


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# FARM INCOME SITUATION





JULY 1965

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Farm production expenses in '64 dropped some \$300 million from 1963 to a level of \$29,249 million. This decline followed increases in each of the past 10 years; only one other time since '60 did expenses decline. The drop last year came about mainly because of reduced outlays for hired labor and purchased feed and livestock. Prices paid by farmers for feed were down slightly. Feeder cattle prices were down about 15 percent from 1963, and the number moving to feedlots was also lower. A sharp drop in the number of hired farmworkers more than offset higher farm wage rates. Overall costs continued rising during '64.

## FARM INCOME--FIRST HALF OF 1965

Income and Expenses

Realized net farm income of the Nation's farmers in January-June 1965 was estimated at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$13.8 billion--fully a billion dollars above the rate in the first half of 1964. Rising farm prices in April, May, and June this year, particularly for meat animals, were the major factor in the brightening farm income picture for 1965. With the prospects for harvest generally favorable, according to the July Crop Report, realized net farm income in 1965 may well turn out the highest since 1953. However, prices will likely ease off during the second half of the year.

Realized gross farm income in the first half of 1965 was more than \$43 billion, seasonally adjusted annual rate, 3 percent above a year earlier. Cash receipts from farm marketings and Government payments to farmers were both at a higher rate than a year earlier.

Production expenses also rose, but not as fast as realized gross income. Seasonally adjusted at annual rates, expenses through June this year were estimated at \$29.8 billion, some \$400 million more than a year earlier. Prices paid by farmers for production items, interest, taxes, and wage rates were 2.5 percent higher this January-June than in January-June 1964. Feeder cattle have risen sharply in price in recent months, and purchased feed prices have also moved well above 1964 levels.

Commodity Receipts

Marketings in the first half of this year brought in an estimated \$15.9 billion, about \$700 million more than in the corresponding period of 1964. Livestock and product receipts were about \$550 million higher and crop receipts were up about \$150 million. The volume of livestock product marketings was about the same in January-June 1965 as a year earlier, but prices averaged 6 percent higher. The volume of crop marketings this January-June was estimated slightly higher than in January-June 1964 while prices for all crops averaged almost 2 percent lower.

Receipts from marketings of cattle and calves and hogs in the first half of this year are estimated some \$500 million higher than a year earlier. Cattle prices at the farm have been rising sharply, and this June were \$4.00 per cwt., or about one-fifth, higher than in June 1964. Cattle marketings through June this year were larger in volume than in January-June 1964. Hog prices received by farmers were 25 percent above a year earlier in the first half of this year, and in June were 50 percent higher than in June 1964. Hog slaughter was down almost 10 percent from 1964 levels in the first half of this year.

Broiler prices also strengthened, and were about 8 percent higher than in January-June 1964. Farmers received 15.7 cents per pound for broilers in June

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1965 compared with 14.0 cents per pound in June 1964. Marketings of broilers were 3 percent larger in volume during January-June 1965 than in the first half of 1964. Prospects are that the volume of broiler marketings will pick up sharply later this year.

Some small increase in receipts from milk marketings occurred in the first half of 1965 compared with a year earlier. Both prices and the volume of milk sold to plants and dealers were up slightly over year-ago levels.

Cash receipts from farm marketings of vegetables during the first half of 1965 increased sharply compared with January-June 1964. Potato marketings were moderately smaller in volume, but prices were almost double a year earlier resulting in an increase of some \$200 million. Truck crop receipts were about one-tenth higher due mainly to more favorable prices as market volume showed little change from 1964 levels.

For fruits, lower prices on the average more than offset a larger volume of farm marketings and cash receipts were down about 3 percent from the first half of 1964. Orange prices declined in the face of increased supplies resulting in a drop in receipts for this most important cash product in the fruits and tree nuts commodity group. Changes in receipts from a year earlier were mixed for most other fruits marketed in the past six months, and were generally small dollarwise.

Receipts from farm marketings of soybeans also were estimated higher this January-June than a year ago, mainly as a result of prices averaging about 12 percent higher. Soybean prices will remain strong until the new crop is ready for harvest from the record planted acreage of 35.6 million acres.

