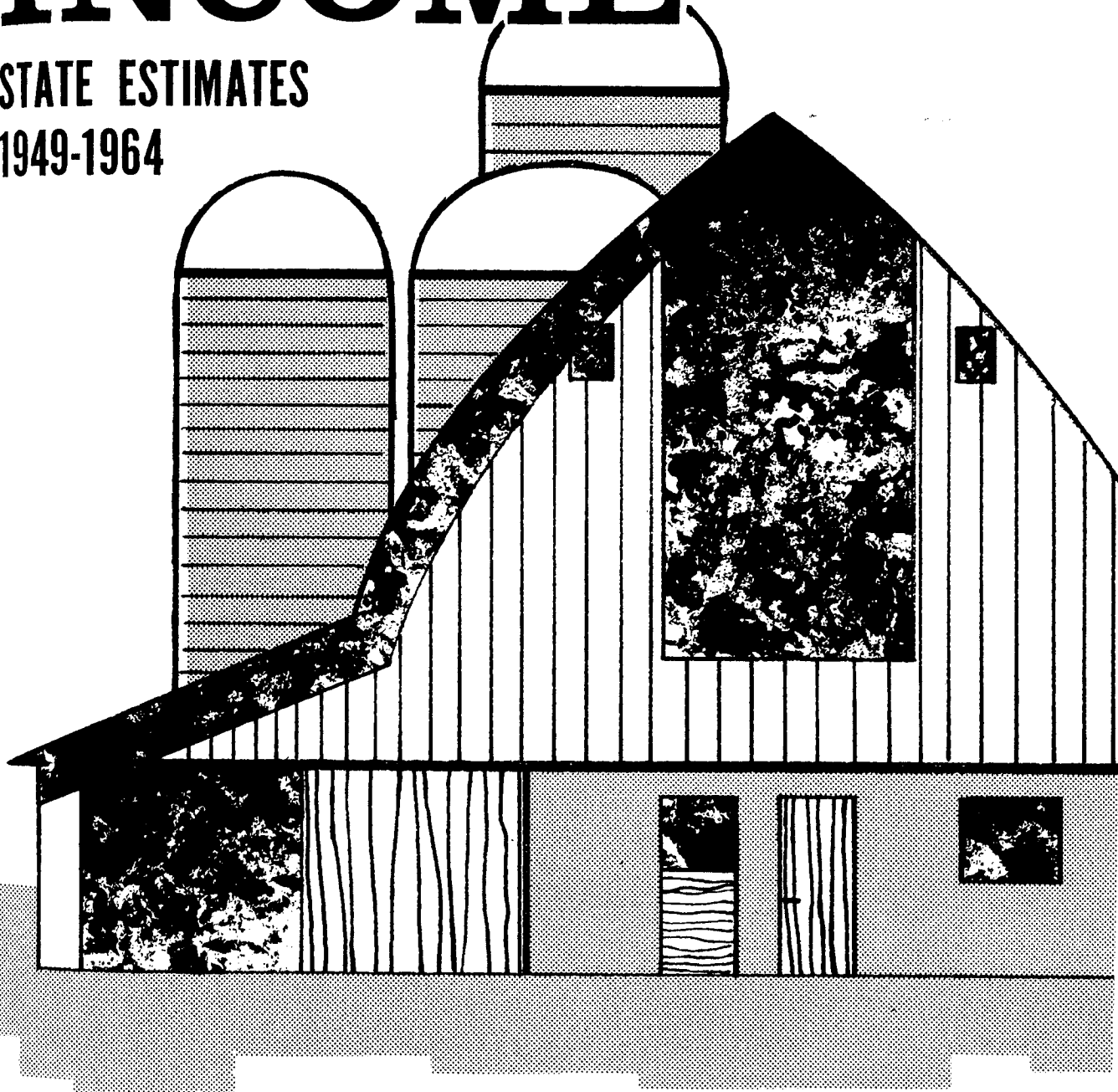

STATE ESTIMATES OF FARM INCOME, 1949-64

Aggregate estimates of gross farm income, production expenses, net farm income, and related data by states and regions from 1949 to 1964 are presented in this report for the 48 conterminous States. Also included for the first time in this report are estimates for Alaska and Hawaii covering 1960 to 1964.

The data for the 48 states incorporate the latest information available relating to production, marketings, prices, and inputs from Government and private sources. They reflect a general revision of farm income estimates which was recently completed, and are in line with revised 48-State totals presented in the July 1965 Farm Income Situation, FIS-199. The Alaska and Hawaii data have been developed mainly from basic production, marketing, and price data from the Statistical Reporting Service, from the 1959 Census of Agriculture, and from private sources.

