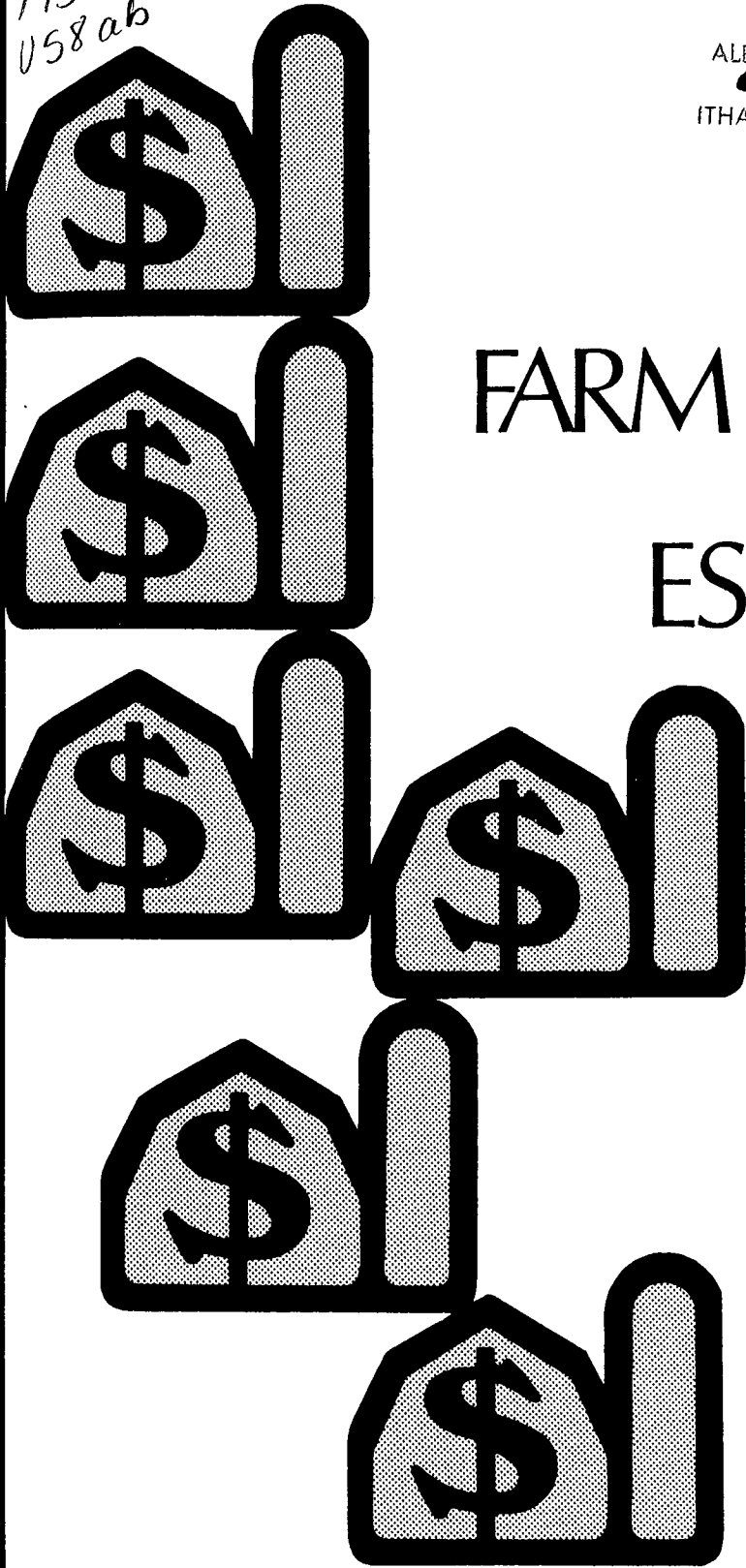

STATE ESTIMATES OF FARM INCOME, 1959-72

The detailed State estimates in this report backup the U.S. and State data published in the July 1972 Farm Income Situation. State estimates for 1970-71, published in the August 1972 Supplement, have been revised in line with more up-to-date information. In addition, the per farm averages in tables 3-5 have been changed in many cases back to 1960 based on revised farm numbers by States as published by the Statistical Reporting Service (SRS).

