the 1940 crop, leaving less to be sold in the early months of 1942. This same situation prevails for several other farm crops.

On the other hand, large numbers of the 1941 pig crop still remain to be marketed and the number of cattle on feed is only slightly smaller than a year earlier. Indications also point to a production of dairy and poultry products in the early months of 1942 larger than in the corresponding months of 1941. These prospective marketings, together with the much higher level of agricultural prices, indicate that cash income from farm marketings during the next few months will continue sharply higher than in the same months of 1941. Government payments also are being made later on the 1941 program than on the 1940 program, and so they are likely to be somewhat higher in the early months of 1942 than they were in the corresponding period of last year.

November Income Above a Year
Earlier in all but One State

Cash income from farm marketings and Government payments in November, totaling 1,301 million dollars, was 38 percent higher than a year earlier and was higher than in November 1940 in all States except South Carolina. Because of the sharp reduction in cotton marketing in this State income from marketings continued to be substantially less than a year earlier. In the remaining States income ranged from 4 percent higher to nearly 3 times as high as in the corresponding month of 1940. The greatest increase in income was in North Dakota, where the movement of wheat was somewhat later than usual this year so that marketings were unusually heavy in November.

Cash income from farm marketings made about the usual seasonal decline from October to November for the country as a whole. However, in the South Atlantic and Western regions the decline was slightly larger than usual, whereas in the East and West North Central regions the decline was slightly less than usual.

The greatest increase in income in November 1941 over the corresponding month of last year was in the East North Central region. Returns both from crops and from livestock and livestock products in this region were sharply higher than a year earlier, and Government payments also were somewhat higher, resulting in an increase in total income including Government payments of 46 percent. The increase in total income in the West North Central and Western regions, nearly as large as in the East North Central region, amounted to 43 percent. In the South Central and North Atlantic regions the increases in income amounted to 37 and 33 percent, respectively, but in the South Atlantic, because of the sharp decline in income in South Carolina and only moderate increases in Florida and North Carolina, the increase was only 14 percent.

Income from farm marketings and Government payments during the first 11 months of 1941 was higher than a year earlier in all 48 States, the increases ranging from 2 percent in Maine and South Carolina, to 50 percent in Arkansas and Mississippi. Increases of 40 percent or more were also recorded in North Dakota, Kansas, and Montana. For the United States as a whole, cash income from farm marketings was 32 percent higher than a year earlier, while income including Government payments totaled 27 percent more than from January to November 1940. The increase in income in the different geographic regions ranged from 18 percent in the North Atlantic area to 35 percent in the South Central States.