Receipts from egg marketings were estimated down some \$60 million in the first half of this year from a year earlier. Lower egg prices were responsible for the decline.

Despite higher prices for corn at the farm, receipts from this most important crop were slightly lower than in January-June 1964 due to a reduced volume of marketings. Lower prices for wheat resulted in smaller receipts during the first half of 1965 compared with January-June 1964, but certificate and diversion payments will supplement wheat growers' income this year. Tobacco receipts were also lower as marketings were well below the volume sold a year earlier.

#### Government Payments to Farmers

Through May this year (June figures not available) payments to farmers under all programs were reported at \$584 million compared with \$551 million in January-May 1964. Direct payments to farmers for the entire year 1965 are expected to be almost 10 percent higher than the \$2,169 million paid out in 1964.

#### CASH RECEIPTS, JUNE 1965

Tentative estimates for June 1965 place cash receipts from farm marketings in that month at about \$3.0 billion, up about \$350 million from June 1964. Compared with a year earlier, livestock and products prices averaged 18 percent higher while crop prices were unchanged. The volume of livestock marketings this June was about the same as in June 1964. Crop marketings were moderately larger in volume than a year earlier.

Most of the bulge in receipts over a year ago came from beef and hog marketings at much higher prices. Potato marketings were noticeably above a year earlier and prices, although still higher than a year earlier, edged closer to 1964 levels.

Livestock receipts in June 1965 are estimated at \$1.8 billion, and crop receipts at \$1.2 billion.

#### VOLUME OF FARM MARKETINGS, 1965

The total volume of farm marketings in 1965 is expected to be almost the same as the record of last year based on conditions as of July 1, 1964. Marketings of livestock and livestock products may be close to the 1964 volume. Crop marketings probably will be down slightly from 1964. Carryover marketings from 1964 crops are small, and farmers may add to inventories.

Marketings of cattle and calves this year may be slightly larger in volume than those of last year. Hog slaughter is expected to be down sharply this year--probably by 10 percent or more. Prospects are that 1964 milk

production will be up slightly, and the volume of milk sold to plants and dealers will be slightly larger than in 1964. Marketings of eggs likely will be about the same as in 1964. Broiler marketings are expected to accelerate in the second half of this year, and for the year likely will be 5 percent or more larger in volume than the 1964 level.

Crops planted for 1965 harvest total 308 million acres--1.5 million more than the 1964 total and 2 percent above the record low of 301 million acres planted for 1962 harvest. Total acreage of feed grains declined, although sorghum plantings exceed last year. Corn production is forecast at 3.9 billion bushels, 10 percent more than last year's drought reduced crop. Soybean acreage planted is estimated at a record high of 35.6 million acres, up 12 percent from 1964. The late summer potato crop is estimated to be 12 percent above the 1964 crop. Sugar beet acreage is down 9 percent, but indicated yields are somewhat higher than in 1964. All wheat production is estimated at 1,354 million bushels, 5 percent more than last year. The initial forecast of 1965 production of all tobacco is 10 percent smaller than last year, resulting mostly from a reduced acreage for harvest.

On July 1, 1965 prospects for all crops as reported by farmers to the Crop Reporting Board are rated as good-to-excellent over more of the Nation than a year ago. Development of 1965 crops lagged somewhat behind the normal pace. Only a few pockets of poor-to-fair prospects were scattered in the important North Central region.

#### FARM INCOME IN 1964

Revised estimates show realized net farm income at \$12.9 billion in 1964, up \$0.4 billion from the \$12.5 billion in 1963. The increase in 1964 was partly due to larger-than-usual marketings from farm inventories. An increase in Government payments and a decline in farm production expenses were also contributing factors in the increase.

The physical volume of farm inventories declined in 1964 for the first time since 1956. The value of the net change in farm inventories went from a plus \$0.6 billion in 1963 to a minus \$0.8 billion in 1964, a downward swing of \$1.4 billion. Total net farm income (realized net farm income adjusted for inventory change) was \$12.1 billion in 1964, down \$1 billion from the \$13.1 billion in 1963.

Gross farm income realized in 1964 is estimated at a record high of \$42.2 billion, some \$100 million more than in 1963. A rise in direct Government payments to farmers of about \$500 million more than offset a drop in cash receipts from farm marketings. The value of home consumption of farm products declined again, and is now estimated at less than \$1 billion.