All estimates in this report, as in all official Department farm income data, are on a calendar-year basis. They tie in with the national income and product accounts and State and regional income estimates maintained by the Department of Commerce. The historical data start with 1949 for the 48 conterminous States; Alaska and Hawaii start in 1960. However, this report starts with 1959 because of space limitations.

State data on marketing receipts and direct government payments by programs are shown for 1970-72. Production expense details, by States, are presented for 1959-72.

Tables 1 and 2 afford a quick view of farming in the U.S. and the States based on marketing receipts. Table 1 shows the leading States for the 25 ranking farm commodities. Table 2 presents for each State the five leading commodities

marketed by farmers and a comparative ranking among the States.

These estimates are made in the Economic Research Service with the exceptions of direct government payments data which are based on fiscal reports of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS). Net loans made under the price support program are included in cash receipts from farm marketings.

In cooperation with SRS, and using 1969 Census of Agriculture data, estimates of components of marketings too small to be published by SRS have been revised for 1970-72. These so-called "minor State" estimates are incorporated into miscellaneous or other group totals. Value of sales for this group of relatively minor items is included in order to provide more comprehensive State estimates.

There are several instances in this report where State adjustments have been made so the data do not tie to the July 1973 Farm Income Situation. This is usually covered by a footnote. The major exception is an adjustment to the net change in farm inventories for 1971-72 which was made at the State level but not at the U.S. level. In all cases, the U.S. data in this report are tied to the established national income and product totals maintained by the U.S. Department of Commerce and as published in the July Farm Income Situation.

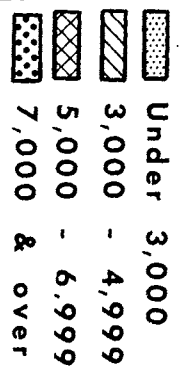
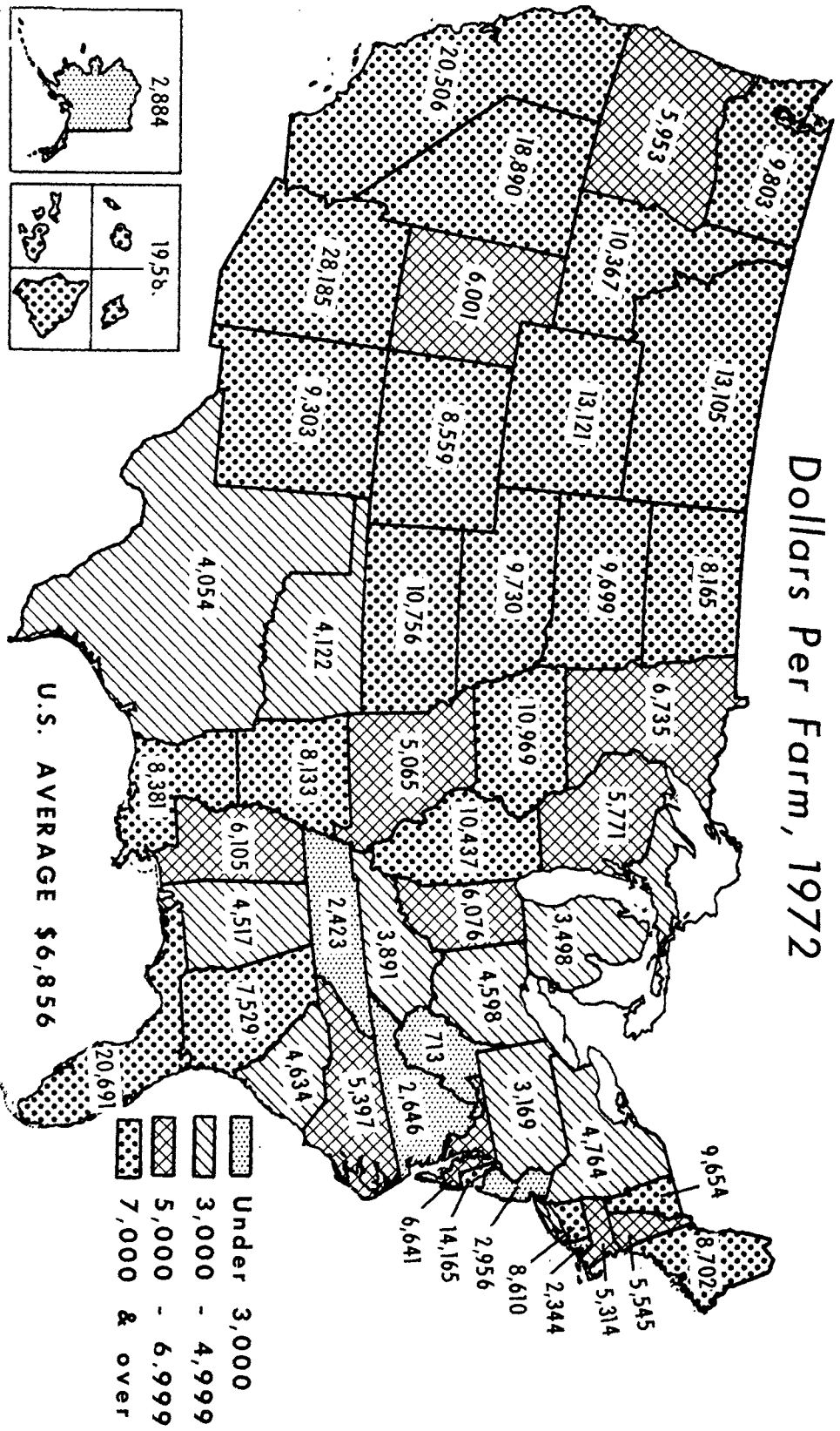

