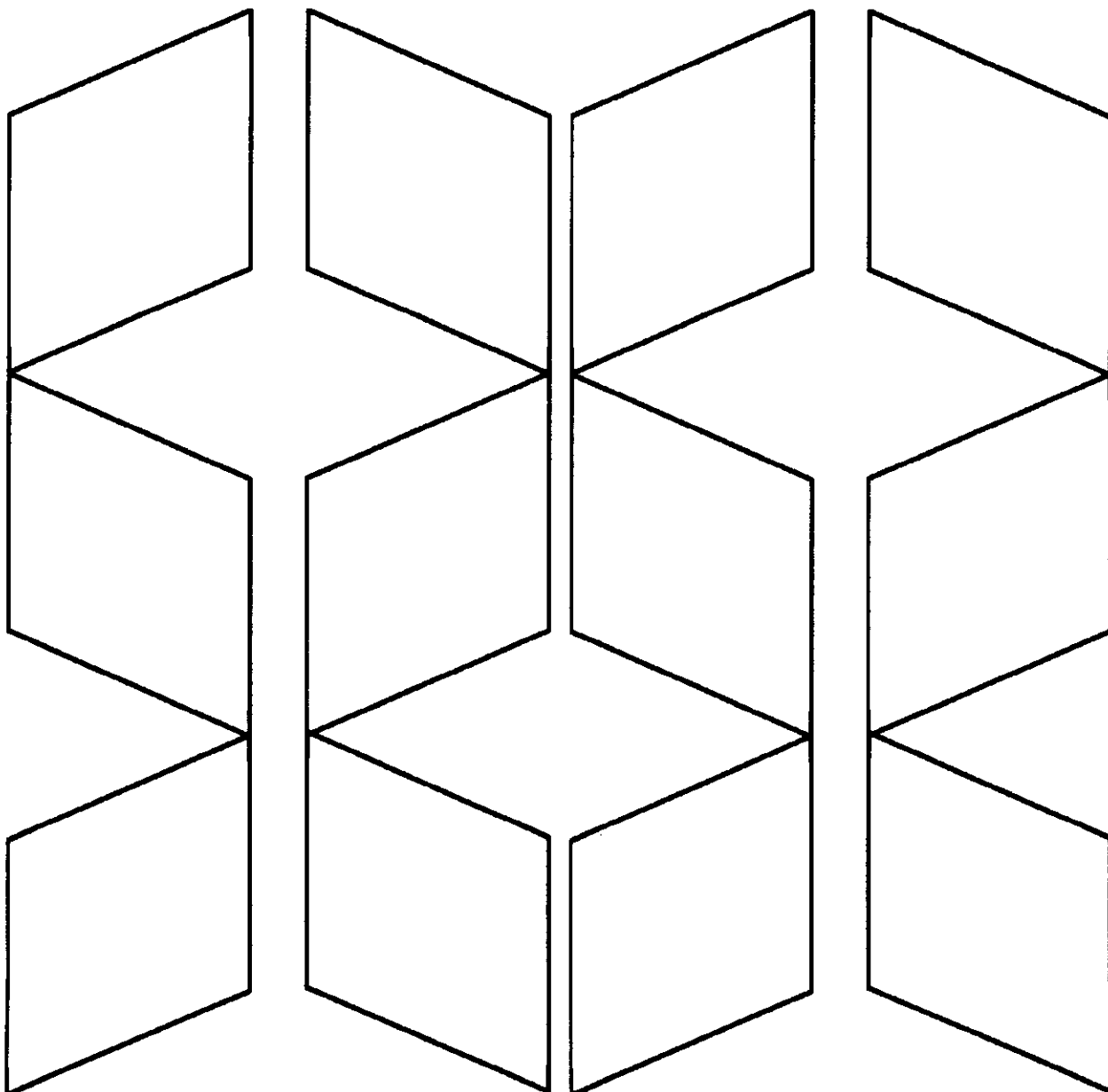

Poultry Production and Value 1993 Summary



Poultry

Production and Value by States, 1992-93

Value of Production and Sales Up 12 Percent

The combined value of production from broilers, eggs, and turkeys and the value of sales from chickens in 1993, was \$16.8 billion, up 12 percent from the \$15.0 billion in 1992, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Of the combined total, 62 percent was from broilers, 22 percent from eggs, 15 percent from turkeys, and about 1 percent from other chickens.

