In 1960, realized gross farm income was estimated at a record \$38.1 billion, due primarily to a rise in cash receipts from farm marketings. Production expenses at \$26.4 billion were up only fractionally from 1959, in contrast to sharp year-to-year increases for earlier years. With income up more than expenses in 1960, realized net farm income at \$11.7 billion was 4 cent larger than in 1959.

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## FARM INCOME IN THE FIRST HALF OF 1961

Farmers' realized net income in the first half of 1961 was estimated at an annual rate close to \$12.6 billion. This was 12 percent more than in the first half of 1960 and about 7 percent above the revised estimate for the full year 1960.

Cash receipts from farm marketings in the first half of this year totaled more than 3 percent above the first half of 1960. For January-June 1961, prices of all farm products averaged almost 1 percent above January-June 1960 while the volume of farm marketings was estimated about 3 percent larger than a year earlier. In the first quarter of this year, cash receipts totaled more than 9 percent above the same period in 1960 when lower prices, particularly for livestock, and a depressed level of crop marketings contributed to reduced cash receipts. But in the past quarter, April-June 1961, cash receipts from marketings were estimated somewhat lower than a year earlier due mainly to price declines for cattle and poultry in recent months.

Farm income in the first half of this year was supplemented by advance payments to participants in the 1961 feed grain program. Through June 2, certificates covering about \$265.3 million worth of grain had been issued to farmers and total payments under the program could total more than \$700 million in 1961.

Production expenses of farm operators in the first half of this year were estimated just above early 1960 with cost rates in the main holding fairly stable. As usual in recent years, interest charges and property taxes moved up this year. However, farm wage rates through June were virtually unchanged from the first half of 1960. Among major production items, motor vehicles,

feed, feeder livestock and seed prices averaged lower, while farm machinery and supplies, motor supplies and fertilizer prices were higher than a year earlier through June 1961.

#### FARM INCOME REVISIONS, 1958-60

Results of revisions on estimates of farm marketings, production expenses, and other components of farm income for 1960 resulted in a realized net income to farm operators of \$11.7 billion. This is up slightly from the earlier preliminary estimate of \$11.6 billion. Changes in livestock numbers and marketings of livestock, and dairy products based on the 1959 Census of Agriculture resulted in some downward revision in realized net incomes in 1958 and 1959.

Small revisions anticipated for crops on the basis of the 1959 Census will be made as the data become available. Farm income and expenditure estimates for the U. S. in this report do not yet include data for Hawaii and Alaska.

Quarterly estimates of farm income, seasonally adjusted annual rate, are revised in this issue for 1958-60 in line with revised annual totals. (Table 1) The estimates for 1957, also given in Table 1, and those for earlier years, were not revised. Previously published estimates for the first quarter of 1961 are revised slightly in line with new information on components of farm income.

#### CASH RECEIPTS FROM MARKETINGS

Total cash receipts from farm marketings in January-June 1961 were \$14.4 billion, more than 3 percent above the same period of 1960. Receipts were 9 percent larger in the first quarter than a year earlier, but totaled about 2 percent less in April-June 1961 than in April-June 1960.

Farmers received an estimated \$9.4 billion from livestock and products during the first half of 1961, about 3 percent more than for the same period a year earlier. A sustained high level of marketings of cattle and calves and broilers helped maintain receipts in the face of recent price declines for these items. Cash returns from hogs were up around 11 percent and those from dairy products over 3 percent from the 1st half of 1960.

Crop receipts at \$5.0 billion during the first half of 1961 were up about 5 percent from a year earlier reflecting marketings from the large 1960 production. Receipts were higher for food grains, feed crops, cotton, tobacco, and oil crops. Cash returns from oranges, reflecting smaller marketings and higher prices, were sharply higher and contributed largely to the increase in receipts from fruits and nuts. On the other hand, sharply lower potato prices reduced receipts from vegetables compared to the January-June 1960 period.