There was a drop of \$300 million in total farm production expenses following increases in each of the last ten years. The decline in 1964 resulted mainly from sizeable reductions in estimated outlays for purchased feed and livestock and hired labor. The usual rise in overhead costs offset some of the drop in current operating expenses last year.

Realized net income per farm from farming in 1964 was a record high \$3,727 compared with \$3,499 in 1963. This sharp rise resulted from the increase in aggregate realized net income in 1964 and a continuation of the annual decline in farm numbers of about 3 percent. The 1964 rate of realized net income per farm was about one-fourth higher than that in 1960 (Table 3H, page 51).

The disposable personal income per capita of the farm population last year is estimated at \$1,270, down slightly from the \$1,290 in 1963. This series covering 1934-64 is in line with revised farm income estimates, and reflects the increasing number of farm operators who do not live on farms, as well as the decreasing proportion of hired farm workers who are farm residents. This revision has lowered the level of personal income of the farm population in recent years. With the personal income per capita of the nonfarm population increasing as the economy continues to advance, the per capita disposable income of the farm population in 1964 is now estimated at about 55 percent of that of nonfarm people (Tables 4H-6H, pages 52-54).

#### FARM INCOME REVISIONS

In the Farm Income Situation each July, regularly scheduled routine revisions are made in the estimates of gross income and expenses for the several preceding years. These revisions incorporate the latest information available relating to production, marketings, prices, and inputs from Government and private sources.

In addition to the regularly scheduled routine revisions, this report contains revised estimates of the components of gross income and expenses back to 1910. The revisions are relatively small prior to 1946. These revisions have been incorporated into historical tables in this report starting on page 47.

Quarterly estimates of farm income, at seasonally adjusted annual rates, have been revised for 1946-64 in line with the revised annual totals and new quarterly pattern of receipts for 1962-64. These data are presented in table 1 for the entire period, 1946-64, along with a revised estimate for the first quarter of 1965 which has also been changed in line with new levels and new information on the components of farm income.

The revised farm income estimates presented in this report will be incorporated into revised National Income Accounts of the Department of Commerce, to be published soon in the Survey of Current Business, a monthly release of the Office of Business Economics, Department of Commerce.

#### DISTRIBUTIONS BY VALUE OF SALES CLASS, 1959-64

Tables 1D through 5D, pages 72-77, show distributions for 1959-64 on the number of farms and realized gross and net income of farm operators from farming according to value of sales classes and the average income position of farm operator families by value of sales class.

The estimates reveal many aspects of the farm income situation that are not apparent from the aggregates and averages for all farms combined. In 1964, for example, an estimated 1,010 thousand farms with sales of \$10,000 or more accounted for \$31.6 billion in cash receipts (including Government payments) out of a total \$39.1 billion for all farms combined. In relative terms, this group comprising 29.1 percent of all farms accounted for 80.7 percent of cash receipts in 1964. Furthermore, this same group of farms accounted for 64.3 percent of total realized net income in 1964.

The total income position--off-farm income as well as farm income--of farm families in the various sales groups reveal several significant aspects of the total income structure within agriculture. For example, about \$8 out of every \$10 of the total income of farm families in the \$10,000-\$19,999 sales group came from farm sources. As the scale of farming operations declines, the relative dependence upon off-farm sources of income increases.

#### ALASKA AND HAWAII CASH RECEIPTS, 1960-64

Data are presented for the first time in this report in Table 3 on cash receipts from farm marketings for Alaska and Hawaii, and for the United States (50 States). Cash receipts from farm marketings in Alaska are estimated at slightly over \$4 million a year. For Hawaii, they ranged between \$150 million and \$186 million a year.

## HISTORICAL TABLES

Estimates of farm income and related data for the United States (excluding Alaska and Hawaii) are presented in the following tables. Data for most of the series are available from 1910 to date. However, because of space limitations, the annual data for 1910 through 1914 and 1915 through 1919 have been combined into two averages. The personal income estimates series start in 1934 and for national income in 1929.

