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

Monthly cash receipts in the first half of 1950 were consistently below receipts in corresponding months of 1949. The 6-month total

was down about 9 percent. In July, however, cash receipts are expected to be about the same as a year ago.

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CASH RECEIPTS IN JULY AND JANUARY-JULY 1950

Farmers' cash receipts from marketings in July are tentatively estimated at 2.3 billion dollars, considerably higher than in June and about the same as receipts in July of last year.

Cash receipts in the first half of 1950 were 10.6 billion dollars, 9 percent below receipts in the first half of 1949. Adding the July estimate gives a 7-month total of 12.9 billion dollars, or 7 percent less than receipts in the corresponding months of last year. As prices paid by farmers for commodities used in production have risen slightly, it is likely that farmers' net income during this period declined a little more than their cash receipts.

Monthly marketings this year have frequently been smaller than marketings in corresponding months of 1949; and prices received by farmers for their products have averaged consistently lower. In July, however, although total marketings may remain slightly below a year ago, prices for the first time are expected to average higher.

Cash receipts in July

The tentative estimate of 2.3 billion dollars for cash receipts in July represents an increase of approximately 25 percent over the June level. It is about the same as receipts in July a year ago--or perhaps even slightly higher. Prices of farm products are expected to average higher than in June and also higher than in July of last year. The volume of farm marketings will be substantially above the June level due to seasonally larger crop marketings, but it will probably be slightly smaller than a year ago because of smaller crop production this year.

July receipts from livestock and livestock products are estimated at 1.3 billion dollars, slightly less than in June but 8 percent above last July. Receipts from meat animals will probably be much the same as last month but about 15 percent larger than a year ago. A seasonal decline in marketings of meat animals may be about offset by higher prices, while the increase over last July is due mainly to higher prices. Dairy receipts may be slightly smaller than in June, as seasonally smaller marketings are likely to be only partly offset by slightly higher prices. Dairy receipts are also expected to be a little below last July because of lower prices. Receipts from poultry and eggs will probably be about the same as in June, but they are expected to remain below a year ago because of lower prices.

July crop receipts are estimated at 1.0 billion dollars, nearly twice the June level but a little smaller than in July 1949. Crop prices in July are expected to average slightly higher than prices received both in June of this year and in July of last year. Crop marketings will be up seasonally, but they may be smaller than a year ago. Seasonally larger marketings are expected to result in higher cash receipts for such crops as wheat, cotton, tobacco, oats, vegetables, and fruits. On the other hand, some seasonal declines may occur in the case of corn and oil-bearing crops.

Cash receipts, January-July

Cash receipts in the first 7 months of 1950, tentatively estimated at 12.9 billion dollars, include 3.3 billions from livestock and livestock products and 4.6 billions from crops. The total decline of 7 percent from the corresponding period last year combines a 12-percent drop in crop receipts with a decline of only 4 percent in receipts from livestock and products. Prices as a whole have averaged about 4 percent below last year, and the volume of marketings has been slightly smaller.

Declines in the 7-month totals of cash receipts are indicated in varying degrees for all the important commodity groups except tobacco, meat animals, and fruits. Receipts from tobacco have been a little higher than in the corresponding period last year, but little change is evident for either meat animals or fruits.

**REVISED ESTIMATES OF CASH RECEIPTS AND HOME CONSUMPTION,
1948 AND 1949**

Recent revisions in the estimates of cash receipts from farm marketings move the 1949 total slightly higher, but make almost no change in total cash receipts for 1948. The upward shift in 1949 occurred more in the estimates for livestock and products than in the crop estimates. But percentage revisions in receipts from some of the individual groups were considerably larger in both years than revisions in either the livestock or crop totals.

Total cash receipts in 1949 are now estimated at 28.1 billion dollars, up 2 percent from the previously published estimate of 27.5 billion dollars. Revisions for 1948, however, produce a net reduction of only 1 million dollars, and the total still rounds to 30.5 billion dollars.

The value of home-consumed farm products in 1949 is now estimated at 2.5 billion dollars, down 9 percent from the previous estimate. The revised estimate for 1948 is 2.9 billion dollars, 7 percent less than the estimate published a year ago.

Cash receipts in 1948

The revised estimates of cash receipts for 1948 show only small differences from those published in the June 1949 issue of The Farm Income Situation. In general, the revisions reflect adjustments in the estimated volume of marketings during the calendar year, with small increases for dairy products, poultry and eggs, wheat, and cotton offset by a small r volume indicated for some of the other crops.

Cash receipts in 1949

Revisions for 1949 increase total cash receipts by a little more than 2 percent to 28.1 billion dollars. Upward revisions are nearly 3 percent in the total for livestock and products, and a little more than 1 percent in the crop total. The estimate for meat animals is up nearly 5 percent because marketings of cattle and calves were somewhat understated in the earlier estimate. Marketings of chickens and eggs are also slightly larger in the revised data.

The small upward correction in crop receipts is chiefly because of a rather substantial increase in the estimate for food grains. Sales of wheat and rye were somewhat larger in the calendar year 1949 than current information had indicated. The revisions also show increases in receipts from potatoes, sweetpotatoes, and truck crops, accounting for the change of about 9 percent in the estimate of vegetable receipts. Receipts from oil-bearing crops are up a little, reflecting larger sales of peanuts than had previously been reported. Slightly larger marketings also account for the upward revision in receipts from tobacco.

Changes in cash receipts, 1948-49

The revisions generally bring the 1949 estimates a little closer to those of 1948 than was previously the case; and total cash receipts from marketings last year are now estimated as having been 8 percent below the 1948 level instead of 10 percent as indicated by earlier estimates. Receipts from livestock and products are found to be down 10 instead of 12 percent in 1949.

and total crop receipts show a 6-percent decline instead of 7 percent. The estimates for meat animals especially are drawn closer together by the revisions, with 1949 showing a drop of 10 rather than 14 percent. The change for dairy products is not significantly affected by the revisions, but poultry and eggs now show a decline of only 1 percent in 1949 as compared with 3 percent in the earlier estimates.

The revisions for crops drew the 1948 and 1949 estimates closer together for all commodity groups except fruits and nuts. The 1949 declines in receipts from food grains, oil-bearing crops, tobacco, and vegetables are smaller than previously indicated, and the gains previously shown for feed crops and cotton are also smaller. In the case of fruits and nuts, revised estimates indicate a 3-percent decline in 1949, whereas earlier estimates involved an increase of 2 percent.

Value of home consumption

The value of all home-consumed farm products in 1948 is now estimated at 2,936 million dollars, down 7 percent from the previous estimate of 3,155 million dollars. For 1949, the estimate is reduced about 9 percent to 2,504 million dollars. These revisions are much larger than those ordinarily required in this category. For both years, they arise almost entirely from corrections in data underlying the estimates for truck crops and forest products.