Tentative estimates for June 1961 place cash receipts from farm marketings at \$2.4 billion, down about 2 percent from June 1960. Lower meat animal and poultry prices and a reduced volume of crop marketings from a year earlier accounted for the decrease in total cash receipts. Livestock receipts were estimated at \$1.5 billion this June and crops \$0.9 billion, down 2 and 3 percent, respectively, from June 1960.

## VOLUME OF FARM MARKETINGS, 1961

Despite a sharp drop in the 1961 planted acreage and indicated acreage for harvest of crops (as of July 1), the aggregate volume of farm marketings may be down only slightly (Table 2). This assumes that weather and growing conditions for the remainder of this year will not worsen.

Prospective output of food and feed grains in 1961 will be less than in 1960. But the carryover into 1961 from the very large food grain output and the record feed grain outturn in 1960 will maintain 1961 marketings at a high level. Moreover, indicated soybean acreage is up about 15 percent from 1960 and upland cotton plantings are indicated 3 percent more than in 1960.

Marketings of livestock and livestock products in 1961 will probably be slightly larger than in 1960. Movement of cattle and calves to market is likely to exceed last year while little change is expected in the volume of hog marketings. Poultry and egg marketings, in total, will be above 1960, with marketings of broilers and turkeys expected to be at record levels.

## REVISIONS IN ANNUAL ESTIMATES FOR THE UNITED STATES, 1958-60

The following historical tables carry estimates of gross farm income, production expenses, net farm income, and related series back to 1910 on an annual basis for the United States. A supplement to this issue, to be released shortly, will contain State estimates for 1949 to 1960 for many of the important components of cash receipts and expenditures.

Revisions for most of the series are limited to the years 1958-1960 and are based on more complete current information as well as some new information provided by the 1959 Census of Agriculture. These revisions do not wholly reflect the new data from the 1959 Census of Agriculture since much of the new information is not yet available. Revisions for livestock and livestock products, however, are available and have been incorporated in gross farm income estimates. Revisions for gross income from crops are yet to be made. For certain production expenses, revisions have been made on the basis of changes indicated between the 1954 and the 1959 Censuses of Agriculture. However, because of the necessity of integrating farm accounts into national income totals, many of the items in production expenses are still tied to the previously published 1957 levels.

The changes in net farm income have been slight with respect to previously published estimates of farm operators' realized net income, although major revisions have been made in some of the components.

Revised income and expenditure estimates do not extend back to 1955, thus estimates for some earlier years are not strictly comparable with the revised estimates for 1958-1960. But the discrepancies are probably relatively small. Revisions back to 1955 will be made in conjunction with the issuance of the next National Income Supplement to the Survey of Current Business, for release in July 1962. Revisions that may be required in the crop components of gross income will be made back to 1958 when the new benchmark data from the 1959 Census of Agriculture become available, and back to 1955 when the next National Income Supplement is issued.

New definitions adopted in the 1959 Census of Agriculture together with the long-run decline in farms have reduced the number of farms in 1959 by about 20 percent from the number in 1954, according to preliminary results of the Census. Various comprehensive analyses and appraisals are yet to be made of these results and final figures on the number of farms will be available later this year. However, tentative estimates of the number of farms have been developed in order to derive realistic interim approximations of per farm income for the period 1954-60. These approximations will be firmed up when official USDA estimates of farm numbers are available.

A complete analysis and evaluation of 1959 Census data on the farm population and other information is being made. Special emphasis is being given to the adjustments required in previous estimates to make them consistent with the new definitions of a farm and the farm population. The definition changes have also raised problems of comparability and level changes in the series on

per farm and per capita income from both farm and nonfarm sources. Results of the 1960 Sample Survey of Agriculture will permit adjustments in the per farm and per capita income estimates. The Sample Survey contained questions relating to income by source, both from the farm and other sources, on the basis of the new definitions. These will provide new benchmark data on which to base adjustments. Previously published tables on population and per capita income, therefore, are deleted in this issue. A revised series will be made available as soon as possible after the results of the Survey are released and appraised.