In addition to the regularly scheduled routine revisions which incorporate the latest information available relating to production, marketings, prices, and inputs from Government and private sources, this report contains revised estimates of the components of gross income and expenses back to 1910. The revisions from 1946-64 are fairly large for some components and accounts. These revisions are incorporated into the following historical tables, 1H through 22H.

The revisions for 1958 through 1963 did not change appreciably the net income estimates for those years. In some of the years such as 1962 and 1963, an upward revision in the level of cash receipts from farm marketings was about offset by an upward revision in the level of farm production expenses. In other years such as 1958-61 the changes in the components of farm income were very small resulting in changes in net farm income of less than \$100 million.

The revisions in farm income in 1946-57 resulted in a reduction in both realized and total net income in all years. The imputed value of home consumption was revised downward during the period in line with latest available information. A change in pricing meat animals used for home consumption was also a factor in the revisions. Also, cash receipts from farm marketings underwent a small downward revision in the period 1946-57. Some of the revisions in 1964 estimates of cash receipts from farm marketings resulted from a change in point of pricing for vegetables and fruits. Revised estimates of the value of the net change in farm inventories were fairly important in 1955, 1956; and 1957; changes in the other years 1946-54 were very small.

Most of the revisions in production expenses are of a statistical nature and are the adjustment of the historical series to the latest available benchmark data. In some cases the latter is the 1959 Census of Agriculture, in others the 1955 Survey of Farmers Expenditures and in others various independent research results. Adjustment to these benchmarks has been delayed because of the standard revision policy that limits revisions to the three years prior to the date of publication.

The capital investment accounts were the only accounts in which conceptual changes were made. These changes were as follows:

- (1) Depreciation rates for farm dwellings and service structures were increased to reflect more reasonable structure life;
- (2) The value of the stock of buildings on farms was adjusted to account for the decline in the number of farms;
- (3) Estimated expenditures by farmers for such soil conservation facilities as terraces, tile lines, drainage ditches and ponds were added to the investment account;
- (4) The depreciation rate for tractors was reduced; and,
- (5) The cost of using farm trucks for family living purposes, which had been included in production expenses, was estimated and excluded from three accounts--repairs and operation of farm capital items, depreciation of farm capital equipment, and farm capital investment.

The revised farm income estimates presented in this report will be incorporated into revised National Income and Product Accounts of the Department of Commerce, to be published soon in the Survey of Current Business, a monthly release of the Office of Business Economics, Department of Commerce. Total national and personal income data in the tables in this report may differ from revisions to be published by the Department of Commerce.

INCOME OF FARM OPERATOR FAMILIES  
BY VALUE OF SALES CLASS

Estimates in the following tables, 1D through 5D, covering 1959-64 reveal many aspects of the farm income situation that are not apparent from the aggregates and averages from all farms combined. They show generally that relatively few farms in the higher value of sales classes account for the bulk of cash receipts and realized net income. In 1964, for example, an estimated 1,010 thousand farms with sales of \$10,000 or more accounted for \$31.6 billion in cash receipts (including Government payments) out of a total \$39.1 billion for all farms combined. In relative terms, this group comprising 29.1 percent of all farms accounted for 80.7 percent of cash receipts in 1964. Furthermore, this same group of farms accounted for 64.3 percent of total realized net income in 1964.

The total income position--off-farm income as well as farm income--of farm families in the various sales groups shown in table 5D reveal several significant aspects of the income structure within Agriculture. For example, of the average total income in 1964 for farm families in the \$10,000-\$19,999 sales group, by far the largest share came from farm sources--about \$8 out of every \$10 of total income.

Table 5D shows that as the scale of farming operations declines from the \$20,000 and over level, the relative dependence upon off-farm sources increases. For example, for the \$20,000 and over level farm operator families derive less than \$2 of every \$10 of total income from off-farm sources while in the less than \$2,500 sales group, about \$7.50 out of every \$10 of total income came from off-farm sources.

The series in the following tables are a continuation of the series first published in the November 1964 Farm Income Situation which covered the years 1959-63. The estimates of income of farm operators from farming operations by value of sales classes are consistent with, and are breakdowns of, the farm income estimates published in this report. There has been some redistribution of the number of farms in each sales class group from the previously published series, but the number of farms in the over and under \$10,000 sales class group has remained essentially unchanged.