Value of Broiler Production Up 13 Percent

The value of broilers produced during 1993 was \$10.4 billion, up 13 percent from the \$9.17 billion in 1992. The total number of broilers produced in 1993 was 6.69 billion, up 4 percent from 1992. The 1993 average price per pound on a liveweight equivalent basis was 34.0 cents per pound, compared to 31.8 cents per pound in 1992.

Value of Egg Production Up 11 Percent

Value of egg production in 1993 was \$3.77 billion, up 11 percent from the \$3.39 billion in 1992. Egg production totaled 71.4 billion eggs, up 1 percent from the 70.5 billion eggs produced in 1992. In 1993, eggs averaged 63.4 cents per dozen, compared with 57.6 cents in 1992.

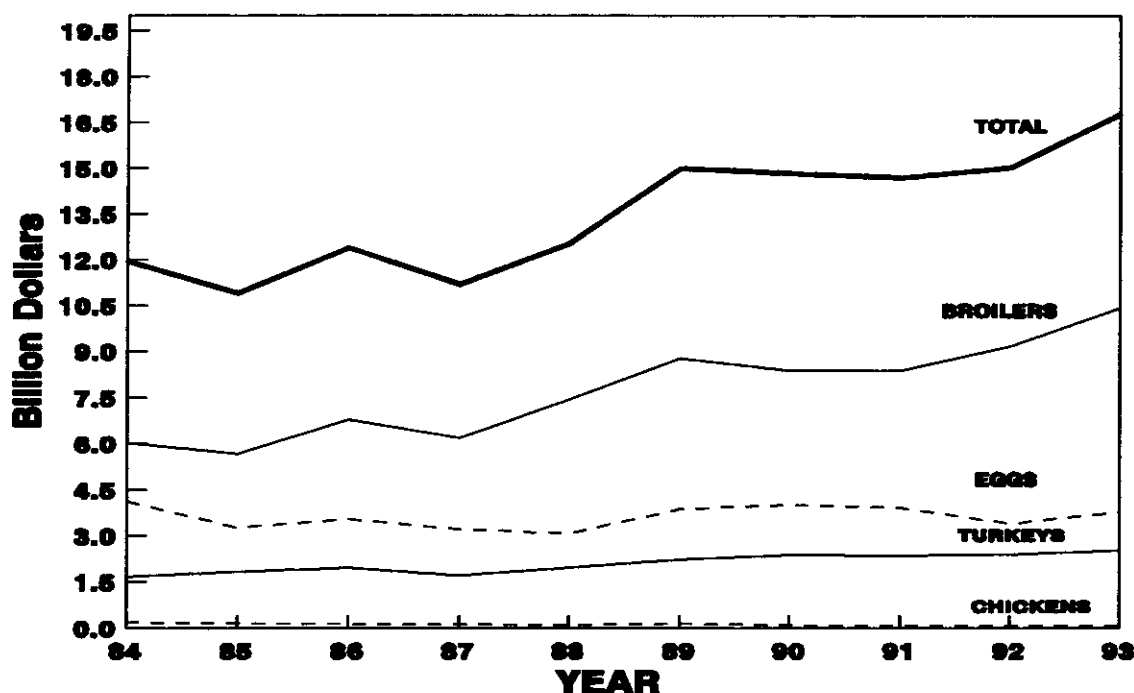
Value of Turkey Production Up 5 Percent

The value of turkeys produced during 1993 was \$2.50 billion, up 5 percent from the \$2.39 billion the previous year. Turkey production in 1993 totaled 6.42 billion pounds liveweight, compared with 6.33 billion pounds in 1992. The average price received by producers during 1993 was 39.0 cents per pound, compared with 37.7 cents in 1992.

Value of Sales of Chicken Up 7 Percent

The value of sales from chickens (excluding broilers) in 1993 was \$88.7 million, up 7 percent from the \$82.9 million a year ago. Prices averaged 9.4 cents per pound compared with 8.6 cents in 1992.
