STATE ESTIMATES OF FARM INCOME
1949-63

Aggregate estimates of gross farm income, production expenses, net farm income, and related data by States and Regions from 1949 to 1963 are presented in this report. Also included are State and regional averages per farm of realized gross, realized net, and total net income (see map charts, pages 4 and 5, for a graphic presentation of the 1963 averages).

Revised annual estimates of cash receipts and the value of home consumption are given, by States, for 1962 and 1963. Also, cash receipts from farm marketings by commodity groups and individual commodities are shown as revised by States for 1962 and 1963.

State estimates presented herein incorporate the latest available information from Government and private sources relative to production, marketings, prices, and inputs. Preliminary State estimates, presented for 1963 in FIS-193, February 1964 to provide a timely review of the farm income situation, were based on fragmentary information. The estimates and the movement in farm income previously presented for the individual States have in some cases changed, not only because of revisions in 1963 data, but because of revisions in the 1962 estimates.

Because of the necessity of integrating farm income accounts into national income totals, estimates for the years prior to 1961 are not changed from previously published estimates. A general revision of the State estimates from 1950 to date is currently in process.

The data in this report cover the 48 conterminous States. Estimates are not available for the States of Alaska and Hawaii.

Dollars Per Farm, 1963

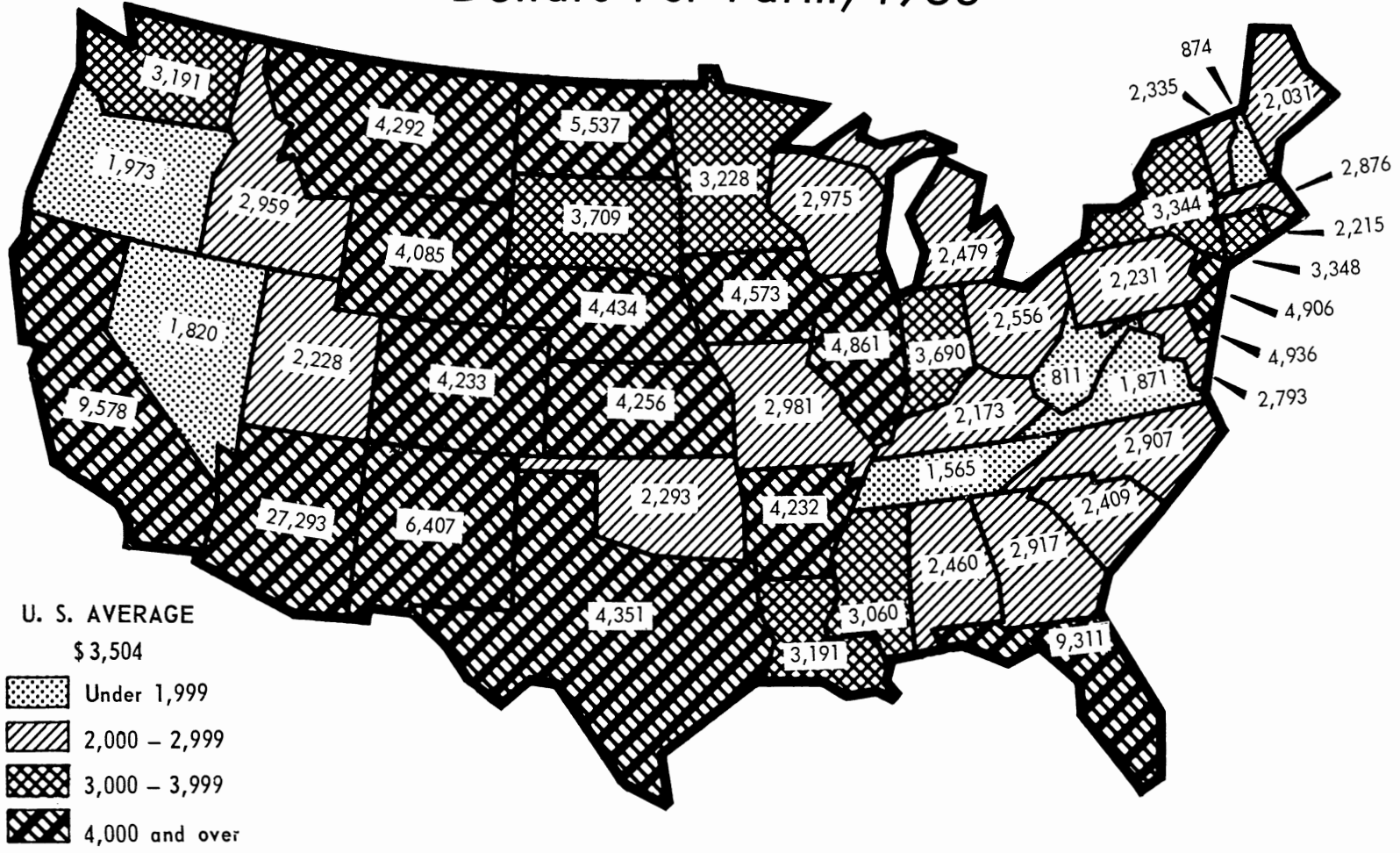