## FARM INCOME CONCEPTS: THEIR MEANING AND MEASUREMENT

The Department of Agriculture publishes regularly a comprehensive set of income estimates relating to agriculture which have been developed over more than a third of a century (see the preceding tables). The purpose of this article is to describe briefly the principal concepts involved in the farm income estimates and how they are measured.

Basically the estimates center around two major concepts of farm income.

One views agriculture as a business or industry, measuring gross farm income, farm production expenses, and finally the net return to farm operators for their farm work (including that of their families) and for the capital invested in their farms and equipment. The most commonly used measure of the net return from agriculture is--Realized Net Income of Farm Operators from Farming.

The other major concept relates to the people who live on farms and the incomes they have available for purchasing the goods and services in the American standard of living. This concept recognizes that there are some people living on farms, such as farm laborers and their families, in addition to people in farm operator families, and also that farm people receive a significant part of their income from nonfarm sources as well as from the farm. The series appropriate to this concept is--Personal Income of the Farm Population from All Sources.

These two major series are derived from the various components, or building blocks, of the farm income estimates. Generally, the individual components are important series in their own right, providing insight into the major economic forces affecting the over-all farm income situation.

The components used in calculating the realized net and total net income from farming for 1964 are shown in the following table:

Realized gross farm income includes 3 principal components:

1. Cash receipts from farm marketings of farm products represent gross receipts from commercial market sales as well as loans (net of redemptions) made or guaranteed by CCC and purchases under price support programs.
2. Government payments to farmers are those made directly to farmers in connection with farm programs such as the Soil Bank, Agricultural Conservation, and Wool Incentive Programs.
3. Nonmoney income includes farm products consumed directly in farm households (valued at average prices received by farmers) and the value of housing provided by farm dwellings (determined in relation to the value of the dwellings).

Farm production expenses comprise the aggregate costs incurred in farm production. They include current farm operating expenses for such items as wages paid to hired labor (in cash and in kind) and outlays for repairs of equipment and operation of the farm, as well as purchases of feed, seed, and livestock. Overhead-type costs include charges for depreciation and other capital consumption, taxes on farm property, and interest on the farm mortgage debt.

Expenditures on new buildings, motor vehicles, and other capital equipment are not included as a production cost. Production expenses include instead an allowance for annual depreciation and other capital consumption.

Estimates of depreciation are based on replacement cost, which is the amount necessary at current prices to replace buildings and equipment used up during the year. Thus, after a period of substantial price increase, as has occurred since World War II, the current replacement cost basis results in larger depreciation charges than would estimates on an original cost basis. The difference for farm machinery and equipment is estimated at around \$0.6 billion per year for recent years.

Farm operators' realized net income represents what is left from realized gross farm income after deducting farm production expenses. This is substantially the net income realized from sales.

Net change in farm inventories measures the change in physical quantities of livestock and crops on farms, valued at average prices prevailing during the year. For some purposes, particularly for combining with the national income estimates of the nonfarm economy, which measure the net value of production during the calendar year, it is necessary to take into account changes in farm inventories. However, it should be kept in mind that the value of a buildup in inventories is "unrealized" until sold and that prices realized at the time of sale may be considerably different from those prevailing during the year of accumulation.

Farm operators' total net income is their realized income plus or minus the value of the net change in inventories. It is the figure included in the national income estimates of the U. S. Department of Commerce as farm proprietors' income.

Farm wages of laborers on farms represents the income received by farm laborers living on farms from wages paid by farm operators.

Personal income of the farm population from all sources is the sum of the personal income of the farm population from farm and nonfarm sources. Personal income from farm sources is the total net income of farm operators, including Government payments, less the net income of nonresident farm operators, plus wages and salaries and other labor income of farm resident workers, less contributions of farm resident operators and workers to social insurance. Personal income of the farm population from nonfarm sources consists of income received from nonfarm wages and salaries, business and professional income, interest, and transfer payments, such as, unemployment compensation, social security, and veterans benefits. Also included is rental income from nonfarm sources and an estimate of income from items such as dividends and royalties.

The components used in calculating the personal income of the farm population are shown in the following table:

The per capita personal income of the farm population is derived by dividing the appropriate totals by the number of people living on farms.

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