Also presented in this report are revised annual estimates of cash receipts and the value of home consumption, by States, for 1962, 1963, and 1964. Cash receipts from farm marketings by commodity groups and individual commodities are shown as revised by States for 1963 and 1964. For 1962, State estimates of cash receipts by commodities are shown only if they differ from previously published estimates.

The State estimates presented herein may differ from previously published estimates because of the general revision in the farm income accounts and the incorporation of routine revisions for 1962, 1963, and 1964. The estimates and the movement in farm income presented for the individual States have in many cases changed from those previously presented in this report. Preliminary state estimates presented for 1964 in FIS-197, February 1965, provided a timely review of the farm income situation, but were based on fragmentary information. The revisions incorporated into this report for 1964 and prior years are believed to more accurately portray relationships among states as well as the changes over time in a particular State or region.

Realized net farm income as referred to in this report represents the net value of farm output sold or used by farm operators and their families. This is the most representative measure of farm income actually realized in a calendar year by farm operators, and is the primary measure of changes in their income position. It omits from consideration the value of any change in the inventory of crops and livestock held by farmers. Total net farm income which allows for the inventory change is also shown since it agrees with concepts used in the National Income Accounts of the Department of Commerce where it is called farm proprietors' income.

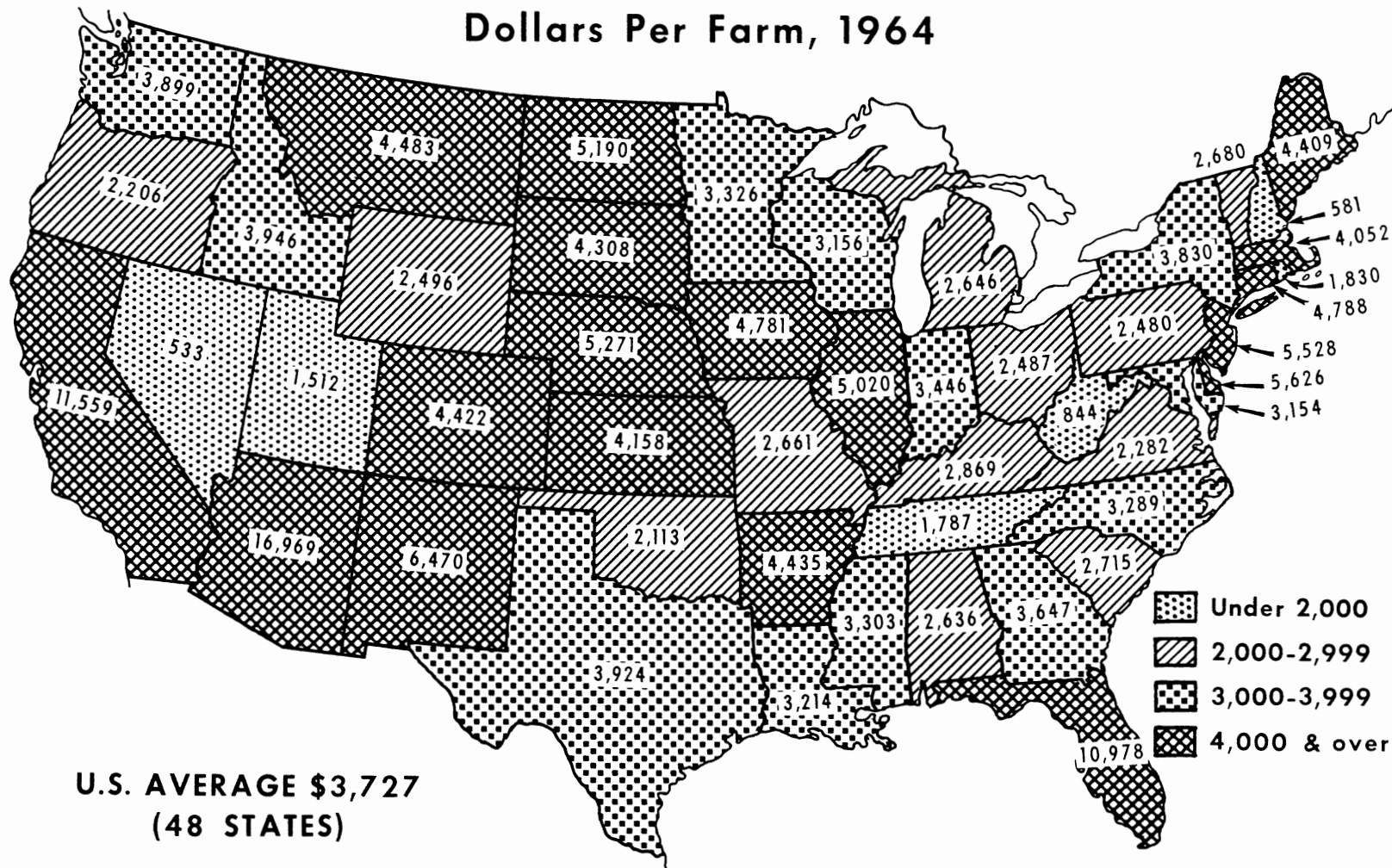

REALIZED NET FARM INCOME

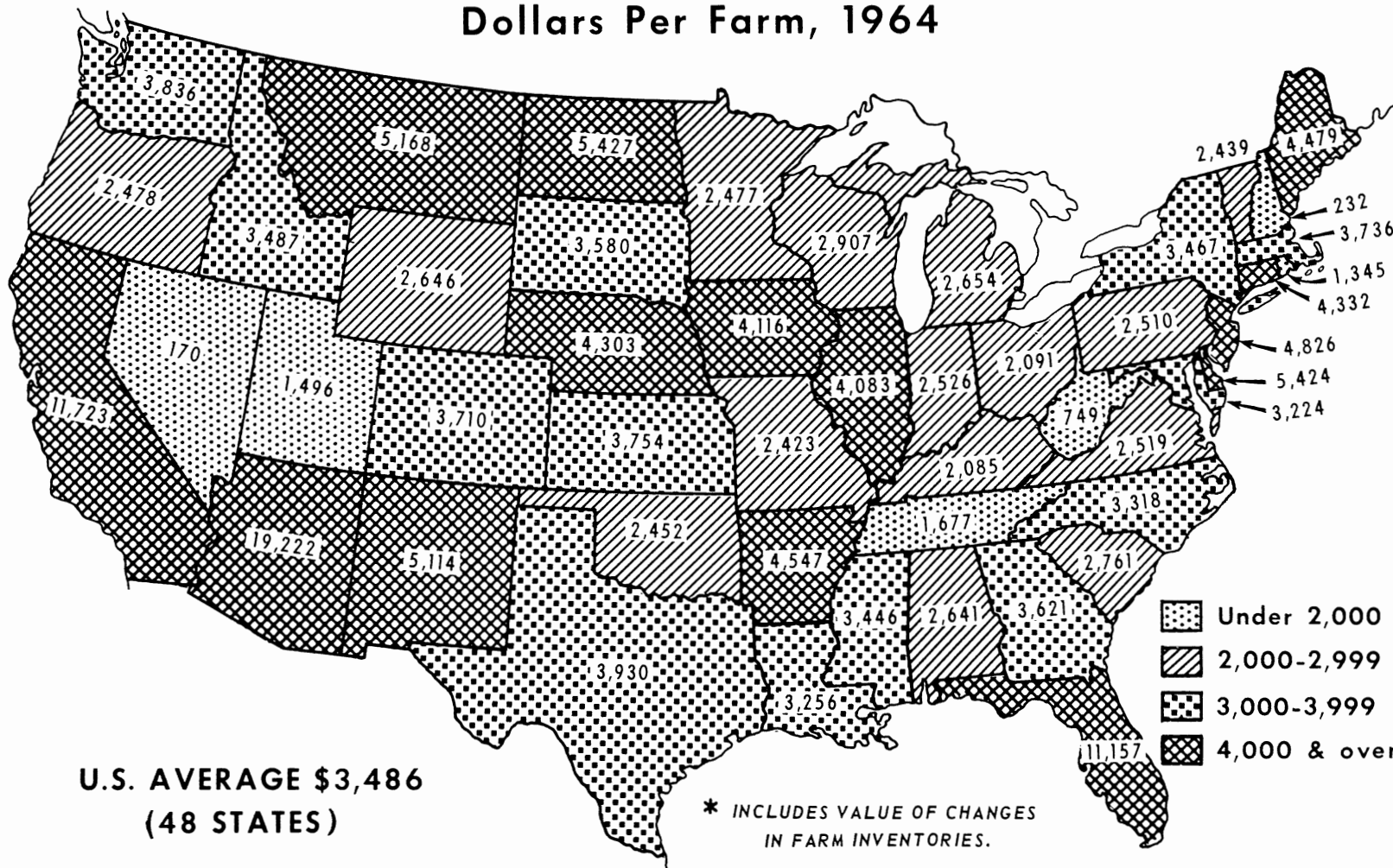
Dollars Per Farm, 1964