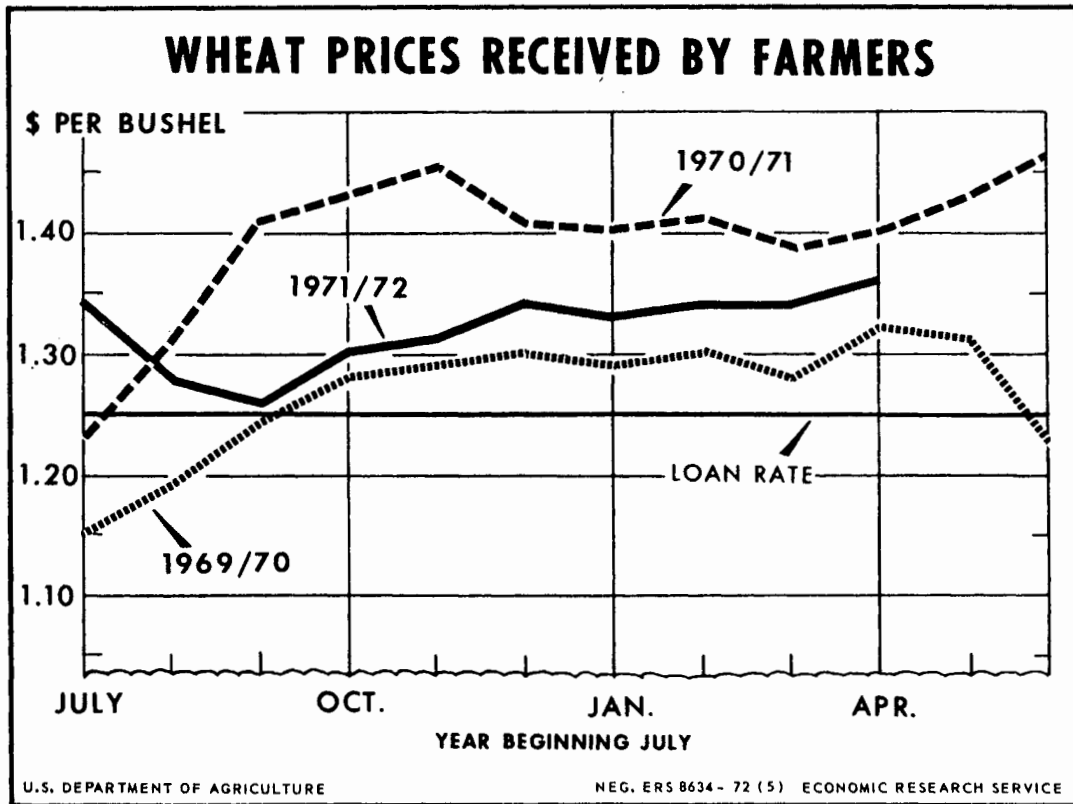