## FARM INCOME CONCEPTS: THEIR MEANING AND MEASUREMENT

The Department of Agriculture publishes regularly a comprehensive set of income estimates relating to agriculture which have been developed over more than a third of a century. (See the preceding tables.) On occasion, these measures are misunderstood. The purpose of this article is to describe briefly the principal concepts involved in the farm income estimates and how they are measured.

Basically the estimates center around two major concepts of farm income.

One views agriculture as a business or industry, measuring gross farm income, farm production expenses, and finally the net return to farm operators for their farm work (including that of their families) and for the capital invested in their farms and equipment. The most commonly used measure of the net return from agriculture is--Realized Net Income of Farm Operators from Farming.

The other major concept relates to the people who live on farms and the incomes they have available for purchasing the goods and services in the American standard of living. This concept recognizes that there are some people living on farms, such as farm laborers and their families, in addition to people in farm operator families, and also that farm people receive a significant part of their income from nonfarm sources as well as from the farm. The series appropriate to this concept is--Income of the Farm Population from All Sources.

These two major series are derived from the various components, or building blocks, of the farm income estimates. Generally, the individual components are important series in their own right, providing insight into the major economic forces affecting the over-all farm income situation.

The components used in calculating the realized net and total net income of farm operators from farming for 1960 are shown in the following table:

Realized gross farm income includes 3 principal components:

1. Cash receipts from farm marketings of farm products represent gross receipts from commercial market sales as well as loans (net of redemptions) made or guaranteed by CCC and purchases under price support programs.
2. Government payments to farmers are those made directly to farmers in connection with farm programs such as the Soil Bank, Agricultural Conservation, and Wool Incentive Programs.
3. Nonmoney income includes farm products consumed directly in farm households (valued at average prices received by farmers) and the value of housing provided by farm dwellings (determined in relation to the value of the dwellings).

Farm production expenses comprise the aggregate costs incurred in farm production. They include current farm operating expenses for such items as wages paid to hired labor (in cash and in kind) and outlays for repairs of equipment and operation of the farm, as well as interfarm purchases of feed, seed, and livestock. Overhead-type costs include charges for depreciation and other capital consumption, taxes on farm property, and net rents paid to nonfarm landlords.

Expenditures on new buildings, motor vehicles, and other capital equipment, estimated in arriving at gross capital expenditures in agriculture, are not included as a production cost. Production expenses include instead an allowance for annual depreciation and other capital consumption.

Estimates of depreciation are based on replacement cost, which is the amount necessary at current prices to replace buildings and equipment used up during the year. Thus, after a period of substantial price increase, as has occurred since World War II, the current replacement cost basis results in larger depreciation charges than would estimates on an original cost basis. The difference is estimated at around \$0.9 billion per year for recent years.

Farm operators' realized net income represents what is left from realized gross farm income after deducting farm production expenses. This is substantially the net income realized from sales.

Net change in farm inventories measures the change in physical quantities of each crop and live-stock product on farms, valued at average prices prevailing during the year. For some purposes, particularly for combining with the national income estimates of the nonfarm economy, which measure the net value of production, it is necessary to take into account changes in farm inventories. However, it should be kept in mind that a buildup in inventories is "unrealized" until sold and that prices realized at the time of sale may be considerably different from those prevailing during the year of accumulation.

Farm operators' total net income is their realized net income plus or minus the net change in inventories. It is the figure included in the National Income Estimates of the U. S. Department of Commerce.

Farm wages of laborers on farms represent the income received by farm laborers living on farms from wages paid by farm operators.

It should be noted that in some instances there are needs for special series beyond those regularly published by the Department. Some businesses concerned with the size of the farm market for their products might well find significance in the total gross cash flow to farm people--i.e., the total money available for spending whether for production or living purposes. A rearrangement of existing published series is easily made to provide such a measure.

The Department has developed a comprehensive system of farm income statistics to meet most needs, but there are still some gaps. Most important is the lack of current information on income trends within agriculture, particularly as between commercial operations with large investments in land, buildings, and equipment and noncommercial farms where farm income is small but nonfarm income relatively large. To obtain such information would require periodic special surveys at considerable expense.