CASH INCOME FROM FARM MARKETINGS, BY REGIONS, UNITED STATES, AVERAGE 1936-39, AND 1940-41

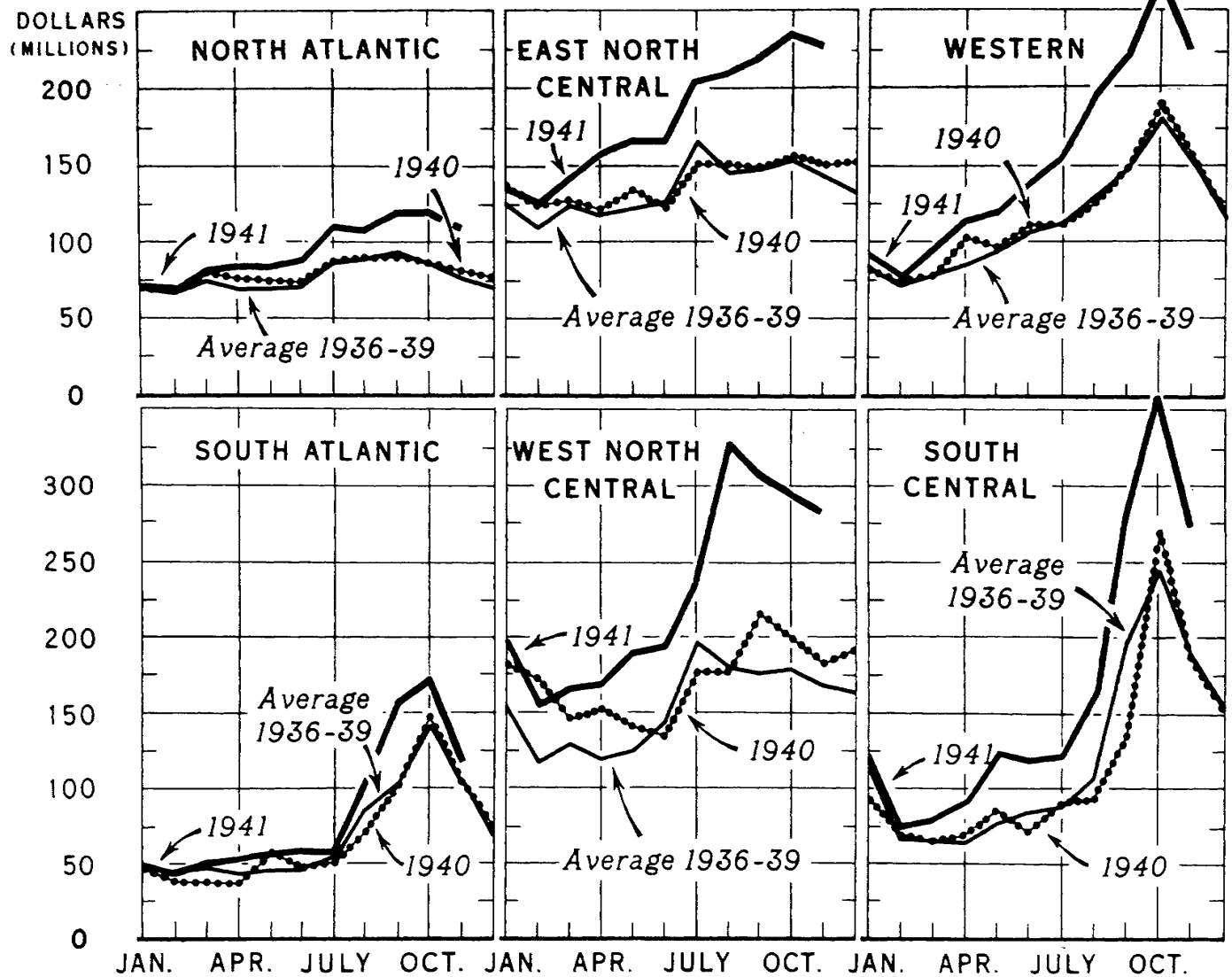

The trends in income from farm marketings in the different regions for the first 11 months of 1941 are compared with income in 1940 and an average for the years 1936-39 on the preceding page. The marked advance in farm prices since March 1941 is reflected in the income of all regions, but the greater increases in income, particularly in the West North Central and South Central regions, also reflect the marked increase in production and marketings in 1941 compared with a year earlier. The larger wheat crop, the heavy marketings of dairy and poultry products, and the increased movement of cattle, have all been contributing factors to the marked increases in income in the Central and Western regions of the country.

North Atlantic States

Income from crops, livestock, and Government payments increased substantially over November 1940, so that income for this region as a whole totaled 33 percent higher than a year earlier. Income from crops was increased substantially by larger returns from apples and potatoes, although returns from most other crops also were higher than a year earlier. The greatest increase in income from livestock and livestock products was in the returns from hogs, chickens and eggs, and milk. Income in Maine was 89 percent higher than in November last year, and in the remaining States increases in income ranged from 14 to 40 percent.

For the first 11 months of 1940 income from crops in this region was up 13 percent, and income from livestock and livestock products was 21 percent more than in the same period a year earlier, resulting in an increase of 18 percent in total income. Because of the smaller income from potatoes in Maine, income in that State was only 2 percent higher than a year earlier. In Connecticut income was up only 7 percent, largely as a result of the smaller return from tobacco, but in the remaining States the increases in income ranged from 16 to 22 percent.

East North Central Region

Every State in this region recorded substantial increases in returns from the sales both of crops and of livestock and livestock products during November. The increase in income, including Government payments, ranged from 35 percent in Indiana to 63 percent in Wisconsin. Larger marketings, accompanied by substantially higher prices for nearly all farm products, were an aid in recording the higher level of farm income.

