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

Gross farm income in 1949 will be down about 10 percent from last year's record high. Production expenses are only slightly lower, however; and farmers' realized net income will

be about 16 percent less than last year and more than a fifth below the 1947 peak.

Further declines in both gross and net income are expected during 1950.

FARM INCOME IN 1949 AND OUTLOOK FOR 1950

Gross farm income this year is running about 10 percent lower than last year; and farmers' realized net income in 1949 will be down around 16 percent.

Both gross and net income are expected to decline further in 1950—perhaps by percentages not greatly different from those indicated for this year. Such a decline would bring net farm income about a third below its 1947 record high; but it would still be more than double its 1935-39 average.

Cash receipts from marketings in 1949

Farmers' cash receipts from marketings in 1949 will probably total close to 27.7 billion dollars, or 9 percent below receipts in 1948. Total crop receipts are estimated at 12.5 billion dollars and receipts from livestock and livestock products at 15.2 billion dollars, down 7 and 11 percent respectively from last year. The total volume of sales is a little larger this year for both crops and livestock; so the declines in cash receipts are generally a reflection of lower prices.

Cash receipts are expected to be lower this year for all important crops except corn, cotton, sugar crops, and some fruits. The largest relative decline may be about 45 percent in the case of flaxseed, due to reductions in both quantity and price. Wheat, soybeans, and peanuts are each likely to be down about a fifth from last year; tobacco around 15 percent; and potatoes and other vegetables almost 10 percent. Declines are also expected in cash receipts from sales of feed crops other than corn.

Lower prices for corn and cotton are more than offset by the increased quantities sold. Therefore, cash receipts from cotton and cotton-seed will probably be up slightly, and receipts from corn by almost 20 percent. In the case of fruits, increases for apples and citrus fruits will be largely offset by declines for other types.

Declines are also likely in 1949 for all types of livestock and livestock products except broilers. The largest relative decline may be about 20 percent in cash receipts from sheep and lambs, due to a substantial reduction in marketings. Increased sales of hogs and of cattle and calves are more than offset by lower prices, and cash receipts may be down around 15 and 10 percent respectively.

Dairy receipts may be down about 15 percent from last year as a result of lower prices. A substantial increase in sales of broilers this year is more than offsetting lower prices, and receipts from broilers may be up from 15 to 20 percent. Cash receipts from other chickens and from eggs and turkeys may each be down a little, however; total receipts from all poultry and eggs are not likely to show much change from last year.

Cash receipts from marketings in 1950

Farmers may receive around 10 percent less from marketings in 1950 than they are receiving in 1949. The general demand for farm products is likely to remain fairly high next year, but at a slightly lower level than in 1949. It is expected that the need for large exports of some of the important commodities like wheat, tobacco, and cotton will continue through most of the year. But the slight downward tendency in economic activity and employment which has been in effect throughout most of 1949 is likely to continue into 1950, exerting a further downward pressure on domestic demand and farm prices. Prices may average as much as 10 percent below this year's average, with some decline likely for nearly all groups of commodities.

The total volume of farm marketings is also likely to be slightly less next year than in 1949. Although the large 1949 crops will help to maintain the level of crop marketings in the first half of the year, the production control programs now in prospect probably will result in lower crop sales during the latter part of 1950 than in the same period this year; and crop marketings for the year as a whole may be somewhat below 1949. The volume of livestock and livestock products marketed next year, however, may be slightly greater than that marketed this year. Sales of poultry and eggs and marketings of dairy products are likely to be about as high as in 1949. Hog marketings in 1950 may exceed this year because of the relatively large 1949 pig crop and the expected large 1950 spring crop. Total marketings of meat animals next year may be a little larger than those of this year.

Cash receipts may be down moderately in 1950 for both crops and livestock. They are likely to show some decline for nearly all commodity groups, although receipts from fruits may hold fairly well to the 1949 level.

Gross farm income, 1949 and 1950

Gross farm income in 1949—the sum of cash receipts from farm marketings, the value of home-consumed farm products, the rental value of farm dwellings, and Government payments—is estimated at around 32.0 billion dollars as compared with 35.3 billion last year. As average prices of farm products are down this year, the value of products consumed in farm households will be lower along with cash receipts from marketings. The rental value of dwellings may be about the same as last year, but Government payments will be considerably lower because of reduced conservation payments.

A further decline in gross income is in prospect for 1950--possibly by as much as 10 percent. If average prices are lower, the value of home consumption will again be down along with cash receipts. Government payments will be increased next year; but the rental value of farm dwellings may be down a little along with the total value of farm real estate.

Production expenses, 1949 and 1950

Farmers' total expenses of production are estimated at 18.0 billion dollars for 1949, or only about 3 percent lower than last year's expenses. They will show only a moderate decline in 1950, but probably a little more than has occurred this year.

The small decline this year is resulting from definitely lower costs of some items, largely offset by increases for others. The cost of purchased feed is down about a sixth, as lower feed prices more than offset a small increase in number of animals fed. Expenditures for livestock are a little smaller because of lower prices. Expenditures for hired labor are lower because employment and wage rates are both down slightly. And rents are also lower with declining farm incomes. The total cost of fertilizer and lime is about the same as in 1948.

On the other hand, expenditures for many items are up this year. Operating costs for motor vehicles are almost 10 percent higher mainly because of larger numbers in use on farms. Depreciation charges on farm machinery, buildings, and other capital equipment are about 8 percent higher than in 1948 because of increases in numbers and values on farms. Farm taxes are up with rising outlays for schools, roads, and other civic improvements. Increased indebtedness is resulting in slightly higher farm-mortgage interest charges. And some miscellaneous costs such as seeds and short-term interest are also rising.

Total production expenses may show more of a decline next year. But they will remain relatively high. Further reductions are expected in expenditures for feed, purchased livestock, hired labor, and rents; and capital depreciation charges may decline slightly. But outlays for taxes, farm-mortgage interest, fertilizer, and motor-vehicle operation, as well as many of the smaller miscellaneous items, are likely to remain close to their 1949 levels--or may even be a little higher in some cases.

Farmers' net income, 1949 and 1950

Farmers' realized net income in 1949--the difference between gross income and total production expenses--is estimated at 14.0 billion dollars. The expected decline of almost 10 percent in gross income from the 1948 level, associated with a much smaller reduction in expenses, means that net income for the average farmer will be off about 16 percent.

A similar pattern of changes is in prospect for 1950; and realized net income is again expected to be down more than gross income on a percentage basis. The decline could equal that indicated for this year, in which case net income would be at a level approximately a third below its 1947 high.

Net income is likely to be down more than gross income in 1949, and also in 1950, mainly because of high and relatively fixed overhead costs. This is especially true of depreciation charges on farm capital, which are up this year and may show only a slight decline in 1950. However, farmers' actual cash expenditures on buildings, machinery, and other equipment are already declining in 1949 and are likely to be down substantially in 1950. So farmers' net cash available for family living, after deducting actual cash expenditures for production purposes, will show smaller declines in both years than their realized net incomes.

MONTHLY ESTIMATES OF CASH RECEIPTS

October

Farmers received approximately 3.3 billion dollars from marketings in October. This is the largest monthly total for the year to date, but it is 15 percent less than last October's record monthly high of 3.9 billion dollars.

Seasonally large crop marketings resulted in an increase in crop receipts of more than a third over the September level. However, the total of 1.9 billion dollars was almost a fifth lower than last October. Receipts from livestock and livestock products were about 1.4 billion dollars, nearly 10 percent above September but also 10 percent below a year ago.

January-October

Total cash receipts from farm marketings during the first 10 months of 1949 are estimated at 22.4 billion dollars, including 12.6 billion from sales of livestock and livestock products and 9.8 billion from crop marketings. Declines from the corresponding period last year are 7 percent for crops, 11 percent for livestock, and 9 percent for the total.

Revisions for 1948

Revised monthly estimates of cash receipts and the volume of marketings in 1948 are presented in considerable detail in tables 6-10 of this issue. These monthly data are in agreement with the revised annual totals for 1948 as published in the June issue.

All monthly comparisons of 1949 with 1948 are now in terms of the revised estimates. For the United States as a whole, percentage changes from last year are only slightly affected by the revisions. But readers interested in the change in cumulative monthly receipts for individual States, as shown in table 5, may find some significant differences.