From January through November, income from crops in this region was 22 percent higher than in the same period a year earlier, and returns from livestock were up 33 percent. In the region as a whole income including Government payments totaled 27 percent more than in the first 11 months of 1940, the increases in the different States ranging from 24 percent in Ohio and Michigan to 36 percent in Wisconsin.

West North Central Region

Income from crops in this region in November was more than twice as large as in November 1940, and income from livestock was up 38 percent, resulting in a total increase in return from farm marketings of 54 percent.

However, Government payments were somewhat smaller than in November last year, so that income including Government payments was up 43 percent. The marked increase in income from crops resulted largely from the later movement of wheat to market or under loan, increased income from sugar crops and soybeans, but increases in income from nearly all crops also was a factor. The greatest increases in income during November were in Minnesota and North Dakota, where spring wheat was still moving to market in volume.

Income from marketings of crops and livestock during the first 11 months of 1941 were about one-third higher than in the corresponding months a year earlier, but Government payments were considerably smaller, so that total income from marketings and Government payments was up only 26 percent. In Nebraska, where Government payments under the 1941 program are being made somewhat later than usual, income including Government payments through November was only 9 percent higher than in the same period a year earlier, but in the remaining States the increase in income has ranged from 17 to 45 percent.

South Atlantic Region

Income from crops in this region during November was only 7 percent higher than a year earlier as marketings of cotton from this area were sharply reduced and sales of tobacco were smaller than usual. The smaller apple crop in this region in 1941 also was a factor in reducing the income in the Northern States of this region during November. Income from sales of livestock and livestock products was higher than a year earlier in all States of the region, and Government payments were up substantially, but total income including Government payments was only 14 percent higher than in November 1940.

From January through November income from marketings total 24 percent more than in the same months of 1940, with returns from crops and livestock increasing at about equal rates. Government payments during the period were slightly smaller than in 1940, so that total income including Government payments was up only 21 percent. In South Carolina a decrease in the returns from crops was more than offset by the increase in returns from livestock, and income from marketings and Government payments was up 2 percent. In the remaining States increases in total income ranged from 11 percent in Georgia to 37 percent in North Carolina, where income from tobacco was about 50 percent higher than a year earlier.

South Central Region

Income from farm marketings in this region in November was 45 percent higher than in November 1940, but Government payments were slightly smaller and income including Government payments was up only 37 percent. Income in all States of the region was substantially larger than a year earlier, increases ranging from 23 percent in Oklahoma to 49 percent in Mississippi. The greatest increases in income from crops were in the returns from wheat, rice, citrus fruits, cotton, sugar crops, and peanuts, whereas the increase in income from livestock and livestock products was fairly general for all types of products.

For the first 11 months of 1941 the increase in this region was greater than for any other region, and for the region as a whole income including Government payments was up 35 percent. The increases ranged from 18 percent in Kentucky and 21 percent in Louisiana to 50 and 51 percent respectively in Arkansas and Mississippi. In the remaining States the increases in income ranged from 32 percent to 39 percent. Returns from both crops and livestock products were substantially higher than a year earlier in all States of the region.

Western States

Cash farm income from crops in the Western region in November totaled 58 percent more than in November 1940. Returns from nearly all crops were somewhat larger than a year earlier, but the greatest increases in returns were from wheat, rice, potatoes, beans, cotton and sugar, but income from livestock and livestock products in November was 30 percent higher than a year earlier and total income from marketings and Government payments was 43 percent higher than in November 1940. Income in all States of the region was substantially higher than a year earlier, increases ranging from 24 percent in New Mexico to more than 100 percent in Montana.

An increase of 36 percent in the income from crops and 28 percent in the returns from livestock resulted in a total income from farm marketings during the first 11 months of 1941 of 32 percent more than in the corresponding period of 1940. Income including Government payments was up 29 percent. The increase in income was fairly equally distributed throughout the region, the increases ranging from 15 percent in New Mexico to 44 percent in Montana, with the remaining States recording increases between 20 and 39 percent. Returns from wheat, apples, citrus fruits, and cotton were important factors in the increase in income from crops. Cattle, sheep and lambs, and wool contributed most of the increase in income from livestock.
